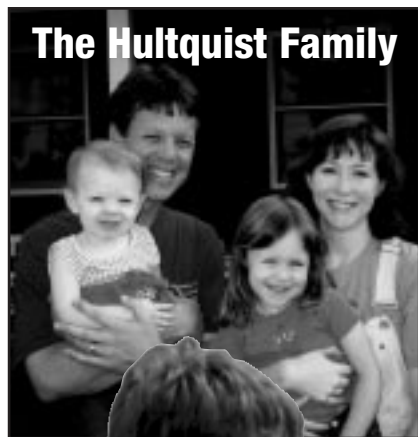

The Hultquist Family

Dwayne Hultquist begins his fourth season at Florida State and with his strong recruiting and deep roster, the 2002-2003 version of Seminole tennis could be his best yet. When he took over the program, Hultquist insisted that Florida State would contend among the Atlantic Coast Conference's top teams, challenge FSU's non-conference opponents and grow stronger as a program. In 2001-2002, Hultquist helped bring FSU its first ever ACC Champion doubles team in Xavier Luscan and Rodrigo Laub. Luscan also made it to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Hultquist's fourth team is his strongest yet and is ready to take Florida State to the next level.

With a passion for the sport of tennis, Hultquist has always wanted to accomplish one thing. That one thing is the desire to become a successful Division I collegiate coach. In the summer of 1999, Hultquist's hiring as the Seminole head men's tennis coach culminated a decade-long journey to fulfill his dream. Hultquist's immediate goal for FSU was to strengthen its schedule and to provide for upward movement in the rankings. He is a firm believer that better opponents will bring about higher rankings. Hultquist has stayed firm in this belief by bringing tougher competition to the Seminoles each year. Entering his fourth year, Hultquist maintains high hopes for the future of his Seminole program.

In his first year, Hultquist brought the Seminoles a winning record of 14-10. In his second year, the men's team finished the season going 10-14 and entered the 2001-02 season ranked No. 59 in the Intercollegiate Tennis Association's rankings.

Hultquist arrived at Florida State after serving eight years as an assistant coach at the University of Texas. While working under legendary coach Dave Snyder at Texas, Hultquist became known for his excellent recruiting abilities. He was also responsible for scheduling, fundraising, individualized coaching and many of the day-to-day operations of the program.

While at Texas, Hultquist coached nine All-Americans, helped

lead the Longhorns to six conference titles and made it to the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 in each of his eight years. Texas reached the national semifinals in 1993 after defeating defending National Champion Stanford. The doubles team of Chad Clark and Trey Phillips reached the NCAA finals. Former player Jack Brasington has climbed into the 120's in the world rankings.

Hultquist began his tennis career at Penn State where he was a four-year letterman and team captain in 1986. During that same year, he was an NCAA Tournament qualifier in doubles, and earned all-conference honors in both singles and doubles. After graduating from Penn State, Hultquist turned pro, playing in the United States, Israel and Asia. During his career, Hultquist was selected to play on national teams that traveled to Korea and China for competition. He also participated in a goodwill tour for the United States in Okinawa, Japan, where he participated in exhibition matches and helped direct clinics for the U.S. Military.

Hultquist's coaching career began when he accepted a job with the USTA in 1988. His playing experience helped prepare him to become the USTA Boy's National Team Coach. There he was able to travel overseas for international tournaments, as well as tournaments such as the Orange Bowl, Easter Bowl and the Reebok Cup. In 1991, Hultquist began his collegiate coaching career when he accepted a graduate assistant position at the University of Kentucky, where he was responsible for individualized coaching, recruiting and co-directing the National Collegiate Indoor Team Championships. When the position at Texas opened up, Hultquist jumped at the chance and has never looked back.

Hultquist is married to the former Angela White. The couple has a four-year old daughter, Devan and two-year old daughter, Avery.

ASSISTANT COACH, 3RD SEASON

As Ty Braswell enters his third season as the Seminole assistant men's tennis coach, he brings with him higher expectations for the 2002-2003 season. Braswell knows Florida State tennis. He knows the program, the people and the competition, which makes him a huge asset to the program.

With two years of coaching at FSU under his belt, Braswell will continue to offer his leadership and knowledge of the game that is sure to be of benefit to each of the players. Having graduated from Florida State only four years ago, where he was a celebrated member of the men's tennis team himself and team captain from 1997-99, Braswell knows what it takes to lead this team to victory. Braswell will continue to assist in helping head coach Dwayne Hultquist to take the Seminole men's tennis program to the next level.

Braswell became a member of the Florida State University coaching staff when he accepted the position as assistant men's tennis coach on July 1, 2000. By accepting this position on the tennis team, Braswell switched from player to coach.

During his senior campaign in 1998-99, Braswell was the only ranked Seminole in singles and tied his career high with 19 wins. Braswell also won the Flight One Singles Championship at the Seminole Fall Classic and advanced to the quarterfinals of the ITA Region II Indoor Championships where he defeated the No. 13th player in the nation.

In his 1997-98 season, he boasted 17 victories in doubles and gained an ACC tournament victory over Georgia Tech's nationally ranked doubles team. Braswell played at the No. 1 and 2 singles position all season where he held a singles ranking as high as 60 in the ITA Singles Rankings.

The previous season (1996-97) Braswell played at the No. 1 and 2 singles positions while defeating five nationally ranked players including Florida's Jon Glover to clinch a 4-3 victory over the 10th ranked Gators. Braswell teamed with Yvo Niks to win the ACC No. 2 doubles championship.

As a freshman in 1995-96, he played at the No. 3, 4, and 5 singles positions where he put together a respectable 18-13 singles record which was third best on the team. In addition, Braswell was 10-7 at No. 2 and 3 doubles where he and his partner defeated a nationally ranked duo in the team's

biggest win of the season. He also clenched the Flight 4 Singles Championship in the Seminole Fall Classic.

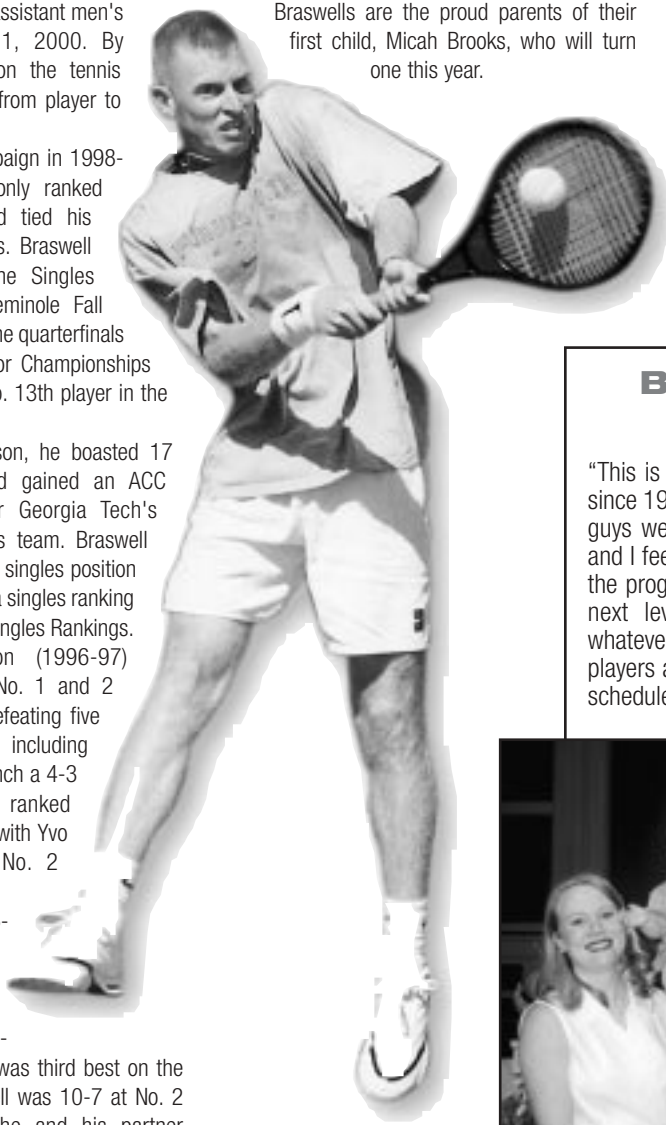
In high school he was ranked as high as No. 5 in the country in the Boys 18 and under division, while being ranked as high as No.1 in Florida in Boys 18 and under division.

Braswell participated in the 1995 U.S. Olympic Festival in Colorado where he won two gold medals and one silver medal. He was a finalist in the 1993 U.S. National Clay Court Championship.

From 1999-2000, Ty Braswell served as the Assistant Tennis Pro at Laurel Oak Tennis Club in Sarasota, Florida.

Braswell graduated from Florida State in 1999 with a degree in Sports Administration. In October of 1999 Braswell married the former Anna Nixon. Both are members at First Baptist Church in Tallahassee and are Bible Study Teachers with the College Ministry. The

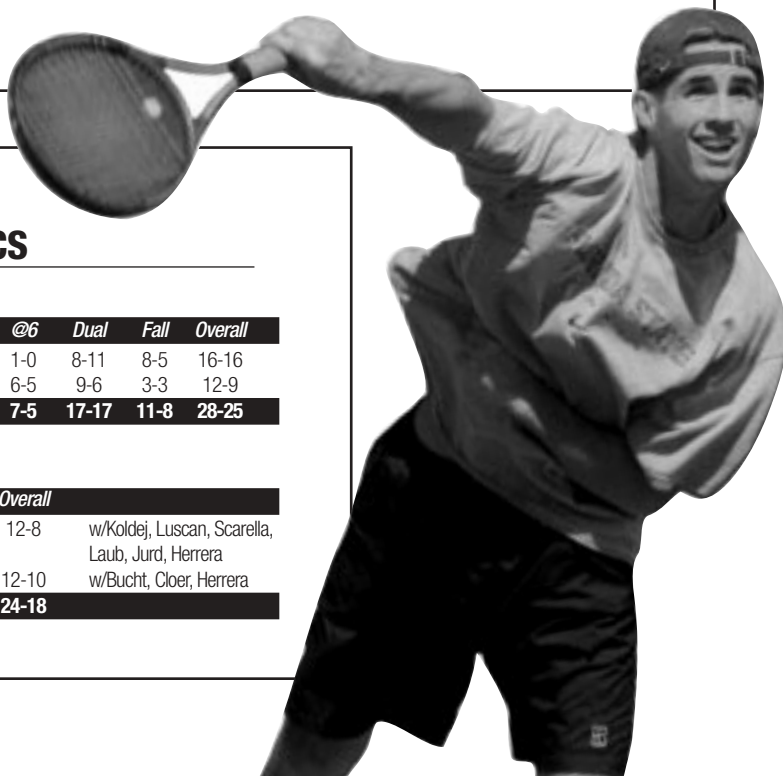

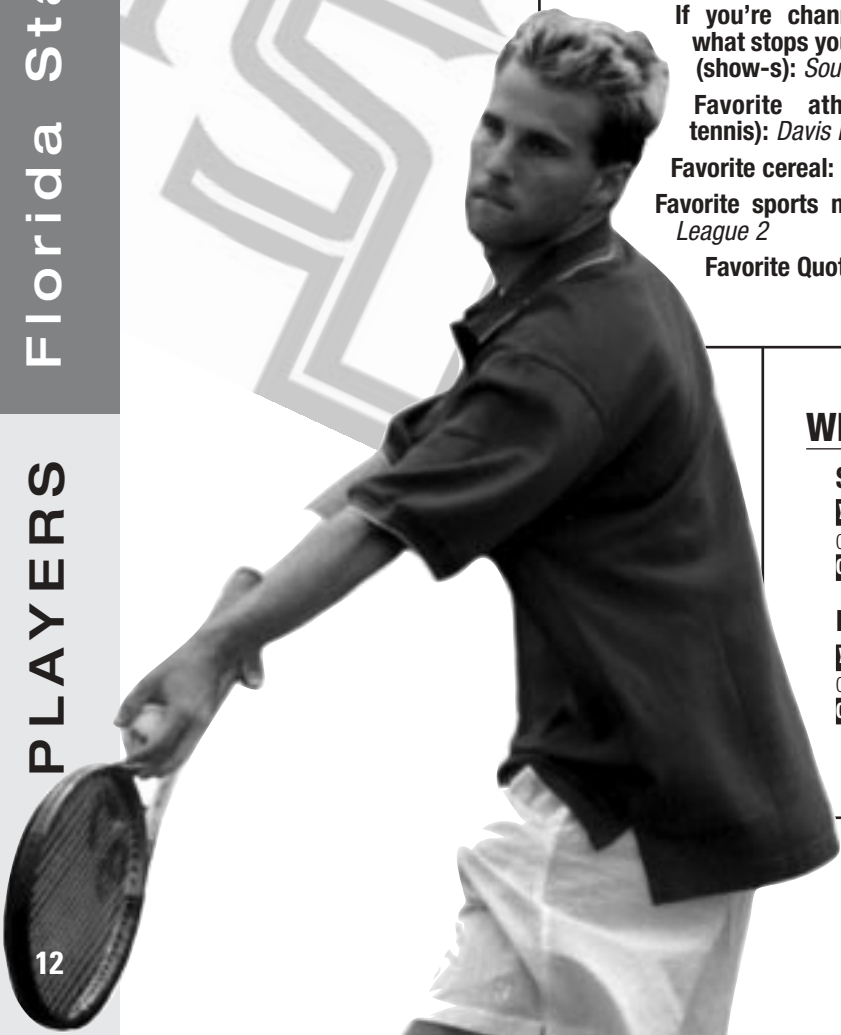
