

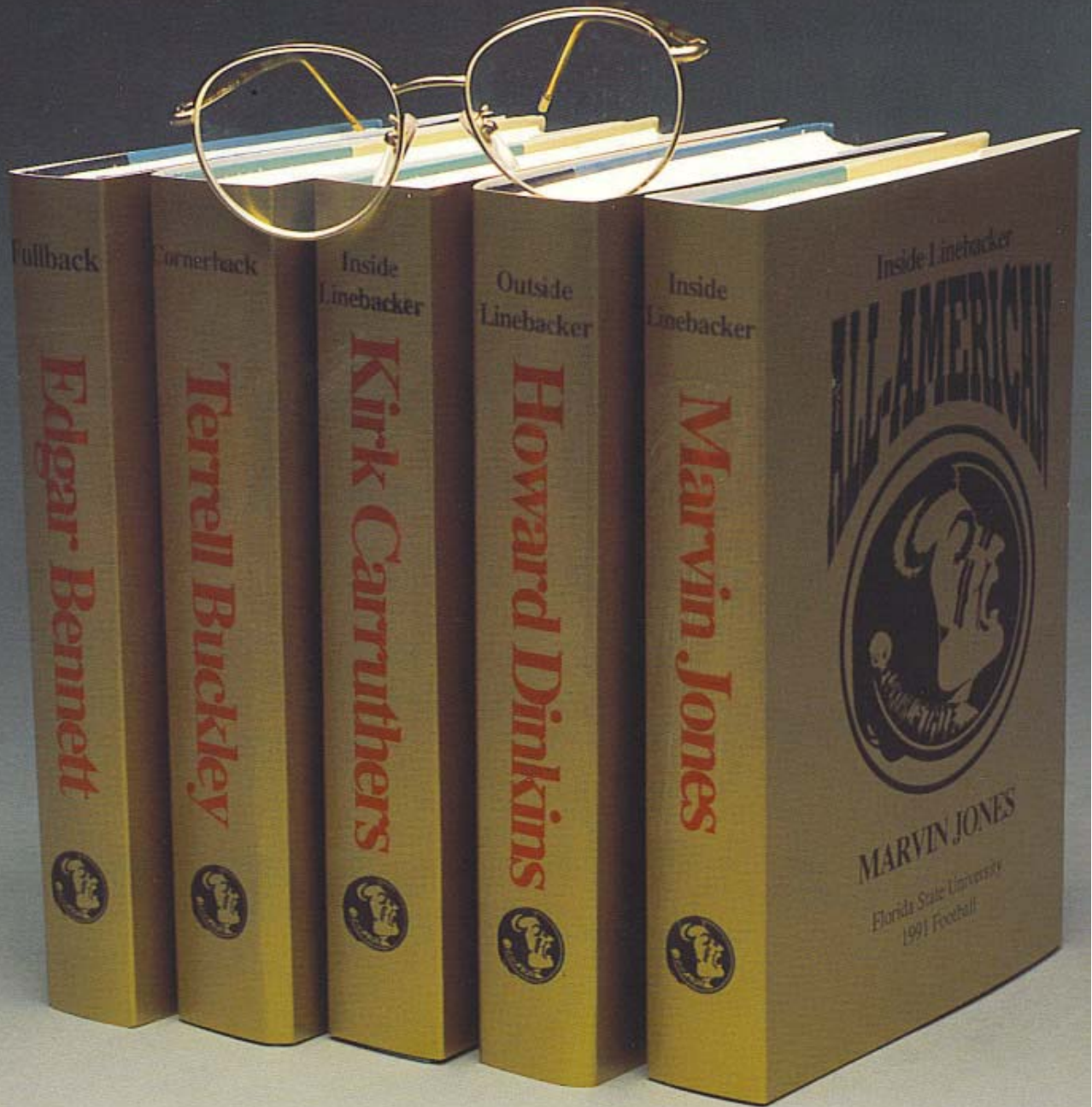

Florida State's ACC Future



On July 1, 1991, Florida State University took the most significant step in its athletic history when it officially became a

member of the Atlantic Coast Conference. Florida State followers will see an immediate impact for the Seminoles as FSU will play a full conference schedule in all sports other than football in the 1991-92 academic year. And yes, that means regular season basketball participation and a spot in the prestigious ACC Basketball Tournament next spring.

Remarkably, Seminole football makes its move to the ACC in 1992. Beginning next season, FSU will play a full schedule of eight Atlantic Coast Conference games and become eligible for the conference football championship.

Even more exciting is the prospect for the ACC football champion to receive an automatic bid to one of four three million dollar New Year's Day Bowl games.

MEDIA INFORMATION

CREDENTIAL REQUESTS

All requests for working press, radio, television, photographer or scouting credentials should be directed to Communications Director Wayne Hogan no later than one week prior to the game. Requests for season credentials should be made at least two weeks prior to the first game.

Space for the working press, radio, television and scouts is allocated by the FSU Communications Office.

Florida State's press box is located on the west side of Doak Campbell Stadium with elevator service to all levels. Media representatives and scouts should enter through the press gate, located south of the elevator. The Will Call booth, where media can pick up credentials on game days, is located outside the gate at the base of the elevator. Will Call credentials will also be available in the Communications Office on Fridays prior to games.

PRESS POLICIES

Working press will be admitted to Level 5, where approximately 90 seats are available. Credentials are issued by FSU according to the following criteria:

1. Local newspapers, wire services, national publications, newspapers from opponents' area and student newspapers from FSU and opponents' schools.
2. Other daily newspapers with preference to those which regularly cover FSU.
3. Scouts.
4. Non-daily newspapers, with preference to those which regularly cover FSU.
5. Radio and television personnel not broadcasting, but considered reporting (seats may be provided in the stands and locker room access granted).

MEDIA HEADQUARTERS

The official media headquarters for the 1991 home football season is the Ramada Inn - North. It is located at North Monroe Street (U.S. 27 North) and I-10. Most media functions, including the Sunday morning "Breakfast with Bobby," will be held there. The Florida State

University Communications Office has a number of rooms set aside for accredited media representatives during home game weekends. Arrangements for these rooms must be made through Debbie Powell of the Communications Office and priority is determined in the same manner spelled out above under "Press Policies."

[SPECIAL NOTE— Media rooms at the Ramada Inn - North on home game weekends will require a TWO NIGHT MINIMUM. There will be no exceptions. The 1991 rate is \$63 per night on football weekends. When reserving a room through FSU it will be necessary to give us a credit card number to guarantee the room.]

Florida State also maintains a minimal number of rooms for the media at the team headquarters for all road games. Check with the Communications Office for information on availability of these rooms.

RADIO - TV

The sixth level of the press box is designated for use by radio and television broadcasting crews and home and visiting coaches. Each booth is fully enclosed and sound proof.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Only accredited photographers and photographers shooting for the FSU Communications Office will be issued working credentials.

Florida State reserves the right to admit only those photographers deemed to be on the premises for legitimate media purposes. All photographers working FSU games should be prepared to show a media ID card and equipment designed to photograph major college football.

Florida State will use a double photo line system on its sidelines again in 1991. Only those photographers actually shooting the game will be allowed on the "front" line. These shooters will be given credentials upon check-in to allow them front line access. All other photo personnel will be required to stay behind a second line so as not to obstruct the working view of the shooters. This would include grips, runners and sideline reporters. Violation of the double-line system will result in removal from the sideline.

The press box catwalk, or photo deck, offers an unobstructed view for TV and video cameras. Holders of a photo deck pass will be assigned space in that area. Still photographers may have access to the sidelines only. Those holding a still photography credential should report to the gate specified on the pass where they will be issued an armband, a set of rosters and a pre-game meal. A photographers' lounge area with tables and chairs is available.

Special requests for photographers whose assignments warrant shooting from the photo deck may be made to Communications Director Wayne Hogan.

VIDEO SERVICES

Florida State's Communications Office has the ability to assist networks and television stations by providing video services through Seminole Productions, Inc. The FSU athletic department has a working relationship with SPI and its general manager, Mark Rodin, whose office is located in the Moore Athletic Center. Seminole Productions has editing facilities and studio equipment on sight and can produce virtually any material you may request. In most cases there will be a nominal fee charged for these services. Please call Rodin at 644-0019 to arrange for these services.

PRESS PARKING

Parking is limited and passes will be issued on a priority basis within the same guidelines as working credentials. The press lot is located on the south end of Doak Campbell Stadium. Access to the lot is from Stadium Drive.

STATISTICAL SERVICES

Play-by-play, half-time and complete

statistics will be provided. Post-game quotes from FSU Head Coach Bobby Bowden and the visiting coach also will be available.

REFRESHMENTS

A pre-game meal will be served on Level 6 of the press box approximately two hours before kickoff. Refreshments will be available throughout the game.

TELEPHONES

Telephone service for the FSU press box should be secured directly through Centel Telephone Company of Florida in Tallahassee (904/681-6600). Have them contact the Communications Office for location. Due to deregulation, media members must bring their own phones. Centel will provide lines only. When contacting Centel, please be specific as to the type of line you need (i.e. touchtone, etc.).

FAX SERVICE

An independent fax service will be available for each game with a nominal fee charged. Please contact a member of the Communications Office staff during the game to secure post-game FAX service.

MID-WEEK INTERVIEWS

Media interviews with all FSU players should be arranged through the Communications Office. For phone interviews, a Communications staff member will fill out a card informing the player to return the call. It is helpful to call one day in advance when requesting players for mid-week interviews. All player calls to the media will be made collect.

Anyone wishing to schedule an interview with Head Coach Bobby Bowden should contact his secretary, Sue Hall, at (904) 644-0097.

BREAKFAST WITH BOBBY

Following each Seminole home game, Head Coach Bobby Bowden will join the media Sunday morning for breakfast at the Ramada Inn - North. Breakfast will be served at 8:30 a.m. with a question and answer session beginning at 8:45 a.m.

CONFERENCE CALL

Media members may contact Bowden for follow-up material via a Sunday conference call on road game weekends. Contact a member of the Communications Office during the previous day's game for further information.

ROAD GAME CREDENTIALS

Writers covering Florida State may make requests for road credentials with the opponent school or with the FSU Communications Office by Monday of game week.

POST-GAME INTERVIEW POLICY

Florida State University's athletic staff is well aware of the importance of media coverage and is briefed continually on the role of the media insofar as it interacts with their respective duties. At no time is this cooperation more important than in our post-game interview and locker room procedures. To insure the most workable situation for members of the media and for the FSU staff, the following procedures *must* be observed:

1 Entrance to the Florida State locker room can be made *only* through the second floor interview room. All members of the media will be directed to this room by the FSU Communications Office staff immediately at the conclusion of the game. It is helpful if all media personnel assemble at the tunnel entrance in the north end zone immediately following the conclusion of the game. You will *not* be allowed access to the locker room through the players' entrance so follow closely.

2 Florida State Coach Bobby Bowden will be brought directly to the interview room as soon as he dismisses the team and declares the locker room open.

3 When Coach Bowden makes his appearance in the interview room, those members of the media wishing to go to the locker room will be instructed as to the proper route. Down one flight of stairs leads directly into the player dressing area.

4 FLORIDA STATE'S LOCKER ROOM IS OPEN TO ALL MEDIA MEMBERS, MALE AND FEMALE. HOWEVER, IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT FEMALE REPORTERS INFORM FSU COMMUNICATIONS OFFICE PERSONNEL DURING THE GAME THAT THEY WILL NEED LOCKER ROOM ACCESS. (FSU players have been assured that they will be told on a game-by-game basis when there will be female reporters in the locker room — a courtesy we feel must be extended.)

5 Exit from the locker room and access back to the press box can be made through the players' entrance to the stadium.



Media Information

It is our desire at Florida State to make the post-game procedures as painless as possible for both the media and our staff. Remember, both groups have important tasks and are under extreme pressure.

The Florida State Athletic Department cannot and will not be responsible for problems incurred by any media member not following the above procedure. Security personnel will facilitate only those following the proper guidelines. If, however, you encounter a problem while following this procedure from any member of our staff or security, please inform a Communications Office staff member immediately.

How Seminoles?

After the Florida State football team played its first football game on October 18, 1947 as a no-name team, the students of the university rallied together and submitted different potential nicknames to be voted on by the entire student body. A week after that first game, the list was narrowed to six names. Those names were: Golden Falcons, Statesmen, Crackers, Senators, Indians and Seminoles. The nickname "Seminoles" eventually beat out "Statesmen" by 110 votes.

SEMINOLE RADIO NETWORK

Florida State's Seminole Sports Network is a regional radio network which broadcasts FSU football over a three-state area covering most of Florida and parts of both Georgia and Alabama. The Network brings the excitement of Seminole games to fans, alumni and college football enthusiasts across the Southeast.

The Seminole Sports Network is controlled by Host Communications Sports, Inc., one of the nation's leaders in collegiate sports broadcasting. FSU and the Lexington, Ky. based company have joined forces to establish a comprehensive marketing opportunity which will include radio, TV, print and corporate sponsorship components.

In addition to its long-term broadcast relationship with the NCAA, Host also owns the rights to the networks of other outstanding schools like Texas, Auburn, Alabama, Kentucky, Tennessee, Notre Dame, Army, Navy and LSU.

In 1991, the Florida State network has grown to extend into more than 50 markets throughout the region. Locally, Tallahassee station WTNT-FM is the flagship station.

Florida State's broadcast crew will remain intact for 1991. Play-by-play announcer Gene Deckerhoff and color analyst Vic Prinzi will work together for the 10th consecutive season.

Deckerhoff begins his 13th season as the "Voice of the Seminoles" in 1991. A six-time Florida Sportscaster of the Year, he also has been judged by the Florida Sportscaster's Association as the best college and pro play-by-play announcer in the state 11 out of the past 12 years. Again this year, Deckerhoff will handle the play-by-play duties of the NFL Tampa Bay Buccaneers in addition to his duties with FSU. He is nationally known as one of the finest announcers in the South. Deckerhoff will continue to serve as producer and co-host of the Bobby Bowden Television Show.

Former Florida State quarterback Vic Prinzi (1954-57) begins his 10th season as Deckerhoff's color analyst. A long-time friend and former teammate of actor Burt Reynolds, Prinzi had a brief professional football career with the New York Giants and Denver Broncos following graduation from FSU. After a 12-year coaching career in the high school and college ranks, Prinzi joined Dulin Brokerage in Tampa where he is Vice President of the Wholesale Division.

Loaded with depth, experience, speed and talent, the Florida State University football team may need just one element in 1991. A little luck!

After finishing in the nation's Top Four in each of the past four seasons, anticipation runs feverishly high for a determined run at all the marbles this year. Almost nothing stands in the Seminoles' way to a national title in 1991. Nothing, that is, except the likes of BYU, Michigan, Syracuse, LSU, Louisville, South Carolina, Miami and Florida.

"We're playing enough strong teams that we won't be able to afford a letdown during any stage of the season," said Florida State's wily coach Bobby Bowden, about to begin his 16th year at FSU. "You simply can't peak every week, no matter how good you are. That's where you need a little luck to go along with everything else."

Bowden's toughest job in 1991 may be keeping everyone happy. The fruits of three straight recruiting sweeps combined with an uplifting 10-2 "rebuilding" season in 1990 have left the Seminole camp deep in talent.

After watching the Tribe streak to six straight victories to close out the 1990 campaign and win its last two games over Top 10 opponents, one is hard-pressed to find a weakness heading into 1991. But even with all the talent, one question remains: Can these Seminoles get out of the blocks better than teams of the past several years?

Obviously Bowden is banking on that. His team accepted a bid to play in the second annual Disneyland/Pigskin Classic in Anaheim, Calif. on August 29. The opponent, Brigham Young, merely boasts a returning Heisman Trophy winner in quarterback Ty Detmer.

"I must be crazy after seeing what they did to Miami last year," Bowden said. "But if you're ever going to play in one of these pre-season games, you want to do it when you've got some experienced players returning. I'd say this would be the year if there ever was one."

In 1988, Florida State was tabbed the nation's No. 1 team in virtually every pre-season poll only to suffer an embarrassing 31-0 loss to Miami in the season opener. That team won 11 straight after the debacle, but could do no better than a No. 3 finish. In 1989, it was back-to-back losses to open the year and then a 10-game winning streak and a third-place finish again. And last year, October losses to Miami and Auburn were followed by a six-game closing flurry and a

final No. 4 national ranking.

"I would say the way our schedule plays out this year, there's no room for a lull," Bowden said. "We've got to hit the ground running and maintain that pace until the end. It'll be dad-gum tough to do."

Also looming big early is a September 28 date with Michigan in Ann Arbor. The Wolverines, too, are expected to field one of the nation's best teams in 1991. That game shapes up as one of college football's best early season contests.

Syracuse visits Tallahassee in early October, and at mid-season there are consecutive road games at LSU and surging Louisville.

Marvin Jones (55) and Howard Dinkins (89) return for the 1991 season as the top inside-outside linebacker combination in the nation.

The "State Championship" will be decided late this year as the Seminoles host Miami Nov. 16 and play at Florida Nov. 30.

The Florida State talent pool begins with its trigger-man, **quarterback** Casey Weldon. He took the reins from returning backup Brad Johnson at mid-season and has not lost as a starter. Among returning players, only Heisman-winner Detmer had a better efficiency rating in 1990. Look for those two to go toe-to-toe in Anaheim.

The Seminoles are four-deep at quarterback with flashy sophomore Charlie Ward, a basketball star, and solid sophomore Kenny Felder, a baseball star, waiting in the wings behind seniors Weldon and Johnson.

The entire backfield is back intact — three deep at each spot. Senior **fullback** Edgar Bennett already has a degree in hand, but opted to return for his final season rather than jump to the NFL. There is not a more versatile fullback in the nation — a runner, a blocker and a pass-catcher extraordinaire. Senior Paul Moore has lots of game experience and will provide valuable backup for the third straight season.

At **tailback**, Amp Lee is electrifying. The slippery junior is coming off an MVP performance against Penn State in the Blockbuster Bowl in the 1990 finale. He also ran roughshod over a vaunted Florida Gator defense in the regular season ender, gaining 147 yards on 26 carries. Lee scored more touchdowns (19) in his sophomore year than any returning player in college football in 1991. Sophomore Sean Jackson, who averaged 7.9 yards on 54 carries, returns as well as a stable of newcomers. The nation's best high school player, Orlando tailback Marquette Smith, could make an early impact.

Though the Seminoles lose outstanding guard Hayward Haynes, a preview of the 1991 **offensive line** could be seen in the Blockbuster Bowl victory. Haynes went out early

with an injury, leaving underclassmen at every position. The result was astonishing. Seniors Kevin Mancini and Mike Morris at tight tackle and tight guard, respectively, will lead the way for many a 1991 touchdown. Junior center Robbie Baker snapped virtually every play last year and senior Reggie Dixon and junior Robert Stevenson on the split side have seen plenty of action in starting roles. Backups here are a little inexperienced and it's likely some newcomers will get some early experience. If the starting group stays healthy, it has the look of one of the best lines FSU has produced.

Perhaps the only offensive position completely wiped clean after last year was **tight end**. Reggie Johnson seems a sure bet for the NFL after going in the second round of last year's draft and Dave Roberts, an Academic All-American, has headed for law school at the University of Texas. Look for sophomores Warren Hart and Marvin Ferrell to get the first cracks at the job, but Lonnie Johnson, who played last season as a first-year freshman, is quite a specimen and may well make an impact.

It may be impossible to replace an All-American like Lawrence Dawsey, but Florida State has plenty of candidates standing in line at the **wide receiver** spot. Two of the team's top wide receiver returnees, juniors Shannon Baker and Eric Tural, are battling for



Dawsey's vacated flanker spot, and the split end position will likely fall to experienced sophomore Matt Frier or a new name. Sophomore Kevin Knox and redshirt freshman Kez McCorvey will also have a chance to shine in '91.

Always known for offensive prowess, the Florida State defense may be the key to any great achievements in 1991. With nine of 11 starters back, the Seminoles should at least give Detmer and others something to think about.

That "thinking" just might turn into nightmares if they start with the **inside linebackers**. Marvin Jones may well go from the finest freshman player in America to the finest sophomore. No first-year man has ever made as big a mark as Jones. He led the team in 1990 with 133 tackles, eight for losses. Miami coach Dennis Erickson said of Jones: "He gets to the ball in a hurry, and when he gets there, he's in a bad mood." That mood should improve after he eventually collects a Butkus Award.

To do that, he may have to muscle aside senior Kirk Carruthers, one of 10 finalists for that award in 1990. Carruthers can fly, as evidenced by his 317 career tackles and four interceptions. Sophomore Ken Alexander, a 3.6 student, made quite an impact on the field as well in his freshman season. He'll push for a good deal of playing time.

Anyone who saw the Blockbuster Bowl game can attest to senior Howard Dinkins' abilities at **outside linebacker**. Dinkins ran stride-for-stride with a Penn State fullback down the sideline and made a dazzling interception on just one of his great plays in that game. An amazing 11 of his 74 tackles last year resulted in a loss. His speed, quickness and a penchant for the big play make him a player to watch in '91.

Junior Reggie Freeman has the inside track on replacing Anthony Moss at the other OLB spot. Moss, the leading quarterback sacker and one of the most underrated players on the 1990 team, is one of two starters who departed. Look for sophomore Sterling Palmer to make a serious run at the job after playing the second team spot last year. A pair of redshirt freshmen, Chris Cowart and James Roberson, also have caught the eyes of FSU's defensive coaches.

On the **defensive front**, things are in good hands with all three starters returning. The Ostaszewski twins are now seniors. Henry should start at left end; Joe will challenge for the noseguard spot, playing behind senior James Chaney. Sophomore Toddrick McIntosh will again see playing time and watch for big junior college transfer Dan Footman, injured last year in the pre-season, to make a move.

Three right ends are all experienced and should share playing time. Junior Troy Sanders was the starter last year, backed up

by fellow juniors Carl Simpson and Deondri Clark.

The **secondary** begins with All-America junior Terrell Buckley at cornerback. Not only a deadly cover man, Buckley is one of the finest punt returners in college football, averaging 14.4 yards per return. He also had six of his nine career interceptions during the 1990 campaign.

Senior Errol McCorvey is a three-year starter at corner. Two juniors who split time last year - Leon Fowler and John Davis - anchor the free safety position, although Davis may move to strong safety with Lavon Brown also in the mix at one of the safety positions. Davis, Brown, or another candidate - possibly Bryce Abbott who saw action there in the Seminoles' nickel package last year, or incoming freshman Derrick Brooks - is needed to fill the strong safety spot vacated by Bill Ragans and John Wyche.

The Florida State **kicking game** continues to struggle for respect. Redshirt freshman Dan Mowrey is the heir-apparent to the place-kicking duties, replacing departed kickers Richie Andrews and Bill Mason.

John Wimberly and Scottie McLaren, both juniors, handled the **punting** duties last year, but neither rose out of the ashes to win the job outright. Look for newly-signed freshman Scott Holmes to get an early shot at winning the job.



Florida State has won 42 of its last 48 games, dating back to the 1986 All-American Bowl.

Florida State returns everyone off the young defensive line of 1990 and boasts seven experienced players along the defensive front this year, including Carl Simpson (95), Joe Ostaszewski (75) and Troy Sanders (62).
