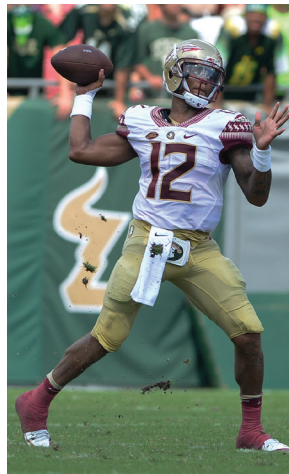

tied for most in the nation

- » Florida State joins Alabama as the only two teams in college football who enter 2017 having gone to five straight BCS/New Year's Six bowl games. Alabama has been to six straight, while FSU is right behind with five - 2012 Orange Bowl, 2013 BCS National Championship, 2014 Rose Bowl, 2015 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl and 2016 Orange Bowl.
- » Florida State is one of only two teams to rank in the final AP Top 25 the last seven years (since 2010), joining Alabama.
- » Florida State's 78 wins since 2010 are the second-most over the last seven years (behind only Alabama- 86).
- » The Seminoles and Crimson Tide open the 2017 season in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game on Sept. 2 at the brand new Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta.
- » Jimbo Fisher has the highest winning percentage of any coach in ACC history (.821) with a 78-17 record. Bobby Bowden ranks second (.765, 173-53-1), while Clemson's Dabo Swinney is third (.761, 89-28).
- » Florida State will bring a five-game win streak into the 2017 season after capping the 2016 campaign with a thrilling 33-32 victory over No. 6 Michigan in the Orange Bowl. Deondre Francois found Nyqwan "Noonie" Murray for the game-winning touchdown catch with 36 seconds left.
- » Florida State opens spring practice for 2017 returning 18 starters (six offense, nine defense and two special teams), including DB Derwin James who played in two games before injury in 2016.
- » James, a redshirt sophomore, returns after suffering a season-ending injury in Week 2. He was a preseason All-American in 2016 and a freshman All-American in 2015. In 15 career games, James has totaled 102 tackles, including 9.5 TFLs and 4.5 sacks. He had an interception against Ole Miss in the 2016 season-opener en route to ACC Defensive Back of the Week honors.
- » The Noles are expected to feature 13 scholarship seniors in 2017, including returning defensive starters Matthew Thomas (LB), Jacob Pugh (LB/DE), Ro'Derrick Hoskins (LB), Trey Marshall (DB) and Derrick Nnadi (DT). Nine of the 13 seniors have started at least one game in their careers.
- » Deondre Francois had the most passing yards of any freshman in the nation last season (3,350). The Orlando, Fla., native collected ACC Rookie of the Year and ACC Offensive Rookie of the Year honors, while tossing 20 touchdowns against just seven interceptions.
- » Defensive tackle Derrick Nnadi returns for his senior season after his All-ACC First Team junior campaign where he recorded 49 tackles, including 11.5 tackles for loss and 6.0 sacks.
- » Cornerback Tarvarus McFadden tied for the nation's lead with eight interceptions as a true sophomore in 2016. He grabbed First Team All-America honors and collected the Jack Tatum Award (Top DB).
- » DB Carlos Becker finished the 2016 season with a bang, securing the game-sealing interception at the end of the 2016 Orange Bowl to give Florida State the 33-32 victory over No. 6 Michigan. Becker continued to show off his athleticism the last few months, competing on the Seminoles' track and field squad in the longe jump. He finished sixth at the ACC Indoor Championship in the event last month with a jump of 24-1.5.
- » Florida State's offense averaged 466.2 yards per game in 2016 - third in the conference and the third-highest total under Jimbo Fisher (2013 - 519.1, 2012 - 470.8). The Noles ranked No. 25 overall in the nation in total offense.
- » Florida State returns 86.6 percent of its tackles in 2017 (653 of 754), including four of its Top 5 leaders in tackles: No. 1 Thomas, 77; No. 3 Marshall, 58; No. 4 Hoskins, 53; No. 5 Nnadi, 49.
- » Sophomore DE Brian Burns was outstanding in 2016, leading all freshman in sacks (9.5) en route to freshman All-America honors. Junior DE Josh Sweat wasn't far behind contributing 7.0 sacks in his second year as a starter in 2016.
- » Florida State ranked No. 1 in the NFL with 44 alumni on NFL rosters in 2016, including Pro Bowl CB Xavier Rhodes (Vikings), 2015 Rookie of the Year QB Jameis Winston (Buccaneers), former walk-on and undrafted free agent CB Javien Elliott (Buccaneers), Super Bowl star RB Devonta Freeman (Falcons) and four starting kickers: Sebastian Janikowski (Raiders), Dustin Hopkins (Redskins), Graham Gano (Panthers) and Roberto Aguayo (Buccaneers).

THE LAST TIME WE SAW THE NOLES...

- » FSU was celebrating at Hard Rock Stadium, tossing Oranges into the crowd following a thrilling 33-32 victory over No. 6 Michigan in the Orange Bowl.
- » Deondre Francois found Nyqwan Murray for a 12-yard game-winning touchdown with 36 seconds left after freshman wide receiver Keith Gavin took his first career kickoff return 66 yards to give the Noles great field position for the final drive.
- » The victory capped a five-game winning streak to end the season. The Seminoles finished 10-3 in 2016 and at No. 8 in the final Associated Press Poll, rebounding from a 3-2 start.

D RETURNS 15 WHO HAVE STARTED

- » Florida State returns 15 defensive players who have started at least one game in their careers.
- » The FSU defense has 186 career starts under its belt heading into 2017.
- » Defense career starts: DT Derrick Nnadi (24), DB Nate Andrews (21), DE Josh Sweat (20), LB Ro'Derrick Hoskins (19), DB Trey Marshall (18), LB Matthew Thomas (15), DT Demarcus Christmas (14), CB Tarvarus McFadden (13), DE/LB Jacob Pugh (12), DB Derwin James (10), DB A.J. Westbrook (8), DB Marcus Lewis (5), DB Ermon Lane (4), DT Fredrick Jones (2), LB Dontavious Jackson (1).

JUNIOR WRs LOOK TO EMERGE

- » Rising junior wide receivers Nyqwan "Noonie" Murray and Auden Tate enter the spring with the most experience of any Florida State receivers. Murray averaged 16.3 yards per catch, while Tate led the Noles with a 16.4 yards per reception average.
- » Murray totaled 27 receptions for 441 yards and five touchdowns in 2016 with 22 catches, 395 yards and all five scores coming over the final six games.
- » The Orlando, Fla., native caught two passes for 104 yards - both for touchdowns in the Orange Bowl, including an Orange-Bowl record 92-yard touchdown run-and-catch in the first quarter to put the Seminoles up 17-3. Murray thwarted Michigan's comeback when he grabbed the game-winning 12-yard touchdown pass from Francois with 36 seconds remaining as the Seminoles won, 33-32.
- » Murray, who switched his jersey to No. 8 from No. 80, had a nine-catch, 153-yard effort at NC State en route to ACC Receiver of the Week honors.
- » Tate emerged as a big-play threat as a sophomore, starting four games and finishing with six touchdowns on just 25 catches (4.2 catches per touchdown!). He totaled 409 yards.
- » Tate had six catches for 101 yards versus Boston College and caught two touchdowns at Louisville.

SACK ATTACK

- » Florida State led the nation in sacks per game (3.92) and finished second in total sacks (51) in 2016. The Noles return 68.6 percent of their sacks in 2017 (35 of 51). FSU loses consensus All-American defensive end DeMarcus Walker (16.0 sacks), but returns freshman All-American Brian Burns (9.5 sacks), two-year starter Josh Sweat (7.0 sacks), All-ACC nose tackle Derrick Nnadi (6.0 sacks) and three-year contributor Jacob Pugh (4.5 sacks) among others.

PATRICK HAS TWO 100+ GAMES

- » Rising junior running back Jacques Patrick has a pair of 100-yard rushing performances and enters with the most experience of any Seminole running

back, serving as the primary backup to Florida State's all-time leading rusher Dalvin Cook the last two seasons.

- » In his only career start, Patrick was dominant against Syracuse on Oct. 31, 2015, rushing for 162 yards and three touchdowns on 24 carries. A true freshman at the time, he added six catches for 62 yards to finish with 224 all-purpose yards against the Orange.
- » The Orlando, Fla., native also rushed for 124 yards and a score on one touchdown at USF in 2016.
- » For his career, Patrick has rushed 124 times for 664 yards (5.35 ypc) and nine touchdowns.

ANDREWS RETURNS FOR FIFTH YEAR

- » Defensive back Nate Andrews returns for a fifth year after injuries limited the Fairhope, Ala., native to just four games and a medical redshirt in 2016.
- » Andrews is the most experienced player on the Seminoles' roster having started at least one game in each of the last four years: 2013 (1), 2014 (13), 2015 (4), 2016 (3).
- » Andrews, primarily a safety, has appeared in 45 games with 21 total starts. He has 171 tackles, five forced fumbles and eight interceptions in his career.
- » Andrews is the only current Nole who regularly contributed on the 2013 national champion team, leading FSU with four interceptions. In 2014, he led FSU with three picks and ranked second on the team with 93 tackles.

IZZO ENTERS THIRD-YEAR AS STARTER

- » Redshirt junior Ryan Izzo returns as the starter at tight end for a third consecutive season and is poised to be the ACC's premier tight end.
- » The Highlands, N.J., native has 34 receptions for 444 yards (13.1 ypc) and three touchdowns over 27 career games with 23 starts.
- » The 6-5, 245-pound team leader is also an effective blocker, helping FSU total 466.2 total yards per game (third in the ACC) in 2016.

THOMAS DOMINATES WOLVERINES

- » Redshirt senior linebacker Matthew Thomas had the best performance of his career against No. 6 Michigan in the 2016 Orange Bowl, totaling a career-high 15 tackles and 3.5 TFLs en route to collecting ESPN All-Bowl team honors.
- » Thomas led FSU with 77 tackles in 2016 in his first year as a full-time starter for the Seminoles.
- » The Miami, Fla., native has totaled 107 tackles and 15.5 TFLs over 25 career games with 15 starts.

WHAT A PAIR

- » Ricky Aguayo and Logan Tyler flashed their talent as true freshmen specialists in 2016.
- » Aguayo, brother of three-time All-American Roberto Aguayo, collected ESPN True Freshman All-America and All-ACC honorable mention honors as FSU's primary placekicker. Aguayo nailed 19 of 26 field goals and 51 of 52 PATs. He made 6-of-6 field goals to tie a national freshman record in the season opener against No. 11 Ole Miss.
- » Tyler handled punting and kickoffs. He averaged 40.3 yards per punt. On kickoffs, he had 57 touchbacks on 90 kicks, an average of 64.1 yards per kick which ranked No. 1 in the ACC and No. 9 in the nation. Tyler kicked a 53-yard field goal on his first career attempt.

ANOTHER BANNER RECRUITING CLASS

- » Florida State signed an eighth consecutive Top 10 recruiting class in February and became the first program ever to sign three of Rivals Top 5 overall prospects in DT Marvin Wilson (No. 2), RB Cam Akers (No. 3) and DE Joshua Kaindoh (No. 5).
- » Akers and Kaindoh highlight a seven-member early enrollee class that will participate this spring that also includes cornerback Stanford Samuels, safety Cyrus Fagan, quarterback Bailey Hockman, tight end Tre' McKitty and linebacker Adonis Thomas.

FRANCOIS DAZZLES IN DEBUT

Florida State quarterback Deondre Francois was outstanding in his first season under center in 2016. The redshirt freshman from Orlando led all freshman nationally in passing yards per game (257.7) and total passing yards (3,350).

Francois...

- » Led Florida State to the biggest comeback victory in school history in his collegiate debut, bringing the Noles back from a 28-6 deficit en route to a 45-34 victory over No. 11 Ole Miss at the Camping World Kickoff. Francois passed for 419 yards and two touchdowns, while rushing for 59 yards. His 478 total-yard performance is the most ever by a freshman in ACC history. He was named Davey O'Brien National QB of the Week and ACC Offensive Back of the Week, and captured his first of four ACC Rookie of the Week accolades.
- » Had five 300-yard passing games in 2016.
- » Also found success with his legs, rushing for 198 yards and five touchdowns. He rushed for 75 yards at USF, including a 35-yard touchdown run.
- » Led Florida State to a 33-32 victory in the Orange Bowl, finding Nyqwan Murray for the game-winning 12-yard touchdown with 36 seconds left to defeat No. 6 Michigan. Tossed a 92-yard pass to Murray in the first quarter, marking the longest pass and catch in Orange Bowl history, the longest pass in FSU bowl history, the sixth-longest pass overall in FSU history and the longest play of 2016 for the Seminoles.

EBERLE LEADS OFF FIELD, ON FIELD

- » Redshirt junior center Alec Eberle will miss the spring with an injury, but there is not doubt he will have an impact on his teammates. The Mechanicsville, Va., native has made 19 consecutive starts for the Noles and will be FSU's most experienced offensive lineman this fall.
- » He's also a leader off the field. He was named to the AFCA's Good Works Team in 2016 as he was recognized for his work as Florida State's president of its Uplifting Athletes Chapter which raises funds for rare diseases.

PLENTY OF DEPTH, OPPORTUNITIES ON THE LINE

- » Florida State loses left tackle Rod Johnson, who left early for the NFL Draft following back-to-back seasons where he won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy as the ACC's top offensive lineman.
- » The Noles also lose guards Kareem Are (17 starts) and Wilson Bell (18 starts) to graduation. Bell was a reserve for most of the 2016 season.
- » The Noles have plenty of potential stars ready to step up, however. In addition to Eberle (19 starts), the Seminoles have several linemen with starting experience, including redshirt junior guard/tackle Derrick Kelly (6 starts), redshirt sophomore guard Cole Minshew (3 starts) senior tackle Rick Leonard (6 starts), redshirt junior tackle Brock Ruble (13 starts), redshirt junior center Corey Martinez (3 starts) and sophomore guard Landon Dickerson (7) who was on track to be a freshman All-American until he was sidelined with a knee injury.

MCFADDEN A GAME CHANGER AS SOPH

- » Junior Tarvarus McFadden burst onto the scene in 2016 by tying for the nation's lead with eight interceptions in his first year as a starter. He was a finalist for the Nagurski Trophy given to the nation's top defensive player and collected the Jack Tatum award as the nation's top defensive back from the Columbus Touchdown Club. He grabbed First Team All-America honors from FWAA and Phil Steele.
- » McFadden's eight picks are tied for the second-most in FSU history with Monk Bonasorte (8, 1979) and Curt Campbell (8, 1951). Terrell Buckley set the school record with 12 picks in 1991 en route to the Jim Thorpe Award.
- » McFadden's eight picks are tied for the eighth-most in a single-season in ACC history.

NOLES HAVE A FIVE-GAME WIN STREAK

- » Florida State will take a five-game win streak into 2017 after closing the 2016 season with victories vs. NC State (24-20), Boston College (45-7), Syracuse (45-14), No. 13 Florida (31-13) and No. 6 Michigan in the Orange Bowl (33-32). Only Oklahoma (10), Southern California (9) and Stanford (6) have longer win streaks among Power 5 teams. (Miami and Clemson also have won five straight)

WHO'S NEXT?

- » Florida State head coach Jimbo Fisher has coached a consensus All-American every year since taking over the Seminoles' program in 2010. RB Dalvin Cook and DE DeMarcus Walker became the 11th and 12th consensus All-Americans under Fisher in 2016. Cook is also likely to extend Florida State's streak of first round selections to five straight years. He could be the ninth first round pick under Fisher.

- » Florida State led the country in red zone scoring percentage again in 2016, converting 55 of 57 attempts for a 96.5 score percentage.
- » It was the highest percentage by college football team since FSU converted 97.3 percent of its red zone attempts (71-73) in 2013.
- » During Jimbo Fisher's tenure as a head coach, the Seminoles are converting 91.5 percent (386-422) of their red zone trips - the best mark in the country since 2010.

DEFENSE LOADED WITH EXPERIENCE

- » DeMarcus Walker's presence and production will be missed on the Seminole defense but FSU will return a wealth of players with extensive experience. Heading into 2017, the FSU defense will return 15 players that played in either 12 or all 13 games last season. On top of that experience, Nate Andrews will be back along with his 45 games played as will Derwin James who played in all 13 games as a freshman in 2015.

JIMBO'S SEC-CESS

- » In 10 career games against schools from the SEC, Jimbo Fisher is 9-1 at Florida State. In addition to the annual game against Florida, Fisher's FSU teams have recorded wins over Ole Miss (2016), Auburn (2013) and South Carolina (2010).
- » Florida State is averaging 30.1 points over those 10 games and outscoring opponents by 12.2 points per game (30.2-17.4). In five of the 10 games under Fisher versus SEC competition, FSU has scored 31 points or more six times.

WELCOME TO ATLANTA

- » For a long stretch, the last place in the world FSU wanted to play was Atlanta. From 1952-1975, the Seminoles posted an 0-8-1 record in Atlanta with eight of those games coming against Georgia Tech (0-7-1) and one versus LSU (0-1).
- » Since 1983, the Seminoles fortunes have changed in the A-T-L as FSU is 8-4 in its last 12 games played in Atlanta.
- » Florida State opens the 2017 season in Atlanta at Mercedes-Benz Stadium against Alabama on Sept. 2 in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game.

NOLES AT NEUTRAL SITES

- » Alabama holds the series lead all-time with FSU at 2-1-1 but in neutral site match-ups between the schools FSU actually holds the edge (1-0-1). In general, Florida State has been successful in regular season games played at neutral sites.
- » Since 1976, the year coach Bobby Bowden came to Tallahassee, FSU is 13-1 in non-conference, neutral site games. The lone loss was a 30-26 defeat at the hands of a Brett Favre-led Southern Mississippi team in 1989. If you include regular season conference games played at a neutral site, the Noles' record increases to 17-1 over the last 40 years.

MAKING THE SWITCH

- » Senior DB Ermon Lane became the latest Nole to find success after switching from offense to defense in 2016. A former WR, Lane moved to S and contributed 37 tackles and made five starts.
- » Senior RT Rick Leonard is another position switch success story for the Noles. Leonard was a reserve DE before moving to the OL and starting six games in 2016.
- » Leonard and Lane join NFL players Xavier Rhodes (WR to CB), Cameron Erving (DT to OL) and Karlos Williams (DB to RB) who have found great success following position changes.

Seven years into what has already become a legendary head coaching career, Florida State's Jimbo Fisher has established the Seminoles as one of the nation's premier college football programs and himself as one of the elite coaches of the current era.

Heading into his eighth season, Fisher has won five bowl games, including the 2013 National Championship and two Orange Bowl titles. He has the highest winning percentage in ACC history (.821) and his 78 total wins are the most by a Power Five coach through their first seven seasons in modern history. Fisher leads all active coaches in wins per season (11.1) and guided the Seminoles to three consecutive ACC Championships from 2012-2014, winning a school- and ACC-record 29 straight games in the process.

Fisher continues to develop NFL players at a higher rate than any head coach in the country. Since taking over in 2010, 38 of Fisher's protégés have been selected by NFL teams and 44 FSU players were on NFL rosters in 2016, giving Florida State the most alumni in the league.

Fisher's goal when he succeeded iconic head coach Bobby Bowden was to foster a program that sustained success by graduating student-athletes, turning out elite players and winning consistently. The Clarksburg, West Virginia, native has done just that while developing a family atmosphere. Fisher treats his players like his own sons, challenging and praising when necessary to develop relentless competitors who thrive under adversity and have all the tools to become responsible young

adults.

The results speak for themselves.

In his fourth year as head coach in 2013, Fisher planted the Seminoles back at the top of the college football world, leading Florida State to a 14-0 record en route to the final national championship of the BCS era. FSU has built on that success in the three seasons since. Fisher followed up the historic campaign – which included an NCAA record 723 points and the nation's No. 1 scoring defense (12.1) – by leading Florida State to the first-ever College Football Playoff Semifinals at the Rose Bowl and capturing the Noles' third consecutive Atlantic Coast Conference Championship in 2014.

Despite losing 11 draft picks to the NFL the following year, Fisher led the Seminoles to a 10-3 mark and the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl behind running back Dalvin Cook and All-Americans Jalen Ramsey and Roberto Aguayo.

The Seminoles returned to the Orange Bowl in 2016, joining Alabama as the nation's only programs to appear in five consecutive BCS/New Year's Six Bowls. Fisher's Noles rebounded from a 3-2 start in 2016 to go 7-1 down the stretch and finish with 10 wins for the sixth time in seven seasons. Led by ACC Rookie of the Year quarterback Deondre Francois and consensus All-Americans Cook and DeMarcus Walker, the Noles capped the season with a thrilling 33-32 victory over No. 6 Michigan in Miami.

Fisher and the Seminoles show no signs of slowing down, either. FSU returns 18 starters in 2017, and signed another top five recruiting class in February.

After 22 seasons as a college assistant, including three as FSU's offensive coordinator, Fisher in 2010 took over for Bowden - the second-winningest coach in major college football. The Seminoles' first new coach in 35 years, and just the ninth in program history, Fisher

hit the ground running and hasn't looked back. He led the Noles to a 10-4 mark in 2010 - the most wins by a first-year coach in FSU history - and the first of four ACC Atlantic Division titles. He followed with a 9-4 season in 2011 and improved to 12-2 in year three before the perfect 14-0 2013 campaign. The Seminoles finished 13-1 in 2014 ahead of back-to-back 10-3 campaigns in 2015 and 2016.

Known for his success in developing quarterbacks, Fisher has tutored three first-round NFL draft picks at the position while at FSU. That includes Jameis Winston, who became the first Seminole selected first overall in the NFL Draft, going to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2015. Christian Ponder (12th overall pick, 2011) and current Buffalo Bills quarterback EJ Manuel (16th overall, 2013) also developed under Fisher. Fisher guided Winston to one of the greatest seasons ever by a collegiate quarterback in 2013. Winston became the youngest player ever to win the Heisman Trophy, while collecting several other awards in addition to consensus All-America honors.

Overall, Fisher has seen 38 Seminoles drafted into the NFL, including 17 first- or second-rounders. In 2016, Ramsey was selected with the No. 5 overall pick by the Jacksonville Jaguars, while Aguayo was picked in the second round (59th overall) to become the highest drafted kicker in over a decade.

Florida State has been just as dominant on the recruiting trail under Fisher, putting together six top-five classes in the last seven years. In addition to the No. 1-ranked 2016 class Fisher's 2011 class was ranked No. 1 or 2 by every major recruiting service. In 2017, the Seminoles' class ranked in the top five as FSU became the first program in history to sign three of Rivals' top five overall prospects.

Off the field, Fisher has been arguably even more impressive. Since becoming head coach in 2010, Fisher has been very active in several efforts to raise funds and awareness for children with diseases, including his foundation, Kidz1stFund.

Kidz1stFund was founded in 2011 and is a national fund to raise awareness and research funds to find a cure for Fanconi anemia, a rare blood disease that affects many, including Fisher's youngest son Ethan. Kidz1stFund has already donated more than \$4.5 million to FA research at the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital, the largest FA treatment center in the country.

In May 2015, Fisher helped Dick Vitale and the V Foundation raise \$2.38 million in one night for pediatric cancer research at the longtime ESPN basketball analyst's 10th annual gala event. Fisher was honored at the event for his philanthropic efforts.

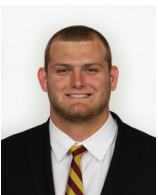

- » Head coach Jimbo Fisher extended his season opener record to a perfect 7-for-7.
- » The Seminoles came from 22 points behind by scoring 33 unanswered points to achieve the largest comeback in school history. Over a 6:12 time span between the second and third quarters, Florida State went from a 28-6 deficit to a 29-28 lead.
- » Deondre Francois became the fourth freshman quarterback in Florida State history to start the season opener and did so by throwing for 419 yards, the 16th-most in Florida State history, on 52 attempts with a pair of touchdowns.
- » Junior running back Dalvin Cook totaled 192 yards on 30 touches (23 carries for 91 yards, seven receptions for 101 yards). The 101 yards receiving made him the first Seminole running back since Lorenzo Booker in 2006 to have over 100 yards receiving in a game.
- » DeMarcus Walker achieved a career high in sacks with 4.5, all coming in the second half.
- » Ricky Aguayo broke the school record in field goals made and points by a kicker, going 6-for-6 and recording 21 points in his debut for the Seminoles.
- » The young Seminole secondary of Derwin James, Marcus Lewis and Tarvarus McFadden stood out as they forced Chad Kelly into throwing three interceptions.
- » After letting up 28 points in the first half the Seminole defense tightened up and only allowed six total points and held Ole Miss to 7 yards of offense in the third quarter.

- » The Seminoles extended their home winning streak to 22 straight games, the longest current streak in the country.
- » Junior receiver Travis Rudolph recorded his second career multi-touchdown game and his third career 100-yard receiving game. His second touchdown tied him with Kenny Shaw for the 23rd-most receiving touchdowns in Florida State history with 14.
- » The defense, led by senior defensive end DeMarcus Walker, forced three more turnovers to bring the season total to seven forced turnovers. All three turnovers were fumbles with two of them being forced on back-to-back drives by the Buccaneers in the first quarter that led to a 21-0 Seminoles lead.
- » The three fumble recoveries are the most for FSU since nabbing three vs. Ga. Tech in 2009.
- » Senior receiver Bobo Wilson helped cap off the Seminoles' 28-point first quarter with an 89-yard punt return for a touchdown with 0:22 left in the quarter. This marked the third longest punt return in school history as well as the first punt return for a touchdown since Tyler Hunter's against Duke in 2012.
- » With a one-yard touchdown run in the first quarter and a 37-yarder in the third quarter, junior running back Dalvin Cook moved into fifth place all-time at FSU with 29 career rushing touchdowns. Cook is now one touchdown behind Amp Lee (1989-91) and Devonta Freeman (2011-13) for third place.
- » Freshman defensive end Brian Burns led the Seminoles with two sacks and five tackles.

- » Junior running back Dalvin Cook rushed for a career-high 267 yards and two touchdowns on 28 carries to go along with a team-high 62 yards on four receptions. This marked Cook's third career 200-yard rushing game and the second most rushing yards in school history.
- » Sophomore defensive back Tarvarus McFadden nabbed his third interception of the season.
- » The Noles scored 38 unanswered points from 10:22 left in the first quarter to 3:22 left in the third quarter.
- » With two interceptions against the Bulls, Florida State has forced 10 turnovers in the first four games after tallying 15 in 2015.
- » Sophomore running back Jacques Patrick rushed for 124 yards and a touchdown. It is his second consecutive game with over 75 rushing yards. With Cook, it was just the third 200/100 rushing game in FSU history and the first since 1985.

- » Junior running back Dalvin Cook became the first Florida State running back to have 100 yards rushing and 100 yards receiving in a game, totaling 140 on the ground and a career-high 106 in the air.
- » Cook had 29 carries and tied his record high of three touchdowns. He had six catches, including a 41-yard gain that is the longest pass play of the year for the Noles.
- » It was Cook's 15th 100-yard rushing game. This puts him in third place in the FSU record books behind Greg Allen (17) and Warrick Dunn (22).
- » This game marked the sixth consecutive game that the Noles forced a turnover, led by red-shirt junior linebacker Matthew Thomas who forced a fumble leading into half that was recovered by junior linebacker Jacob Pugh. It kept UNC from increasing its 21-7 lead before halftime.
- » Quarterback Deondre Francois had over 400 yards of total offense, passing for 372 yards and adding 32 on the ground. His two-yard touchdown run with :23 remaining in the fourth quarter gave the Seminoles their first lead of the game.
- » The tight end pair of Ryan Izzo and Mavin Saunders came into their own combining for seven catches for 137 yards.
- » The loss snapped the Noles 22 game home winning streak, which included 17 straight ACC wins. FSU's last home loss came to Florida in 2012. It was the longest streak in the country.
- » It was the first time since the 2010 loss against North Carolina that FSU lost a game and did not commit a turnover.

- » Junior running back Dalvin Cook continued his streak of 100-yard rushing games with his third in a row and 16th of his career. Cook ran for 150 yards on 27 carries to go along with a 59-yard touchdown reception. It was Cook's third consecutive game with over 200 yards from scrimmage.
- » Cook has 784 yards from scrimmage over the past three weeks, the highest three-game total in FSU history.
- » Redshirt freshman quarterback Deondre Francois shined in his first FSU-Miami game by racking up 255 total yards while throwing for 234 yards and two touchdowns and running for another 21 yards. His two touchdown passes covered 59 and 20 yards. The 59-yard catch-and-run by Cook was the longest pass play of the season for the Seminoles.
- » Tarvarus McFadden recorded his fourth interception of the season, tied for the national lead with five other players. His pick against Miami quarterback Brad Kaaya came in the end zone. He is the first Seminole since current senior Nate Andrews in 2013 to have four interceptions in a season.
- » The four interceptions are the most for any player in head coach Jimbo Fisher's six-plus seasons.
- » With Miami looking to tie the score after a fourth-down touchdown made the score 20-19 with 1:38 remaining, senior defensive end DeMarcus Walker got a hand on the point after try to provide the final margin of victory. It was the second consecutive week the Noles blocked an extra point in the final minutes of a game.
- » It was the seventh consecutive win over Miami (all under Fisher), tying the longest winning streak in the 61-game history of the series (FSU, 1963-72, all played in Miami).

- » Junior wide receiver Travis Rudolph recorded the second 200-yard receiving game of his career, finishing with 238 yards on 13 catches against the Demon Deacons in FSU's 17-6 win.
- » The output is the fourth-highest receiving total in school history and the most since Peter Warrick had 249 against Clemson in 1997. Rudolph is just the third player in school history with multiple 200-yard receiving games (Ron Sellers, 5; Craphonso Thorpe, 2).
- » The 13 receptions are tied for the fifth-most in school history with a number of players, most recently done by Rashad Greene in 2014 against Virginia.
- » Running back Dalvin Cook hit the 100-yard mark for the fourth consecutive game, finishing with 115 yards on 25 carries for the Seminoles. It was the first 200-yard receiving, 100-yard rushing combo for FSU since Sellers had a school-record 260 through the air and Tom Bailey had 105 on the ground against Wake Forest in 1968.
- » Quarterback Deondre Francois was solid on the day, finishing with 319 yards, his third game reaching the 300-yard plateau. He also recorded a two-yard touchdown run, his third of the season. His 11-yard touchdown pass to Auden Tate put the final points on the board for the Noles and was Tate's fourth touchdown catch, a team high.
- » The FSU defense forced three Wake Forest turnovers. Sophomore defensive back Tarvarus McFadden intercepted John Wolford in the second quarter, his fifth interception of the season which leads the country. McFadden is the first FSU player with five interceptions in a season under Jimbo Fisher and the first since Patrick Robinson recorded six in 2007.
- » Defensive end DeMarcus Walker had two more sacks, pushing his season total to 8.5, second-most in the country. His 21.0 career sacks are 11th in school history and just a half-sack away from the Top 10.
- » Defenders Ermon Lane and Dontavious Jackson made their first starts of the season. For Lane, it was his first defensive start after making two at wide receiver in 2014. Jackson was the starting linebacker in place of Matthew Thomas, who was out for the first half.

- » Junior running back Dalvin Cook rushed for 169 yards on just 19 carries. Cook scored on two runs of over 40 yards for the first time in his career, 43 and 70, and recorded the first four touchdown game for FSU since Antone Smith had four at Miami in 2008.
- » Cook became the seventh player in ACC history, and just the second Seminole (Warrick Dunn), to eclipse 1,000 yards rushing in three consecutive seasons.
- » Sophomore receiver Nyqwan Murray had six catches for 96 yards and the first touchdown of his career, playing extended minutes in the absence of Bobo Wilson (foot).
- » Sophomore defensive back Tarvarus McFadden came away with his sixth interception to continue to lead the nation in interceptions. McFadden's six interceptions are the most by a Seminole in a single season since Patrick Robinson had six of his own in 2007.
- » Marquez White also came away with an interception, which marked the 11th interception of the season for the Seminoles. FSU had eight in all of 2015.
- » Junior receiver Travis Rudolph's reception in the second quarter helped extend his catch streak to 26 consecutive games.
- » Freshman defensive end Brian Burns came away with his fifth sack of the season as Florida State got to Deshaun Watson four times. DeMarcus Walker, Derrick Nnadi and Demarcus Christmas combined for four pass breakups.

- » Sophomore defensive back Tarvarus McFadden came away with his seventh interception of the season in the first quarter.
- » McFadden leads the country in interceptions and is the first Seminole since Samari Rolle in 1997 to have seven in a season
- » This interception extends FSU's streak of takeaways to 10 games.
- » Junior running back Dalvin Cook rushed for 65 yards and a touchdown as he inched closer to becoming the Seminoles' all-time leading rusher.
- » With 3,833 career yards, Cook is just 127 yards from breaking Warrick Dunn's school record of 3,959 rushing yards.

- » The 45-7 victory over Boston College was Florida State's largest against an ACC opponent since beating Wake Forest 43-3 in 2014.
- » The Seminoles rang up 180 yards on the ground and one touchdown, and added 236 yards through the air with five passing touchdowns, the most in a game for FSU since also throwing five in the 2015 season opener against Texas State.
- » The Noles came away 6-for-6 in the red zone, improving to 44 of 46 (96 pct.) on the year.
- » Florida State shutout Boston College through the first three quarters, extending their shut-out streak against the Eagles to eight quarters dating back to the third quarter in 2014. The Eagles scored with 3:21 left in the game to end the streak. In the second quarter, the Eagles totaled -7 yards. In the second and third quarters, Boston College did not record a first down.

- » Junior running back Dalvin Cook became Florida State's all-time leading rusher with a 41-yard run in the first quarter. Cook finished the game with 4,166 career rushing yards, breaking Warrick Dunn's 20-year FSU record of 3,959 career-rushing yards.
- » Cook ended the game with 225 yards on 28 carries and tied his and FSU's single game rushing touchdown record with four. Cook's 225 yards are the fifth-most in FSU history (Cook has three of the top five spots).
- » Cook became the first running back in ACC history to rush for 4,000 yards in just three seasons and currently ranks third in ACC history in rushing yards.
- » Sophomore defensive back Tarvarus McFadden came away with yet another interception when he picked off Syracuse quarterback Zack Mahoney in the second quarter. He leads the country with eight interceptions on the season.
- » The FSU defense had a stout performance against Syracuse as they came away with eight sacks, the most since eight against BYU in 2010.
- » True freshman defensive end Brian Burns had the best game of his young career as he came away with a blocked punt (an FSU player's first since 2010) and 2.5 sacks to give him 8.0 sacks on the season, the most nationally among freshmen.
- » Senior defensive end DeMarcus Walker came away with 2.0 sacks on Mahoney to give him 13.0 on the year and 25.5 in his career, third in school history.
- » Redshirt freshman quarterback Deondre Francois recorded his fifth 300-yard passing game of the season, tying Chris Rix (2001) for second-most by a freshman.
- » Junior receiver Travis Rudolph ranks 8th in career receptions (146) and 9th in yards (2,225) after nabbing five catches for 64 yards and a touchdown.

- » Doak Walker Award finalist Dalvin Cook finished with 153 yards on 26 carries, including a 17-yard touchdown run in the first quarter.
- » Cook now has eight 100-yard rushing games in 2016 and 21 in his career, one behind Warrick Dunn's 22 for the most in school history. He is the second Seminole (Sammie Smith, 1986-88) to rush for over 100 yards against the Gators in three straight seasons.
- » Cook recorded his school-record setting 45th rushing touchdown at the 4:46 mark of the first quarter. The 17-yard rush was Cook's 18th of the season, two off the school record set by Greg Allen in 1982 and one short of his 19 from last season.
- » Cook's 47 total touchdowns are two behind Warrick Dunn's FSU record.
- » Senior defensive end DeMarcus Walker recorded the first two fumble recoveries of his career, including one in the fourth quarter when he emerged with the ball following Derrick Nnadi's sack of Florida quarterback Austin Appleby at the Gator 28-yard line. That recovery helped set up the final Seminole touchdown of the game.
- » True freshman defensive end Brian Burns recorded another 1.5 sacks against Florida, pushing his season total to 9.5. It ties for the 19th-most in single-season history at Florida State.
- » Burns 9.5 sacks are the most in the country by a freshman.
- » The Florida State defense held Florida without a third down conversion (0-12) in the win. It marks the first time since 2004 when FSU defeated North Carolina 38-16 at home that the Seminoles have held an opponent without a third down conversion. The Tar Heels went 0-for-11 in that contest.
- » Travis Rudolph's four receptions in the third quarter extended his reception streak to 30 straight games, including a touchdown reception (46 yards) in four straight games.

- » Doak Walker Award finalist Dalvin Cook finished with 145 yards on 20 carries, including a 2-yard touchdown run in the first quarter.
- » This game marked Cook's ninth 100-yard rushing games in 2016 and 22nd of his career, tying Warrick Dunn's 22 for the most in school history.
- » Cook finished with 1,765 yards on the season topping his 1,691 from the year before for most rushing yards in a season at Florida State.
- » Cook recorded his school-record setting 46th rushing touchdown at the 12:47 mark of the first quarter. The 2-yard rush was Cook's 19th of the season.
- » Redshirt freshman quarterback Deondre Francois' 92 yard pass to sophomore Nyquan Murray was the longest reception in Orange Bowl history.
- » Francois connected with Murray again with 36 seconds remaining for the game-winning 12-yard touchdown.
