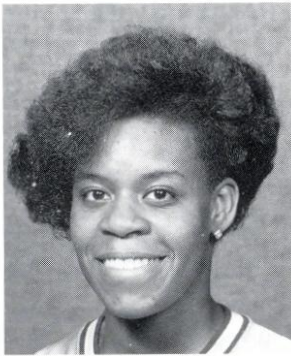

## In Review

### A Season to Remember

Looking back at the 1989-90 Florida State Lady Seminole basketball season, the first game of the year set the tone of things to come.

Facing an eight-point halftime deficit against the South Alabama Lady Jaguars in the LSU Crawfish Classic, Florida State battled back and bettered South Alabama by eight points in the second half sending the game to overtime.

After a five-minute period, the score remained tied. In the second overtime, the Lady Seminoles broke the game open to win by seven points, 89-82.

Winning the first game of the season, as they did, the Lady Seminoles established the pace for the remainder of the season. A season which saw FSU women's basketball produce the first 20-win season and NCAA Tournament appearance in seven years. Florida State established itself within the state of Florida with wins over Florida, Florida A&M and Miami, in the Metro Conference by sweeping the season series from five of seven Metro opponents and nationally by facing eight teams which advanced into post-season play.

After a disappointing loss in the championship game of its own Tallahassee Hilton Classic, the Lady Seminoles rebounded with an 81-76 come from behind win at Alabama, on December 6, to give head coach Marynell Meadors her 400th career victory. That win started a nine-game win streak that would propel FSU into the decade of the 90s. Win streaks came easy for Florida State during the 1989-90 season as the Lady Seminoles strung together seven wins in succession later in the season.

Even in losses, which were few and far between in 1989-90, the Lady Seminoles could hold their heads high. Of the nine losses of the season, seven were at the hands of top 20 competition and four were by five points or less.

"I truly believe that it was the way we played competitive against top competition that got us into the NCAA Tournament," said Meadors.

Finishing the regular season with a 20-7 slate and an 11-3 Metro Conference mark, the Lady Seminoles were seeded third due to a second place tie with Southern Mississippi.

Making their mark on the conference, the Lady Seminoles stocked up on awards before beginning competition in the Metro Tournament.

Individually, Marynell Meadors was named Coach of the Year, Wanda Burns earned first-team All-Metro status and Chris Davis was named second-team All-Metro for the second year in a row. With a brilliant rookie campaign, Chantelle Dishman was named Metro Freshman of the Year and was also named to the All-Rookie team along with Tia Paschal.

In the first round of the tournament, FSU picked up its first win in post-season conference play since the 1982-83 season defeating Memphis State 83-58. The following night, eventual champion Southern Mississippi eliminated FSU by a 90-78 count. With a 32-point effort in the two games, Paschal was named to the Metro Conference All-Tournament team.

Following the conference tournament loss, FSU coaches waited on pins and needles to learn of their next maneuver. Post-season play was almost assured. But the who, where and when was yet to be answered.

Due to a series of events which involved the Penn State home playing facility, it was announced that the Lady Seminoles would host the Penn State Lady Lions in the first NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament game to be held in Tallahassee.

Excitement was at an all-time high as 1,392 basketball fans packed Tully Gym as, FSU, the lone NCAA Women's Tournament team in the state of Florida, squared off against the eastern power, Penn State.

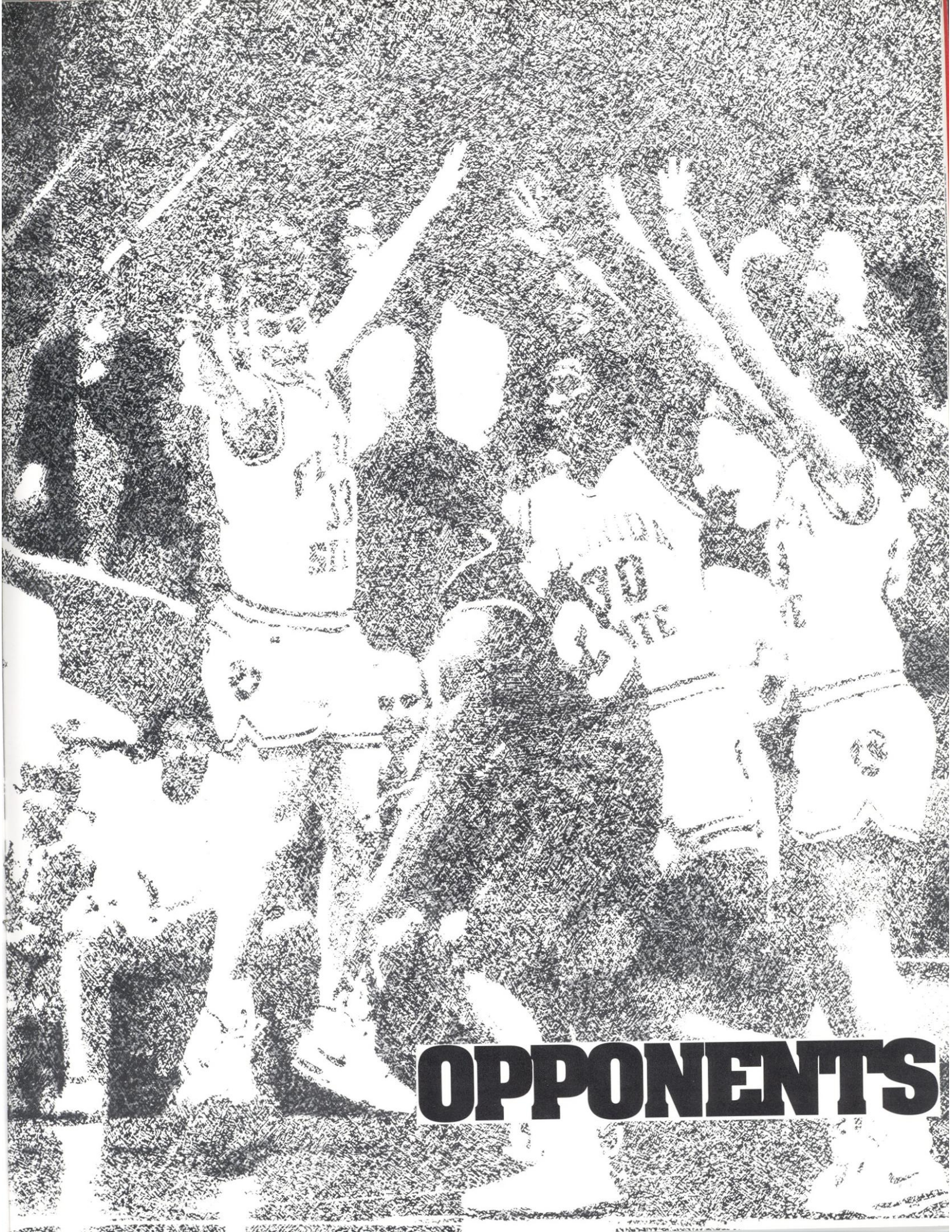
While attempting to close off a powerful inside game, Florida State was riddled with three-pointers from seldom-used guard Dana Eikenberry as she scored a career high 25 points with the aid of six three pointers. Penn State advanced to the second round defeating Florida State 83-73.

"As a team, we set pre-season goals each year," said Meadors. "In the 1989-90 season, we almost reached all of our goals. Having a great season, as we did, opens up more doors for us and the program as a whole."

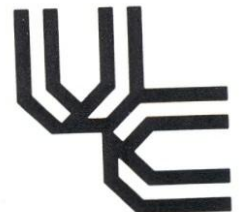

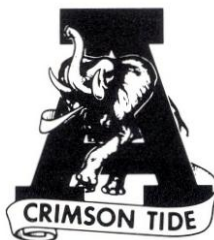

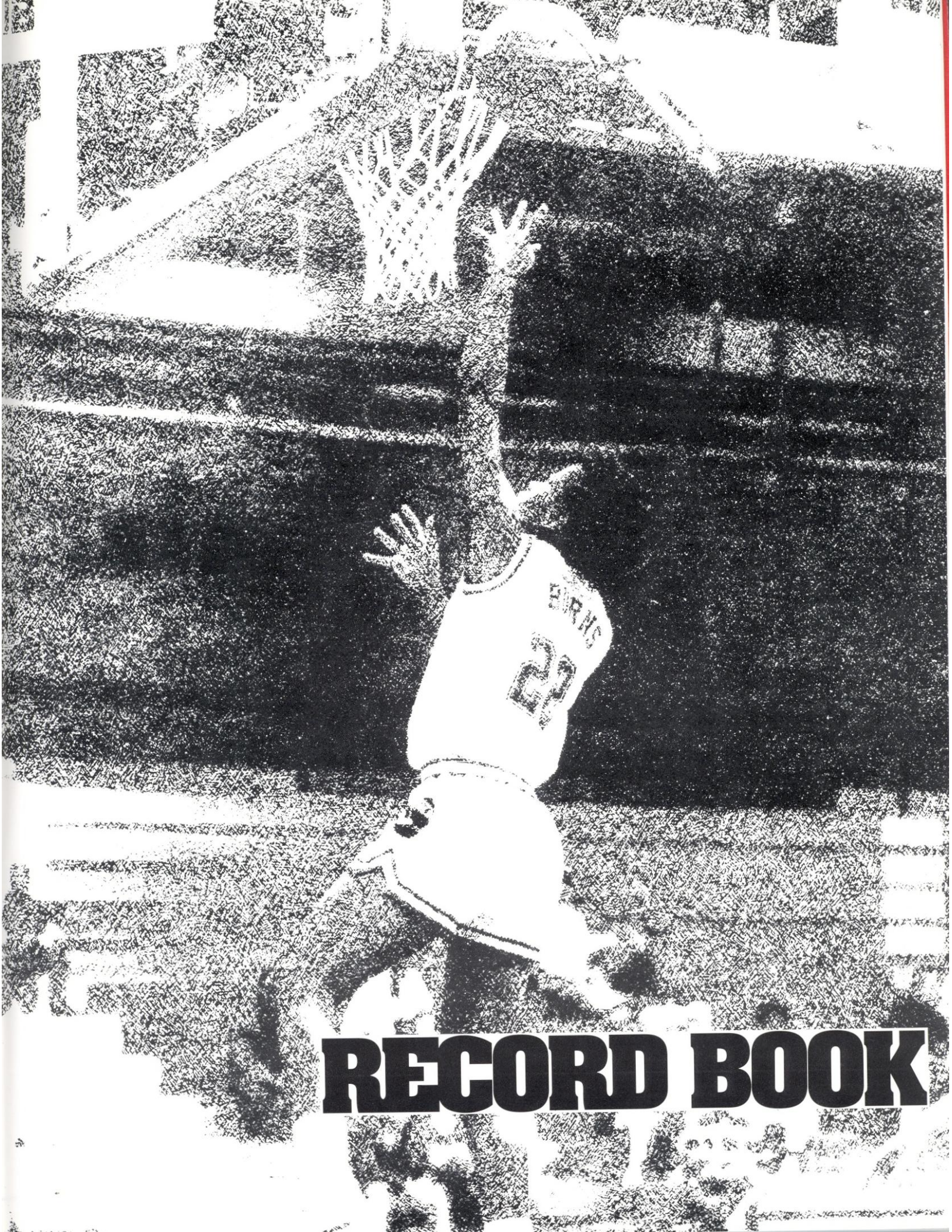

## *Florida State University*



At the dawn of a new decade, Florida State University is trailblazing toward a new century - exploring science through supercomputing, pioneering in Florida's growing film industry and scouting new adventures of cultural exchange in a world opening the paths to freedom.

Among the elite of supercomputing since obtaining its first high-speed computer in 1985, FSU took yet another step in ultrafast computing in 1990 with the acquisition of two new supercomputers, the Thinking Machine Corp. Connec-

tion Machine and the Gray Y-MP4/432. Both computers can be accessed from hundreds of locations in the United States and Europe.

For many years FSU has extended its reach far beyond Florida through international study programs in England, Italy, Switzerland, Yugoslavia, France, Panama, Costa Rica and the Caribbean. In 1990, the FSU School of Theatre reached out to the Soviet Union when it began a mutual student and faculty exchange program with the Moscow Art Theatre. Also in 1990, the University embarked in a program

requiring all its students to take multicultural courses to expand their knowledge of the world and its variety of people and cultures.

Expanding on its longstanding reputation in the performing arts and keeping pace with the professional movie studios that have opened recently in Florida, Florida State is now the professional training ground for one of Florida's fastest growing industries, film production. FSU admitted its first film students to the new School of Motion Picture, Television and Recording Arts in fall 1989. The

school, which offers a bachelor's degree program in Tallahassee and a master's program in Sarasota, will train 150 Students a year in the art of filmmaking.

These far-reaching programs are but a few of the 276 graduate and undergraduate degree programs offered through Florida State's eight colleges - Arts and Sciences, Business, Communication, Education, Engineering, Human Sciences, Law, and Social Sciences and eight schools - Criminology, Library an Information Studies, Music Nursing, Social Work, Theatre, Visual Arts and Dance, and Motion Picture, Television and Recording Arts.

Florida State is a public, coeducational university and a senior member of the State University System, founded as an institution of higher learning in 1851 by legislative act. It began operating in Tallahassee with its first students in 1857.

Today, Florida State's opening budget is \$352 million. Faculty and administrators generate more than \$68 million annually in external funding to supplement state-sponsored research, and the private, non-profit FSU Foundation raises millions through private gifts to support academics.

The main campus is spread over 347 acres in Tallahassee; the University owns a total of 1,167 acres in Leon, Bay and Franklin counties. Within the state, FSU spreads west to its 20-acre campus in Panama City and South to its marine laboratory on the Gulf of Mexico and its film and theatre professional

training programs programs in Sarasota. In 1990, through a generous gift to the Foundation, the University acquired the Appleton Art Museum in Ocala, which will become a study center for visual arts. Additionally, the Center for Professional Development and Public Service, housed in the Florida State Conference Center on the edge of the main campus, provides extensive credit and non-credit continuing education programs statewide.

With 1,549 members, the FSU faculty currently includes four members of both the National Academy of Sciences, and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and has included four Nobel laureates. It is backed by 2,786 administrative, professional and support staff.

Library holdings at Florida

State include 1.76 million book titles, 18,650 serials and 3.25 million microfilms. The main library facility, Robert M. Strozier Library, is linked via a computerized information system to other state university and national research libraries. The Paul A.M. Dirac Science Library places scientific resources close by the University's main science research complex.

On the top floor of the Dirac Library is the Supercomputer Computations Research Institute, a multidisciplinary, multinational program that brings together some 100 scientists, engineers and technicians. SCRI is electronically linked to an off-campus research complex and the University's two powerful supercomputers.

Also providing unique research opportunities is the physics

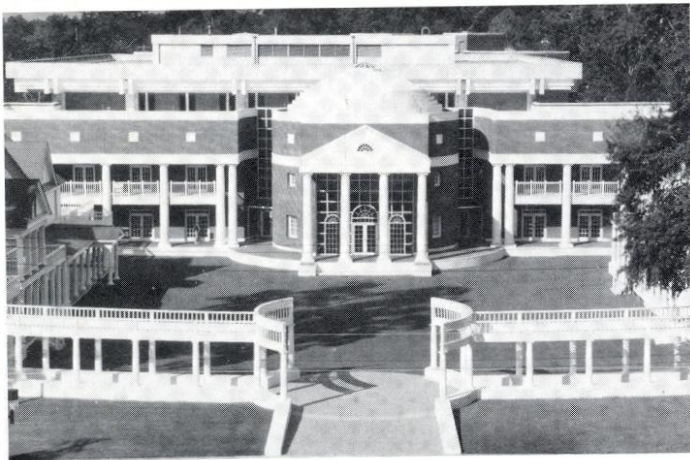

department's Tandem Van de Graaf Superconducting Accelerator Laboratory, which houses two powerful atom smashers and is ranked by the National Science Foundation.

Recent growth during Dr. Bernard F. Sliger's 13-year presidency at FSU includes the student union expansion, the building for the joint Florida A&M University/Florida State University College of Engineering, the Dirac Science Library, the Village Green project at the College of Law and the FSU Panama City Campus. Currently under construction adjacent to Tully Gym is a \$12 million state-of-the-art student recreation center, which will include a multipurpose gymnasium and indoor pool. And Florida State is managing its growth through the planned University Center, an office and classroom complex to be built adjacent to Doak Campbell Stadium. The building is expected to meet many of FSU's administrative and classroom needs and provide a centralized location for many student services.

FSU places a high priority on its more than 28,000 students, their needs and interests. The one-of-a-kind, all-collegiate Flying High Circus, the Honors and Scholars program, student government and intramural sports are among the more than 200 organizations and activities in which students can participate. Programs such as FSU Artist Series and Distinguished Lecture Series also serve to broaden the horizons of FSU students.

Florida State bonds the educational and social aspects of campus life just as it blends Gothic and modern styles of architecture with the oaks, pines, dogwoods, palms and azaleas of North Florida and with the state's thriving capital city.

Florida State remains a growing institution - from its roots as the Seminary West of the Suwannee, through the early 20th century as the academically respected Florida State College for Women and its coeducational status as a university in 1947, to its modern development as an acclaimed research institution, a top-ranked competitor in intercollegiate athletics and as a standard-setter in the basic sciences and the performing arts. In all areas of teaching, research and service, Florida State University continues to be a pathfinder into the 21st century.
