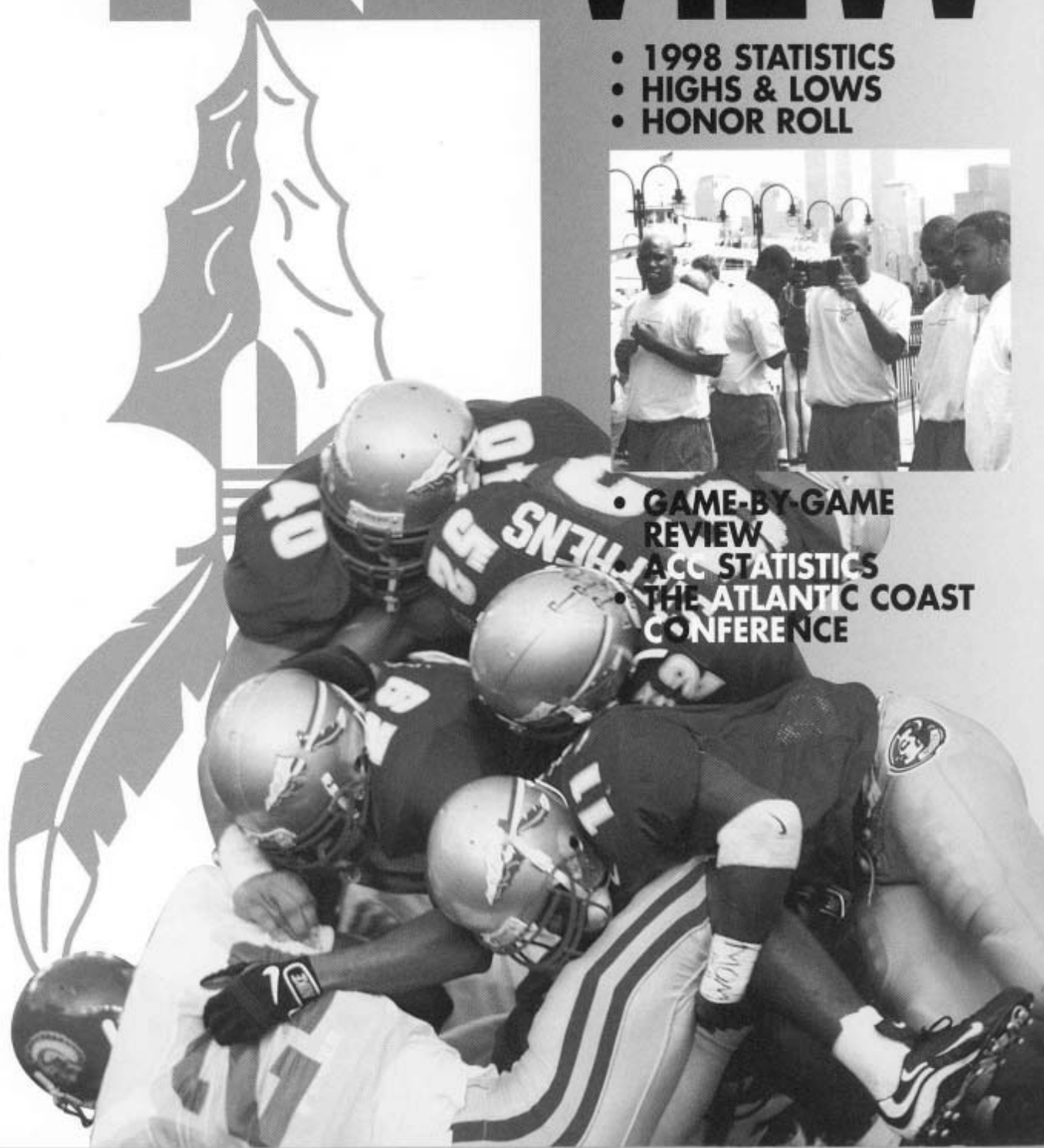

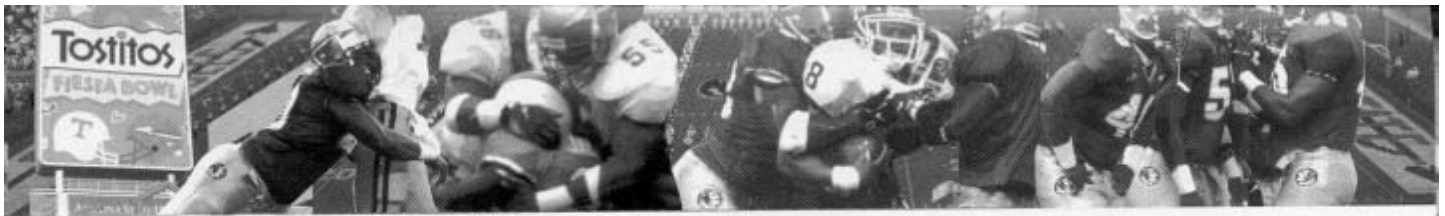

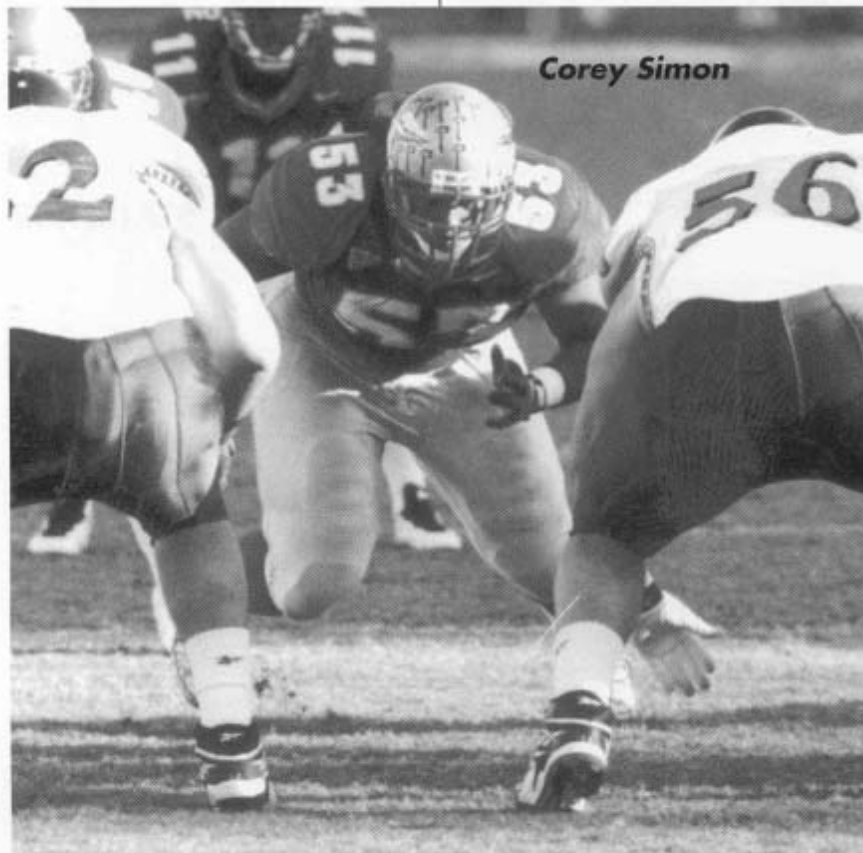

**TRAVIS MINOR RUSHED** for 146 yards and 26-year-old sophomore quarterback Chris Weinke threw for 207 yards in his first start to lead Florida State to a 23-14 season-opening win over Texas A&M at the Kickoff Classic in the Meadowlands.

Minor carried the ball a school record 34 times against the Aggies for a 4.3 yard average. Weinke completed 21 of his 36 pass attempts including a nine-yard touchdown pass to Peter Warrick.

The Seminole defense was outstanding throughout the game limiting the Aggies to just 33 yards rushing and 133 yards of total offense.

FSU took advantage of an A&M fumble at their 39 in the first quarter with Minor finishing the short drive with a three-yard TD plunge with

2:33 left in the quarter for the game's first score. A little under four minutes later Sebastian Janikowski's 33-yard field goal capped another short drive following an A&M fumble.

Texas A&M scored with 12:42 left in the first half on a six-play, 58-yard drive to cut the Seminole lead to 10-7. The Aggies then took a 14-10 lead into the locker room at halftime after a 21-yard return of a Chris Weinke fumble with just :29 left in the second quarter.

The Seminoles answered with 10 points in the third quarter when Janikowski nailed a 28-yard field goal with 6:43 left and Weinke hit Peter Warrick from nine yards out with just five seconds left in the period.

FSU tacked on another Janikowski field goal from 22 yards out in the fourth to preserve the 23-14 win.

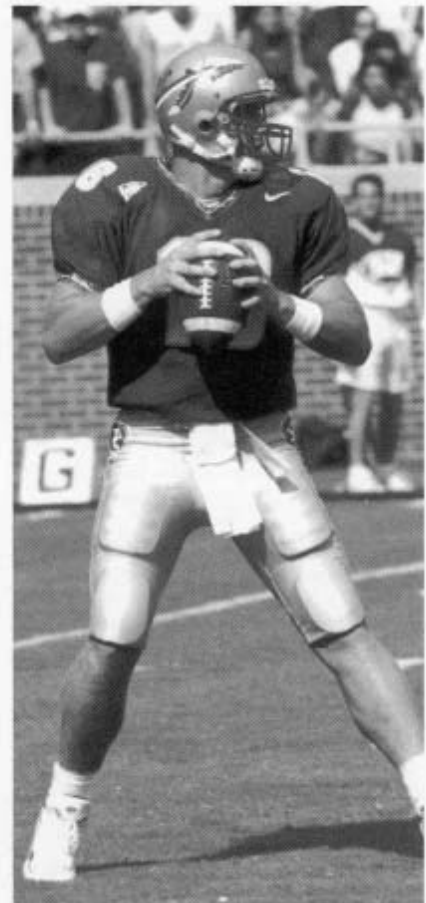

FSU's defense allowed Duke just 165 yards of total offense in the 62-13 win.

**CHRIS WEINKE THREW** for three touchdowns and the Florida State defense limited Duke to just 165 total yards as the Seminoles opened their 1998 home campaign with a 62-13 rout of the Blue Devils in front of 80,032 in Doak Campbell Stadium.

Weinke bounced back from a six-interception day one week earlier to complete 11-of-19 passes for 241 yards without an interception. His scoring passes covered 30 and 24 yards to Peter Warrick and 17 yards to Travis Minor.

Duke jumped out to a 7-0 lead midway through the first quarter when Letavious Wilks scored on a one-yard plunge. The touchdown was set up when FSU punter Keith Cottrell had a punt blocked inside his own 10-yard line.

Florida State took control of the game with a 24-point outburst in the second quarter. Sebastian Janikowski put the Tribe on the board with a 38-yard field goal, then Weinke and Warrick connected on a 30-yard score to give FSU a 10-7 lead.

After Duke's Sims Lenhardt booted a 51-yard field goal to tie the contest at 10, Laveranues Coles took the ensuing kickoff 97 yards for a touchdown to give Florida State the lead for good. Minor's 17-yard TD reception from Weike gave the Seminoles a 24-10 lead at intermission.

Florida State added 28 points in the third quarter to take a 52-10 lead after three periods. Minor scored on an eight-yard run, Warrick caught a 24-yard TD pass from Weinke and William McCray and Jeff Chaney scored on runs from one and two yards out, re-

spectively.

Lenhardt added a 43-yard field goal early in the final period for Duke. Janikowski hit a 40-yard field goal and Chaney added a six-yard scamper to close out the scoring.

Chaney led FSU with 88 yards on the ground on 10 attempts while Minor ran for 76 yards on 14 carries. The Seminole defense held Duke to just 56 yards through the air on 5-of-18 passing with two interceptions.

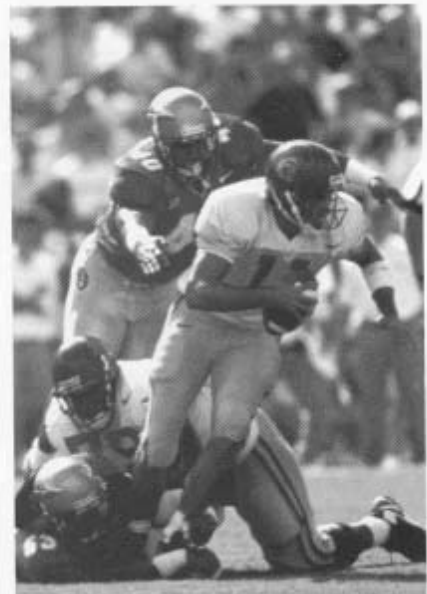

for five yards in the first three quarters and did not break out of single digits in passing yards until less than two minutes remained in the game.

Sebastian Janikowski got Florida State on the board first with a 37-yard field goal that capped a seven-play, 65-yard drive in the first quarter. The Trojans countered with a 49-yard Adam Abrams field goal five minutes later and the score was tied 3-3 at the end of the first period.

FSU went into the half with a 13-3 advantage after scoring 10 points in the second quarter. A seven-yard touchdown run by Chaney and a 36-yard Janikowski field goal five seconds before the half gave the Tribe the margin.

The Seminoles stretched the lead to 20-3 on a Chris Weinke to Peter Warrick five-yard scoring pass late in the third quarter. But USC closed to within 20-10 at the end of the period when Chad Morton scored from seven yards out.

Florida State put the game away in the fourth quarter with a 26-yard field goal by Janikowski and a 35-yard TD pass from Weinke to Ron Dugans.

**SOPHOMORE JEFF CHANEY**, filling in for an injured Travis Minor at tailback, rushed for a career-high 133 yards on 30 carries while Sebastian Janikowski tied an FSU record with five field goals as the Seminoles defeated Maryland 24-10 in College Park.

Quarterback Chris Weinke completed 16-of-32 passes for 261 yards and one touchdown to help open things up for Chaney in his first start. FSU's defense held the Terrapins to just 64 yards through the air and 197 yards total offense.

The Seminoles orchestrated a six-play, 69-yard drive on their first series which used 2:30. The drive was capped by a 38-yard touchdown pass from Weinke to Laveranues Coles, who would finish the day with four catches for 74 yards and a touchdown.

Janikowski rounded out the scoring in the first half with three field goals. The sophomore connected from 27, 47 and 48 yards to give the Seminoles a 16-10 half-time advantage. He also added a 23-yard field goal in the third quarter, before tying Bill Capece's record

of five field goals in a single game with a 36-yarder with 11:01 left in the fourth quarter.

FSU's defense stifled Maryland's two-quarterback attack, holding them scoreless in the second half and allowing just 65 yards over the last 30 minutes. The Terps rotated quarterbacks Randall Jones and Ken Mastrole, who combined to complete just 9-of-23 passes.

The Seminole defense added a safety in the third quarter on a Roland Seymour tackle of Jones, which gave the Seminoles an 18-10 advantage.

The victory improved the Seminoles to 9-0 all-time against the University of Maryland.

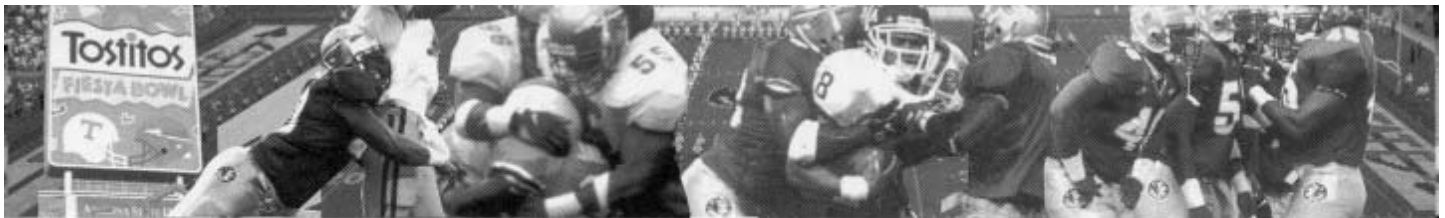

After the Tiger defense forced a three-and-out on the first series of the game, Travis Zachery fumbled the punt and Mario Edwards pounced on it at the Clemson 40. Weinke hit on another long scoring pass, this time a 48-yarder to Peter Warrick, to give the Tribe a 14-0 lead with 12:13 remaining in the second quarter. With the defense holding the Clemson offense in check, Weinke found another of his talented wide receivers for a touchdown as Ron Dugans grabbed a 12-yarder with 5:35 left in the half. Sebastian Janikowski boomed a season-long 53-yard field goal at the 1:45 mark to give Florida State a 24-0 halftime lead.

Tailback Jeff Chaney broke free for a 41-yard touchdown run with 11:40 left in the third quarter as the Tribe opened up a 31-0 margin.

Clemson had their best chance to get on the scoreboard when Antonio Dingle forced and recovered a

Weinke fumble at the Seminole 11. The FSU defense preserved the shutout as Brandon Streeter's pass fell incomplete on fourth and six at the seven.

It was 41-0 at the end of the quarter after a 42-yard Janikowski field goal and Weinke's fourth touchdown pass — a 15-yard strike to a wide open Marvin Minnis. Backup quarterback Marcus Outzen provided the final score on a two-yard touchdown run.

Weinke finished the day with his second career 300-yard game, going 18-of-35 for 302 yards and four touchdowns. With the 48-0 final, Clemson has been held without a touchdown in their last four visits to Doak Campbell Stadium.

stopping Seminole drives. However, FSU's defense was gaining strength after clamping down on Joe Hamilton and the Yellow Jacket offense. In fact, after its initial drive, Tech could manage just 119 yards over the final three quarters.

Sebastian Janikowski gave the Tribe a slim 10-7 lead on a 43-yard field goal with 10:10 left in the third quarter, which held until a fourth quarter explosion by FSU.

With 13:41 left, Weinke found Warrick in the endzone from eight yards out to push the score to 17-7. After a Janikowski field goal at the 8:49 mark, Warrick found the endzone for the third time. The junior wide receiver took a reverse around left end, put a move on a Yellow Jacket defender that left him on the ground, and carried it in for the touchdown. The TD put the Seminoles up 27-7 with 5:31 remaining.

Laveranues Coles got some work at tailback and responded with a two-play 78-yard drive of his own with the touchdown coming on a 60-yard jaunt.

Warrick was named player of the game with three touchdowns on six catches for 82 yards and three runs for 21 yards. The FSU defense limited the ACC's leading passer (Hamilton) to eight-of-14 throwing and only 56 yards.

**QUARTERBACK CHRIS WEINKE** passed for a career-high 338 yards and two touchdowns as he led the Seminoles to a 39-13 victory over North Carolina in Doak Campbell Stadium.

Travis Minor made his first start since the USC game due to an ankle injury and rushed for 76 yards on 24 carries and two touchdowns. Weinke completed 15-of-27 pass attempts without an interception and increased his FSU record of consecutive pass attempts without an interception to 202.

Kicker Sebastian Janikowski was perfect on four field goal attempts, including a pair of 42 yarders. Janikowski booted 42 and 28-yard field goals in the first quarter to put the Seminoles ahead 6-0 and Minor scored his first TD from the one-yard line in the second quarter to give FSU a 13-0 advantage.

North Carolina kicker Josh McGee and Janikowski then traded field goals and the Seminoles headed into halftime with a 16-3 lead.

Minor scampered down the sideline for a 16-yard touchdown just minutes into the third quarter as FSU increased its lead to 23-3. The Tar Heels battled back with a 22-yard field goal by

McGee and a seven-yard TD catch by Kory Bailey from Ronald Curry to cut the Seminoles lead to 10.

Peter Warrick and Laveranues Coles ripped the UNC defense in the fourth quarter with 56-yard and 49-yard TD catches, respectively. The two would combine for 245 yards and eight catches. Janikowski's second 42-yard field was FSU's final score, sealing the 39-13 win.

Linebacker Tommy Polley led the Seminoles with 10 tackles, including two for loss, while defensive tackle Corey Simon contributed 1.5 sacks and a tackle for loss to the FSU defensive effort.

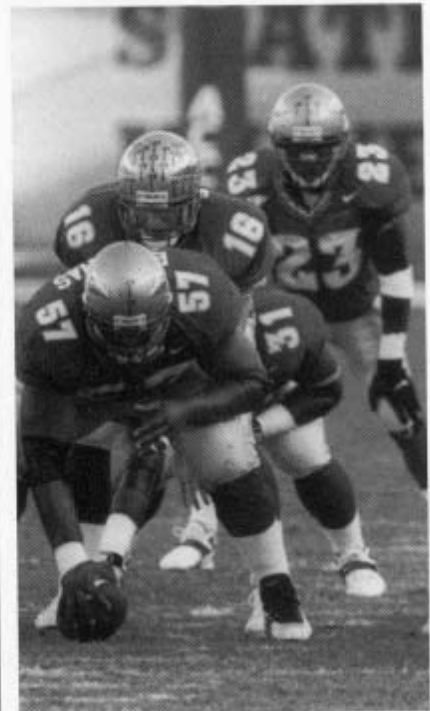

liers tied the score on an Anthony Southern two-yard touchdown run. FSU bounced right back driving 80 yards on its next possession that resulted in Lamarr Glenn's two-yard TD plunge and a 14-7 lead.

On the next series, free safety Dexter Jackson intercepted an Aaron Brooks' pass to set up a one-yard quarterback sneak by Weinke early in the second quarter, giving FSU a 21-7 advantage. The Cavaliers battled back to within a touchdown as Thomas Jones caught an eight-yard pass from Brooks with 6:47 left in the half.

Florida State shutout the Cavaliers in the second half, holding Virginia to just 64 yards total offense after the break.

The Seminoles ran for three more touchdowns under Outzen's leadership. Minor dove for a one-yard score as he rushed for his fifth career 100-yard game. Jeff Chaney and Raymont Skaggs each added a touchdown to the Seminoles' campaign in the fourth quarter, while kicker Sebastian Janikowski booted a 22-yard field goal. Outzen finished the game 5-of-6 passing for 67 yards with one interception.

**MARCUS OUTZEN STEPPED** in as FSU's starting quarterback for the first time on a cold, rainy night at Wake Forest and led the Seminoles to a hard-fought 24-7 win over a determined Demon Deacon team that clinched a share of a seventh straight ACC title for the Seminoles.

Outzen completed 11-of-19 passes, including nine of his last 10, for 164 yards to lead FSU to the

win. Travis Minor gained 102 yards on 19 carries, but the offense could generate just 347 yards of total offense.

FSU's defense maintained their dominating form holding Wake Forest to just 179 yards of total offense, which included a minus 30 yards rushing on the night. Cornerback Mario Edwards set an FSU record and tied an ACC mark with four interceptions in the game.

Outzen opened the scoring in the second quarter diving over from the one-yard line which capped a five-play, 59-yard drive with 8:36 left in the first half. Sebastian Janikowski gave the Tribe a 10-0 lead at the half with a 32-yard field goal with 1:32 left in the first half.

Wake's only touchdown came on a 56-yard bomb when two Seminole defenders collided in the third quarter.

Minor capped a 10-play, 71-yard drive with a touchdown plunge from the one with 4:22 left in the third quarter, and ran in from 22 yards out in the fourth quarter to complete the scoring.

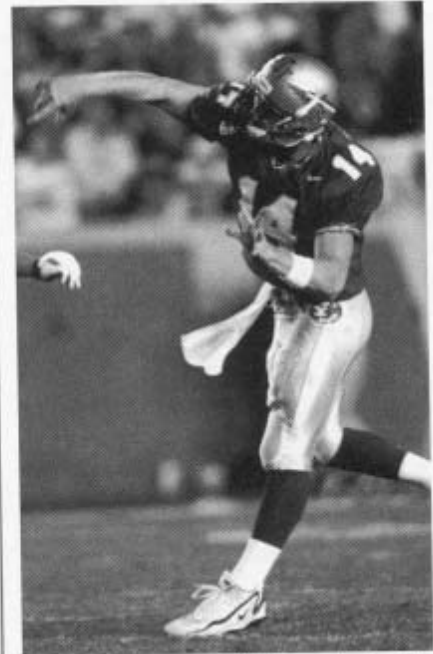

The victory extended FSU's home unbeaten streak to 40 games and kept UF coach Steve Spurrier winless at FSU for his coaching career.

Marcus Outzen, who was starting just his second game at quarterback, completed 13-of-22 passes for 167 yards, including the 32-yarder to Warrick that gave FSU a lead they would never give up at 13:12 with 3:29 left in the third quarter. Travis Minor led a potent FSU ground game with 127 yards on 30 carries.

Florida's only points came in the first half on a 50-yard TD bomb, a safety and a 22-yard field goal following the safety.

FSU's defense held UF scoreless in the second half and allowed the Gators just 204 yards of total offense, the lowest output for the Gators in eight years. Quarterback Doug Johnson was just 13-of-36 and threw three interceptions.

Sebastian Janikowski drilled two field goals in the first half to offset Florida's 12 points, giving the Seminoles hope although they trailed 12-6 at halftime.

FSU's first lead came on their first possession of the second half when Outzen's pass deflected off a Florida defender and into the hands of Warrick, who snaked the remaining 32 yards into the endzone.

The Seminoles grabbed momentum for good early in the fourth quarter. Travis Minor's 46-yard touchdown run was called back for holding, but on the next play Warrick took a reverse and threw a 46-yard touchdown strike to Ron Dugans to give the Seminoles a 20-12 lead with 13:30 left to play.

Janikowski sealed the win with a 41-yard field goal with 4:31 remaining. The win gave the Seminoles an 11-1 regular season record.

FSU's defense limited Tennessee's offense to 16 points in the national title game.

**TENNESSEE HAD ONE MORE** big play in them than Florida State and the Seminoles could not convert on two comeback opportunities in the last four minutes as the Volunteers defeated FSU 23-16 to win the 1998 national championship.

Both teams were sloppy at times in a game that saw the teams flagged for a combined 21 penalties, but FSU had its chances at the end.

Tennessee quarterback Tee Martin hit wide receiver Peerless Price with a majestic 79-yard bomb that put the Volunteers ahead 20-9 with just over nine minutes remaining in the game.

With 3:42 left, FSU quarterback Marcus Outzen, who was making just his third career start for an injured Chris Weinke, scored from seven yards out to cut the UT lead to 23-16. On the ensuing kickoff, the Seminoles recovered an onside kick and appeared to have set-up their offense in great shape for a short drive. To the dismay of FSU fans, officials ruled the ball touched an FSU player within the 10-yard zone and Tennessee was awarded possession. Tennessee then drove to the FSU 10 but fumbled to give the Seminole faithful one more hope of a comeback. However, a UT interception on the next play sealed the Volunteers' win.

Tennessee's Martin was 11-of-18 for 278 yards and two TD's, but the 16 points generated by the Vols offense would have only tied the Tribe. The difference came on a defensive play in the second quarter when UT

comeback Dwayne Goodrich stepped in front of an Outzen pass and raced 54 yards for a touchdown. The interception return came just 25 seconds after the Vols first touchdown of the night and gave them a 14-0 lead which they never relinquished.

Outzen completed 9-of-22 passes for 145 yards, but suffered two interceptions. His favorite target was Ron Dugans, who finished with 135 yards on six catches. Dugans benefitted from Tennessee's double coverage of FSU All-America wide out Peter Warrick, who had just one catch for seven yards.

FSU closed the gap to 14-9 at halftime after William McCray scored from three yards out on a short drive set up by Derrick Gibson's interception and 43-yard return. Sebastian Janikowski drew the 'Noles to within five with a 34-yard field goal with 1:17 left in the half.

FSU's final score came on a five-play, 29-yard drive that culminated with Outzen's run at the 3:42 mark of the fourth quarter.

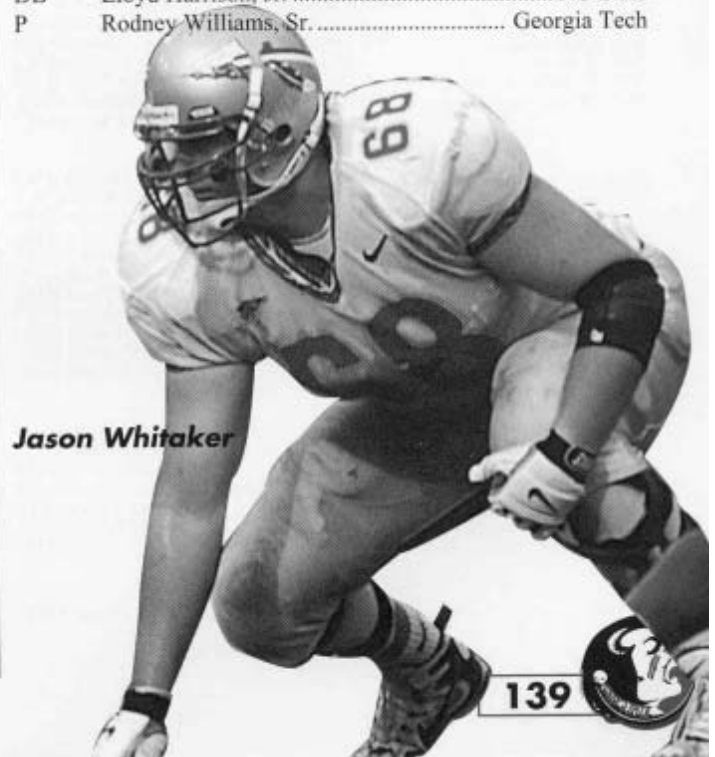

# THE ATLANTIC COAST CONFERENCE

## THE TRADITION

**C**onsistency. It's the mark of true excellence in any endeavor. However, in today's intercollegiate athletics, competition has become so balanced and so competitive that it is virtually impossible to maintain a high level of consistency.

Yet the Atlantic Coast Conference has defied the odds. Now in its 47th year of competition, the ACC has long enjoyed the reputation as one of the strongest and most competitive intercollegiate conferences in the nation. And that is not mere conjecture, the numbers support it.

Since the league's inception in 1953, ACC schools have captured 75 NCAA and AIAW championships, including 38 in men's competition and 37 in women's. In addition, 115 men and 26 women have earned the coveted title of NCAA champion.

The conference had an immediate impact on the national college football scene in the fall of 1953 when the University of Maryland captured the first of what would eventually be four national football titles for the ACC. Clemson laid claim to the league's second national title in 1981, Georgia Tech followed suit in 1990 while the Florida State Seminoles pocketed national title No. 4 in 1994.

The nine schools that take to the field this fall under the ACC banner have produced 346 first or second team gridiron All-Americans and 50 first-team academic All-Americans. ACC teams

have had 1,418 players selected in the annual professional football draft, including 101 first round selections. A year ago, 154 players from the nine current ACC schools played in the NFL during the regular season or playoffs.

If success is best measured in terms of wins and losses, then the ACC over the years has proved itself to be among the elite in Division I-A football. The ACC remains the nation's winningest bowl conference as the nine current league teams are a combined 81-70-5 (.535) in post-season play, including a 24-19-1 mark since 1987. Over the past nine years, the ACC is the only conference in the country to have each of its schools play in a bowl game.

Georgia Tech and Florida State rank among the nation's winningest bowl teams. Among teams with 20-or-more bowl appearances, the Yellow Jackets are No. 1 with a 19-8 (.702) post-season record while the Seminoles are fifth at 16-9-2 (.630).

In the decade of the 1990s, ACC teams have posted the nation's second best non-conference record. Including both post-season and regular season games, the ACC is 197-104-4 (.652) versus non-league foes since 1990.

Over the past two years, the ACC has had nineteen first round picks in the annual NFL draft. In 1998, the ACC had 14 players earn first, second or third team All-America honors. The league tied with the Big 12 and the Big 10 for the most consensus All-Americans with five each. Over the past three years, the ACC has produced 15 consensus All-Americans.

## 1998-99 IN REVIEW

The 1998-99 academic year concluded with the league pocketing three more national team titles and seven individual NCAA crowns. In all, the ACC has won 32 national team titles in the last nine years. The past year, the ACC was the only Division I-A conference to have a team play in the national championship game in men's and women's basketball and football.

The ACC's 1998-99 national champions were Maryland in women's lacrosse, Virginia in men's lacrosse and Duke in women's golf. In addition the ACC had five other teams participate in national title games — Florida State in football, Virginia in women's lacrosse, Duke in men's and women's basketball and North Carolina in women's soccer. Overall, ACC teams posted a 66-45-1 (.595) mark in NCAA Tournament play.

The ACC placed at least one team in the Top 10 nationally in 15 of the 24 sports sponsored by the league. Other records of note during the 1998-99 season include 76 teams competing at NCAA Championships, five bowl teams and 28 Top 10 showings.

Seven ACC teams, in seven different sports representing six of the nine member institutions, earned a No. 1 ranking during the course of the past academic year.

## ACC Leads National Television Ratings

OVER THE LAST TWO YEARS, the Atlantic Coast Conference has reached a new level of popularity among college football television viewers across the country. In 1997, the ACC had the highest rated game on ESPN (FSU vs. UNC), CBS (FSU vs. Florida) and NBC (Georgia Tech vs. Notre Dame). In 1998, the ACC had the two highest rated games on ABC (FSU vs. Florida & FSU vs. Texas A&M), the highest rated ESPN Thursday night telecast (Virginia vs. Auburn), and the highest rated ESPN Saturday prime time telecast (Georgia Tech vs. FSU). ■

## Noting ACC Football

- THE ACC had two teams in the Top 10 of the final 1998 Associated Press poll for the second straight year.
- THE ACC had the nation's best record (8-4) against non-conference AP-ranked teams.

The ACC Academic Honor Roll record was broken for the 12th-straight year in 1998-99 as 1,552 student-athletes were recognized for their work in the classroom.

## THE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The conference will conduct championship competition in 25 sports during the 1999-2000 academic year — 12 for men and 13 for women.

The first ACC championship was held in swimming on February 25, 1954. The conference did not conduct championships in cross country, wrestling or tennis during the first year.

The 12 sports for men include football, cross country, soccer, basketball, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, wrestling, baseball, tennis, golf and lacrosse. Fencing, which was started in 1971, was discontinued in 1981.

Women's sports were initiated in 1977 with the first championship meet being held in tennis at Wake Forest University, October 6-8. Conference championships for women are currently conducted in cross country, volleyball, field hockey, soccer, basketball, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, tennis, golf, lacrosse, softball and rowing.

## A HISTORY

The Atlantic Coast Conference was founded on May 8, 1953, at the Sedgefield Inn near Greensboro, N.C., with seven charter members — Clemson, Duke, Maryland, North Carolina, North Carolina State, South Carolina and Wake Forest — drawing up the conference by-laws.

The withdrawal of seven schools from the Southern Conference came early on the morning of May 8, 1953, during the Southern Conference's annual spring meeting. On June 14, 1953, the seven members met in Raleigh, N.C., where a set of bylaws was adopted and the name become officially the Atlantic Coast Conference.

On December 4, 1953, conference officials met again at Sedgefield and officially admitted the University of Virginia. The first, and only, withdrawal of a school from the ACC came on June 30, 1971 when the University of South Carolina tendered its resignation.

The conference operated with seven members until April 3, 1978, when Georgia Tech was admitted. The Atlanta school had withdrew from the Southeastern Conference in January of 1964.

The ACC expanded to nine members on July 1, 1991, with the addition of Florida State.
