#### On Blixt

- Helped lead Florida State to an appearance in the 2006 NCAA East Regional Championship – the first appearance in the NCAA Tournament for the Seminoles since the 1998 season.
- In his third season as a Seminole, he will contend once again to earn the No. 1 position in the Seminoles' lineup and will contend for national and ACC honors as he continues to hone his game.
- Has played Florida State's No. 1 player 10 times during his career.
- Earned medalist honors in the Gator Invitational during the spring of 2005 and earned a total of six top-20 finishes during the spring 2005 and fall 2006 seasons and nine top-20 individual finishes in 22 career events.
- Averages 73.60 strokes in 65 rounds in 22 tournaments during the first two years of his career.

#### Fall 2004

- Burst onto the Seminoles' scene with an outstanding first semester and earned the honor of having the Seminoles' low stroke average for the fall season.
- Led the team with five rounds at par or better and eight rounds with 75 or lower.
- Earned his best finish of the fall season and the first top-25 individual finish of his career with a 25th place finish at the Gary Koch/Cleveland Golf Intercollegiate.

#### Spring 2005

- The Seminoles' top golfer who appeared in all six tournaments including the first Atlantic Coast Conference Championship of his career.
- Won his first individual title at the Gator Invitational as he became the first Seminole to earn an individual title since Mark Donaldson won medalist honors at the 2001 Cavalier Classic.
- Led the team with the most number of scores at 74 or below (11) and low round (career-best 68) in the 3rd round of the Gator Invitational.
- Earned a top-20 finish in his first career ACC Championship as he finished in a tie for 18th place.

#### Fall 2005

- Led the team in stroke average (73.00), scores at par or better (six) and finished with 11 of 12 rounds with scores at 75 or better.

- Was a total of 14 over par and did not finish more than six over par in any of his four events during the season.
- Best tournament score of 215 came in the Tennessee Tournament of Champions as he finished in a season's best tied for 21st place in the individual standings.

#### Spring 2006

- Averaged a team-leading 73.19 strokes in 36 rounds during eight tournaments.
- Played in a single-season career-high eight tournaments and led the Seminoles to the NCAA East Regional Championship for the first time since 1998.
- Earned two top-10 finishes with a tied-for-seventh standing at the Lexus/Naples Intercollegiate and a tied-for-10th place finish at the U.S. Collegiate Championship.
- Tied his career best for a 36-hole score with a 141 total (71-70) in the first two rounds of the Lexus/Naples event.
- Played the best ACC Championship of his career with a 214 total (71-73-70, -2 vs. par) and a tied-for-20th finish in the individual standings. He knocked nine strokes from his first career ACC Championship in 2005.
- Counted 20 of his 24 rounds (.833 percent) toward the team score during the season and tied for the team lead as he finished as the top Seminole golfer in three events.

- A member of the Swedish national boy's team from 1999-2002 and a member of the men's amateur team in 2003 and 2004.
- Earned medalist honors at the Swedish national stroke championship in 2003.

## On Jeon

- Helped the Seminoles advance to the 2006 NCAA East Regional Championship for the first time since 1998.
- One of three players in the Seminoles' 2006-07 roster who has played in multiple ACC Championships (two) during his career.
- Has carded his career-low tying score of 69 three times – during the spring 2005 Gator Invitational, the fall 2005 Shoal Creek Intercollegiate and the spring 2006 ACC Championship.
- Florida State's top finisher at the 2005 ACC Championship with a tied-for-12th-place finish.
- Top career outing came at the spring 2005 Gator Invitational with personal best for finish (tied for fifth), low single-round score (69), low 36-hole score (143), best tournament score (212) and best tournament score vs. par (+2).
- Averages 75.17 strokes in 46 rounds during 16 events in the first two years of his career.

## Fall 2004

- Earned his way into the Seminoles' starting lineup for two of the final three events of the fall season.
- Played well in his three outings and carded single round scores of 75 in each of his first two events.

## Spring 2005

- One of only two Seminoles to play in all six events during the spring season, including the first ACC Championship of his career.
- Earned two top 15 finishes – a tie for fifth place finish at the Gator Invitational and a tie for 12th place at the ACC Championship.
- Played the best golf of his first year at Florida State at the Gator Invitational as he established personal best for finish (tied for fifth), low single-round score (69), low 36-hole score (143), best tournament score (212) and best tournament score vs. par (2).

## Fall 2005

- Played in two events and earned the fourth top-25 finish of his career at the Shoal Creek Intercollegiate.
- Tied his career-low with a 69 in the second round of the Shoal Creek Intercollegiate in the second event of the fall season.
- Was one of three Seminoles during

the season (also Torstein Nevestad and Nick Smith) to card single-round scores in the 60's.

- Finished third on the team with a career-low 73.33 scoring average in six rounds during two events.

## Spring 2006

- Played in a career-high six events including the 2006 NCAA East Regional Championship.
- A member the Seminoles' starting lineup at the NCAA East Regional and helped Florida State finish in 14th place in the event.
- Tied his career-low score for a single-round with a 69 in the second round of the ACC Championship.
- Played well as an individual in the Florida State hosted Seminole Intercollegiate with a 221 total and a tied for 30th place finish in the event. He scored a 70 in the second round of the event which was tied for the best score in the event by a Seminole player.
- Had nearly 90 percent of his single-round scores counted toward the team total (11.5 of 13/.885 percent) for the season.
- Averaged 75.94 strokes in 17 rounds during six events.

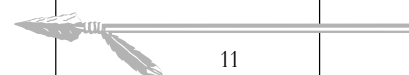

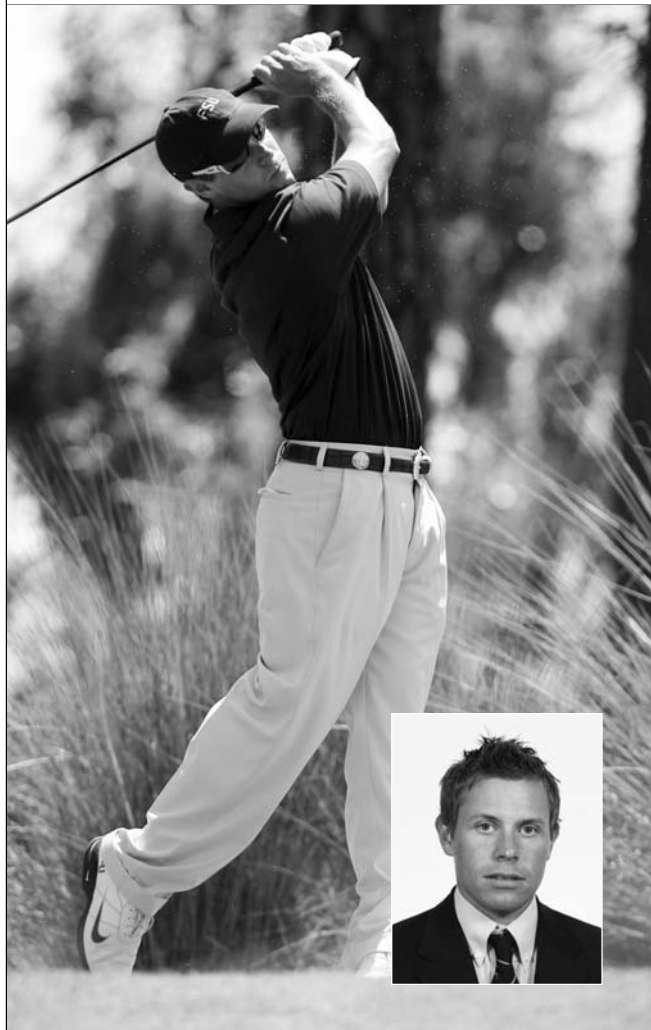

## TORSTEIN NEVESTAD

Senior • Height: 5-9 • Swings: Right • Oslo, Norway  
Ullern Vas Norwegian College/Florida Atlantic University



*Torstein Nevestad has competed in over 30 events during his collegiate career and is one of two seniors on the Seminoles' roster.*

### On Nevestad

- The Seminoles' most experienced golfer with 32 career tournaments played and one of two seniors (also Bradley Ruch) on Florida State's roster for the 2006-07 fall and spring seasons.
- Became a Seminole after transferring from Florida Atlantic and enrolling at Florida State during the spring 2005 semester.
- Carded his career-best single-round score of 65 in the first round of the Lexus/Naples Intercollegiate during the spring 2006 season.
- Has earned eight career top-10 individual finishes including two during his Florida State career. He has earned top-25 individual finishes in 16 of his 32 career events and has finished in the top 20 in 12 events during his career.
- Has earned medalist honors twice during his career and has eight top 10 finishes to his credit. He finished in first place in the individual standings at the Stetson Fall Intercollegiate during the fall of 2003 and the Daytona Beach Invitational during the fall of 2004.
- Best career tournament score of 211 (-5) came during the fall 2004 Charleston Southern Invitational.
- Led his Florida Atlantic team in stroke average in each of his three semesters of competition with the Owls.

### Fall 2003

- Started for Florida Atlantic in all four matches during the fall season.
- Shot his career low for a single round (first of two times in his career) with a 68 in the first round of the rain short-ened Charleston Southern Fall Invitational.

### Spring 2004

- Selected as the Atlantic Sun Freshman-of-the-Year and was named to the Second-Team All-Conference and All-Freshmen teams.
- Was a member of Florida Atlantic's starting line-up for a single-season career-high six matches during the spring season and once again led the team in scoring average.
- Finished in the top 30 in five of six matches during the spring season and earned a second place finish at the El Diablo Classic.

### Fall 2004

- A regular in the Owls' starting line-up in all five matches during the fall.

- Led the team for the third semester in low scoring average.
- Finished in the top 10 in three of five matches during the season.
- Career low tournament score of 211 (-5 is also his best tournament score vs. par) at the Charleston Southern Fall Invitational.
- Earned medalist honors and helped guide the Owls to a first place team finish (out of 14 teams) at the Daytona Beach Invitational.

### Spring 2005

- Competed in four tournaments including his first career ACC Championship in his first semester as a Florida State golfer.
- Helped lead the Seminoles to three top-10 finishes including a sixth place finish at the Florida State hosted Seminole Intercollegiate.

### Fall 2005

- Played in four events and helped the Seminoles to four top-10 team finishes including a third place standing at the Tennessee Tournament of Champions.
- Tied for the team lead as he carded 11 (out of 12 rounds) with scores at 75 or below. His only score not at 75 or below was a 76 in the third round of The Ridges Intercollegiate.
- Best finish of the season came at the Shoal Creek Intercollegiate as he finished tied for 14th place with a two-over par score of 218.
- Low round of the season (70) came in the second round of the Shoal Creek Tournament.
- The Seminoles' leading finisher at the Shoal Creek Intercollegiate.
- Finished second on the team with a 73.33 stroke average in 12 rounds during four events.

### Spring 2006

- A team leader who helped the Seminoles finish 14th in the NCAA East Regional Championship.
- Shot a career-low 65 in the first round of the Lexus/Naples Intercollegiate. He tied his career low tournament score with a five-under par score of 211 in finishing in sixth place at the Lexus/Naples event.
- His single-round score of 65 at the Lexus/Naples event was tied for the best round of the season (with Matt Savage's 65 in the NCAA East Regional) while his tournament score at the

Lexus/Naples event led the team for the spring season.

- Finished as the team leader at the Gator Invitational (tied for sixth in the individual standings) and at the Lexus/Naples Intercollegiate (sixth place).

- Played well in his second career ACC Championship with a four-over par score of 220 and a tied-for-35th-place individual finish.

- Counted 20 of 27 rounds during the season (.740 percent) to the team score.

- Averaged 74.44 strokes in 27 rounds during nine tournaments.

- Attended Florida Atlantic University in Boca Raton, Fla., during the fall 2003, spring 2004 and fall 2004 seasons.

- Won his first college individual championship at the Stetson Intercollegiate in 2003.

- A member of the 2002 Norwegian World Championship team and won the individual 2002 Norwegian World Championship.

- The top finisher at the 2002 European Team Championship.

- Led his team to a first place finish at the 2001 and 2002 Norwegian Team Championship and the 2001 Nordic Team Championship.

#### Fall 2003

- Played in one event – the Landfall Tradition – during his first season as a member of the Seminole men's golf team.

#### Spring 2004

- A staple in the Seminoles' starting lineup as he appeared in all seven events for the Seminoles.
- Was one of only three players (also Rusty Mosley and Matt Adcock) who played in all seven events during the season.
- Ranked first on the team with 16 rounds scored at 75 or below, second on the team with a 74.33 stroke average and was second on the team with rounds at par or better (five). His career-best 69 at the Atlanta Intercollegiate was the second best single-round score among the Seminole teammates during the season.
- Led the team as he counted 20 of his 21 rounds played for the season (.952 percent) towards the team score.
- Florida State's top finisher in two events – the Seminole Intercollegiate and the Palmetto Intercollegiate – in consecutive events during the month of March.

#### Fall 2004

- The only Seminole to compete in all five of the team's events during the fall season.
- Tied for the team low with a single-round score of 69 during the first round of the Mason Rudolph Intercollegiate.
- Career-best tournament outing of 214 total (+1) came at the Mason Rudolph Intercollegiate.
- Established career-best scores of gross tournament score (214), tournament score vs. par (+1), best 36-hole score (143) and tied his career-low for single-round score (69) in finishing in a tie for 21st in the individual standings at the Mason Rudolph.

#### Spring 2005

- Competed in three events including his second career ACC Championship.
- Earned his second career top-15 finish as he tied for 15th in the Florida State hosted Seminole Intercollegiate.

- Played his best golf of the spring season as he finished with a 220 tournament score for an average of 73.33 strokes in three rounds.

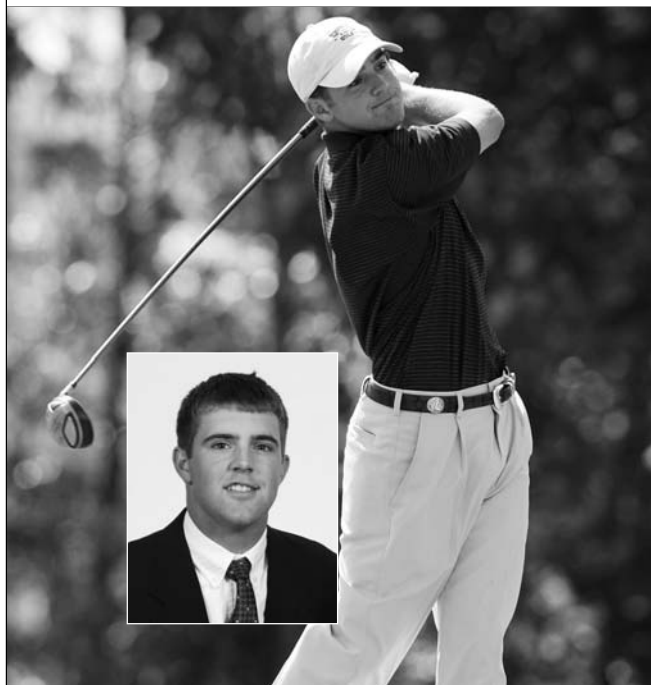

### MATT SAVAGE

**Louisville, Ky. (St. Xavier)**



- Advanced to the quarterfinals of the 2006 U.S. Amateur Public Links Championship.

- Played in the prestigious 2006 U.S. Amateur Tournament.

- Won the individual championship at the Kentucky State Open in 2006.

- Ranked second on the team with a 73.76 stroke average in 33 rounds during 11 tournaments as a freshman.

#### Fall 2005

- Helped Florida State to four top-10 team finishes as he participated in all four events for the Seminoles' during the fall season. He was one of three Seminoles (also Jonas Blixt and Torstein Nevestad) who played in all four events during the fall season.

- Finished second on the team in rounds at par or better (four of 12) and third on the team with scores at 75 or better (eight of 12).

- Best event of the season was his first as he finished with a one-over par total of 214 which earned him a tied-for-18th-place individual finish at the Tennessee Tournament of Champions.

- Best finish of the season (tied for 17th) came at the Gary Koch.

- Counted nine of his 12 rounds (.750 percent) towards the team score during his first season as a collegian.

- Averaged a career-low 73.42 strokes in 12 rounds during four events.

#### Spring 2006

- Played in seven of Florida State's nine events including the ACC Championship and the NCAA East Regional Championship.

- Tied for third on the team with six rounds at par or better and fourth on the team with 13 rounds scored at 75.

- Finished as the Seminoles' leader in the individual standings with a tied for 12th place finish in the ACC Championship and a career-best tied for 10th place finish in the inaugural Linger Longer Invitational.

- Best career tournament came in his first ACC Championship appearance as he finished tied for 12th (team leader) with a career-best score of four-under par 212. His scores at the ACC Championship were 67-71-74 with his 138 total for the first two rounds ranking as his career 36-hole best. He was second in the individual standings after the first round of the event and tied for sixth after the second round

and played 46 of his 54 holes at par or better in the ACC Championship.

- Saved his best for last as he recorded a seven-under par 65 in the final round of the NCAA East Regional Championship. He made the biggest move of the final day of the event for Florida State on the individual scoreboard as he finished with a seven-under par score of 65 to move from 112th place after the first two rounds into a tie for 44th in the final standings.

- Counted 80 percent of his single-round scores (12 of 16) toward the team score during the season.

- Averaged 73.93 strokes (second on the team) in 21 rounds during seven tournaments.

#### Before Florida State

- Graduated from St. Xavier in 2005.

- Named the National Player of the Year and earned All-American honors by the National High School Coaches Association as a senior in 2005.

- An AJGA All-American Honorable Mention selection his junior season.

- Helped lead Florida State to a 14th place finish in the 2006 NCAA East Regional Championship at Lake Nona Golf Club in Orlando, Fla.

- Earned four career top-20 finishes as a freshman including his career-best top-10 finish at the Linger Longer Invitational during the spring of 2006.

## On Smith

- The Seminoles' top individual finisher at the 2006 NCAA East Regional Championship. He finished tied for 18th in the individual standings to lead Florida State to a 14th place finish in the team standings in the event. He closed the event with scores of 74-74-71 for a total of three-over par 219 in the event at the Lake Nona Golf and Country Club in Orlando, Fla.
- Played in 12 events (tied for second on the team), recorded 10 rounds with scores of par or better (tied for second), totaled 23 rounds with scores of 75 or better (third) and averaged 74.42 strokes per round (fourth) as a freshman.

## Spring 2006

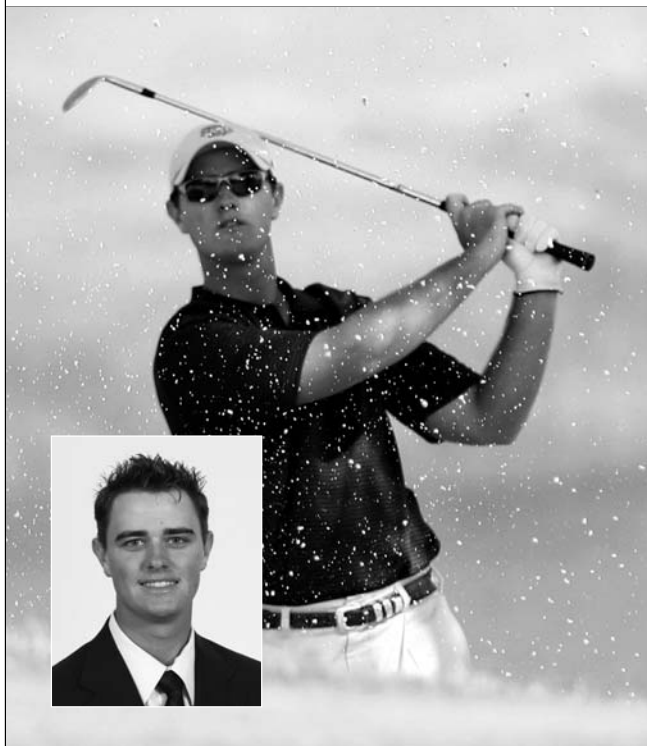
