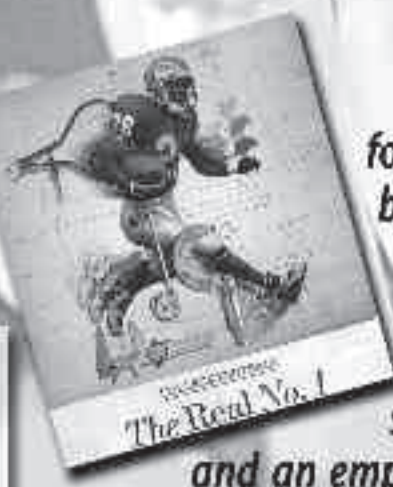

## 1993

- Florida State captured the first football National Title in school history with an 18-16 win over Nebraska in the Orange Bowl.
- The 1993 National Championship team was the first in eight years to start the season No. 1 and go on to win the title.
- In 1993 FSU quarterback Charlie Ward collected 20 national awards, including the Heisman Trophy, leading the Seminoles to a National Championship.
- FSU led the nation in scoring offense and defense as the Seminoles outscored their 13 opponents by an average of 34 points per game.

**1999**

- The Seminoles became the first team in the history of the *Associated Press* poll to go wire-to-wire as the No. 1 team in America.
- FSU completed its 12-0 season with a 46-29 Sugar Bowl win over Virginia Tech.
- Not only did Bobby Bowden lead the Seminoles to the NCAA's first-ever wire-to-wire season as the AP No. 1 team but he also won his 300th game in 1999 and recorded the first perfect season of his career.

**RICK TRICKETT — Offensive Line**

- Coached four players drafted in the first round in a six-year span at Auburn
- 30 players have won all-conference honors under Trickett
- In 2006 as the offensive line coach at West Virginia, the Mountaineers were second in the nation in rushing and fifth in total offense



**JOHN LILLY — Tight Ends/Recruiting Coordinator**

- Won a National Championship in 1999 as the Seminoles' Tight Ends Coach
- Four of FSU's last six recruiting classes have been ranked in the top four in the nation under Lilly



**ODELL HAGGINS — Defensive Tackles**

- Won a National Championship in 1999 as the Seminoles' Defensive Line Coach
- Eight Seminole defensive linemen have been drafted in the first round during Haggins' tenure
- Member of the San Francisco 49ers Super Bowl Championship team in 1990

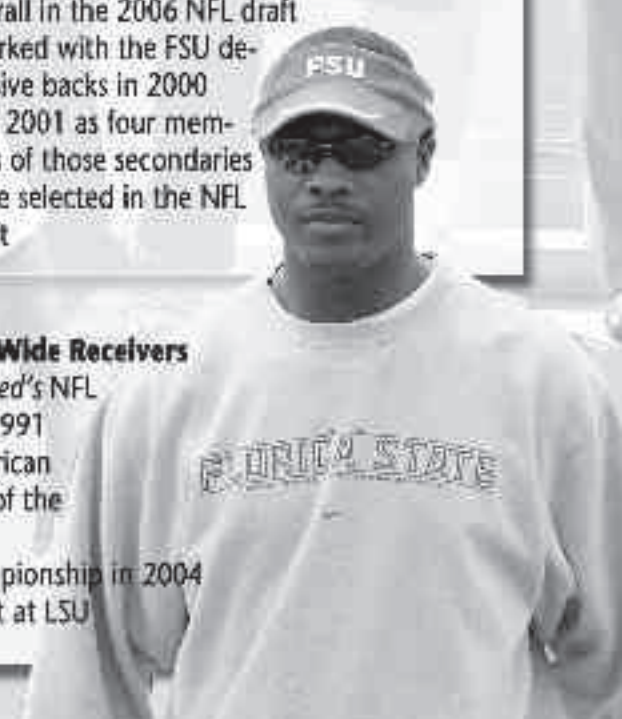


**JODY ALLEN — Defensive Ends/Special Teams Coordinator**

- Coached Cleveland Browns first-round pick Kamerion Wimbley who was selected 13th overall in the 2006 NFL draft
- Worked with the FSU defensive backs in 2000 and 2001 as four members of those secondaries were selected in the NFL draft

**LAWRENCE DAWSEY — Wide Receivers**

- Named *Sports Illustrated's* NFL Rookie of the Year in 1991
- First-team AP All-American in 1990 as a member of the FSU football team
- Won a National Championship in 2004 as a Graduate Assistant at LSU

#### **CHUCK AMATO — Linebackers**

- Won National Championships in 1993 and 1999 as the Seminoles' Assistant Head Coach
- Coached five first-round draft picks including the No. 1 overall pick in the 2006 draft as the head coach of NC State
- Led NC State to the first 11-win season in school history

#### **JIMBO FISHER — Offensive Coordinator**

- Offensive coordinator for the 2003 National Champions
- Coached three players selected in the first round of the 2007 NFL draft including No. 1 overall pick JaMarcus Russell
- Coached five quarterbacks in seven years at LSU that were NFL draft picks
- Led LSU to school records for points, passing TDs and yards in a season

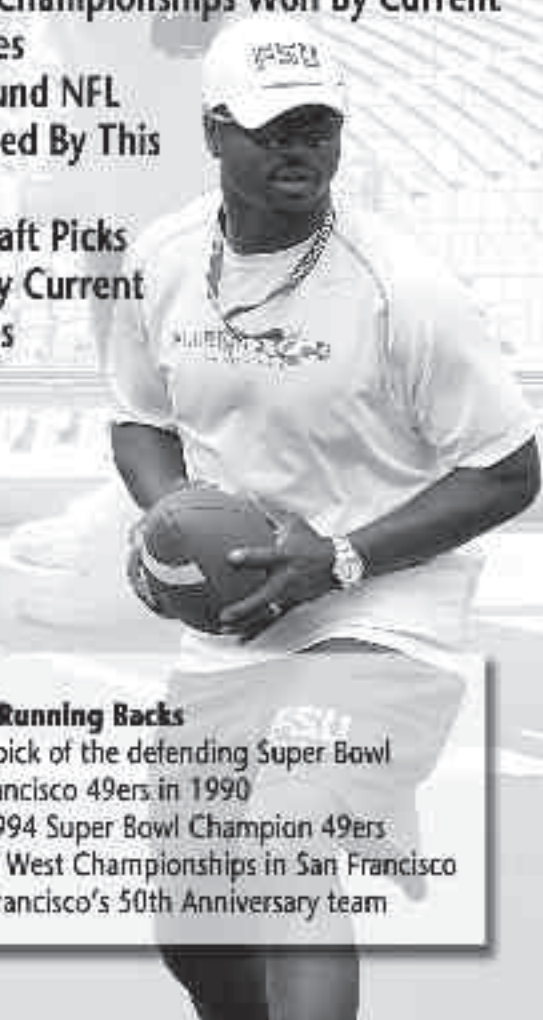
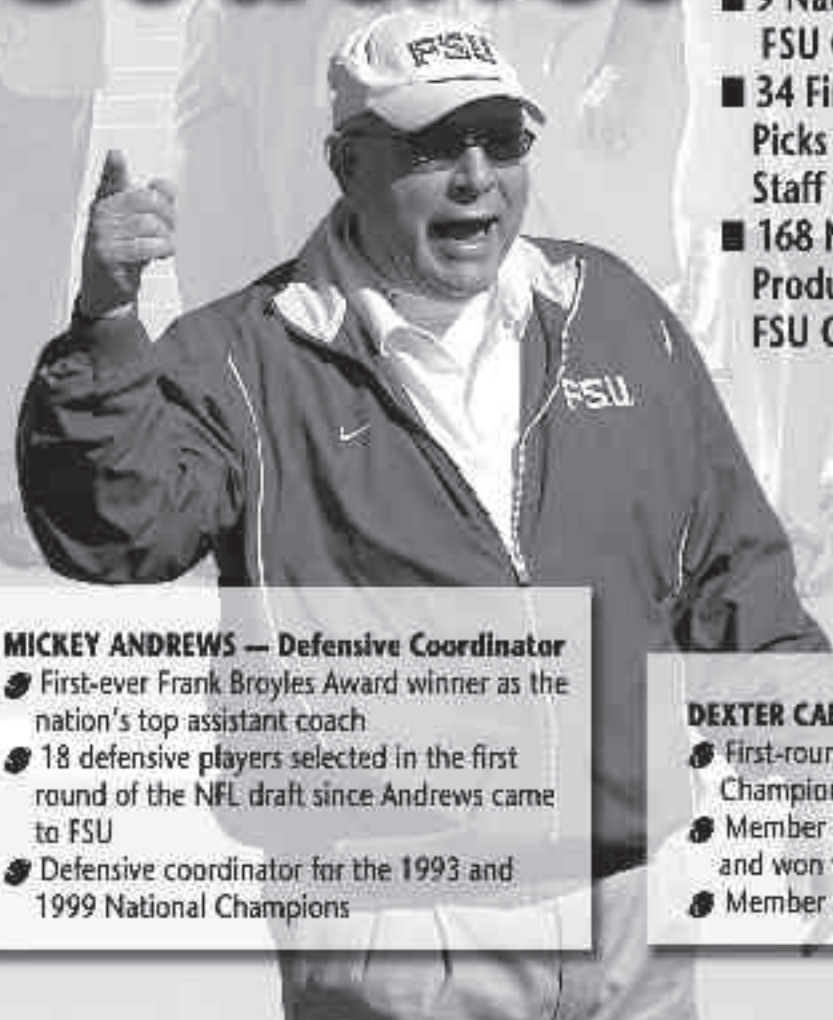

#### **MICKEY ANDREWS — Defensive Coordinator**

- First-ever Frank Broyles Award winner as the nation's top assistant coach
- 18 defensive players selected in the first round of the NFL draft since Andrews came to FSU
- Defensive coordinator for the 1993 and 1999 National Champions

#### **DEXTER CARTER — Running Backs**

- First-round draft pick of the defending Super Bowl Champion San Francisco 49ers in 1990
- Member of the 1994 Super Bowl Champion 49ers and won five NFC West Championships in San Francisco
- Member of San Francisco's 50th Anniversary team







Florida State has played in the two most-watched games in the history of ESPN. In 2006, 6.3 million viewers watched as the Seminoles downed Miami. That was the most-viewed game in the network's history. In 1994, Florida State played in the highest-rated game ever broadcast by the network as well (7.7 rating).

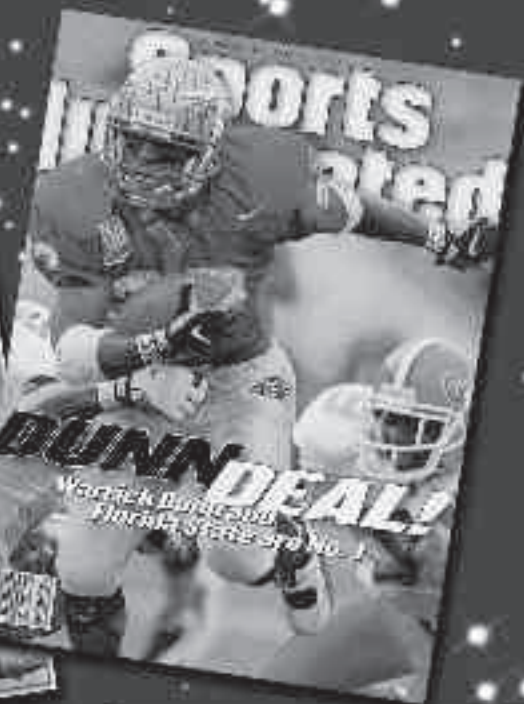

- FSU played in the most-watched college football game in the history of ABC and ESPN.
- Three of the top five most-watched BCS games involved Florida State.
- Florida State has played on national TV 155 times.
- Since 1990, the Seminoles have averaged six games per season broadcast nationally and more than 50% of all FSU's games in that span have been shown on national TV.
- 85% of FSU football games played over the last 20 years have been televised.





# Spotlight







- For the 2006-07 academic year, FSU student-athletes volunteered over 5,500 community service hours.
- The National Consortium for Academics and Sports honored FSU athletics for the most successful outreach and community service program in which FSU student-athletes impacted the lives of over 150,000 youths.
- Student-athletes walked for a combined total of 325 hours at the 2007 Relay for Life.
- Office of Student Services offered Senior in Transition courses to assist senior student-athletes with resume writing, interview and financial planning education.





- 93% of FSU's 2000 football class left Tallahassee with a degree in hand.
- The Seminole Football Team had 31 student-athletes named to the 2006 ACC Honor Roll. Second-best in the ACC (behind Duke).
- 165 student-athletes made the 2006-07 Dean's List (3.5 GPA or higher).
- Three former FSU student-athletes began medical school in 2007. David Castillo (football), Alex Kennon (swimming) and Alvaro Bada (men's track).
- FSU boasted 14 *ESPN The Magazine* District Academic award winners in 2006-07, including Seminole quarterback Drew Weatherford.
- Myron Rolle was one of six FSU student-athletes to win the 2007 Arthur Ashe Junior Sports Scholar Award.
- Eight of FSU's teams had a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.

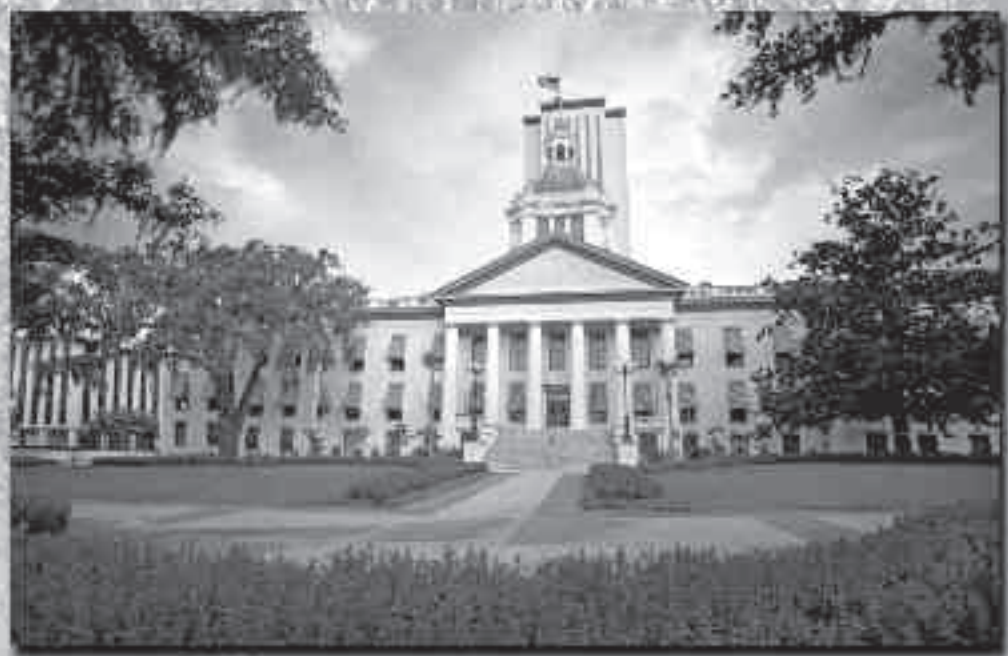

# Florida State
