**GAME NOTES**

Florida State and East Carolina play for the seventh time in 1990, and for the first time in two years...the game is the season-opener for the Seminoles, but the second game of 1990 for the Pirates who play Louisiana Tech Sept. 1...FSU will attempt to break a two-game losing streak in season openers...prior to losses to Miami and Southern Miss in season starters the past two years, the Tribe had won 11 straight first games...the six meetings between FSU and ECU all took place in the '80s, with FSU winning all six...five of the games were played in Doak Campbell Stadium...their meetings have traditionally been high-scoring affairs...Florida State has averaged over 50 points a game in the series...in 1983, the Seminoles and Pirates waged a classic battle in a season-opening game, with FSU finally triumphing 47-46...Head Coach Bobby Bowden is 8-0 all-time against ECU, including a pair of wins while head coach at West Virginia... Florida State quarterback coach Mark Richt spent last season as ECU's offensive coordinator...FSU assistant SID Rob Wilson had the same post at East Carolina from 1984-87.



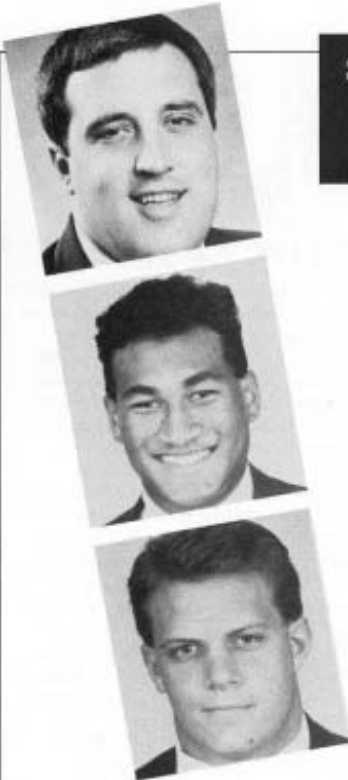

GAME NOTES

The Eagles enter 1990 on a 15-game winning streak as the defending national champions in Division I-AA...Georgia Southern was the only undefeated team in any division in collegiate football last year...Head Coach Tim Stowers is one of two first-year coaches the Seminoles will face in 1990...this year's game marks only the second meeting between the two schools...the Eagles visited Tallahassee in 1988 as the Homecoming opponent and dropped a 28-10 decision to the Seminoles...however, GSC led Florida State 10-7 entering the fourth quarter...Florida State is not the only Bowden-coached team Georgia Southern will play this year...the Eagles finish their season Nov. 17 against Samford, which is coached by Terry Bowden, son of the FSU head man...several GSC administrators have strong ties to Florida State including athletic director Dr. David "Bucky" Wagner, who graduated from FSU, and associate AD Hank Schomber, a former member of the FSU sports information staff.

GAME NOTES

FSU and Tulane meet for the eighth consecutive year in 1990...the series history is confusing due to the first meeting in 1983 in New Orleans...the Green Wave won that game on the field, 34-28, but had to forfeit the win after using an ineligible player...so Florida State is credited with seven wins in the series, including three in the Superdome... FSU's last visit to New Orleans was for the 1989 Sugar Bowl where the Tribe defeated Auburn, 13-7...last season in Tallahassee, Florida State evened its 1989 record at 2-2 by recording a 59-9 victory over Tulane...it was the most points FSU scored all season...six of those points came on an 88-yard pass reception and run by Amp Lee, the longest of the year for Florida State and the fifth longest TD pass in Seminole history...in the series, the games in New Orleans have been closer than those played in Tallahassee...TU defensive line coach Bill Shaw, a 1972 FSU graduate, served in a similar position at Florida State from 1979-81...three of Florida State's 1990 signees get a chance to return home for this game...Chris Cowart and Sean Jackson both hail from St. Augustine High in New Orleans while Kevin Adams is from Lake Charles, La. and LaGrange High.

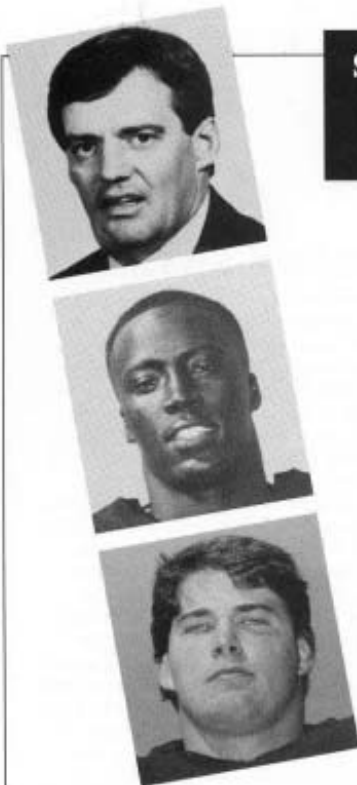

GAME NOTES

The Hokies are the oldest out-of-state rival on the Seminole schedule in 1990...the two teams meet for the 28th time...FSU owns a 16-10-1 lead in the series after last year's 41-7 victory in Blacksburg...before that game, the two teams had not met since 1980...Florida State has won the last seven games between the teams, dating back to 1975 when Virginia Tech defeated the Seminoles 13-10 in Blacksburg...the Seminoles are 11-5 against Tech in games played in Tallahassee and have not lost to Virginia Tech at home since 1974...Bobby Bowden is 10-0 against the Hokies, including a 7-0 mark as the Seminole mentor...Florida State's defense and Peter Tom Willis were the story of the 1989 contest...the schools are both members of the Metro Conference, which features competition in sports other than football.

GAME NOTES

Over the past three years, this has become the hottest rivalry in college football...both teams have finished among the nation's top three in each of those years...last year, Florida State won the state championship by virtue of a 24-10 win over the Hurricanes and a 24-17 win over the University of Florida...FSU put the only blemish on Miami's season, but the Hurricanes went on to win the national championship...that game had 62,602 fans, the second largest crowd in FSU history, standing from beginning to end...Miami is FSU's oldest rival - the schools have faced off 33 times since 1951...Florida State's win last year broke a four-game UM winning streak over FSU...overall, the Hurricanes own a 19-14 advantage in the series...Miami is the only team to shut out the Seminoles in the past 14 seasons, holding FSU scoreless in 1976, Bowden's first year, and again in 1988...Bowden would probably rather forget his last trip to the Orange Bowl, as Miami knocked Florida State from its preseason number one perch with that 31-0 shutout victory...the last five games between the teams have been nationally televised...22 of the 33 series games were played in Miami, where FSU holds a 12-10 advantage...Miami is one of only four opponents with a winning record against Bowden's FSU teams at 9-5...Seminole quarterback coach Mark Richt is a former Hurricane signal-caller.

Florida State's broadcast crew will remain intact for 1990. Play-by-play announcer Gene Deckerhoff and color analyst Vic Prinzi will work together for

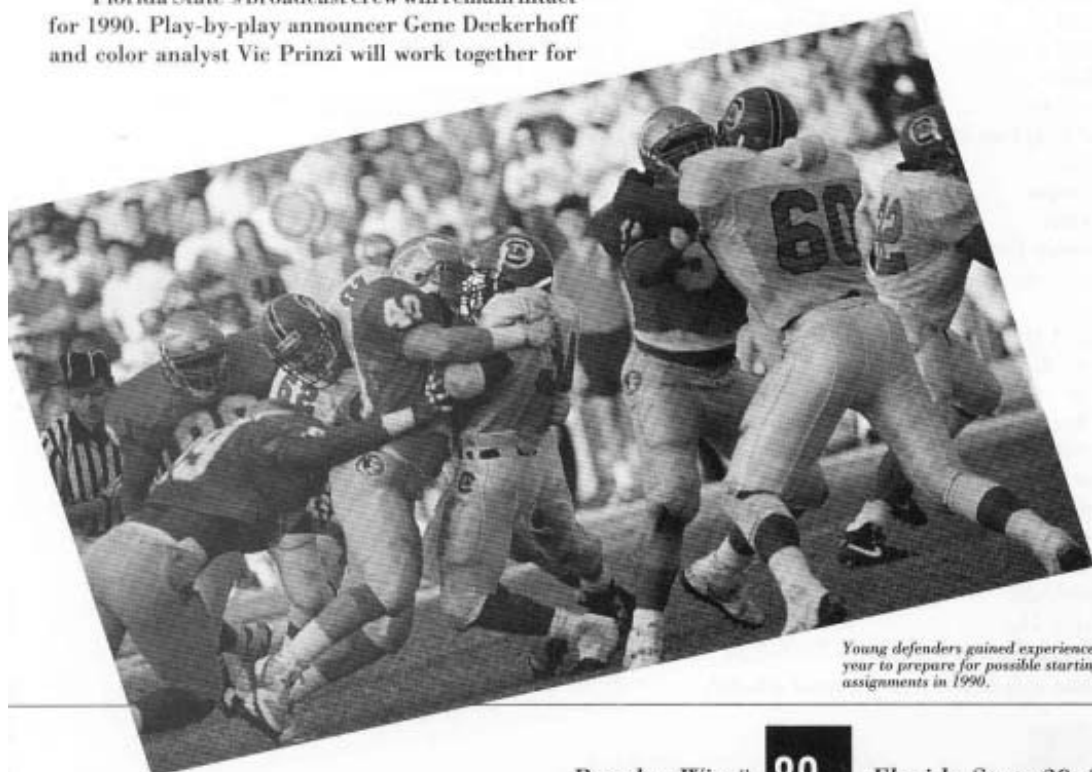
their ninth consecutive season.
