## Game Notes

Two of the nation's top programs and winningest head coaches meet for the first time ever at the 1991 Disneyland Pigskin Classic...this Thursday night game in Anaheim inaugurates the 1991 college football season...the game will be nationally televised by Raycom, marking the second straight appearance on the network for the Tribe...two of the nation's top quarterbacks will have a chance to exhibit their skills with FSU's Casey Weldon matching up against 1990 Heisman Trophy winner Ty Detmer of BYU...Detmer finished last season second on the NCAA Division I-A passing efficiency list (155.9) with Weldon right behind him (152.7)...Detmer's father, Sonny, came to Florida State to play baseball back in his playing days but left after one season...the game features two of the country's top coaches in Bobby Bowden, who ranks second in victories among active coaches with 205, and LaVell Edwards, whose 175 wins puts him fifth on that list...Edwards has the edge in winning percentage though as his .747 percentage is third while Bowden's .732 mark ranks fifth...for the second time in three years, Florida State begins the season with a neutral site contest...under Bobby Bowden, the Seminoles are 2-1 in the regular season and 11-3-1 overall in games played at neutral sites...over the past 14 years, FSU is 12-2 in season openers...the Seminoles have won only one of its last three first games, that a 45-24 win over East Carolina in Tallahassee last year.

# 2 - Tulane

## Game Notes

FSU and Tulane meet for the ninth consecutive year in 1991...the series record will forever include an asterisk (\*) due to the first meeting in 1983 in New Orleans...the Green Wave won that game on the field, 34-28, but were forced to forfeit the win because they used an ineligible player...so Florida State is officially 8-0 against Tulane...Florida State is 13-2 in its home openers under Bobby Bowden...last season, FSU took a 31-13 win over the Green Wave in New Orleans...two years ago in Tallahassee, Amp Lee and Casey Weldon got their first tastes of fame when Lee was a freshman and Weldon a sophomore...in that contest, the two hooked up on an 88-yard pass reception and run which stands as the fifth-longest TD pass in Seminole history...in that game, Weldon completed three of four passes with all three completions going for touchdowns, of 88, 56 and 17 yards...in the series, the four games played in New Orleans have been closer than those played in Tallahassee...at home against Tulane, FSU has a victory margin of 41 points...three members of Florida State's 1991 team are from the New Orleans area.

One of three teams Florida State will play for the first time ever in 1991...the Broncos are in town on Parents' Weekend in Tallahassee, annually one of the top draws on the Seminole schedule as FSU's 29,000 students are invited to bring their parents to the game on this weekend...Western Michigan is also the first of two teams from the state of Michigan FSU will face in September...two weeks after its home game with WMU, the Seminoles travel to Ann Arbor to take on their more-heralded neighbors, the Michigan Wolverines...the Broncos, who finished third in the Mid-American Conference last season, are the third MAC team to visit Tallahassee...FSU previously played Ohio (47-7 win in 1956) and Toledo (24-0 win in 1986) of the MAC...WMU Head Coach Al Molde has 132 wins in 20 seasons as a head coach which would rank among the nation's top 20 for Division I-A coaches, but has only four years in the division and doesn't qualify for the list...Western Michigan Athletic Director Dr. Leland Byrd and FSU AD Bob Goin are long-time associates from their days at West Virginia...the FSU game is one of only two night games on the WMU schedule.

## Game Notes

Florida State returns to Ann Arbor for the second time in school history...the game is already scheduled for showing on national television as ABC placed the contest on its September schedule last summer...the first and only game played between the teams was a 20-18 Michigan victory in 1986...this game will be played in Ann Arbor before an anticipated crowd of over 100,000...a pair of former Tallahassee Lincoln High School stars, senior J.D. Carlson of Michigan and freshman Dan Mowrey of Florida State, will likely start for the two teams at placekicker...the Wolverines are one of six 1990 bowl teams the Seminoles face in 1991...unlike in 1986, FSU and UM will square off on natural grass this season...the artificial turf in Michigan Stadium was replaced with Prescription Athletic Turf (P.A.T.) this past spring...FSU is familiar with P.A.T. as it is the field surface at Doak Campbell Stadium...Seminole senior linebacker Kirk Carruthers, who grew up in East Lansing, Mich., has a chance to perform for the home folks in this game...Wolverine Desmond Howard is a dangerous kickoff return man who averaged nearly 30 yards per run back in 1990 to rank second in the nation...Florida State is 5-1 all-time against teams from the Big 10 Conference with all six games played since Bowden's arrival.

The Orangemen visit Tallahassee for the first time in school history for the fourth meeting between Syracuse and Florida State...FSU owns a 2-1 edge in the series thanks to a 41-10 victory over Syracuse in the Carrier Dome in 1989...each of the four games between FSU and SU have been played in a different decade...in 1966, the Orangemen defeated Florida State 37-21 in Syracuse...the Tribe evened the series at one with a 28-0 shutout win in 1978...in the 1989 contest, FSU defenders recorded nine quarterback sacks, Terrell Buckley dashed 69 yards on his famous "freeze" return and LeRoy Butler raced 87 yards with an interception to lead the Seminoles...Paul Pasqualoni is one of two first-year head coaches Florida State will face in 1991...Bobby Bowden's record against the Orange is 6-2, including a 4-2 mark while the head man at West Virginia...Syracuse and FSU have a pair of common opponents as the Orange will play host to Florida Sept. 21 and travel to New Orleans to take on Tulane Sept. 28...seven players on the Syracuse roster attended high school in Florida, including a pair signed last year...sophomore quarterback Marvin Graves was named the Eastern College Rookie of the Year in 1990...during the 1990-91 season, Pat Kennedy's basketball Seminoles visited the Carrier Dome in addition to the FSU football team' visit the previous season.

## Game Notes

This is a matchup of the two most successful college football teams in the nation over the past four years... since 1987, Miami is 44-4 (.917) and FSU is 42-6 (.875)...as a result, this game has become one of the biggest annual contests in college football...both teams have finished in the nation's top four teams in each of the past four years...last year, Miami handed Florida State its first loss of the season with a 31-22 win in the Orange Bowl before a crowd of 80,396...Miami is FSU's oldest rival...the schools have faced off 34 times since 1951...the Hurricanes own a 20-14 advantage in the series and have won five of the last six contests...the only exception was FSU's 24-10 win two years ago in Tallahassee which was the only blemish on UM's season...Miami is the only team to shut out the Seminoles in the past 15 seasons, holding FSU scoreless in 1976, Bobby Bowden's first year, and again in 1988...the last six games between the teams have been nationally televised...the Hurricanes have had more success in Doak Campbell Stadium than any other team with a 9-2 record at FSU's home field since 1957...Miami also has more wins over Bobby Bowden-coached teams than any other school with an 11-6 mark, which includes a 10-5 mark against Bowden's FSU teams...Seminoles quarterback coach Mark Richt is a former Hurricane signal-caller.

## Game Notes

Florida State's current winning streak in this series stretched to four with last year's 45-30 victory in Tallahassee...that nationally televised game matched two of the hottest teams in the nation...FSU took a 7-0 lead two plays into the contest on a 76-yard pass from Casey Weldon to Lawrence Dawsey...never before 1990 had both teams been ranked in the Top 10 at the time of the game...since Bobby Bowden's arrival, this series has been marked by a series of streaks...after suffering a 33-26 loss to Florida in 1976 Bowden's teams ran off four straight wins...then in 1981, the Gators won six straight before Florida State's current streak began...last year's win gave Bowden an 8-7 edge over the Gators in his 15 seasons at FSU...in Gainesville, where 19 of the previous 33 games in the series have been played, the Tribe is 5-13-1 all-time and 4-3 under Bowden...Miami, not Florida, is FSU's oldest rival...Florida State has won the last two games played in Gainesville, 28-14 in 1987 and 24-17 in 1989...the Gator teams UF Head Coach Steve Spurrier played on in four seasons as a player for the Gators went 2-2 against Florida State...during his Heisman winning season of 1967, his UF squad lost to FSU 21-16...this game has been nationally televised in nine of the last 14 years.
