Three Seminoles Earn All-America Indoor Honors

The Florida State Seminoles' track and field program sent three athletes to the 2001 NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championship in Fayetteville, Ark. All three Seminoles, senior Joe Allen (long jump) and juniors Laura Gerber (800m run) and Shawn Brown (high jump), collected top-five finishes to earn All-American status.

Shawn Brown Named ACC Performer of the Week

Brown, a junior from Tampa, Fla., competed in the Kroger Invitational and cleared an NCAA provisional mark of 7-3.75 in the high jump to earn ACC Performer of the Week honors. The mark was the top result in the ACC as well as the third-best mark in the country.

Men Just Miss Top 25 Finish At NCAA's

On the strength of Shawn Brown's fourth-place finish and Joe Allen's fifth-place finish, the men's squad earned nine points to place 26th at the championship meet, one point away from making the top 20. Clemson, who placed 20th with 10 points,

was the only ACC team to finish higher than the Seminoles. The Lady Seminoles gained six team points with Laura Gerber's third-place finish and ended the meet in 31st position.

Men Finish Third, Women Sixth At ACC Championship

The men's team won one individual title (Mario Lowe, triple jump), placed six members on the all-conference team and scored 86 points to finish third at the ACC Indoor Championship. On the women's side, the Lady Seminoles had four individuals take home all-conference honors and finished seventh at the meet after scoring 47 points.

Top Performances

Kim Jones was the lone Lady Seminole to turn in a top individual performance in the ACC. She ran the 55m hurdles at 8.04 to lead the conference. Shawn Brown turned in the conference's best high jump mark of the season at 7-03.75, while Joe Allen topped the ACC in the long jump (25-09.25) and triple jump (51-06.50).

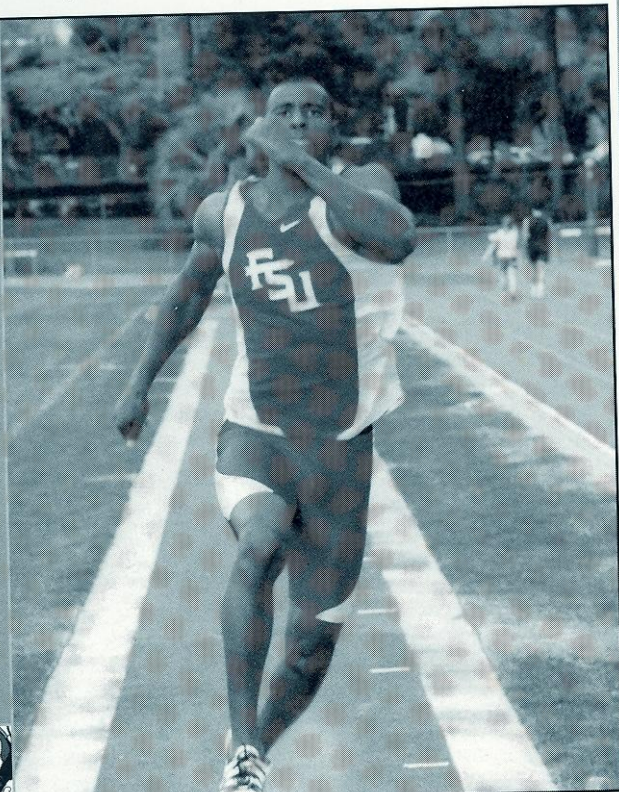
FSU Record Breakers

Four Florida State indoor track and field records were broken in 2001. Joe Allen and Shawn Brown broke previous records that were 14 and 15 years old, respectively. Brooke Bastien and Lindsay Osborn set new records for the Lady Seminoles with Bastien's time in the 5000m and Osborn's mark in the pole vault. OUTDOOR SEASON REVIEW 2001

Proud To Be An All-American

Shawn Brown continued his impressive junior campaign by earning All-American honors for the second time in 2001 at the NCAA Outdoor National Championship. Brown placed seventh in the nation in the high jump to earn the honor. His finish earned FSU two team points to place the Seminoles 64th at the NCAA's. Earlier in the year during the indoor season, Brown earned All-American status in the high jump with a fourth-place finish at the NCAA indoor meet.

2001 SEASON REVIEW



The Magnificent Seven

Shawn Brown was not the only Seminole to qualify for the NCAA Outdoor National Championship in Eugene, Ore. FSU sent an impressive seven athletes to the national competition: three women and four men. Although Brown was the only Seminole to make it to the finals, five of the national qualifiers will return to the 2002 squad looking to improve on what was already an impressive year. Here is a breakdown of the NCAA participants, with the returning athletes in bold.

Meet Joe Allen

Joe Allen racked up numerous accolades in his final year at FSU during the outdoor season. After winning individual titles in the long jump and triple jump and earning All-ACC status in both events, Allen was named the ACC Outdoor Meet Most Valuable Performer. In addition, Allen received the ACC Performer of the Week award following a performance that included two first-place finishes (long and triple jump) and an NCAA provisional qualifying mark (long jump) at the FSU Relays. Allen leaves FSU holding the school record in both the outdoor (26-00.5) and indoor (25-09) long jump. In the 2001 indoor season, he tallied All-ACC performances in both the long jump and the triple jump while also advancing to the NCAA Indoor Championship where he earned All-America honors.

Seminoles Impressive At ACC Championship

Both the men's and women's squads turned in impressive performances at the ACC Outdoor Championship with the men finishing second with 183 points (only six points behind Clemson) and the women placing third with a score of 166. The women placed eight athletes on the All-ACC squad, while the men captured six individual titles, the 4x400m relay title and placed 13 athletes on the all-conference team. Mason Named ACC Freshman of the Year

Matt Mason earned the ACC Freshman of the Year honor following his title run in the 400m hurdles at the ACC Outdoor Championship. Mason's time of 50.80 in the 400m hurdles at the conference meet earned him the second-best time on the squad, as well as in the conference. He also owned the team's top time in the 110m hurdles, running a 14.32 at the FSU Season Opener.

Taylor Earns ACC Performer of the Week Honors

After an impressive performance at the 2001 FSU Quad Meet, which included an NCAA Provisional mark in the 400m hurdles, Bryon Taylor earned ACC Performer of the Week honors. Taylor ran an NCAA provisional time in the 400m hurdles, crossing the finish line in 50.63 to vault him into the top five times in the country, as well as the top time in the ACC. Taylor also finished fourth in the 110m hurdles, finishing just behind teammate Danyne Brown with a time of 14.43.

Brooke Bastien and Megan Robbins set school records in the 3000m steeplechase and pole vault, respectively. In addition, their records also stand as the Mike Long Track records. For the men, Joe Allen broke the school record in the long jump. Here are the new records with the old marks in parenthesis:

HEAD COACH: TERRY LONG

Florida State University head coach **Terry Long** begins his 23rd season with the Seminoles, and his 14th as head coach, following yet another successful season in 2001, which was capped off with his induction into the National Track and Field Hall of Fame. In the 2001 campaign, Long coached three Seminoles to All-America status, including Shawn Brown who earned the honor in both the indoor and outdoor high jump. His indoor teams placed fourth (men) and second (women) at the ACC Championship, while the men's outdoor squad finished second at the conference meet and the women's outdoor team placed third.

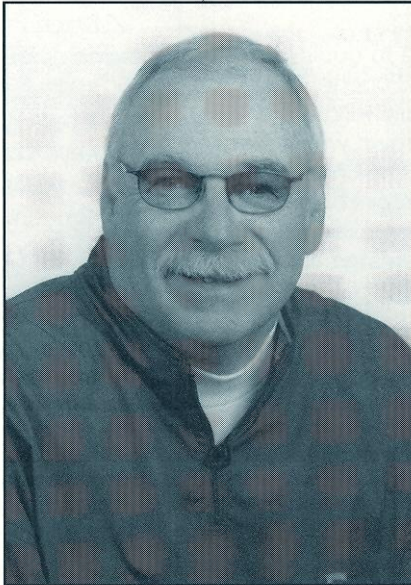
Following in his father's footsteps, Long continues the tradition 20 seasons after his father, Mike, retired as head coach at Florida State. Terry Long has been associated with the Seminole track program since he was 13 years old, when Mike Long began his head coaching legacy at FSU in 1953.

A few years later, Long formally joined the program as a student-athlete and lettered for the Tribe for four seasons. During his career as an FSU athlete, Long set new school records in all indoor and outdoor hurdle events as well as running on the school record setting 440, 880 and sprint medley relays. His senior year, he had the nation's fastest time in the 220-yard hurdles. Long completed his bachelor's degree in 1963 and his master's in 1965, both at FSU. Long began his head coaching career at Leon High School in Tallahassee before moving on to Delray Beach Atlantic High School and then Lakeland High School.

Long built his reputation as one of the nation's finest track coaches during 16 years of coaching at Seminole Community College, Santa Fe Community College and the University of Florida. While serving in the community college coaching ranks, Long produced over 200 All-Americans and 56 national champions. His teams won 16 state track and cross country titles and he was named coach of the year three times. In 1982 and 1983, he guided the Santa Fe women's track team to back to back national championships. During his tenure at Seminole Community College, Long was inducted into the Florida Track Hall of Fame.

The sport of track has certainly been a tradition in the Long family. In addition to FSU Hall of Fame member Mike Long, for whom the school's track facilities are named, his three sons all became coaches.

In 1985, Long rejoined Florida State as the head women's track coach and coordinator of both the men's and women's track/cross country teams. Following the retirement of men's coach Dick Roberts after the 1988

season, Long became the head coach of both the men's and women's teams. As head coach and administrator of the programs, Long has continued a strong tradition of track success with 48 individuals earning All-America honors. His athletes have set 14 new school records in men's track and 19 new school records in women's track. While in the Metro Conference, Long's men's and women's teams never lost a conference track championship. Since joining the Atlantic Coast Conference, Long has coached the men's team to the 1995 ACC Indoor title and has been named ACC Coach of the Year and NCAA District III Coach of the Year. He followed that with the 2000 ACC Outdoor women's title along with South Region and ACC Coach of the Year honors.

During his career, Long has coached numerous outstanding athletes. Notable among those athletes are Olympians Arthur Blake, World Champion and world record holder Kim Batten, two-time gold medalist Chandra Cheeseborough, Michelle Finn, Dennis Mitchell, Tom Reither, Esmerelda Garcia, Rey Robinson, and NCAA national champions Phillip Riley, Andrea Thompson, Janet Levy, Janet Davis and Tonya Carter, a 2000 NCAA Champion in the 60m dash.

Long has been extremely active in track outside of Florida State and even the state of Florida. From 1978-85, he served as co-chairman of the USA Olympic Development Sprints Committee and was very active within the Olympic Development Elite Athlete Project. In 1984, he coached the USA men's team in the first World Indoor Games held in Paris, France and has led other USA teams in international competitions held in Japan and Israel. Additionally, Long has served as head coach and assistant coach of the South Team in the USA Olympic Festival and was head coach for the Athletic Attic, Bud Light Track America and Mazda Track club teams which won six USATF national championships.

In 1977, Long co-founded one of the nation's premier high school post-season championship team meets at the Golden South Track Classic in Orlando, Fla. He also served as its meet director from 1977-79 and was inducted into the Golden South Hall of Fame in 1985. In 1988 and 1994, Long brought the USA National Junior Track Championships to Florida State and he also served as the meet director for the National AAU Track Championships hosted in Tallahassee in 1992.

ASSISTANT COACHES

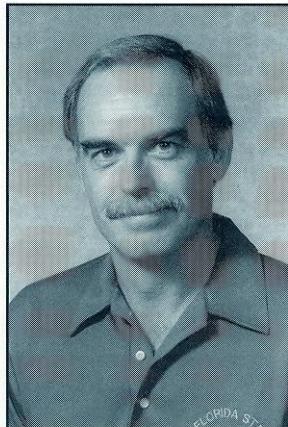


JIM LONG brings a lengthy track background to his 26th season with the Florida State program.

A former Seminole sprinter and son of former FSU head coach Mike Long, he came back to his alma mater in 1975 as an assistant coach. His return followed a successful stint as head track coach at Leon High School in Tallahassee. He has served as a clinician at the U.S. Olympic Development camp in Orlando, joining brothers Terry, head coach at Florida State and Curtis, his Western Kentucky mentor. Long was inducted into the Florida Track Hall of Fame in 1991.

During his years on the Florida State staff, Long has coached numerous NCAA All-Americans. One former All-American decathlete, Rohn Stark, became the NFL's all-time leader in punt yardage in 1996. Long has also coached two Olympic hurdlers in Kim McKenzie and Arthur Blake.

He and his wife Janis have two sons; Justin 25 and Jarrett 22.

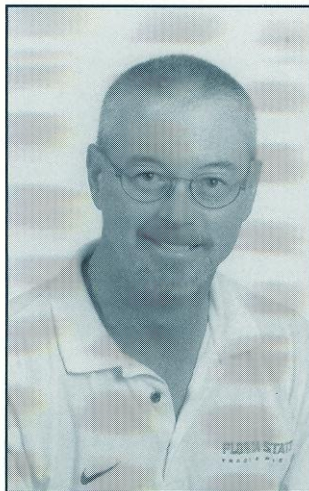

Entering his 17th year with the Florida State track and field staff, **DENNIS NOBLES** is recognized as one of the top coaches in the country. Nobles graduated cum laude from Florida State's School of Physical Education while also starring on the FSU track team as a pole vaulter from 1979-81. He went on to obtain his master's degree from FSU in Exercise Physiology in 1983 and is currently an instructor with the FSU P.E. Department.

Following graduation from Florida State, he began his coaching career at Wayland Baptist College, an NAIA track powerhouse in Plainview, Texas.

While at Wayland Baptist College, he coached 17 All-Americans, two national champions, a pair of Olympic qualifiers and a national record holder. He also led the

school to a national championship and two-runner up finishes. He re-turned to his alma mater in 1985 to accept a position as assistant coach. Nobles has since coached several All-Americans, another Olympian and a world record holder at Florida State. Nobles is currently working towards his Ph.D in Athletic Administration.

His multi-event duties at FSU include coaching athletes in the javelin, high jump, long jump, triple jump and pole vault events. The 2001 season proved to be one of Nobles most successful years at FSU as he coached three Seminoles to four ACC titles. Under his tutelage, All-Americans Joe Allen (long jump and triple jump) and Shawn Brown (high jump) won conference titles at the outdoor meet, while Mario Lowe won the indoor triple jump title.

In recent years, Nobles has been invited to participate in the elite women's javelin clinic in Long Beach, California. Nobles is the proud parent of a daughter, Sally, age 17.

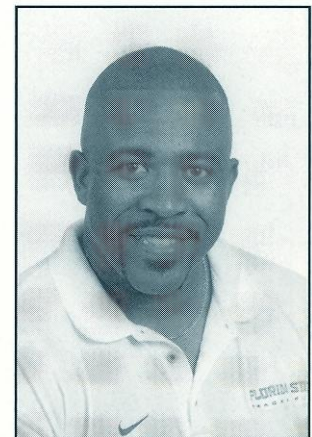
HARLIS MEADERS enters his eighth season on the Florida State coaching staff as the throws coach. A high school All-American in 1988, Meaders competed on the collegiate level at the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill.

His collegiate track experience includes the shot put, the 35-lb. weight throw and the discus. While at UNC, Meaders was a three-time individual ACC champion and key member of the 1992 ACC Outdoor Championship team. Meaders was also an NCAA qualifier in the discus and qualified for the 1992 Olympic trials. He holds the school record in the discus at North Carolina. Meaders came to Florida State by way of Western Carolina University, where he served as the assistant track and field coach for three years and obtained his masters degree in physical education.

While at Western Carolina, Meaders coached three Southern Conference Champions and several other all-conference athletes in the throwing events for both men and women. Meaders helped the men's and women's programs obtain their highest place finishes ever in the Southern Conference.

At Florida State, Meaders has helped the Seminoles become one of the best all-around throwing squads in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

The past few years have been some of the most successful seasons in FSU history in the throwing events. In 2001, junior discus hurler Makiba Batten earned All-ACC honors for both the indoor and outdoor seasons. Meaders coached a pair of ACC Champions in 2000 (Batten and Lakeisha Mose) as well as in 1997 (Greg Jack and Shannon Cook). Batten (discus) and Mose (shot put, hammer) set school records in 2000, and Batten went on to earn All-America status that season.

ASSISTANT COACHES

The Seminole coaching staff welcomes national-renowned athlete and former Olympic Champion, **MAICEL MALONE-WALLACE** to her second year of coaching with the Florida State men's and women's track and field teams. Malone-Wallace brings her own winning tradition to the FSU coaching staff and will look to help the men's and women's squads capture another ACC Championship this season.

Highlights of Malone-Wallace's track career include one Olympic gold medal (4x400m relay, 1996), two World Championships gold medals (4x400m relay and 400m, 1993), one World University Games gold medal (400m, 1991) and one Pan Am Games gold medal (4x400m relay, 1991). To add to her five career gold medals, Malone-Wallace has ran her way to three silver medals (Goodwill Games, 1990; U.S. Olympic Festival, 1990; World Championships, 1997) and a bronze medal at the 1990 U.S. Olympic Festival. She has also set two American records in the indoor 400m and the indoor 4x400m relay, both in 1991. In her time on the track, Malone-Wallace has captured seven NCAA titles, 11 All-American awards, two TAC/USA Championships and 10 PAC-10 titles. Additional accolades include being named the "Most Outstanding Athlete" of the 1990 Penn Relays after running the fastest 400m relay split in the meet's 96-year history, named "Hanes Her Way Woman of the Year" for Arizona in 1991, as well as being the first ever female to win the NCAA indoor and outdoor 400m title, and the TAC 400m title in the same season.

Malone-Wallace's coaching career began as a volunteer coach at the University of Florida, where she coached eight years, before moving to Tallahassee to be part of the Seminoles' program. Wallace will be dealing in part, with the men's and women's sprinters. She will also be handling some of the disciplinary actions as well as working with the athletes on academics and athletics.

BOB BRAMAN takes the helm of Florida State cross country after 18 years of national level success at the University of South Florida. Braman has taken over the head coaching duties for the men's and women's cross country teams and serves as the distance coach on head coach Terry Long's track and field staff. Braman began coaching in 1983 as a men's cross country assistant. He was promoted to head coach in 1985 and initiated the women's cross country program in 1987. When South Florida began its track program in 1991, Braman assumed head coaching duties for that sport as well. Under Braman's guidance the USF men's cross country team won the last three Conference USA titles while the women's team is the two time defending Conference USA champion. Braman coached the men's and women's cross country teams to top 30 finishes 1999.

His men's cross country teams also won six-straight conference titles between 1988 and 1993, three were in the Sun Belt Conference and three were in the Metro Conference. During his tenure at South Florida, Braman was honored as Coach-of-the-Year 14 times. His men's cross country teams earned national rankings ten of the last 12 years, including a No. 5 national ranking in 1991, while the women's teams were ranked four of the last six years. Braman has coached 41 national qualifiers in cross country, and 28 national qualifiers on the track, including two-time NCAA champion Jon Dennis (5000 meters 1992 and 1993).

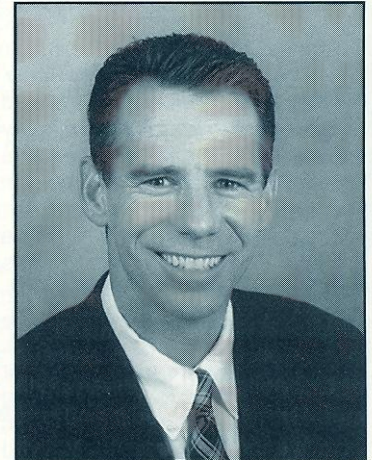

Vaughn handles the day to day tasks of team travel planning,

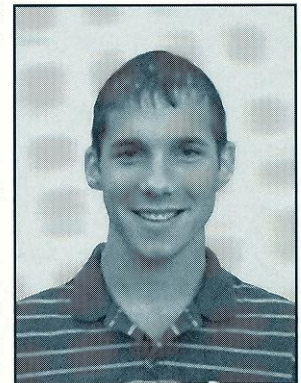

While at USF, Whaley was a three-time NCAA Championship qualifier, a two-time All-Conference USA honoree and an All-South Region member. Whaley's personal best time of 24:36 in the 8K came as a member of the Bulls' cross country team. He graduated from USF in 2001 with a degree in social science.

At Estero High School in Bonita Springs, Fla., Whaley won three individual state championships. He was a two time state champ in the 3,200-meter run and a champion in the 1,600-meter run. In addition to his individual achievements, Whaley helped lead his high school cross country team to a state championship.

Cynthia Campbell, a former runner on the FSU cross country and track team, begins her first year on coach Terry Long's staff.

As an undergrad at FSU, Campbell competed on both the cross country and track and field teams. Her best cross country races of her senior year came at the Crimson Classic and Florida Intercollegiate Championship where she finished 16th and sixth, respectively.

On the track, she placed eighth at the ACC Championship in the 10,000-meter run posting the seventh-fastest time in FSU history.

With a number of returning scorers from last season, the men's team is looking at another successful campaign in 2002. The squad returns key members from last year's team and has depth in almost every event, giving the 2002 Seminoles ACC title aspirations.

SPRINTS

The Seminoles will roll out a deep and talented group of sprinters this year, led once again by Michael Jennings. Following a stellar 2000 campaign, Jennings continued to dominate in the 200m and 400m events, earning All-ACC honors after placing second in both events at the ACC Championship. At the ACC Outdoor Championship, Jennings blazed to a 400m second-place finish in 45.55, shattering his former personal best of 46.42 and grabbing second place overall in the FSU record books. The Seminoles will also have good depth in the 400m, as Sean Campbell, David Johnson and Cedrick Robertson will all see time on the track.

Zimbabwe native Anesu Mushonga will anchor the Seminoles in the 100m, and he will also see time in the 200m. Cedrick Robertson gives the team much-needed depth in 100m, 200m and 400m, while junior transfer David Johnson will also make an impact in the 400m and 800m events.

In the 4X400 relays, the Seminoles will be gunning for a third consecutive outdoor championship, as Moshanga, Byron Taylor and Danyne Brown join Jennings and Campbell.

MID-DISTANCE

One of the strengths of the 2002 Seminoles will be the middle distance events, as 800m ACC Champion Maarten van den Heuvel returns to anchor a deep middle distance squad.

Van den Heuvel will be the Tribe's leader in both in the 800m and the 1500m and will be joined in the 800m by three-time indoor All-American David Johnson, Wade Brett, Sean Campbell and Michael Jennings. Freshman Ryan Albertson, who won the 800m Florida High School state championship as a senior, and freshman Otis Sanders will also see time in the middle distance events, giving the squad even more depth.

Van den Heuvel and Johnson will also team up in

the 1500m, joined by cross country standouts Kim Bergdahl and Nick Stuart, who finished 10th at the 2001 ACC Outdoor Championship with a time of 3:54.52.

DISTANCE

Coming off an exceptional cross country season where he earned ACC Cross Country Freshman of the Year honors, Joep Tigchelaar will lead a strong corps of distance runners for the Seminoles. Tigchelaar will run in the 5K and 10K events, joined by Kim Bergdahl (5K), freshman Andrew Bautel, and junior Dave Guerra.

Bergdahl, a two-time Steeplechase National Champion in Finland, will join All-ACC steeplechase performer Zach Heissner. Guerra rounds out the Seminoles' steeplechase squad.

HURDLES

The hurdles should be a strong event for the Seminoles, as they return two of last season's top three finishers in the ACC. Byron Taylor and Danyne Brown, who finished two and three at the ACC Championships, respectively, will give the Seminoles a potent one-two punch in the 400m hurdles. Besides returning studs Taylor and Brown, the Seminoles have good depth in the hurdles, with junior Nabavi Oliver, sophomore Joe Paiva and freshman walk-on Peter Prato all seeing action.

JUMPS

NCAA All-American Shawn Brown and national qualifier Christian Bland return to give the Tribe perhaps the best high jump combo in the nation. Brown's jump of 7-04.5 was tops in the ACC and earned him a spot at the NCAA Outdoor Championship, where he finished seventh in the nation.

Bland turned in his collegiate-best performance at the Georgia Bulldog Classic, jumping 7-01.75. He went on to finish fourth at the ACC Indoor Championship with a height of 6-10.75, earning a trip to the NCAA Outdoor Championship.

All-ACC performer Kolby Jones returns in the long jump, following a year where he set his personal best (24-09) at the ACC Outdoor Championship.

Coming off a strong indoor season where he earned All-ACC Indoor honors, Jeff Atkinson leads a strong group of pole vaulters, including Brooks Weber, Pat Gerberich and Jared Sweetser.

The future looks bright for this talented group of throwers, led by a pair of sophomores coming off incredible freshman seasons. ACC discus champ Marqus Johnson earned All-ACC honors with a toss of 176 feet at the ACC Championships.

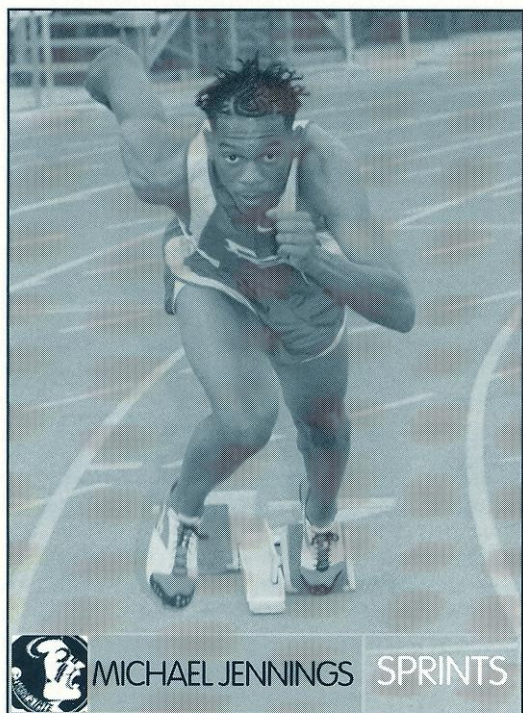

150th Celebration

On January 24, 2001, Florida State began a yearlong celebration of its proud and rich history marking the sesquicentennial anniversary of its establishment. In 1851, only 75 years after this country became an independent nation, and just six years after Florida achieved statehood, the Seminary West of the Suwannee River was established. The role of that forerunner of Florida State University was to educate young people who would help civilize the frontier of Florida. The original location of this institution – the site where the Westcott fountain now stands – is the oldest continuous site of higher education in the state of Florida. Thanks to its founder, Francis Eppes, grandson of Thomas Jefferson, FSU has embraced the liberal arts approach that has prevailed throughout its history.

With a relatively young squad, the Florida State women's team will look to its strengths this year – the middle distance, distance and pole vault events – to continue building off last season's success.

SPRINTS

Senior sprinters Nakeya Crutchfield and Teresa Bundy will pace the Tribe's 2002 sprint squad this season, with both coming off seasons with multiple All-ACC honors. Crutchfield earned All-ACC honors in the 100m and 200m events, while Bundy grabbed All-ACC honors in three events. Bundy will see time in the 100m, 200m and both relay events, while Crutchfield, considered the team's top sprinter, will concentrate on the 100m and 200m. Sophomore Tamara Campbell and junior Shauna Quinn will see action in multiple events, including the 400m, 4x400 and 4x100 relays. NCAA All-American and All-ACC runner Laura Gerber will also see time in the 400m.

MID-DISTANCE

The 2002 middle distance corps is loaded with talent, lead by 800m standout Laura Gerber. Gerber's impressive 2001 season culminated with a third-place finish at the NCAA Indoor National Championship in the 800m, establishing her as one of the country's top 800m runners. Joining Gerber in the 800m will be sophomore Jordana Whittington and highly recruited freshman Natalie Hughes. Whittington was an 800m top-10 finisher at the ACC Outdoor Championship, while Hughes enjoyed a prep career that included three Colorado state cross country championships and nine track titles.

The Lady Seminoles will look to Hughes to anchor the team's 1500m efforts, along with cross country standouts Vicky Gill and Katie Jeffrey. Sophomore Rachel Marsh returns to give the team solid depth in the 1500m.

DISTANCE

The Lady Seminoles' distance runners may be among the best in the ACC, led by junior transfer Vicky Gill, who should be among the top 5K and 10K runners in the nation. Gill had a strong cross country season, earning a spot in the NCAA Cross Country Championship, and should continue that success in the 5K. The Lady Seminoles are expecting great things from sophomore Allison Lind, who transferred from South Dakota State,

where she earned All-America honors in both cross country and track. Rounding out the 5K will be sophomore Katie Jeffrey, who is a three-time All-South Region runner in cross country.

Freshmen Laura Melendez and Amanda Jordan will lead the squad's 10K efforts, and both will see time in the 5K as well.

Sophomores Andrea Dulmage and Misty Harper will provide the Seminoles with good depth after strong performances during the cross country season.

HURDLES

All-ACC performer Kim Jones returns to anchor the Tribe's hurdling events. The junior from Greensboro, S.C., placed fifth or higher in the 100m five times last season, and finished third in the 60M at the ACC Indoor Championship.

JUMPS

All-purpose athletes Teresa Davis and Kim Jones should see plenty of action in the jumping events. Davis is coming off an indoor season where she earned All-ACC honors in the long jump, while Jones gained ACC honors with a third-place finish at the 2001 ACC Outdoor Championship. Davis will concentrate on the triple jump, while Jones and sophomore Chelsea Downs will see most of their action in the long jump. NCAA All-American Stacey Taylor, a senior transfer from the University of Pittsburgh, should make a huge impact for the Seminoles.

The pole vault will be one of FSU's strongest events, lead by freshman sensation Megan Robbins. Robbins set her personal best and broke the FSU school record and Mike Long Track record in the outdoor pole vault with a vault of 12-08.25. Robbins will spearhead a strong group of vaulters that includes Carrie Crandall and Lacy Janson. Crandall set her personal best at the ACC Outdoor Championship with a vault of 11-10, good for a ninth place finish. The Lady Seminoles are also looking to freshman Lacy Janson, a former Florida high school state champion in the pole vault, to make an immediate impact.

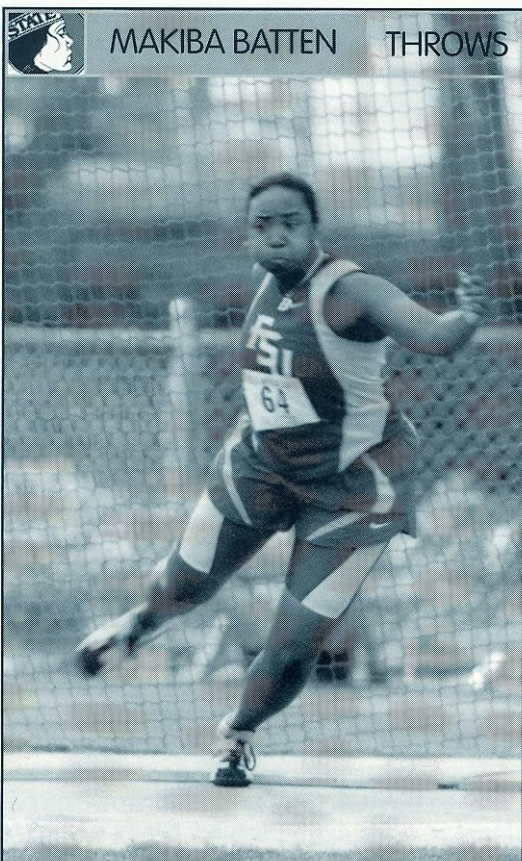
THROWS

With a good blend of experienced throwers and some eager young athletes, the throws could turn out to be one of the Tribe's stronger events. Coming



back to the Lady Seminoles are seniors Makiba Batten in the discus and shot put, and Nicole Scott in the shot put, hammer throw and weight toss events. Scott added to her school-record throws in the shot and hammer, besting both her personal records in 2001, while Batten earned All-ACC honors in three events. Transfer Amanda Kinney, a high school national champion in the shot and weight throw, should give the Tribe another weapon in a strong arsenal of throwers. Sophomores Jennifer Curry and Crystal Couey give the Tribe strong depth in the hammer toss. Curry will also see action in the discus, while Couey will gain valuable experience in the javelin. Junior Chuku Chigozie will see action in the shot.

Senior Karen Rademeyer, who earned All-ACC honors in both the javelin and the heptathlon, returns to anchor both events.

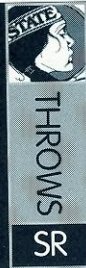

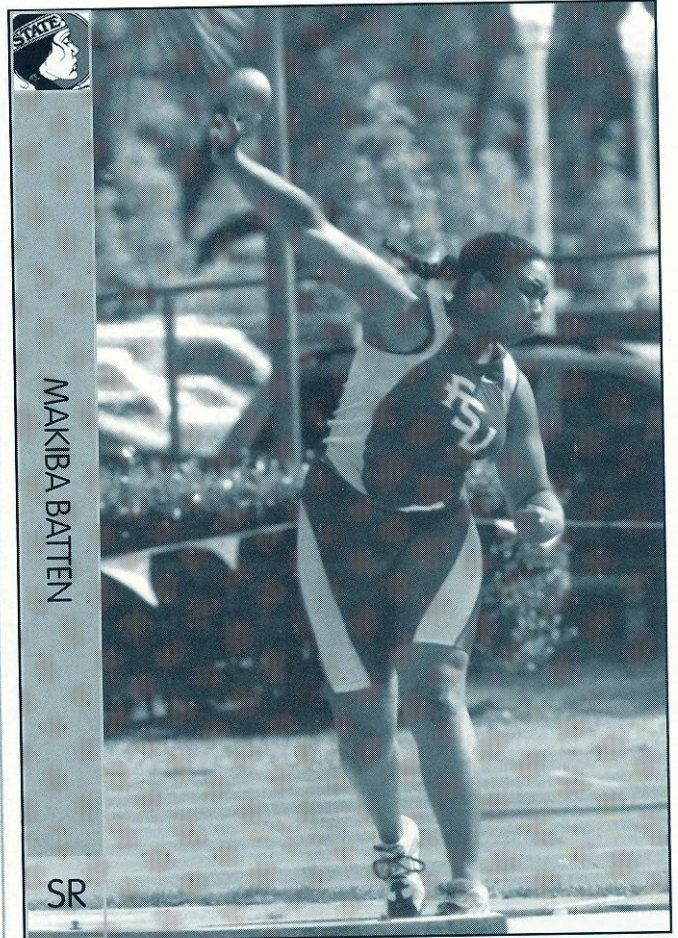
