The University Center construction timetable:

▼ September 1993: "Bowling in" of south end zone, providing 12,000 new seats, plus rest rooms and concessions.

▼ September/October 1993: Reconfiguration of Stadium Drive and Chieftan Way.

▼ July 1994: Completion of east side offices and skyboxes. Among those housed in the east side will be the FSU film school, comptroller, financial aid, admissions, registrar and undergraduate studies offices. At least 16 small skyboxes will also be finished.

▼ May 1994: Completion of Daisy Parker Flory addition to Coyle Moore Athletic Center and north end zone reconfiguration.

▼ September 1994: Completion of northwest corner seating section, adding another 2,000 seats and the south end zone building, providing a food court and other features.

▼ 1994-1996: Construction of the west side of the University Center. Among those housed in the west side will be the university's media relations and publications offices, plus the FSU Foundation and Seminole Boosters.

1993 Football Bowl Coalition



The Orange, Sugar, Cotton and Fiesta bowls (Tier One) have joined with the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Big East Football Conference and the University of Notre Dame in a partnership to provide the opportunity for the champions of the ACC and the Big East Football conferences and Notre Dame to appear in one of the aforementioned bowl games each year.

In addition, the ACC and the Big East Football champions are guaranteed a spot in the Orange, Sugar, or Cotton Bowl each year.

The current commitments of the conference champions of the Big Eight to the Orange Bowl, Southeastern to the Sugar Bowl and Southwest to the Cotton Bowl

remain intact, leaving two additional berths open in the four Tier One coalition bowls.

These two spots will be filled from a pool of "at-large" teams which will include the next best team (as selected by the Tier One coalition bowls) from the following five conferences — Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Eight, PAC-10 (whose champion remains committed to the Rose Bowl) and Southwest.

The three at-large teams NOT selected to the Tier One coalition bowls will then be available for selection to the Tier Two bowls (Gator and John Hancock) of the coalition.

The team selection date for all the bowls involved in the coalition (Tier One and Two) will be following the completion of the regular season.

The selection process is as follows:

1. Whenever Notre Dame, the ACC and the Big East Football champions occupy the number one and two rankings in the combined final regular season polls of the Associated Press

and USA Today/CNN Coaches, they must play the national championship game in the Fiesta Bowl.

2. Whenever the number one or two team in the combined final regular season polls of the Associated Press and USA Today/CNN Coaches comes from among the ACC champion, the Big East Football champion or Notre Dame, and the host conference champion from among the Sugar, Cotton or Orange Bowl is ranked number one or two, these teams must play one another in the bowl of the host conference champion.

3. Barring the above circumstances, the Orange, Sugar and Cotton bowls will select first in order of the final combined rankings of their respective host conference champions. Following that selection, the Fiesta Bowl will have two selections from the remaining pool of five teams.

4. Once these selections have been completed, the remaining three "at-large" teams will be

available to the Tier Two bowls. The Gator Bowl selects one team first, and then the two remaining teams will be assigned to the John Hancock Bowl.

5. The ACC and Big East Football champions and Notre Dame have the right to pass a Tier One selection for a higher payout, to avoid a rematch of a regular season game or to avoid playing in a particular bowl game for a third consecutive year.

6. A team may pass a selection to a Tier Two bowl only to avoid a rematch of a regular season game or to avoid playing in a particular bowl game for a third consecutive year.
