



THE

Florida State will begin the 1995 season with a very young football team and without an All-American at cornerback for the first time in seven years.

Samari Rolle and James Colzie should battle through preseason drills for the coveted pressure point of field cornerback that has produced five All-Americans since Deion Sanders in 1988. Byron Capers has quietly moved in at the other cornerback but FSU's secondary, which must also replace Devin Bush at strong safety, remains the primary concern heading into the season.

Defensive end Reinard Wilson can only hope to match his outstanding sophomore numbers during his junior campaign. If Wilson can shake loose for 11 sacks again this year, the Seminole defense should be in good shape. Senior Orpheus Roye is also capable of dominating along the defensive front and Andre Wadsworth has added size and strength since last year.





easily into Derrick Brook's role as the big play inspiration on defense. Daryl Bush and Sam Cowart are already all-conference level and have the potential to emerge as the nation's best inside tandem.

Clay Shiver may be the finest center in Florida State history and the Outland Trophy

candidate anchors an offensive front that returns four of five starters. Also returning in the backfield are quarterback Danny Kanell and 1,000 yard rusher Warrick Dunn, which gives FSU coaches a lot of confidence heading into the season.

FSU's biggest concern on offense is whether the talented receiving corps can produce quickly. Andre Cooper, E.G. Green, Wayne Messam and Phillip Riley proved very capable during spring practice, but none of them have been the "go to" player in a big game and for the Seminole offense to be successful it must be able to throw and catch.

Scott Bentley and Sean Liss give the Seminoles experience at kicker and punter, respectively. Florida State won the national championship on a last minute kick by Bentley two years ago, while Liss has reserved some of his best punts for the most dramatic moments.

Once again, FSU will hope to wear out opponents with impressive depth at most positions. The Tribe returns just 14 starters from last year, but welcomes back 54 lettermen from the Sugar Bowl champion squad.

The selection of cornerbacks Clifton Abraham and Corey Fuller, along with safety Devin Bush, solidified FSU's reputation as "Cornerback U." according to Lindy's. Seminole alumni; Deion Sanders, LeRoy Butler, Dedrick Dodge, Martin Mayhew, Terrell Buckley, Corey Sawyer, and now Abraham and Fuller roam the backfield of the NFL.



# FORREST CONOLY Offensive Tackle, 6-6, 328, Senior Berlin, CT (Berlin)

Experienced offensive lineman who returns after sharing a starting role at tight tackle in 1994...missed all of spring and the last two regular season games after knee surgery...enters fall workouts at second team tight tackle...excellent speed for a big man...punishing run blocker who drives defensive linemen off the line of scrimmage...footwork and long arms make him a solid pass blocker as well...one of the largest players in FSU football

history...1994: Entered the season as the starter at tight tackle, but was suspended for the first four games of the year...played in each game upon his return until the knee injury...helped clear the way for the Seminoles' first 1,000 yard rusher in eight years (Warrick Dunn)...offensive front allowed quarterback Danny Kanell to have the third most successful season throwing the ball in Florida State history...1993: Saw action in every game during his sophomore year as one of FSU's most durable linemen ... reported to camp in the best shape of his career...that dedication in the off-season resulted in the fulfillment of his vast potential...battled Marvin Ferrell for the starting tight tackle spot all season...the two played on alternate series in most games during the national championship season...won the team's Blocker of the Week honor against North Carolina...had an outstanding game against Miami...named the ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week and the team's Blocker of the Week for his performance in the 28-10 win over the Hurricanes...1992: Improved dramatically over the course of the year...played in seven games, including the last four...slowed early in the year by a knee injury...saw action against Duke, N.C. 




