COACHING EXCELLENCE...

When it comes to legendary head coaches, Florida is arguably as good as any other state. The Seminoles have had three coaches who have obtained records that rank them with the greatest coaches in NCAA history.

Florida State is the only NCAA school with three coaches in the top five for all-time victories in their respective sport and in the top five in wins and winning percentage among active coaches. Bobby Bowden (Football), JoAnne Graf (Softball) and Mike Martin (Baseball) have combined for 3,030 wins and each coach appears in the top four for active winning percentage, active wins and all-time victories.

The caliber of coaches at Florida State is second to none and year after year, three coaches are recognized for excellence nationally, regionally and at the conference level. Track and field and women's country head coach Bob Brunson captured all four titles again last season as he guided the Seminoles to their greatest season ever with a national track and field national championship in 2007. Brunson, the ACC Indoor and Outdoor Coach of the Year, was also recognized on the men's side as the Co-Coach of the Year in the South District, while being honored as the East Region and National Coach of the Year during the earlier season. Jennifer Hyde captured South Region Women's ITA Coach of the Year accolades as she led the women's tennis team to one of the finest turn-around seasons in school history. After leading the women to their first conference championship a season ago, swimming and diving head coach Ned Harper guided his men to their first league title or more in being named the ACC Coach of the Year. Martin's legacy was secured as he was enshrined into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame on January 5, 2007. He would round out the accolades in 2008-09 claiming his fifth ACC Coach of the Year honor.

IN THE COMMUNITY...

Seminoles students-athletes are committed to making a positive impact on the community, logging over 5,500 hours of community service during the 2008-09 school year. They help to raise thousands of dollars in direct support to charities.

The National Consortium for Academics and Sports honored FSU athletes for the most successful outreach and community service program in which FSU student-athletes reached the lives of over 150,000 youths.

Students-Athletes have volunteered their time to work with elementary, middle, and high school students within the Leon County School system. In addition, Seminoles student-athletes have participated in projects such as Kids' Day (hosted by the Boys and Girls Club), Bowls for Kids (fundraise for Big Brothers Big Sisters), The Heart Ball (fundraise for the American Heart Association), Relay for Life, and Special Olympics to name a few.

POSTGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS...

In November 2005, two-time All American star punter Garret Johnson became the second FSU student and first FSU student-athlete to be selected a Rhodes Scholar when he was chosen as one of 82 college students from throughout the United States to study at the University of Oxford and one of less than 100 from around the world who joined the prestigious academic program in 2006. The program's criteria are based on academic success, leadership potential, personal integrity and physical vigor.

Florida State athletes have earned over \$360,000 in post-graduate scholarships in the past 18 years as well as other numerous academic honors and awards. They have also received 73 post-graduate scholarships from the ACC since 1993 including Sarah Griffin (volleyball), Alex Kamin (swimming and diving), Tom Landshire (track and field) and Kelly Rowland (basketball) among 45 recipients of the scholarship awards in 2007. In addition, Garret Johnson (track and field) earned the ACC Scholar Award in 2008.

In 1988, Summita athlete Darrel Bush was the first ever recipient of the State Farm National Scholar Athlete of the Year award, now given annually.

Florida State has won two NAACD Post Graduate Award winners in the last seven years. The scholarship, which was originated in 2001, grants \$10,000 scholarships to its recipients.

Florida State earned a record 204 student-athletes to the Atlantic Coast Conference Honor Roll in 2007. At the conclusion of the 2006-07 school year, seven of Florida State's athletic teams had a 3.0 or better cumulative grade point average. In the spring 2007 semester, 108 of its male athletes had at least a 3.0 semester GPA, while the average semester GPA was 2.93.

Since joining the ACC in 1991, Florida State has had seven National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame National Scholar Athlete Award winners.

In 2007, Heisman Trophy winning quarterback Chris Weisung was the recipient of the inaugural ACC Scholar Award, which is presented annually to an excellent athlete and scholar who plans to pursue a professional athletic career. Since 2001, Florida City's Hesse (2002), baseball's Matt Lynch (2008) and track and field's Garret Johnson (2008) have also earned the award.

Six Olympic student-athletes earned the postgraduate Arthur Ashe Junior Sports Scholar Award including FSU basketball player Myra Roberts. The Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar Awards were established in 1987 and honor a former minority student-athlete who excelled academically, athletically and in community activities as well as athletic prowess.

Florida State has 19 student-athletes named DeWitt Academic All-American honorees in 2008: 07 incoming Drew Weatherbee (Football), Wendi Youngquist and Kaiti Schmidt (Soccer), Sarah Griffin (Volleyball), Riddie Anthony and Alicia Gardner (Women's Basketball), Melissa May (Golf), Romy Nman (Swimming), Caroline Walsby (Women's Golf), Sara Blalock (Women's Golf), Alex Kamin (Swimming) and John Garcia (Tennis). Jim Lane (Tennis) and Andrew Linnard (Football) also earned the honor.

Florida State has more all-time ACC Academic Honor Roll selections (2,412) than all-time All-ACC honorees (11,768). Since 1993, 32 FSU student-athletes have earned National Academic All-American honors. Florida State has won the NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship winner Alex Kamin (Swimming) in 2007 as well.

TOP ATHLETES...

When you consider the top athletes who don the Garnet and Gold, it's easy to see why Florida State has enjoyed such success over the years. Of the 37 national awards for athletic achievements Florida State student athletes have earned, eight have been for the top athletes in the nation across 11 their respective sports. Florida State boasts two Heisman Trophy winners, three Golden Spikes winners, a USA Football National Player of the Year, a National Women's Track Athlete of the Year and a Hobbs Award winner to be proud of.

From football, to diving, to tennis, to track and field, several of Florida State's student athletes achieve All-American status each year. FSU boasts 743 first team All-Americans in 16 sports, as well as scores of regional and national award winners. Over the years, FSU has enjoyed 1,700 All-ACC selections. Even more impressive is the 80 student athletes have been crowned individual national champions in their respective sports.

TOP TEAMS...

Great athletes make great teams and Florida State has a rich history when it comes to great teams on both the national and conference level and has earned 13 national championships over the years including the basketball 2006 and 2007 NCAA Men's Outdoor Track and Field titles. In 1895 the Florida State Seminoles became the first football team to go win-to-win as the Associated Press' No. 1 team when the squad won 12-0 on its way to the program's second national championship. FSU teams have combined for 169 NCAA tournament appearances and 81 ACC team titles. Florida State's team sports have earned 941-9 victories and eight of the Florida State's team sports have an all-time winning record.
