FSU MAKES HISTORY WITH FIRST TRIP TO SWEET 16 AND ELITE EIGHT

Florida State University men's tennis has produced Grand Slam Champions, All-Americans and numerous professional players, but never have any of them reached the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. All that changed on May 18, 2005, as history was made when the No. 18 Seminoles upset No. 11 Kentucky 4-2 to earn the school's first trip to the final site. Florida State was just the fourth unseeded team to win its Sweet 16 match since the tournament went to 64 teams in 1999. Three days later Florida State pulled out one of the biggest upsets in school history as the Seminoles overpowered fifth-ranked Illinois 4-2 to advance to the Elite Eight. The wins gave the Tribe their first 20-win season in two decades as they ended the season 21-8 after a loss to Florida. The Seminoles concluded the year ranked No. 13, the highest ever for the program.

ONE OF THE BEST EVER: MAT CLOER

In the Moore Athletic Center on the campus of Florida State University, a 4-foot banner dangles from the rafters in honor of one of the top players to ever come out of the FSU tennis program. What Mat Cloer did at Florida State both on and off the court is unmatched by any other tennis player to ever wear the Garnet & Gold. Not only did he become the school's first singles All-American, but he also received the national ITA/Arthur Ashe Leadership and Sportsmanship Award, the first national award for any FSU men's tennis player. Cloer put an exclamation point on his career during the final 10 days he played for the Seminoles. In the Sweet 16, his third-set victory over Illinois' No. 23 GD Jones gave Florida State a 4-2 victory and put the Seminoles in their first Elite Eight. Then four days later, the two-time ACC Player of the Year became the first player in school history to earn All-America honors in singles with his victory over No. 9 Sven Swinnen (Oregon) that also made him the last conference player in the singles draw. He also became the first FSU tennis player to compete in three NCAA Championships. "When I came here six years ago I was looking for someone to elevate this program and Mat was the one that did that," Head Coach Dwayne Hultquist said. "After his four years here we're one of the better programs in the country and a lot of has to do with him, he helped put Florida State tennis on the map. He's accomplished a lot, but he's the hardest worker I've ever coached and he's been a team leader on and off the court."

DOUBLES DOMINANCE

As has been the case all season, the doubles point was the strongest point for the Seminoles in the NCAA Tournament. Florida State only dropped one match to Kentucky and two contests to Florida, running its record to 28-4 in doubles. Florida State had a 64-16 record in dual matches with all three spots having at least 20 wins. The Seminoles were 21-5 when they won doubles with a 7-4 record in tiebreakers and an 8-4 mark versus ranked opponents. Jeff Grosilmond and Chris Westerhof tied their own single-season school record with their 26th victory against Kentucky (May 15, 2005) as they beat their highest ranked opponent in No. 4 Jesse Witten and Tigran Martirosyan. The twosome went on to win their 27th doubles match against an Illinois pair and now hold the top two spots in the FSU annals.

SEMINOLES CONTINUE BEST SEASON IN 20 YEARS

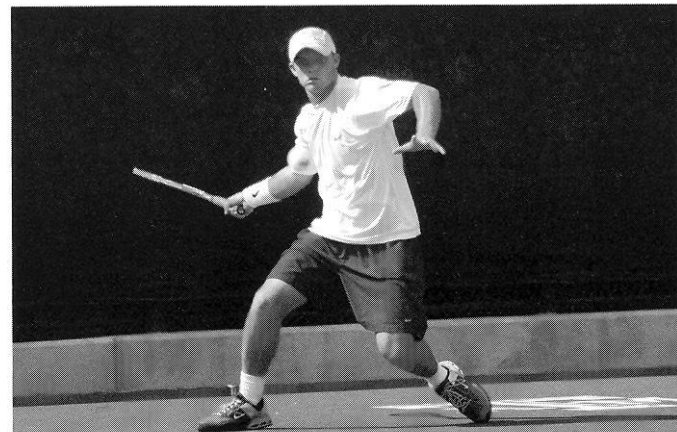
The wins over Ball State, Kentucky and Illinois not only got Florida State into the Sweet 16, but bolstered its record to the best in two decades as the 21-8 mark is the highest total since the 1985 edition posted a 25-4 record. Also, the 2005 squads winning percentage (.724) only trails Richard McKee's squad (.862) from the same year. It was just the seventh 20-win season in school history and only the third in the last 27 years. Dwayne Hultquist is just one win shy of tying Hall of Famer Lex Wood for fourth in the Seminole lore. Among his ACC counterparts, Hultquist is 23rd in conference history and eighth currently despite having the third-shortest tenure.

ACC TITLE DREAMS FALL SHORT FOR FSU MEN'S TENNIS IN 4-1 FINALS LOSS TO NO. 2 VIRGINIA

An Atlantic Coast Conference Championships was so close that the Florida State University men's tennis team could taste it. But then the second-ranked Virginia Cavaliers snatched it from their jaws as Virginia won its second-straight ACC title, beating the No. 25 Seminoles 4-1 on April 24, 2005, at the Cary Tennis Center. At the time, the loss was just Florida State's second in the last 11 matches and snapped a six-match winning streak.

CINDERELLA STORY ENDS FOR FSU MEN'S TENNIS WITH 4-0 LOSS TO FLORIDA IN NCAA ELITE EIGHT

For the second time in three years, the University of Florida ended the season for the Florida State University men's tennis team in the NCAA Tournament. The difference this time was that it was in the Elite Eight as the No. 3 Gators ended the No. 18 Seminoles Cinderella-run in the tournament with the 4-0 victory on May 22. For just the third time all season, the Seminoles found themselves down after the doubles point. After taking a 6-4 lead in their number three match, Jonathas Sucupira and Sam Chang lost four-straight games to drop an 8-6 decision to Nester Briceno and Stef Tell. Evening the doubles point was the tandem of Mat Cloer (and Ytai Abougzir as they won their third-straight match in the tournament 8-5 over Chris Brandi and Jordan Dolberg. All the attention focused on court one where Chris Westerhof and Jeff Groslimond went into a tiebreaker for the third match in a row. Unfortunately, the magic wasn't there this time as they lost 8-6 in the tiebreaker and 9-8 in the match to No. 8 Hamid Mirzadeh and Greg Ouellette. Florida used the momentum from the doubles point to take four of the first six sets. Within about ten minutes, the Gators claimed the three victories it needed to secure the team point.

SEMINOLES' SAM CHANG WINS ITA COLLEGIATE SUMMER CIRCUIT STOP IN TALLAHASSEE

Five months ago, then Florida State University freshman men's tennis player Sam Chang lost a heartbreaking three-set contest to Florida's Ryan Sherry in the deciding match of UF's 4-3 victory. While the stakes weren't as high this time, Chang got even with the Gator as he beat Sherry in the finals of the ITA Collegiate Summer Circuit Southeast Region tournament in Tallahassee on July 15. Seeded third in the draw, Chang used a break in first set to win the opener 6-4. He proceeded to sweep the second stanza 6-0 to claim the title. Ironically, the sophomore was on the verge of not making the championship bout as he was down 5-7, 2-4 to teammate Jonathas Sucupira when Sucupira had to retire. After winning the singles crown, Chang got the sweep as he and then incoming freshman Maciek Sykut teamed up to win the doubles title that afternoon with their 9-7 victory over Brandon Pierpont and Adam Roos.



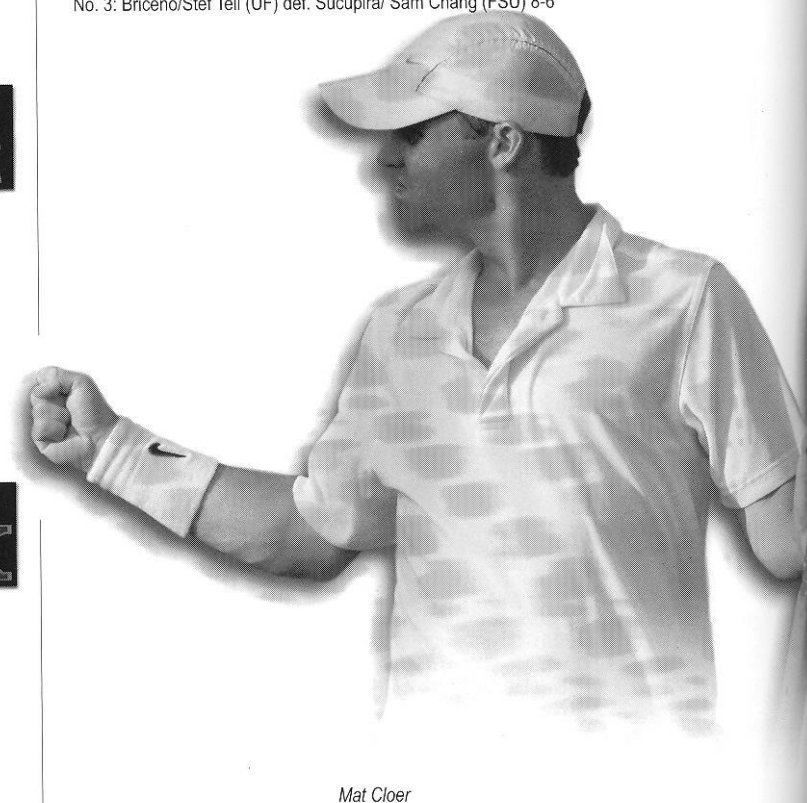
