### Game Notes

Florida State enters a new era in the 1992 season opener...the Seminoles begin their first quest for an Atlantic Coast Conference title against Duke...the Blue Devils are one of two ACC teams the Seminoles face for the first time ever in 1992...in 45 seasons of football, Florida State is 31-14 in season openers...under Bobby Bowden, Florida State is 15-3 in first games...in the past five years, FSU's record in lid-lifters is 3-2, but the Seminoles have won two straight...all-time, Florida State is 22-15-3 against teams from the ACC...FSU enters 1992 having won only one of its last three games, the 1992 Cotton Bowl...in each of the last four seasons, the Tribe brought at least a six-game win streak into its season-opener...Bowden was 0-2 against Duke as the head coach at West Virginia...the last time Florida State started the season at home was in 1990 when the Seminoles beat East Carolina, 45-24.

## Game Notes

Florida State returns to Death Valley for the first time since the infamous "puntrookie" game in 1988...Florida State won that rain-soaked contest, 24-21, thanks to the heroics of LeRoy Butler and Bobby Bowden...the next season, Clemson avenged the loss by handing FSU its worst defeat of 1989, 34-23, in Tallahassee...in fact, that is the worst beating FSU has suffered in the last three years...after that game, the Seminoles embarked on a 14-game winning streak that stretched into the 1990 season...it is one of only two Florida State losses at home in the last 18 games...Florida State leads the all-time series between these teams 3-2...Clemson is one of the few teams with a winning record against Bobby Bowden...the

Tigers have beaten Bowden's FSU teams twice in three meetings, including a 15-12 win in Tallahassee in 1976...the Seminoles are a perfect 2-0 at Tiger Stadium...this game is already scheduled for national television with ESPN airing the rare night contest from Clemson...Tiger quarterbacks coach Rick Stockstill graduated from Florida State and was the Seminoles' starting signal-caller in 1980 and '81...Seminoles defensive coordinator Mickey Andrews held the same post at Clemson from 1977-80...FSU tight end Brad Lundstrom's brother, Jay, played on CU's 1981 national championship team.

### Game Notes

Surprisingly, Florida State has played N.C. State more than any other Atlantic Coast Conference opponent...FSU owns an 8-4 lead in the all-time series, which lasted from 1952-69...the Seminoles are 3-2 in games played in Raleigh...N.C. State was the first current ACC school the Seminoles ever played...Florida State also earned its first win over an ACC team in 1952 against the Wolfpack...Bobby Bowden is 1-1 against N.C. State from his days at West Virginia...the last meeting between the teams came in Tallahassee in 1969, with Florida State taking a 33-22 win...five of the 12 games have been low-scoring shutouts...this game will mark a homecoming for FSU Assistant Head Coach Chuck Amato, a 1969 graduate of N.C. State...Amato was a three-year letterman in football and wrestling for the Wolfpack and claimed a pair of ACC wrestling titles...he also coached at the school for 12 years, beginning as a student assistant in 1968 and working his way up to defensive coordinator from 1974-80...the Wolfpack is one of six 1991 bowl teams on the Seminoles' 1992 schedule...in consecutive weeks, Florida State takes on last year's first and second place ACC teams on the road.

### Game Notes

The Demon Deacons will likely be welcomed to Tallahassee by a sellout crowd in Doak Campbell Stadium as this game falls on Parents' Weekend, annually one of the top draws on the Seminole schedule... Wake Forest all-star tight end John Henry Mills is a native of Tallahassee who played high school football at Godby and works out at FSU during the summer... he was a prep teammate of Seminoles Steve Gilmer and Eric Turrall... at just 3,500 students, Wake Forest is the smallest school in the conference and has one of the smallest enrollments in Division IA... the Seminoles hold a 7-2-1 lead in the all-time series with Wake Forest... the two teams tied 14-all in their first meeting in 1956... Wake won the last meeting, 9-7, in Winston-Salem in 1973... that was also the only game in the series played at Wake Forest... four times between 1956 and '68, the Demon Deacons were FSU's homecoming opponent... in FSU's 42-24 victory over Wake Forest in 1968, Seminole All-American Ron Sellers set four records that still stand today when he caught five touchdown passes, scored 50 points and totalled 260 yards receiving.

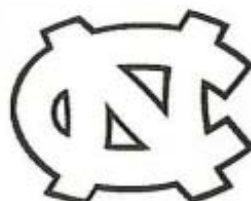

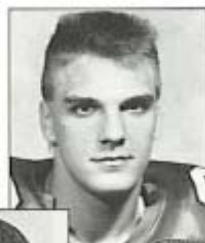

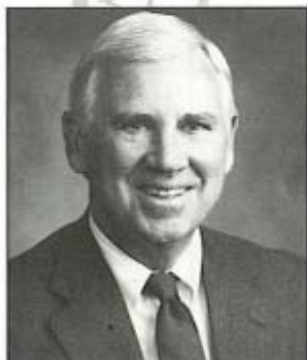
# ATLANTIC COAST Conference

## THE TRADITION

■ Consistency. It's the mark of true excellence in any endeavor.

However, in the world of intercollegiate athletics today, competition has become so balanced and so competitive, that it is virtually impossible to maintain a high level of consistency.

Yet the Atlantic Coast Conference has defied the odds. Now in its 40th year of competition, the ACC has long enjoyed a reputation as one of the strongest and most competitive intercollegiate conferences in the nation. That is not mere conjecture,

the numbers support it.

Since the league's inception in 1953, Atlantic Coast Conference schools have captured 43 NCAA and ALAW championships, including 24 in men's competition and 19 in women's. Individually, 72 men and 22 women have earned the coveted title of NCAA champion.

On the gridiron, Maryland in 1953, Clemson in 1981 and Georgia Tech in 1991 were acclaimed national champions.

If success is best measured in wins and losses, then the ACC has proven itself among the elite in Division 1-A football. The nine ACC teams are a combined 64-58-5 (.532) in bowl games - a winning percentage second only to the PAC-10's .555 success rate.

Georgia Tech, with a 17-8 (.680) postseason mark, is No. 1

among Division 1-A teams in bowl winning percentage. The Yellow Jackets lead a list of three ACC programs that rank as one of the top seven bowl teams of all-time. Clemson is sixth with an 11-7 (.611) record and Florida State is seventh at 11-7-2 (.600).

The ACC also stands at the forefront of intercollegiate athletics in terms of academic accomplishments of its student-athletes. Nowhere is that accomplishment better reflected than in the CFA Academic Achievement Award, which is given annually to the CFA member institution with the highest graduation rate among members of its football team. Six times over the past 12 years, an ACC school has claimed the award. Since 1952, 39 ACC football players have earned first-team Academic All-America honors 44 times.

## THE CHAMPIONSHIPS

■ The conference currently conducts championship competition in 23 sports, including 12 for men and 11 for women.

The first ACC championship was held in swimming on February 25, 1954, while the league's inaugural basketball tournament took place March 4-6, 1954, at North Carolina State, drawing 36,000 fans over three days.

The 12 championship sports for men currently include football, cross country, soccer, basketball, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, wrestling, baseball, tennis, golf and lacrosse.

Women's sports were initiated in 1977 with the first championship held in tennis at Wake Forest University. Conference championships for women are currently conducted in cross country, volleyball, field hockey, soccer, basketball, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, tennis, golf and softball.

## 1991-92 IN REVIEW

■ The ACC enjoyed another productive year in 1991-92 as conference teams captured four national championships, earned two berths in the combined "Final Fours" of the men's

and women's basketball tournaments and won over 70 percent of their games against non-conference opponents in all sports.

Duke made it two straight men's basketball crowns, defeating Michigan 71-51 in the title game. The Blue Devils maintained a No. 1 national ranking throughout the course of the season en route to a 34-2 record.

Virginia's men's soccer team claimed its second national title in three years and the ACC's fifth in eight years, knocking off Santa Clara via penalty kicks.

On the women's side of the ledger, North Carolina once again brought home the NCAA championship trophy in women's soccer, defeating Wisconsin 3-1 in the final match. The Tar Heels capped off a perfect 24-0 season by winning their sixth straight title and ninth overall.

The Maryland women's lacrosse team, after finishing second for the past two years, garnered the ACC's fourth and last crown of the year. The Terrapins, who lost to Virginia in last year's final and to Harvard in 1990, rallied from a three-goal deficit in the second half to post an 11-10 victory over Harvard.

In conference competition, North Carolina led all schools by winning an all-time high nine ACC championships. N.C. State was second with four league crowns, followed by Clemson and Duke with three apiece. Virginia captured two titles and Georgia Tech and Florida State claimed one each.
