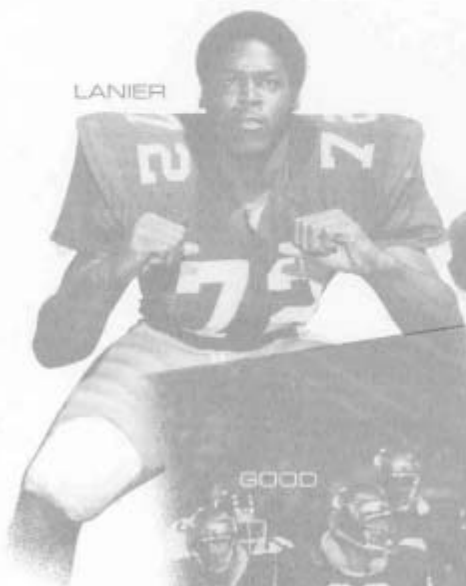
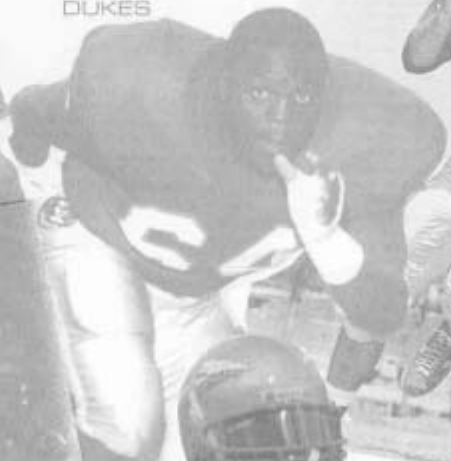

GAME NOTES

Florida State will open the season with Duke for the second consecutive year and third time over the last five seasons...the Seminoles have averaged 55.5 points per game against the Blue Devils over the last four meetings...FSU has defeated Duke by a 37 point average margin since entering the ACC in 1992...Bobby Bowden picked up his 250th career victory with a 70-26 win over the Blue Devils in 1995...Bowden owns a 4-2 career mark against Duke (both losses came while at West Virginia)...the FSU-Duke match-up will be broadcast on ABC for the second straight year...Warrick Dunn and Rock Preston both eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark in the last meeting, combining for 350 yards...Preston broke an 85-yard touchdown

run last year, the longest of the season for the Tribe, and received the AT&T Long Distance "Run from Scrimmage" Award for the feat... Florida State does not list a North Carolina native on its 1996 roster...Duke head coach Fred Goldsmith is a native of Coral Gables and a Florida grad...Goldsmith coached at five Florida high schools, served as a graduate assistant at Florida ('71) and was the defensive coordinator at Florida A&M in Tallahassee for five years.

GAME NOTES

Florida State scored a school-record 11 touchdowns as the Seminoles defeated N.C. State 77-17 at Doak Campbell last year...the Tribe's 60-point margin of victory was the largest scoring margin ever in any ACC game...the 77 points are the most ever scored by an FSU team...the meeting will be just one of two times this year that the Seminoles will play outside the state of Florida... it will be the second time in three years that the Seminoles and Wolfpack pair up on a Thursday night for an ESPN broadcast...Bobby Bowden holds a 5-1 career record against the Wolfpack, including a 1-1 mark while at West Virginia...the Tribe leads the all-time series 12-4, which was played for six straight seasons from 1952-57 and again from 1963-69 until FSU entered the ACC in 1992...the Seminoles have defeated N.C. State by an average margin of 43.8 points in the last four seasons...Florida State assistant head coach Chuck Amato is a 1969 graduate of N.C. State and a three-year letterwinner for the Wolfpack...Amato also coached at N.C. State for 12 years, beginning as a student assistant in 1968 and working his way up to defensive coordinator...FSU marketing director Kim McWilliams played volleyball for the Pack...NCSU quarterback Jose Laureano is the younger brother of former FSU offensive tackle Juan.

Florida State is 6-0-1 against North Carolina in the all-time series...tailback Warrick Dunn rushed for his seventh 100-yard performance of the season, an FSU record, in the Seminoles 28-12 win last year...the Seminoles have held the Tar Heels to less than 14 points in three of the last four meetings...UNC has made four consecutive bowl trips...Florida State special teams shined last year as Mario Edwards and Peter Boulware each blocked a punt and Dexter Jackson blocked a PAT in Chapel Hill...Florida State's equipment truck caught fire on the way back from Chapel Hill last season burning most of the Seminole uniforms...UNC head coach

Mack Brown graduated from Florida State, where he played with FSU assistant Billy Sexton in 1973...Brown was a two-year letterman for the Seminoles in 1972-73 under Coach Larry Jones...Brown rushed for 98 yards on 31 carries and caught 10 passes for 76 yards as a junior running back...eight Florida natives are listed on the Tar Heels' roster...the Seminoles are 42-6-2 all-time vs. schools from North Carolina.

Miami is FSU's oldest rival as the schools will meet for the 40th time in 1996...FSU's 41-17 win last year was the most points the Seminoles ever scored against the Hurricanes...the 24-point winning margin was FSU's largest over Miami since 1984...Miami leads the series 23-16...ESPN "Gameday", featuring former Seminole Lee Corso, went live from Doak Campbell before last season's tilt...Bobby Bowden is 8-14 against Miami during his career...UM is the only team to shutout the Seminoles in the past 19 seasons, holding FSU scoreless in 1976 and 1988...there have been six one-point games in series history...11 games have been decided by three points or less...CBS' telecast marks the 12th consecutive year the game will be nationally televised...Seminole offensive coordinator Mark Richt is a former Hurricane quarterback...11 FSU players come from the city of Miami.

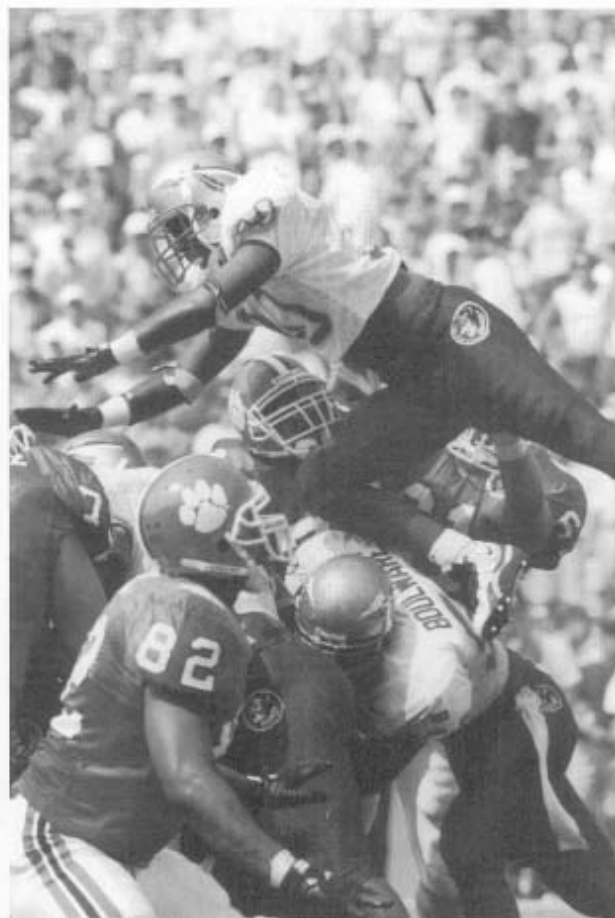
