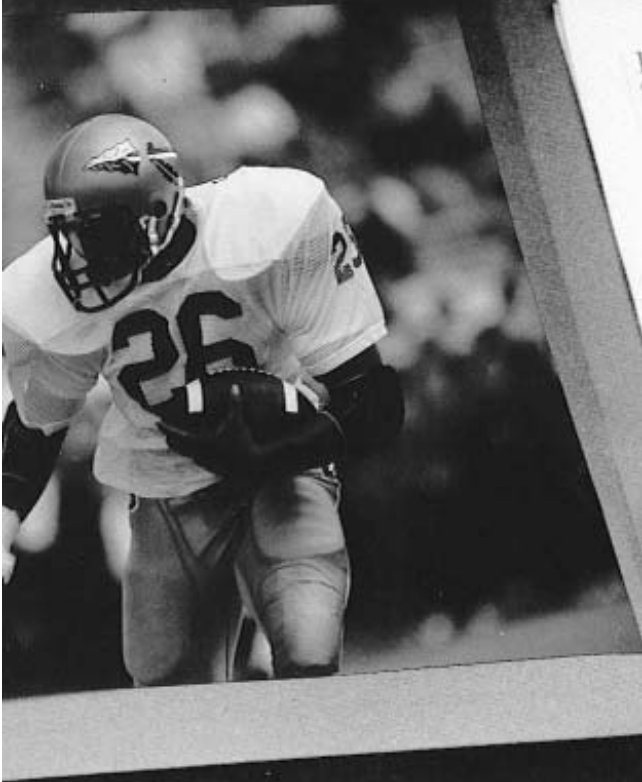

FSU's 1991 Homecoming opponent, the Middle Tennessee State Blue Raiders, lost 16 of its 22 starters off of last year's NCAA Division I-AA playoff team. That is the largest loss for MTSU Head Coach Boots Donnelly during his 14-year head coaching career. On the other hand, the LSU Tigers return nearly their entire starting line-up from last season. New LSU coach Curley Hallman has 20 of his 22 1990 starters back, including the entire defense. FSU returns 17 of 22 starters in 1991.

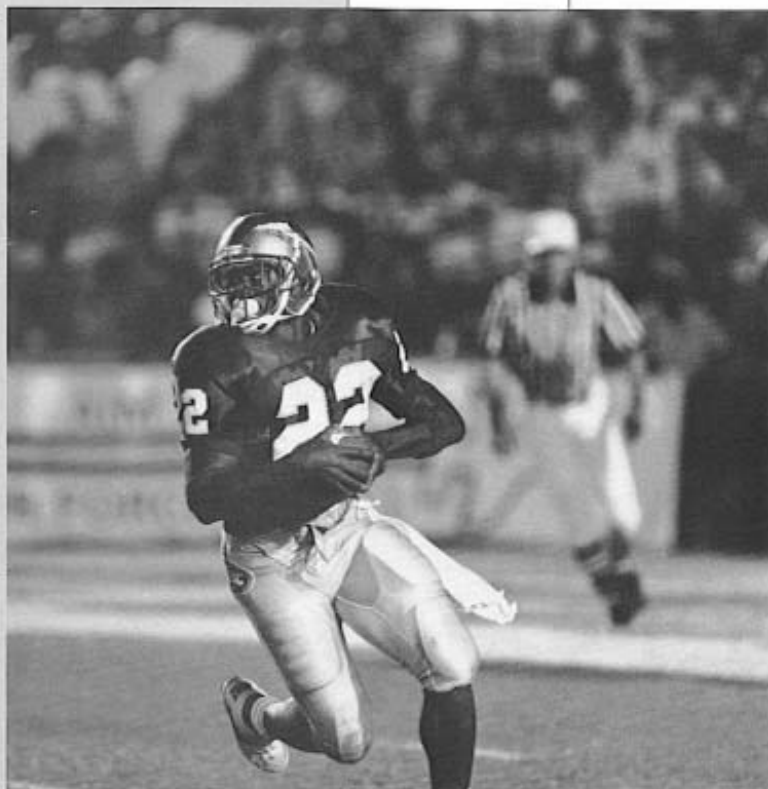

One of the most unique traditions at FSU is the Sod Cemetery. A patch of grass to one side of the Seminole practice fields has been designated the Sod Cemetery. In it are pieces of turf or grass from "big" Florida State victories over the years. All of the victories came on the road. Since 1962, certain games every season have been dubbed "Sod Games". These are contests where Florida State goes into the opponents turf as the underdog or games of particular importance for another reason. If the Seminoles pull off the upset, or even earn the tie, a piece of turf is dug up from the field and taken back to Tallahassee where it is interred in the cemetery.
