GAME NOTES

Florida State opens the year in a preseason game for the second time in three years...the Seminoles faced Brigham Young in the 1991 Pigskin Classic and came away with a 44-28 win...Florida State enters the contest with its third preseason number one ranking...FSU also opened the 1988 and 1991 seasons at the top...this is the fourth time in five years an ACC team has appeared in the Kickoff Classic...Kansas and Florida State have played each other six times with the Seminoles holding a 4-2 series advantage...Bobby Bowden is 2-0 against the Jayhawks...FSU defensive back Clifton Abraham and KU wide receiver Kiley Brown hail from the same high school, D.W. Carter in Dallas, Texas...Kansas is FSU's second consecutive Big Eight opponent as the Tribe's last action was vs. Nebraska in the Orange Bowl...in 46 seasons of football, Florida State is 32-14 in season openers...under Bobby Bowden, FSU is 14-3 in first games and has won three straight...this is the only game Florida State will play on artificial turf this season...the Seminoles are 27-11 on artificial surfaces during the Bowden Era and have won 13 straight turf games.

GAME NOTES

Florida State begins defense of its Atlantic Coast Conference crown at Duke...the Seminoles will play in Wallace Wade Stadium for the first time...Leon Fowler scored FSU's first points ever in ACC competition last year vs. Duke, when he picked off a Steve Prince pass and returned it 94 yards for a touchdown...his score was the longest interception return of the year and the fourth longest in school history...last year's game featured a high flying aerial assault...the longest pass play by an opponent and FSU's longest pass play of 1992 occurred in the season-opening game...Bobby Bowden earned his first career victory versus Duke with a 48-21 win last year...Bowden lost two games to the Blue Devils as the head coach at West Virginia...Duke and Florida State will open conference play against one another through the 1995 season...these two teams boasted the top kickoff return squads in the ACC a year ago...Florida State has not opened a year with two straight road games since 1985.

GAME NOTES

The first game in new, expanded Doak Campbell Stadium is expected to bring record crowds for the 1993 home opener... expansion has added exactly 12,070 seats to the stadium since the start of the 1992 season... the last time Clemson travelled to Tallahassee, the Tigers handed Florida State a 34-23 loss in 1989... that is the worst beating FSU has suffered in the last four years... it is one of only two Florida State losses at home in its last 24 games... Seminole victories over Clemson in 1988 and 1992 were decided in the last few minutes of the games... in 1988, Florida State beat the Tigers on a field goal set up by the infamous "puntooskie" play... last season, Charlie Ward engineered a late comeback drive that lifted FSU to a 24-20 victory... Florida State leads the all-time series between the two teams, 4-2... with last year's win, Bobby Bowden evened his record against the Tigers at 2-2... Clemson quarterback coach Rick Stockstill graduated from Florida State and was the Seminoles' starting signal-caller in 1980 and '81... FSU defensive coordinator Mickey Andrews held the same post at Clemson from 1977-1980.

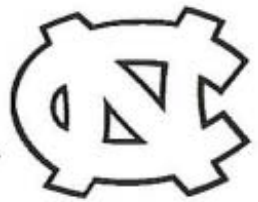

GAME NOTES

North Carolina is one of seven 1992 bowl teams on the Seminole schedule this year...FSU is 1-0 in Chapel Hill with a 20-10 win in 1985...FSU holds a 3-0-1 advantage over the Tar Heels all-time...the two teams tied 10-10 in Tallahassee in 1986 for the last of Bobby Bowden's three career ties...last season the Tar Heels limited Charlie Ward to a season-low 96 yards of total offense...it was one of only two games in which Ward did not throw a touchdown pass...the 1992 game featured FSU's longest punt return of the year...Corey Sawyer stung North Carolina with a 74-yard return for a touchdown...Randall Felton's 17-yard punt return was the longest against Florida State all season...North Carolina is one of three teams on the FSU schedule that returns its starting quarterback this season...Tar Heel Head Coach Mack Brown is a graduate of Florida State...Brown was a two-year letterwinner for the Seminoles in 1972-73 under coach Larry Jones...as a junior running back at FSU in 1972, Brown rushed 31 times for 98 yards and caught 10 passes for 76 yards.

GAME NOTES

Florida State notched its first win in nine tries against Georgia Tech with a come-from-behind victory at Bobby Dodd Stadium last season...the Seminoles are 1-7-1 all-time versus the Yellow Jackets...Georgia Tech won all seven games played between the teams from 1952-75...all nine previous meetings were held in Atlanta...when the Seminoles tallied 29 points against Tech last season, it marked the first time Florida State ever scored more than 14 points vs. the Yellow Jackets...last year's comeback victory proved pivotal to FSU's 1992 success...during the Tribe's fourth-quarter rally, Charlie Ward worked primarily out of the shotgun formation...in the next five games, the offensive set became the staple of FSU's offense...Derrick Brooks recorded a Florida State season high 18 tackles against Georgia Tech last year...after the game, Georgia Tech went on a losing skid, dropping four of its last five games while FSU went undefeated...Seminoles quarterback coach Mark Richt served as offensive coordinator under current Tech head coach Bill Lewis at East Carolina in 1969.

State athlete (volleyball) and alumnus.
