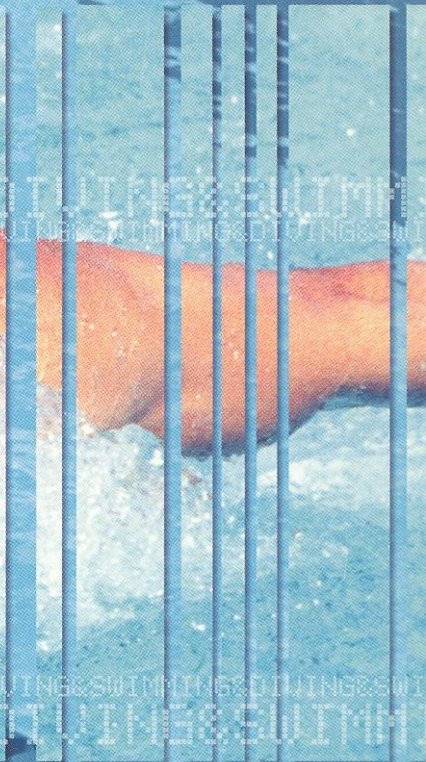
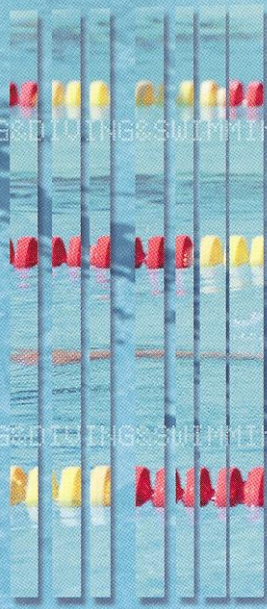

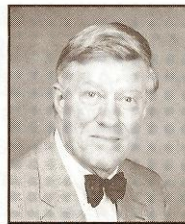

Head Coach Neil Harper returns to Florida State after spending two years as the head coach of the women's swim team at Ohio State University. At the helm of the Lady Buckeye squad, Harper posted a 15-12 record and had six ladies qualify for the NCAA Championships. The squad was also named an NCAA All-American Academic Team and 20 swimmers were named to the All-Big Ten Academic team.

Before heading to Ohio State, Harper spent three years as an assistant coach for the men's and women's programs at Florida State. His responsibilities included recruiting and coordinating the strength and conditioning programs as well as working closely with the individual medley and stroke groups. During his time at FSU, Harper coached 17 NCAA All-Americans as well as FSU's first National Champion, Stephen Parry, who won the 200 Butterfly in 1997. He was also an integral part of the 1997 men's Top 10 finish and the women's Top 30 finish.

After graduating from LSU, Harper served as an assistant coach for the men's and women's programs at his alma mater. From 1988-94, he coached 21 swimmers to NCAA All-America honors and coached seven Southeastern Conference champions.

During his years as a Tiger, Harper was a seven event All-American, won four SEC individual titles and as a senior, captained the team to the conference title. He competed in the 1984 and 1988 Olympics on the 400 meter medley relay, finishing sixth in the Los Angeles Olympics and fourth in the Seoul Olympics.

Harper is a member of the American Swim Coaches Association (ASCA) and the College Swim Coaches Association of America (CSCAA).

Harper and his wife Paige, who as an NCAA All-American and SEC breaststroke champion at LSU, have been married for nine years and have two daughters Katherine, who will be five in November, and Kelly who is three.

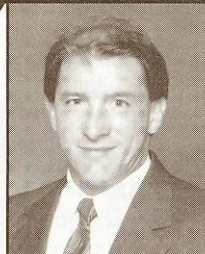

Michelle Gacio is in her first year as an assistant coach at Florida State. Gacio joins the Seminole swimming and diving coaching staff after two years as an assistant coach under Head Coach Neil Harper at Ohio State. Prior to Ohio State, Gacio spent three years coaching with the 200 member Florida Aquatic Swim Team (FAST) in Gainesville, FL, working as the Head Coach, Head Age Group Coach and Head Masters Coach. She coached all levels of swimming, both male and female, including several Olympic qualifiers and numerous Senior and Junior National Qualifiers. In 1998, Gacio received her master's degree from the University of Florida in exercise and sport sciences specializing in sports administration. She also received her bachelor's of business administration from

Florida in 1996. As a Gator, Gacio was an All-American and received all-conference honors in the 400 IM. She was a member of the Southeastern Conference Team Champions from 1991-1995 and in 1992, was on the third place NCAA Championships team. Gacio finished 11th in the 1992 Olympic Trials in the 200 IM.

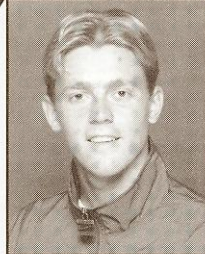

Andy Robins continues as assistant coach with the Seminoles for his fifth year. In addition to his on deck coaching duties, he assists with recruiting and organizing team workout information, performance data, and home meet management. Robins has been actively coaching swimming since 1980. He has held various assistant and head coaching positions, especially in the local Tallahassee area. Beginning in 1985, Robins began coaching for the Area Tallahassee Aquatic Club and eventually became head coach for A.T.A.C. in 1993. Robins led A.T.A.C. to a top 10 finish at the spring 1996 Junior Nationals. Other local swimming coaching positions Robins has

held include coaching Leon High School in Tallahassee from 1986-1991. In 1987 he was recognized as the Tallahassee Democrat's High School Coach of the Year. Robins also served as head coach of Florida's All-Star Team in 1990 and 1991, after previously holding the assistant coaching position for the team in 1989. Robins served on the Florida Swimming Board of Directors, the House of Delegates, and the Technical Planning Committee from 1987-1998. A graduate of The College of William & Mary, Robins swam both the backstroke and distance freestyle events. His swimming accomplishments at William and Mary include setting a school record in the 1650 free and serving as Co-Captain. Robins received a Masters Degree in Science Education from Florida State in 1987. Andy and his wife Karen have 4 children, Beth (21), Kurt (20), Jenna (14), and Annemarie (3).



brendon dedekind

Student Assistant Coach

Brendon Dedekind joins the Florida State coaching staff as a student assistant coach after completing his swimming career with the Seminoles. Dedekind was a 16-time All-American as a Seminole, including a national title in the 50 Free in 1998 and the 100 Breast in 1999. Dedekind also holds three school records, won 10 ACC titles and became only the second swimmer in conference history to win double-digit events in a career. A native of Pietermaritzburg, Natal, South Africa, Dedekind competes in international events for his home country. Among his many accolades is his 50m Free title at the 1999 Pan-Pacific games in Sydney, Australia and a 5th place finish in the event at the 1996 Summer Olympics. Dedekind, an electrical engineering major, will graduate in December.

patrick jeffrey

Diving Coach

Patrick Jeffrey, a former diver at Ohio State University, joins the Florida State coaching staff in his first season as the head diving coach. "I am extremely excited that Patrick has accepted the opportunity to be our new head diving coach," head coach Neil Harper said. "He is regarded as one of the best diving coaches in the country and has coached several national champions. The athletic department and myself are excited about the future of our diving program under Patrick's guidance." Jeffrey comes to FSU from Boca Raton, Fla., where he has produced four Individual Senior National Champions, three Individual Junior National Champions and four Individual World Cup Team members. He served as the USA Senior World Cup Team Coach in 1997 and 1999, the Senior National Team Coach from 1997-99 and the Junior National Team Coach in 1998. As a diver, Jeffrey competed in the 1988 Olympics in Seoul and 1996 Olympics in Atlanta where he was a finalist on the 10m Platform at both games. He is also a three-time US Diving National Champions on the 10m Platform. A graduate of Ohio State University, Jeffrey was a three-time NCAA Champion in 1988, winning the 1m, 3m and 10m platform. He also received the NCAA Diver of the Year award in the same year. He received his bachelors degree in journalism and advertising in 1988.

women's 1999 outlook

The Florida State men's swimming and diving team returns to competition after a 12th place finish at the NCAA Championships last year and a second place finish at the ACC Championships. Despite having to replace four All-Americans and two national champions, the 1999-2000 season looks to be a strong rebuilding year.

"We have lots of good returnees with ACC experience and lots of youth, which should be a good combination," First year Head Coach Neil Harper said. "There is a lot of potential and talent on this team and with the loss of those All-Americans, our younger swimmers will have to step it up."

The Seminoles return three All-Americans this year for their senior campaign in Brett Petersen, Kevin Flanagan and Nelson Mora. Petersen, a senior from East London, South Africa, placed 4th in the 100 Breast and competed in the 200 Breast in the Pan-Pacific Championships this summer and competed in both events at the NCAA's. Flanagan, who came to FSU from Honolulu, Hawaii, competed in the 50 and 100 Free at the NCAA's. Mora, who transferred to FSU from Miami, competed in the 200 Free and Fly events at the championships. All three Seminoles were also a key part of the relays at the NCAA's.

"Kevin is our fastest returning sprint freestyler," Harper said. "From there it's wide open on the sprint side. Nelson will definitely give us good points in the 200 Fly and Free as well as the 500 Free and Brett will be our top 100 Breaststroker."

"We're expecting those NCAA qualifiers from last year to return to the championships and bring with them many new faces," Harper said. "There are some potential NCAA individual qualifiers from the younger swimmers who could make this their breakout year."

Distance swimmers Danny Chocron and Bill Schultz also return for their senior campaign. Chocron, who competes in the open water competitions for Ven-

ezuela, finished 2nd in the 25K Open Water competition at the Pan-Pacific Championships in Sydney this summer. Schultz, who came to FSU from Bowie, Md., finished 10th in the 1650 Free at the ACC Championships. Greg Main-Baillie, a junior from Pietermaritzburg, South Africa, also returns for the Seminoles after competing in the Pan-Pacific Championships this summer where he finished 12th in the 50 Free.

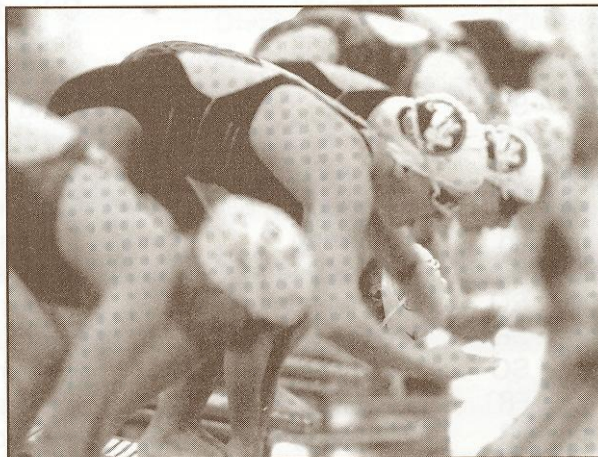
Three divers return for their senior campaign. Brent Burkman, Glenn Gonzales and Ben Nuttall all return after top finishes in dual meets and at the ACC Championships. Burkman took the top finish as he finished third on the 1 and 3-meter springboards at the ACC Championships.

bolster the Fly events this year. Chris Brosche and Justin Betts will have an immediate impact in the Breaststroke and Joey Marshburn and Nnamse Ammons will also step up in the sprint freestyle, both events that were left open with the loss of National Champion Brendon Dedekind.

"Our veterans will have to lead a young squad but we will look to these newcomers to rise to the challenge, especially come the ACC Championships. this is tallahassee



Near, but far from the glaring strips of neon amusement, and the castles and crowds of Disney, lies another magical place in the Sunshine State — one of pow-wows, plantations, politics and great pride. Often described as “The Other Florida” with its deep-rooted history, rolling hills, canopy roads of moss-draped oaks, cool climate and Southern-style hospitality; it is a Florida few have seen. It is Tallahassee — Florida with a Southern accent.

Best known as Florida’s capital, Tallahassee is an intimate neo-metropolitan city where the power of state government, the academic and the artistic are complemented by subtle, old-fashioned charm. It is the perfect two- or three-day diversion for the more than 41 million annual visitors to Florida and 13 million residents.

Tallahassee touts a menagerie of sights including one of the world’s deepest freshwater springs, site of America’s first Christmas, a wildlife habitat, Capitol buildings, fascinating museums of history, sprawling plantations, highly acclaimed fishing and hunting adventures and nearby beaches. Spirited area festivals range from celebrations of Tallahassee’s spectacular spring and swamp stomps to genuine rattlesnake roundups and seafood festivals.

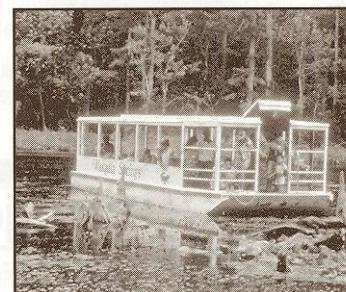


With the Gulf of Mexico just 20 miles south and the Georgia border only 14 miles north, Tallahassee rests between the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains and the juncture of Florida’s panhandle and peninsula. Nearer in miles to Atlanta than to Miami, Tallahassee more closely resembles its Southern neighbors than Florida in topography, climate and lifestyle.

Accentuating Tallahassee’s Southern persona are lush rolling hills, likened to the seven hills of Rome, and five “official” canopy roads of patriarch oaks. The fertile, rich soil and four distinct, yet pleasant,

seasons breed floral brilliance and natural vitality year-round.

Like the city itself, the story of how Tallahassee was chosen as the state capital is rich in history. In 1823, two explorers set out — one on horseback from St. Augustine and the other by boat from Pensacola — to find a permanent, central location for the Legislature to convene. The two met at a beautiful site that the Creek and Seminole Indians called “tallahassee” — derived from the words “talwa” meaning town and “ahasee” meaning old. The rendezvous point remains Florida’s capital.



The “old town” has undergone many changes, but one thing remains the same — it is still a government town fiercely proud and dedicated to preserving its heritage. The Capitol buildings, both old and new, epitomize Tallahassee’s perseverance.

The 22nd floor of the New Capitol provides a panoramic scope of a sophisticated Southern city awash in a sea of flowering azaleas, snowy dogwoods, towering pines, fragrant magnolias, and hundreds of shimmering lakes, springs, swamps, rivers and sink holes. Special legislative viewing galleries are open during the legislative session.

Below, in the shade of giant live oaks, proudly stands the Old Capitol, originally constructed in 1845 and restored to its 1902 splendor complete with red-and-white candy-striped awnings, a dome adorned with stained glass, antique furnishings and political memorabilia.

Across from the Old Capitol are the 40-foot twin granite towers of the Vietnam Veteran’s Memorial, and the blue stone Union Bank, Florida’s oldest surviving financial institution. The nostalgic Old Town Trolley, a replica turn-of-the-century street car, carries passengers through restored Adams Street Commons to numerous other historical downtown shops for *free* — unheard of even 100 years ago.

Minutes from downtown lies the Governor’s Mansion, which resembles the home of Florida’s military hero Andrew Jackson; and the 52-acre natural ani-
