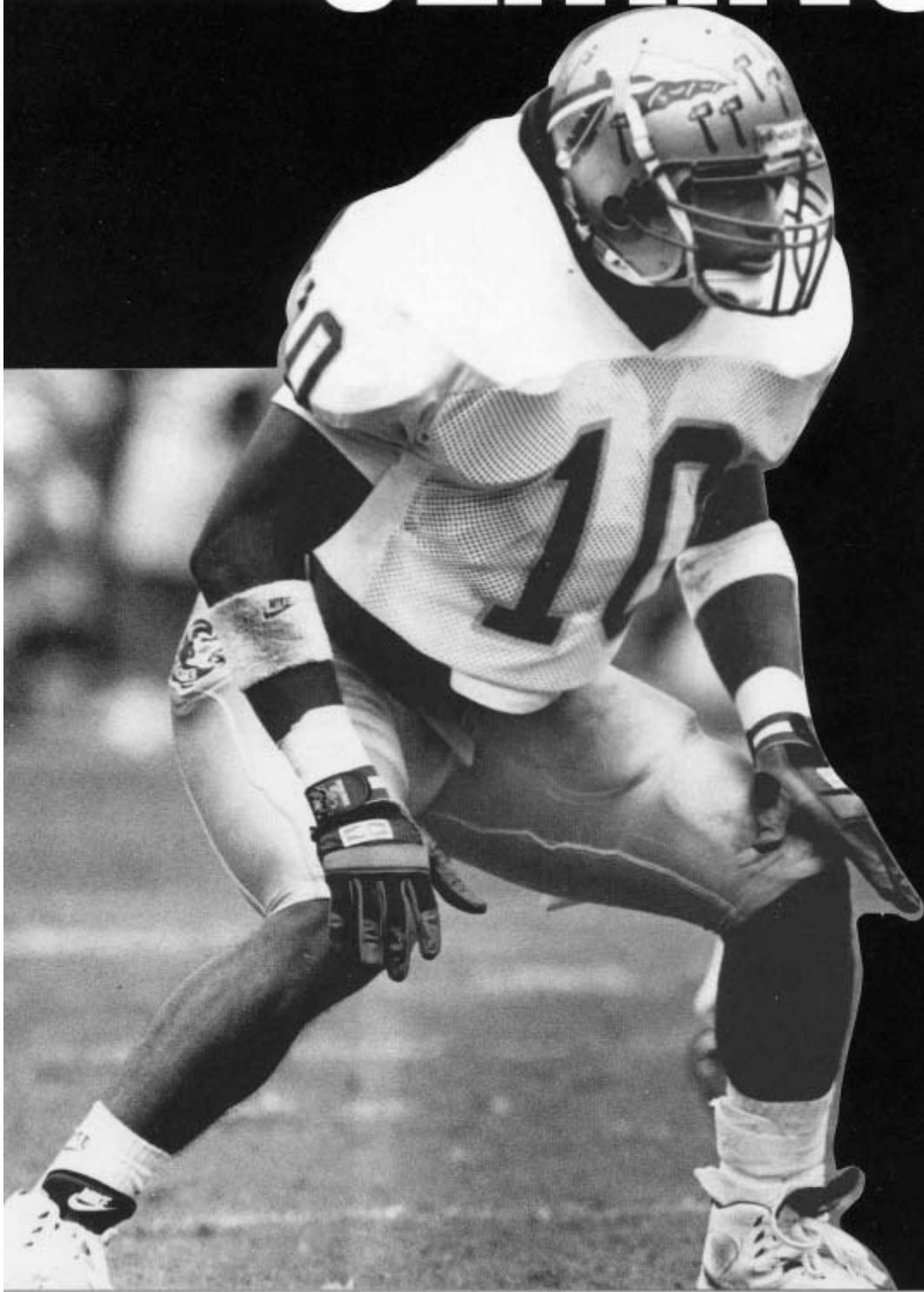

CLIFTON ABRAHAM

CORNERBACK, 5-9, 185, SENIOR
DALLAS, TEXAS (D.W. CARTER HS)



Another in the long tradition of outstanding Seminole cornerbacks...returns for his senior season as a leading candidate for All-America and Thorpe Award honors...after starting at boundary corner the past two years, takes over for Corey Sawyer at field corner in 1994...overshadowed by Sawyer during the past two seasons, but coaches feel he was more consistent and made as many big plays...sound fundamen-

tal player who rarely gets caught out of position...outstanding cover man who can also come up and play the run...hard worker with great practice habits...breaks on the ball well and has fine closing speed...big play maker on the Seminole punt block unit...has scored three touchdowns in his career — two in 1993 — on blocked punts to tie a school record...tallied six career interceptions entering his senior season...received Florida State's Hinesman Award, given annually to the most dominating player during spring drills...**1993:** Started all 13 games at boundary corner for the national champions...selected to the first team All-Atlantic Coast Conference squad...in on 61 tackles — 44 solos and 17 assists — to rank seventh on the team...broke up six passes...returned an interception 29 yards for a touchdown against Wake Forest...scored two more touchdowns, both on recovered blocked punts...leaped over a crowd to collect a blocked punt in the first quarter of the season opener vs. Kansas...scored his second touchdown of the season in similar fashion in a 57-0 blowout of Clemson...led the team in tackles in two games...registered nine stops against Miami, Virginia, and Maryland...also intercepted a pass vs. Nebraska...**1992:** Started nearly every game at right cornerback as a sophomore...in on 48 tackles, 36 solo and 12 assists...broke up nine passes to tie for the team lead...pulled in three interceptions...broke up a season high four passes against Miami...interfered with three more a week later vs. North Carolina...recorded two touchdowns and two interceptions

against Tulane...scored on an 18-yard return of his own blocked punt and added a 32-yard interception return...named ACC defensive back of the week after that performance...also picked off a pass against Virginia...set up an FSU touchdown against Duke with a blocked punt...returned a Clemson fumble 51 yards to set up a Florida State touchdown that gave the Seminoles a 17-13 lead...recovered a fumble at the FSU 22-yard line to thwart a Miami drive...caused two fumbles and made three tackles for loss on the year...**1991:** Saw action in 12 of FSU's 13 games...tallied 10 solo stops on the season...made two tackles for loss...intercepted passes in the Syracuse and Louisville games...also saw action on the punt return squad...blocked a punt against Middle Tennessee State...recovered a fumble in the Cotton Bowl before his hometown fans...**1990:** Redshirted...**High School:** A Parade All-American as a senior...considered one of the top two cornerbacks in

the country...earned 5A all-district and *Dallas Morning News* all-area honors...highly-recruited athlete who made most national All-America teams...chose FSU over Miami, Baylor and Texas A&M...**Personal:** Ran a 4.38 40 during spring drills...has the second-highest vertical jump on the team at 39 inches...majoring in criminology...born December 9, 1971.

DERRICK ALEXANDER

DEFENSIVE END, 6-5, 282, JUNIOR
JACKSONVILLE, FLA. (RAINES HS)



Dominant defensive lineman who will challenge for the Lombardi Award and Outland Trophy...has the potential to be one of the best defensive linemen in school history...will anchor a young defensive line in 1994...possesses unbelievable athleticism for a man his size...coming off a fine spring when he was named the Most Valuable Defensive Player...excellent pass rusher...effective at knocking down passes with his height

and long arms...coaches love his work ethic...relentless on every snap...reads the ball well at the line of scrimmage and gets a great first step...owns good speed and excellent lower body strength...great at shedding blockers to make the play...**1993:** Became a dominant player in his first season as a starter...a first team All-American by the Football Writer's as a sophomore...AP named him to its third team All-America list while UPI had him on its second squad...top vote-getter among defensive linemen for the All-Atlantic Coast Conference team...double-teamed most of the season...earned ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors against North Carolina and Georgia Tech...second on the team with 100 tackles, including 47 solo stops...also second on the squad with eight tackles for loss...credited with five sacks, five passes broken up and one caused fumble...came up big at North Carolina with 11 tackles — three for loss — and one pass broken up...also made 11 stops against Clemson...dominated the Orange Bowl game with 11 tackles, eight solo...also made two tackles for loss and broke up a pass against the Cornhuskers...tied for the team lead with eight stops at Notre Dame...recorded 15 tackles, one for loss, at Maryland...outjumped a crowd of linemen to pick off a batted pass in FSU's 62-3 rout of N.C. State...registered at least one tackle for loss in six different games...had six double figure tackle games...**1992:** Played in 10 games as a back-up to Carl Simpson...registered 38 tackles as a redshirt freshman...in on 14 solo tackles, 24 assists and three quarterback sacks...five tackles for loss tied for second on the team...also credited with two fumble recoveries and one pass break-up...both fumble

recoveries came against Florida...best overall game came against North Carolina with seven tackles, six solo...made six solo stops and recorded two sacks in the Maryland game...**1991:** Redshirted...**High School:** First team class 4A all-state selection as a senior...named to the *Florida Times Union's* Super 24 team...a *Super Prep* All-American...rated the nation's 11th-best offensive lineman by *Super Prep Magazine*...credited with four solo tackles and a sack in the Florida-Georgia All-Star Game...first five-sport athlete in the history of Raines High with letters in football, basketball, wrestling, track and baseball...recorded 79 solo tackles, 51 assists and five quarterback sacks his senior year...also visited Georgia Tech, South Carolina, Florida and Miami...**Personal:** Has increased his bench press 105 pounds, to 440, since arriving at FSU...that mark is tops on the squad...gained 42 pounds in the last three years...runs a sub-five 40...a social science major...born November 3, 1973.

MIAMI, FLA. (MIAMI SPRINGS HS)



Reserve noseguard who gained valuable playing experience during the 1993 campaign...FSU's liberal substitution policy on defense will give him plenty of playing time this year...enjoyed a solid spring where he held on to his second team standing at nose-guard...fine lower body strength makes him tough at the line of scrimmage...shows a relentless, aggressive, intense attitude on the playing field...

1993: Played in 10 games...finished the year with 20 tackles — 10 solo and 10 assists...also tallied three stops for loss...best game of the year was an eight tackle performance at Maryland...also caused a fumble in that game that stopped a Terrapin drive...**1992:** Tallied four tackles in five games...made two solo stops during the year...playing time was limited due to depth on the defensive line...performed well when inserted into games...saw action late with FSU leading...**1991:** Redshirted along with the majority of his class...**High School:** A first team all-Dade County selection as a senior at Miami Springs...Max Emfinger rated him the number six offensive guard prospect in the country...rated all-South by numerous recruiting services...honorable mention all-state choice...averaged 10 tackles per game as a senior...registered 10 sacks his final season...visited Colorado, Miami, Oklahoma State and Georgia Tech...**Personal:** Birthday is October 1, 1972...a nutrition & fitness major...south Miami native whose family was displaced by Hurricane Andrew.

CHAD BATES

OFFENSIVE GUARD, 6-3, 269, SOPHOMORE
COLUMBIA, S.C. (SPRING VALLEY HS)



Solid offensive guard prospect who enters the fall as a backup at tight guard...combines excellent size and strength with outstanding athletic ability...powerful run blocker who gets a great jump off the ball...owns excellent quickness and good foot speed...already an experienced player in only his sophomore season... **1993:** One of 11 true freshmen to play during the season...gained valuable experience

as part of Florida State's "Kentucky Derby" offense that would enter the game for the first play of a drive...backed up Patrick McNeil at tight guard...gained a start in Florida State's 54-0 homecoming win over Wake Forest while filling in for an injured McNeil...recorded nine intimidation blocks on the year...earned playing time in 11 games...hampered by an ankle sprain late in the year that caused him to miss the Maryland game... **High School:** Named to All-America teams by *Super Prep* and *Blue Chip Illustrated*...considered the fourth best player in South Carolina...garnered first team All-East honors from *Big East-ACC Recruiting Magazine*...rated the nation's third best offensive guard by Max Emfinger...led his team to the semifinals of the Big 16 playoffs...earned honorable mention



Scott Bentley shook off some early season inconsistency to hit the field goal that won the Orange Bowl and the national title as a true freshman.

STRONG SAFETY, 6-0, 200, SOPHOMORE
JACKSONVILLE, FLA. (JACKSON HS)



Moves from cornerback to strong safety for the 1994 campaign...listed as the second team strong safety behind returning starter Devin Bush...should see considerable playing time due to a lack of proven depth in the FSU secondary...aggressive player who may be more comfortable playing safety...showed great improvement during spring drills...will benefit from FSU's liberal substitution on defense...good open field

tackler...physical enough to come up and stop the run... **1993:** Played in four games during his freshman season...saw action against Duke, Clemson, Georgia Tech, and Wake Forest...recorded two tackles and broke up a pass...broke his right wrist during the season, which hindered his development... **1992:** One of 16 freshmen to redshirt during the year... **High School:** Earned first-team All-America honors from Allen Wallace his senior season...tabbed first team all-South by *Southern Football Recruiting*...named to Lemming's all-Southeast team and Max Emfinger's national Top 100 list...missed four games in his senior campaign due to an ankle injury, but still tallied 55 tackles and grabbed an interception...as a junior, picked off eight passes...named one of the top 20 high school players in the state by *Super Prep Magazine*... **Personal:** Born December 31, 1973.

SCOTT BENTLEY

KICKING SPECIALIST, 5-11, 178, SOPHOMORE
AURORA, COLO. (OVERLAND HS)



Enters his sophomore season as Florida State's placekicker...kicked well this spring to hold off a charge by Dan Mowrey and retain his starting kicking duties...strong, quick leg gives him great distance on both kickoffs and field goal attempts...has demonstrated the ability to kick well in pressure situations...capped an outstanding spring by hitting his only FG attempt (25 yards) and both his PATs in the Garnet and Gold

Game...hit a 65-yarder at halftime of the spring game...fine all-around athlete who has outstanding speed...did not miss a pressure kick last year...**1993:** Hit a 22-yard field goal with 21 seconds remaining in Florida State's 18-16 win over Nebraska in the Orange Bowl to win the national championship and conclude a fairy tale season for the freshman...nailed three other FGs (34, 25, 39) in the game...the only true freshman to start every game in 1993...connected on 56-of-64 extra points and 17-of-25 field goals on the year, including the Orange Bowl...finished the season with the Atlantic Coast Conference records for most extra points made and attempted...also broke the FSU record for most PATs attempted...began his collegiate career by hitting all six of his PATs in the Kickoff Classic against Kansas...banged a career long 47-yard field goal in FSU's 57-0 win against Clemson...his kick was the longest FSU field goal since 1990...saved the shutout against Clemson by running down and tackling Tiger defensive back Brian Dawkins after a blocked extra point...hit field goals of 23 and 22 yards in FSU's 33-21 win at Florida...earned the coaches' Big Play Award for his 27-yard field goal with under a minute to play in the first half at North Carolina, giving FSU a 10-7 halftime lead...made at least two field goals in six different games...began the year on the cover of *Sports Illustrated's* preseason football issue...kicked under the media microscope all season...**HIGH SCHOOL:** The top high school kicker in the nation in 1993...a two-time *Parade* All-American...named to *USA Today's* All-America squad...also earned All-America honors from *Super Prep* and *Blue Chip Illustrated*...as a senior, split the uprights on 11-of-13 field goal tries inside of 50 yards...nailed all 40 extra point tries...connected on seven field goals of 50 yards or more...made game-winning kicks from 57 and 58 yards...in his career, made 35-of-50 field goals with most of the misses coming from over 50 yards...**PERSONAL:** His hometown of Aurora, Colo. (outside Denver) is further from Tallahassee than that of any other Seminole...selected a major in business...born April 10, 1974.

DEFENSIVE END, 6-5, 234, FRESHMAN

Rangy, quick defensive end who showed flashes of brilliance during spring drills...ready to make big contributions on the defense and on special teams in 1994...enters the fall behind returning starter James Roberson and Reinard Wilson at his position...shows great instincts as a pass rusher...displayed an excellent knack for getting to the quarterback this spring...constantly gives second effort...has good vision

and separates from blockers well...concluded an outstanding spring with three tackles and 1 1/2 sacks during the Garnet and

Gold Game...also credited with a tackle for loss in the game...named the defense's Top Newcomer during spring drills...also earned the Defensive Line's Most Improved Award...**1993:** Sat out the season as a redshirt...**High School:** Named one of America's 50 best players by the *Atlanta Constitution*...listed in the *Dallas Morning News's* top 100 players...a member of *Blue Chip Illustrated's* Dream Team...earned all-state honors after recording 132 tackles and 14 sacks during his senior campaign...also blocked two punts...**PERSONAL:** Born December 18, 1974...brother, Raleigh, plays football at Georgia Tech...a biology major.

DERRICK BROOKS

OUTSIDE LINEBACKER, 6-1, 226, SENIOR
PENSACOLA, FLA. (WASHINGTON HS)



A consensus All-American in 1993 who spurned the NFL to return to Florida State for his senior season...the top returning linebacker in college football...emotional leader of the Florida State defense...slated to start at bandit again in 1994...hard hitter who makes plays all over the field...has a nose for the football and always seems to be in the right place at the right time...the big play man for FSU's defense...possesses

great speed which enables him to chase down plays from the weak side...solid open field tackler who rarely gets beat one-on-one...can shed blockers to get to the ball carrier or power through them...plays much bigger than his size...coaches love his leadership qualities...had a solid spring...also an Academic All-American...**1993:** Leader of the Seminole defense during its national championship campaign...finalist for the Butkus, Rotary-Lombardi, and Football Writer's Defensive Player of the Year awards...a consensus All-America choice as a junior...All-ACC for the second straight year as well as the ACC's Defensive Player of the Year...outscored FSU's opponents 18-14 through the first five games of the season...points came on two interception returns for touchdowns and a fumble return...went 32 yards with an interception against Duke for a score...returned a Clemson fumble 83 yards for a TD the next week...one week later he picked off a pass at North Carolina and went 49 yards for a score...also blocked a punt in the Clemson game which was recovered for a touchdown...finished third on the team in tackles with 77...made 47 solo stops and added seven tackles for loss...posted numbers in every defensive category during the year...made an immediate impact as the MVP of the Kickoff Classic against Kansas...tallied a season high 13 tackles in that game...was in on three stops in FSU's 12-play goal line stand that preserved the shutout...credited with nine tackles against both North Carolina and Georgia Tech...named the ACC Defensive Back of the Week for his performance in FSU's wins over Clemson and UNC...injuries limited his playing time in the second half of the season...missed the Virginia and Wake Forest games and portions of three others...despite a bad ankle, made seven tackles, including one for loss, against Notre Dame...recorded eight solo tackles, 11 total stops, two tackles

for loss and caused a fumble at Maryland...broke a bone in his hand in the third quarter of the Florida game, but came back to make five tackles and break up a pass...named to the second team GTE Academic All-America squad and the ACC All-Academic team...**1992:** First team All-Atlantic Coast Conference choice...also selected to *Football News*' All-ACC team...challenged All-American Marvin Jones atop the Seminole defensive charts all season...his 98 tackles ranked second on the team...recorded 55 solo stops and five tackles for loss on the year...big play man who stepped up when Jones was injured...made three tackles for loss versus Maryland...credited with a team high 14 tackles against Virginia...recorded one tackle for loss, one-and-a-half sacks and nine solo stops in the game...registered a team season high and career best 18 tackles vs. Georgia Tech...also posted a team best 13 unassisted tackles against the Yellow Jackets...started every game at bandit...the Seminoles' leading tackler in four contests...tallied 10 tackles and one sack in the Wake Forest game...also turned in a 10-tackle performance against North Carolina...tallied three-and-a-half sacks to go with one pass break-up and one caused

fumble on the year...credited with 13 knock 'em back tackles...forced the opposition into punting situations 10 times with third down tackles...received the Honda Scholar-Athlete Award for the Clemson game...**1991:** One of two true freshmen who did not redshirt...saw action in every game as a member of the special teams...also saw spot duty on some of the Seminoles' nickel packages...made 22 tackles in that role...10 of 22 total tackles were solo...registered two tackles for loss...**High School:** *USA Today*'s Defensive Player of the Year as a senior...an All-America selection by *Parade Magazine*...earned first team class 5A all-state honors as a junior and senior...named Dial's Scholar-Athlete of the Year...Max Emfinger ranked him the top strong safety in the country and tabbed him a first team All-American...named the nation's top defender by *Super Prep*...stole the show at the Florida-Georgia All-Star Game, winning MVP honors...recorded four solo tackles and four assists in the game...credited with 113 total tackles, three fumble recoveries and four interceptions his senior season...high school scholar with 3.94 grade point average...visited Notre Dame, Miami, Auburn and Florida...**Personal:** Born April 18, 1973...tremendous athlete who has gained 27 pounds since his freshman season, yet runs a 4.40 and has a vertical jump of 37 inches...40 time was the third-best mark on the squad...majoring in advertising.

Begins the fall as Florida State's third team split guard...working behind incumbent starter Lewis Tyre and junior college transfer Tim Johnson...needs to increase his lower body strength to become a more effective run blocker...displayed some flashes of potential during spring scrimmages...needs more time and experience to become a regular contributor to FSU's offensive line...**1993:** One of 14 Seminole freshmen

to sit out the season as a redshirt...**High School:** Earned *Super Prep* All-America status...rated one of the top 10 players in South Carolina by *Super Prep*...gained first team all-state honors...called the seventh best center in the country by Tom Lemming...received honorable mention All-America status from *USA Today*...considered the fifth best prospect in South Carolina by *Big East-ACC Recruiting*...**Personal:** Born February 17, 1975...will pursue a major in criminology.

THAD BUSBY

QUARTERBACK, 6-3, 215, FRESHMAN
PACE, FLA. (PACE HS)



Begins the year as FSU's third team quarterback behind juniors Danny Kanell and Jon Stark...possesses a strong arm and natural athletic ability...only needs experience to become a fine collegiate quarterback...comfortable when throwing in the pocket as well as on the run...has picked up Florida State's complicated offense quickly...most mobile of FSU's three quarterbacks...able to find secondary

receivers when coverage makes that necessary...good size allows him to see over on-rushing defenders...came on toward the end of spring drills to tighten the quarterback race...completed 7-of-12 passes for 51 yards and a touchdown during the Spring Garnet and Gold Game...**1993:** Spent his first year in Tallahassee learning the Seminole offense as a redshirt...**High School:** The Gatorade Player of the Year in the state of Florida...earned *Parade Magazine* All-America honors...considered the number one quarterback in the South by *Southern Recruiting*...a member of *USA Today's* second-team All-America squad...first team all-state selection...considered the second best prospect in the state of Florida by *Super Prep*...also a *Super Prep* All-American...the state Class 3A player of the year...runner-up for Florida's Mr. Football Award...completed 114-of-134 passes for 1,573 yards and 15 touchdowns in a run-oriented offense...led Pace High to the semifinals of the state 3A playoffs...in his career, passed for 4,355 yards and 31 TDs...quarterbacked Florida to a 21-7 victory in the Florida-Georgia All-Star Game...completed 9-of-15 passes for 249 yards and two touchdowns, including a 92-yarder, in the game...**Personal:** Born November 25, 1974...shares a birthday with middle linebacker Todd Rebol...an education major.

DARYL BUSH

MIDDLE LINEBACKER, 6-2, 230, FRESHMAN
ALTAMONTE SPRINGS, FLA. (LAKE BRANTLEY HS)



Intense, hard-nosed linebacker who begins the fall as Florida State's second team middle linebacker...received the Big Otis Award after spring drills, given to the toughest player on the Florida State defense...big hitter who is relentless...coaches love his second effort...will also get a chance to contribute on special teams...displays good technique as a tackler...can explode through blockers or shed them to get to

the ballcarrier...earned Florida State's Best Conditioned Athlete Award during offseason workouts...enjoyed a productive spring...played well in scrimmages and recorded four tackles in the Garnet and Gold Game...**1993:** Slated to receive playing

time at inside linebacker as a true freshman, but injured his knee in a preseason scrimmage...returned from the injury and played at North Carolina, making four tackles before re-injuring the knee...ended up taking a medical hardship...**High School:** Dominant linebacker who was a first team *USA Today* All-American...selected the Orlando Touchdown Club Defensive Player of the Year...rated the best linebacker in the country by *Super Prep*...a member of *Blue Chip Illustrated's* Dream Team...also considered the #2 linebacker in the nation by that publication...garnered *Orlando Sentinel* All-South and Super 24 honors...a first team Class 5A all-state selection...as a senior, made 179 tackles, including 29 for losses and eight sacks...led Florida with six tackles, four solo, in the Florida-Georgia All-Star Game...**Personal:** Top student among football's freshman class last year...vertical jump of 38.5 was the second best effort in the spring...majoring in business...born February 11, 1975.

Returning starter and potential all-star at strong safety...a rising star on the Florida State defense...hard hitter who comes up to support the run well...speed and quickness make him effective against the pass...will team with cornerbacks Clifton Abraham and Corey Fuller to provide leadership to a young secondary...has a knack for being in the right place at the right time...plays at a consistent level every

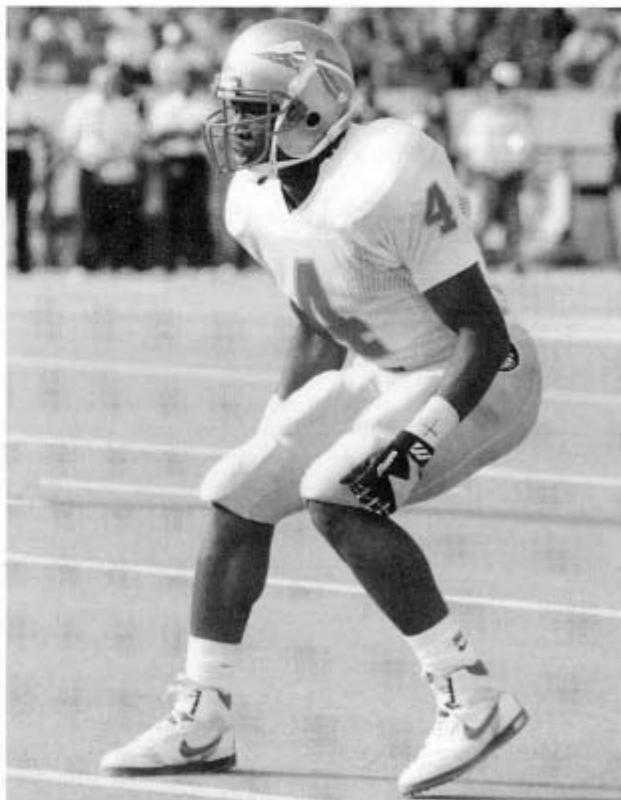

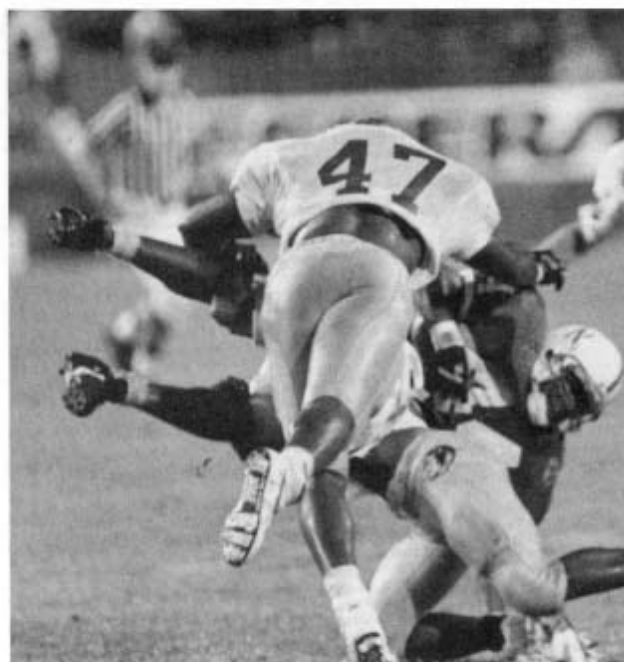

SIDELINES

For the second year in a row, Florida State had a student-athlete selected in the first round of the NFL, NBA and Major League baseball drafts.

In 1994, Florida State celebrated a first as pitcher Paul Wilson became the first Seminole ever taken as the first pick in any professional draft when the N.Y. Mets selected him #1 this spring. In addition, William Floyd went in the first round of the NFL draft to the San Francisco '49ers, and Charlie Ward was taken in the first round of the NBA draft by the New York Knicks.

Last year, Marvin Jones was selected with the fourth pick of the NFL draft by the New York Jets. Two Seminoles went in the first round of the NBA draft with Doug Edwards taken by Atlanta and Sam Cassell by the World Champion Houston Rockets. In June, pitcher John Wasdin was taken with the 25th pick by the Oakland Athletics.



Florida State University was listed among the top 10 of the annual college referral service of "Who's Who Among American High School Students."

Florida State was the 10th most frequent choice of more than 100,000 of America's best and brightest high school students who asked a specific college be notified of their recognition.

Six of the top 10 schools on the list, including FSU, are public universities. The top schools chosen were: 1. Harvard, 2. Duke, 3. Stanford, 4. UCLA, 5. North Carolina, 6. Texas A&M, 7. Michigan, 8. Texas, 9. Yale, 10. Florida State.

Another outstanding defensive recruit and athlete who received national honors...ranked 59th nationally by *Big East/ACC Recruiting*...Max Emfinger listed him as the #7 strong safety in the country...Tom Lemming ranked him #12 overall at safety...named to the Schutt Sports Group Top 100...made one tackle and recovered a fumble in the Florida-Georgia All-Star Game...a tenacious hitter...recorded 60 tackles and two interceptions on the year...also recovered four fumbles...possesses 4.5 speed...has recorded a 300 pound bench press...did double duty as a tight end with eight grabs for 148 yards and a touchdown...first team all-state selection as a senior...a third team all-stater his junior year...attended FSU's summer football camp...picked FSU over Florida, Michigan and Miami.

Illustrated's Dream Team and its #3 offensive lineman...garnered first team 3A all-state mention...a Super 24 selection who represented Florida in its annual all-star game with Georgia...excellent downfield blocker...graded out an impressive 88% on the season...has sheer power with a 365-plus pound bench press...clocked an impressive 4.9 time in the 40...chose FSU over Florida, Tennessee, Auburn and Mississippi.

SAMARI ROLLE, CB

6-1, 160, FR., MIAMI, FL (MIAMI BEACH HS)

SIDELINES

Florida State was one of only 19 schools in the country to earn honorable mention recognition in the annual College Football Association Graduation Rate Survey for 1993. Twenty-one of 30 student-athletes signed by FSU in 1988 graduated for a mark of 70 percent.

FSU was one of five Atlantic Coast Conference schools and conference member Duke had the top graduation rate in the country. The Blue Devils won the CFA Academic Achievement Award for the sixth time.
