## Credential Requests

All requests for working press, radio, television, photography or scouting credentials should be directed to Football Media Relations Director Donna Turner no later than one week prior to the game. Requests for season credentials should be made at least two weeks prior to the first game.

Space for the working press, radio and television is allocated by the FSU Sports Information Office.

Florida State's press box is located on the west side of Doak Campbell Stadium with elevator service to all levels. Media representatives should enter through the press gate, located next to the elevator. The Will Call booth, where media can pick up credentials on game days, is located outside the gate at the base of the elevator. Will Call credentials will also be available in the Sports Information Office on Fridays prior to home games.

## Press Policies

Working press will be admitted to Level 5, where approximately 90 seats are available. Credentials are issued by FSU according to the following criteria:

1. Local newspapers, wire services, national publications, newspapers from opponents' area, and student newspapers from FSU and opponents' schools.
2. Other daily newspapers with preference to those which regularly cover FSU.
3. Radio and television personnel not broadcasting, but considered reporting (seats may be provided in the stands and locker room access granted).
4. Non-daily newspapers, with preference to those which regularly cover FSU.
5. Scouts.

Freelance and/or non-daily writers may be asked to produce copies of actual publications in which their work has appeared. In some cases, these materials will be required as verification of the writers' status. Your cooperation and understanding is requested in such instances.

## Media Headquarters

The official FSU media headquarters hotel for the 1993 home football season is the Ramada Inn - North. It is located at North Monroe Street (U.S. 27 North) and I-10. Most media functions, including the Sunday morning "Breakfast with Bobby," will be held there.

The Florida State University Sports Information Office has a number of rooms set aside for accredited media representatives during home game weekends. Contact Debbie Crews of the Sports Information Office (904/644-1402) to make arrangements for these rooms. Priority is determined in the same manner spelled out above under "Press Policies."

*[SPECIAL NOTE — Media reservations for the Ramada Inn - North on home game weekends will require a TWO NIGHT MINIMUM. There will be no exceptions. The 1993 rate is \$72 per night on football weekends. When reserving a room through FSU, it will be necessary to give us a credit card number to guarantee the room.]*

Florida State also maintains a minimal number of rooms for the media at the team headquarters for all road games. Check with Crews for information on availability of these rooms.

## Radio-TV

The sixth level of the press box is designated for use by radio and television broadcasting crews and home and visiting coaches. Each booth is fully enclosed and sound proof.

## Photographers

Only accredited photographers and those shooting for the FSU Sports Information Office will be issued working credentials.

Florida State reserves the right to admit only those photographers deemed to be on the premises for legitimate media purposes. All photographers working FSU games should be prepared to show a media ID card and equipment designed to photograph major college football.

Florida State uses a double photo line system on its sidelines. Only those photographers actually shooting the game will be allowed on the "front" line. These shooters will be given photo armbands upon check-in to allow them front line access. All other photo personnel will be required to stay behind a second line so as not to obstruct the view of the shooters. This would include grips, runners and sideline reporters. Violation of the double-line system will result in removal from the sideline. No media personnel are allowed in the team area of the sidelines at any time during a game. They must shoot in designated areas only.

The press box catwalk, or photo deck, offers an unobstructed view for TV and video cameras. Television crews may be assigned space in that area upon request. Still photographers may have access to the sidelines only. Those holding a still photography credential should report to the gate specified on the pass, where they will be issued an armband, rosters and a pre-game meal. A photographers' lounge area with tables and chairs is available. Late-arriving photographers must check in on the field with a member of the Sports Information staff. The only access to the field is through the gate at the northwest (flagpole) corner of the stadium.

Special requests for photographers whose assignments warrant shooting from the photo deck may be made to Turner.

## Video Services

Florida State's Sports Information Office has the ability to assist networks and television stations by providing video

services through Seminole Productions, Inc. The FSU athletic department has a working relationship with SPI and its general manager, Mark Rodin, whose office is located in the Moore Athletic Center. Seminole Productions has editing and studio facilities on site and can produce virtually any material upon request. In most cases, there will be a nominal fee charged for these services. Please call Rodin at 644-0019 to arrange for these services.

## Press Parking

Once again, parking is extremely limited in 1993 and passes will be issued on a priority basis within the same guidelines as working credentials.

## Statistical Services

Play-by-play, halftime and complete final statistics will be provided. Post-game quotes from FSU Head Coach Bobby Bowden, selected players and the visiting coach will be distributed after the game.

## Refreshments

A pre-game meal will be served on Level 6 of the press box beginning approximately two hours before kickoff. Refreshments will be available throughout the game.

## Telephones

Telephone service should be secured directly through the Florida State University Office of Telecommunications at 904/644-2414. Have them contact the Sports Information Office for location. The Telecommunications Office can provide both lines and phones. When contacting them, please specify the type of line you need (i.e. touchtone, etc.).

## Fax Service

An independent fax service will be available for each game with a nominal fee charged. Please contact a member of the Sports Information Office staff during the game to secure post-game fax service.

## Mid-Week Interviews

Media interviews with all FSU players should be arranged through the Sports Information Office. For phone interviews, a staff member will fill out a card asking the player to return the

call. Please give one day advance notice when requesting players for mid-week interviews. All player calls to the media will be made collect.

Seminole players are available to the media on a daily basis during the lunch hours and/or after practice in the atrium area of the Moore Athletic Center. Contact the Sports Information staff member working lunch and practice with your request. Advance notice is helpful in setting up face-to-face interviews to ensure that the player requested will be present that day.

Anyone wishing to schedule an interview with Head Coach Bobby Bowden should contact his assistant, Sue Hall, at 904/644-0097.

### ACC Faxback

Florida State no longer mails its football releases each week. Instead, all Florida State football releases, including the daily practice trainer, are available on the ACC Faxback.

The Faxback gives media the capability to request and receive the releases from the

conference office or any Atlantic Coast Conference school, including Florida State, simply by dialing a phone number from a fax machine. The ACC Faxback gives the media 24-hour access to the latest press releases and information.

Use of the Faxback is limited to members of the media ONLY. To get the Faxback phone and code numbers, contact the ACC Media Relations Office (919/854-8787) or the Florida State Sports Information Office.

### ACC Teleconference

Each Wednesday during the 1993 football season, Bowden will be available to the media on the ACC football teleconference call, along with all eight other league coaches. Bowden will be on the call from 11:20-11:30 a.m. every Wednesday from Sept. 1 through Nov. 17. Contact the FSU Sports Information Office or the Atlantic Coast Conference Office to get the number for the call, as well as a complete listing of the coaches and times.

This is the only weekly conference call Coach Bowden will conduct in 1993.

### ACC Satellite Feed

Video highlights and taped interviews with Florida State players and coaches can be obtained each week via an ACC satellite feed put up by JP Sports. The feed, which will contain at least six minutes of Florida State information, will run weekly beginning the first week in September. Contact FSU or the ACC to get the coordinates and time for the feed.

### Breakfast With Bobby

Following each Seminole home game, Head Coach Bobby Bowden will join the media Sunday morning at 8:30 a.m. for a continental breakfast, followed by a question and answer session. Breakfast with Bobby will be held at the Ramada Inn North, FSU's media hotel.

### Conference Call

On road game weekends, media may talk to Bowden via a Sunday conference call. Contact a member of the Sports Information Office during the previous day's game for further information.

### Road Game Credentials

Writers covering Florida State on a regular basis may make requests for road credentials with the opponent school or with the FSU Sports Information Office by Monday of game week.

# POST-GAME INTERVIEW POLICY

Florida State University's athletic staff is well aware of the importance of media coverage and is briefed continually on the role of the media insofar as it interacts with their respective duties. At no time is this cooperation more important than in the post-game interview and locker room procedures. To ensure the most workable situation for members of the media and for the FSU staff, the following procedures must be observed:

**1** Entrance to the Florida State locker room can be made *only* through the second floor interview room. All members of the media will be directed to this room by the FSU Sports Information staff immediately at the conclusion of the game. It is helpful if all media personnel assemble at the tunnel entrance in the north end zone following the conclusion of the game. You will not be allowed access to the locker room through the player entrance, so follow closely.

Elevators will begin leaving for the field with approximately eight minutes left in the fourth quarter. Getting to the field becomes much more difficult if reporters wait until after the game has ended to attempt to reach the field. The only entrance to the field is at the northwest (flagpole) corner of the end zone, where a member of the Sports Information staff will let those holding press passes in the gate.

**2** Florida State Coach Bobby Bowden will be brought directly to the interview room as soon as he dismisses the team and declares the locker room open.

**3** When Coach Bowden makes his appearance in the interview room, members of the media who wish to go to the locker room will be shown the proper route. Down one flight of stairs leads directly into the player dressing area.

**4** FLORIDA STATE'S LOCKER ROOM IS OPEN TO ALL MEDIA, MALE AND FEMALE. HOWEVER, IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT FEMALE REPORTERS INFORM FSU SPORTS INFORMATION PERSONNEL DURING THE GAME THAT THEY WILL NEED LOCKER ROOM ACCESS. (FSU players have been assured they will be told on a game-by-game basis whether there will be female reporters in the locker room—a courtesy we feel must be extended.)

**5** Exit from the locker room and access back to the press box can be made through the player entrance to the stadium.

Each visiting team will set its own post-game interview policy, which will be announced on the inside public address system in the fourth quarter. Check with the opposing team's sports information personnel in

the press box if you have any other questions.

There is an interview room outside the visitors locker room, where the visiting head coach and/or players may be brought for interviews following the game. The visiting team locker room and interview area is located through the gate at the southeast corner of the field.

It is our desire at Florida State to make the post-game procedure as painless as possible for both the media and our staff. Remember, both groups have important tasks and are under extreme pressure.

The Florida State Athletic Department cannot and will not be responsible for problems incurred by any member of the media not following the above procedures. Security personnel will facilitate only those following the proper guidelines. However, if you encounter a problem while following this procedure, please inform a Sports Information staff member immediately.

### How to use the ACC Faxback:

ACC standings and statistics will be updated by no later than 5 p.m. each Monday during the course of the 1993 season. Each school will also update its respective release by 5 p.m.

Simply dial the Faxback phone number from your fax phone. You will be instructed on how to retrieve the information. Connect your fax at the tone, and the requested information will start transmitting to your machine. The ACC will not release this phone number except to certified media sources. Contact the ACC Media Relations Department at 919/854-8787, or fax in your request to 919/854-8797.

In 1993, the network has expanded to include stations in North and South Carolina, as well as continuing its strong presence in Georgia, Alabama and Florida.

The Seminole Sports Network is owned and operated by Host Communications, Inc., one of the nation's leaders in collegiate sports broadcasting. Florida State joined forces with the Lexington, Ky. based company to establish a comprehensive marketing opportunity which includes radio, television, print and corporate sponsorship components.

In addition to Florida State, Host owns the rights to the networks of other outstanding schools like Texas, Auburn, Kentucky, Tennessee, South Carolina, Mississippi State and LSU. Host has a long-term broadcast and print relationship with the National Collegiate Athletic Association.

The Seminole Sports Football Network will reach into nearly 60 markets in 1993, including some of the largest markets in the nation like Atlanta, Miami and Orlando. In Tallahassee, all the Seminole football action can be heard on flagship station WTNT-FM (94.9).

Florida State's professional broadcast crew is known as one of the best in the nation as they provide insight and entertainment, as well as detailed and expert play-by-play.

The broadcast team features award-winning play-by-play announcer Gene Deckerhoff, a 15-year veteran of the FSU radio network, and color analyst Vic Prinzi, who begins his 12th year in that role in 1993. They are joined for portions of the pre- and post-game shows by Tallahassee television sportscaster John Peterson.

After the game, Florida State Assistant Athletic Director for Communications Wayne Hogan takes over to host the popular "Seminole Calls" call-in show.

Deckerhoff is nationally known as one of the finest football and basketball announcers in the South. The "Voice of the Seminoles" for the past 15 years, he is a seven-time Florida Sportscaster of the Year. In 13 of the past 14 years, Deckerhoff has been named the best college and pro football play-by-play announcer in the state by the Florida Sportscasters Association.

A native of Jacksonville, Fla., Deckerhoff also serves as the play-by-play announcer for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers of the NFL, making for some very busy fall weekends. Deckerhoff is also the producer and co-host of "The Bobby Bowden Show", and co-

host of Bowden's weekly call-in radio show. He runs Gene Deckerhoff Productions, a firm specializing in sports broadcasting and the production of radio and television commercials.

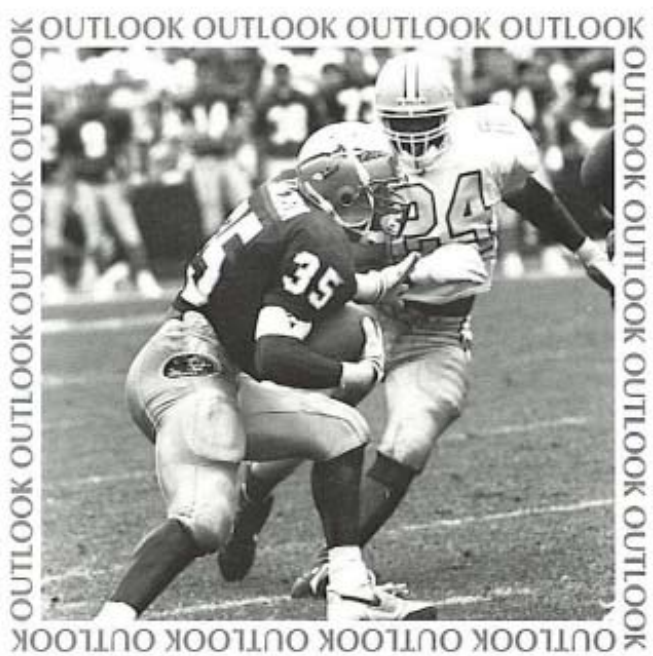

Florida State's game-day broadcasts begin 90 minutes prior to every kickoff on the stations listed below.

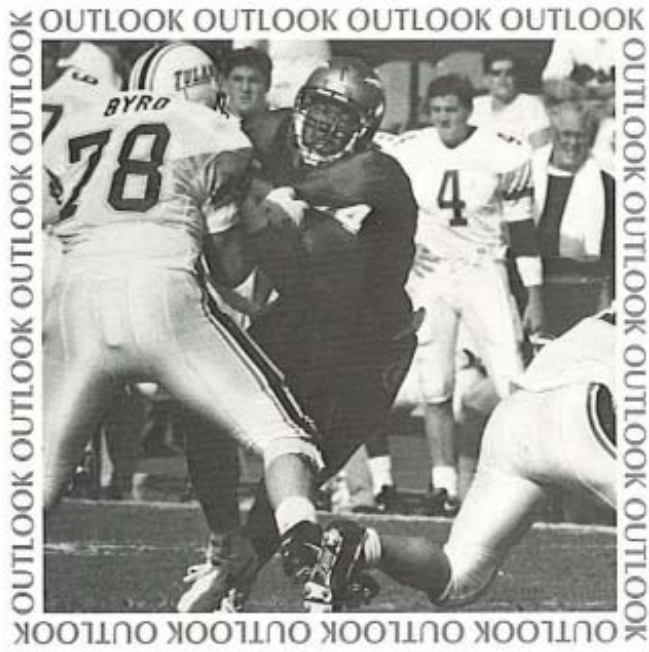

# 1993 OUTLOOK GREAT EXPECTATIONS

How can you tell when a college football program has reached the top?

A reserved spot in the nation's Top 10?

A string of All-Americans and national award winners?

An annual trip to a New Year's Day Bowl?

A legendary coach?

A preseason No. 1 ranking?

Florida State has all of the above. And another element that comes with success — high expectations.

"We've about reached the point where we have become victims of our own success," said Florida State Head Coach Bobby Bowden, who begins his 18th season in Tallahassee in 1993. "Everyone starts saying, 'national championship, national championship, national championship.' What the coaches and players must do is be realistic, be honest and have a good time. We are where we want to be, always mentioned at the top, and we should enjoy it."

In 1993, the Seminoles get to "enjoy" their third preseason No. 1 ranking. Florida State also opened the 1988 and '91 seasons at the top.

"Naturally, being No. 1 puts more pressure on you," Bowden said. "But we've been there

before. Everyone will be gunning for us, we know that."

The challenges mount for the 1993 FSU team, beginning with the schedule. First there's the Atlantic Coast Conference, quickly becoming recognized as one of the toughest leagues in the nation. Add the toughest non-conference line-up in the country in Miami, Notre Dame and Florida, all preseason Top 10 choices. Just for good measure, throw in an August 28th date against Kansas in the Kickoff Classic. Seven teams on FSU's '93 schedule finished in the Top 25 a year ago, and the same number played in bowl games.

"We've got our work cut out for us," Bowden said. "We've got a schedule as challenging as anybody in the country. Just look at those non-conference opponents. We've got three of the Top 10 teams in the nation right there. And the ACC, top to bottom is as tough as any league in the nation. I learned that last year."

Entering 1993, all the talk is about the Seminoles' powerhouse offense. But first priority is the FSU defense, where coordinator Mickey Andrews and his defensive cohorts must find replacements for six 1992 starters.

Those six include inside linebacker Marvin Jones, who won the Butkus and Lombardi Awards and was a consensus All-American a year ago. He left early for the NFL, where he became the highest Seminole draft choice ever. Also gone are Dan Footman, Carl Simpson and Reggie Freeman, three quarters of the Seminoles' front four in '92. All were second round picks in last spring's NFL draft. Starting safeties John Davis and Leon Fowler, and key reserves Lavon Brown, Ed Clark, Tommy Henry and Sterling Palmer must also be replaced.

"No question there are some holes to fill, especially on defense," Bowden said. "But we saw some youngsters step up last spring, and if we get John Nance back, that will give us some experience up front."

"This is a year when you're glad that Mickey has played all those young guys in key situations. Now, when it's their

turn to start, they know what to do."

Up front, Florida State will look to sophomore Derrick Alexander, FSU's top newcomer on defense a year ago, and senior Toddrick McIntosh, the lone holdover from last year's starting front. McIntosh played noseguard in 1992, but moves back to his more natural position of defensive end this spring. If Nance is cleared to return after having a tumor removed from his neck, the noseguard spot is his.

The rest of the talent on the defensive front is young, like freshman noseguard Connell Spain, and/or inexperienced, like spring game sensation Gerald Owens, and sophomore Tyrant Marion.

At inside linebacker, Ken Alexander, an Academic All-America hopeful who is one of four graduate students on the 1993 roster, moves into Jones' spot as the strong side starter. He will be challenged by fellow senior Alonzo Horner, who claimed the job when Alexander missed spring practice with mononucleosis.

The weak side back-up a year ago, sophomore Todd Rebol, will be the top candidate to start there this year. He was the only true freshman to letter on defense in 1992. A pair of redshirt freshmen, Travis Sherman and Henri Crockett also enter the mix for the first time this fall. One of FSU's impressive new signees could step in to earn playing time here, too.

Sophomore Devin Bush and senior Mack Knight, back from academic exile, look to replace the Davis/Brown duo at strong safety. Bush saw considerable action as the number three strong safety a year ago to prepare for a starting role in '93.



Senior Corey Fuller will challenge Clifton Abraham for starting duties at right cornerback again in 1993. The two join with Corey Sawyer to give the Seminoles three of the top corners in the nation.



As a true freshman in 1992, weak side linebacker Todd Rebol made 26 tackles. He is the top candidate to start at the position this year.

At free safety, junior Steve Gilmer and senior Richard Coes get their chances to replace three-year starter Leon Fowler. Gilmer won the job during spring drills, but injured his knee in the spring game and is coming off arthroscopic knee surgery. Freshmen, both redshirt and new, could work into the mix at either safety position.

One of the strengths of the '93 Florida State defense will be at cornerback, where juniors Corey Sawyer and Clifton Abraham and senior Corey Fuller return. Sawyer ranked second in the country with seven interceptions last season, earning second team All-America status.

Abraham, Sawyer's less-heralded partner, made just as many big plays in 1992. The Texas native broke up nine passes, made three interceptions, blocked two punts, recovered two fumbles, caused two more and scored two touchdowns during a sensational sophomore year. Both will vie for all-star honors in 1993, but also will be pushed for playing time by Fuller, FSU's most physical

cornerback.

Another "can't miss" all-star on the defensive side is bandit outside linebacker Derrick Brooks, who ranked second behind only Jones in tackles last year. The most valuable player of spring practice in 1993, he is a multi-dimensional defender with speed, instincts and big-hitting ability. FSU's Top Conditioned Athlete, he gives the Seminole linebacking corps another potential All-American.

Three players with game experience will spell Brooks and fill the other outside linebacking position in 1993. Top candidates to replace the duo of Freeman and Palmer are juniors James Roberson, Dulack Guerrier and Chris Cowart. Roberson led the group as spring practice concluded.

"I like the players we have coming back on defense," Bowden said. "We'll have to see if they can perform as well as the group before did. They have the talent."

There are fewer questions on the other side of the ball, where nine starters and a host of talented back-ups return. The

most well-known returnee — quarterback Charlie Ward, of course, Florida State's quarterback/point guard is back after undergoing surgery on his left (non-throwing) shoulder during the off-season. Ward suffered a subluxation (partial dislocation) of the shoulder during basketball season, and surgery was put off while he helped the Seminole basketball team to the Elite Eight. By June, Ward was throwing again, and showing no ill effects of the injury.

"I expect him to come back good as new," Bowden said. "It's funny that he kept hurting that thing playing basketball, when he never had a problem during football. Of course, he didn't get caught too much playing football."

"To me, Charlie is like a vapor. Just when you think you see him, and can reach out and grab him, he's gone."

After spending the first half of the 1992 season trying to adjust Ward to fit the Florida State offense, Bowden and the FSU offensive coaches spent the final half adjusting the offense to fit Ward, with impressive results. In the Fast Break Offense, which

featured Ward working out of the shotgun and without a huddle, the Seminoles were nearly unstoppable. By the end of the year, Ward had broken the Florida State single game and single season total offense records, earned the Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Year award and was a third team All-American.

"Charlie got off to a slow start last year," Bowden said. "But remember, that was his first time starting. Now, he's got a year under his belt. I'm almost scared to say it, but he could be even better."

With Ward out of spring practice, sophomore Danny Kanell, the No. 2 QB a year ago, and transfer Jon Stark waged a battle for the back-up job. Kanell won it with a solid performance in the spring game.

Ward and his fellow quarterbacks will work behind one of the best young lines in college football, even though the only starters missing from the 1992 offense are linemen, split tackle Robert Stevenson, a four-year starter, and center Robbie Baker.

After experimenting with several players at Stevenson's spot last spring, coaches moved sophomore Juan Laureano over from the tight tackle position he shared with Marvin Ferrell last year. Other candidates for playing time there include sophomore Forrest Conoly, a 6-7, 320-pound giant, sophomore Jesus Hernandez, who came to FSU as a walk-on, and redshirt freshman Todd Fordham.

"At center, we feel like we have a good one with experience coming back in Clay Shiver," Bowden said. "Rob (Stevenson) was a key loss. Playing that open (split) side requires a special guy."

Shiver, a sophomore, started five games and split time with Baker a year ago, allowing only one-half sack on the year. He joins returning guards Patrick McNeil and Lewis Tyre to give Florida State strength up the middle. As a sophomore, McNeil earned second team All-ACC honors, led FSU in intimidation blocks and did not give up a sack while playing more snaps than any other lineman.

Tyre started every game at split guard and was selected to *Football News*' Freshman All-America squad. Ferrell, the only senior on the offensive line, takes over duties as the full-time starter at tight tackle. He is coming off an excellent spring in which he began to make a bid for all-star honors.

At tight end, senior Lonnie Johnson improves every year, giving Florida State ability and experience at the position. Junior Billy Glenn seemed to find his niche as a tight end last season, and is the back-up entering fall drills. A pair of redshirt freshmen, Terry Davis and Kamari Charlton made bids for playing time last spring.

The FSU running game looks to be in good hands in 1993 as a quartet of tailbacks and two fullbacks return. At tailback, senior Sean Jackson and junior Tiger McMillon split duties last year, combining for over 1,000 yards and seven touchdowns while averaging over five yards a carry.

Sophomore Marquette Smith, who volunteered for a redshirt season in 1992, returns along with senior Clyde Allen.

Fiery junior William Floyd was one of the most valuable members of the Seminole offense a year ago with his blocking, rushing and receiving skills. A superb athlete, he's back to start at fullback with potential for an attention-grabbing season. Zack Crockett plays behind Floyd. Newcomer Clarence "Pooh Bear" Williams is a candidate for playing time here in his initial season.

Florida State's no-huddle style in the Fast Break placed more pressure on the Seminole wide receivers, with three or four in the game, running all out, on every play. Add redshirt freshman Wayne Messam, sophomore junior college transfer Phillip Riley, and perhaps even one of the superb true freshmen signees to the 1993 receiving corps, and the Seminoles look solid here.

The depth starts with a sophomore, Tamarick Vanover, and continues with juniors Kez McCorvey and Omar Ellison, and seniors Matt Frier and Kevin Knox. Vanover, FSU's leading

receiver and the ACC Rookie of the Year in 1992, made several All-America teams as a freshman. McCorvey led the Seminoles with six TD catches, while only a severe shoulder separation that forced him to miss five games prevented Frier from having his best season ever.

"We feel pretty good about our skill people on offense," Bowden said. "We've got just about everybody back and they have a lot of talent, and a lot of experience. We're anxious to work some more on this offense because it kind of took us by surprise last year."

As usual, the kicking game provides plenty of questions. Punter John Wimberly has departed, leaving redshirt freshman Sean Liss and sophomore Scott Holmes to vie for the job.

One of the most-heralded freshmen in the country in 1993, kicker Scott Bentley enters with a "leg-up" on the starting kicking position, but must withstand a challenge from returnee Dan Mowrey to earn the full-time job.

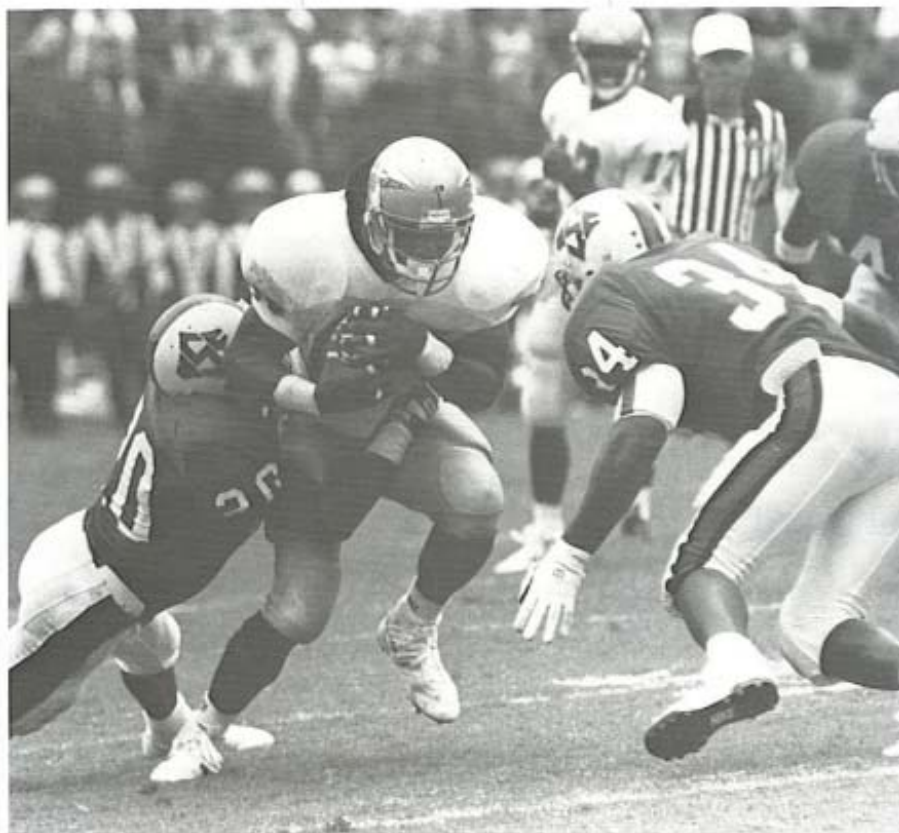
On the return side of the special teams, Florida State is coming off one of its best years ever. Punt returner Sawyer and kickoff return men McMillon and

Vanover are all back. The Seminoles boasted the number one kickoff return team in the nation last year, and scored three times off the kickoff and twice on punt returns.

Overall, Bowden delivers a "yes...but" message.

"Number one, the boys that are returning are talented, there's no question about that," he said. "We also have some with experience, which is encouraging. I feel better about the depth after what I saw in spring, but those players still need experience. With our schedule, you sure hope that comes quick."

While Bowden sounds a cautious note, expectations remain high. Perhaps the only way to know you've reached the top is AFTER you become a victim of your own success. When people nationwide — sportswriters, fans, experts — expect nothing less than a national championship.
