FLORIDA STATE UNIVERSITY

Florida State University, nearing its golden anniversary as a coeducational graduate research institution, is poised on the brink of joining the nation's academic elite.

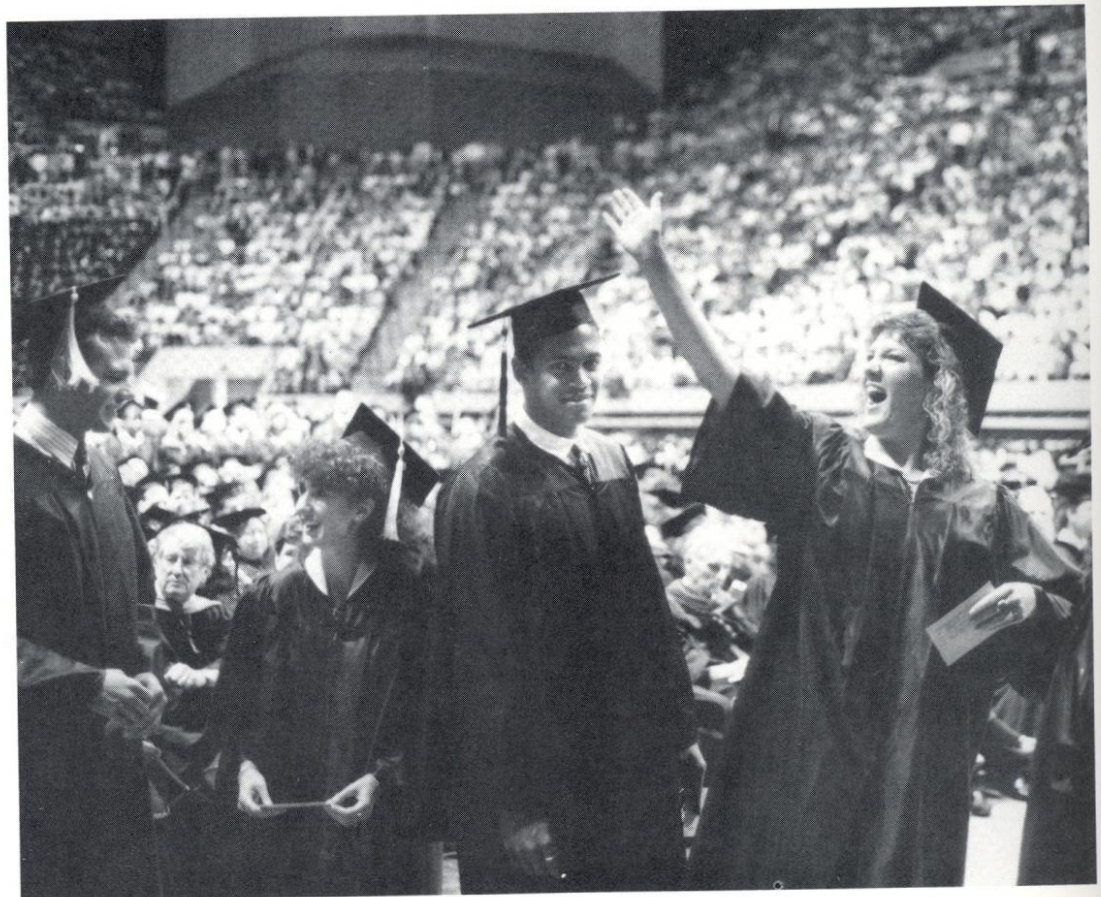
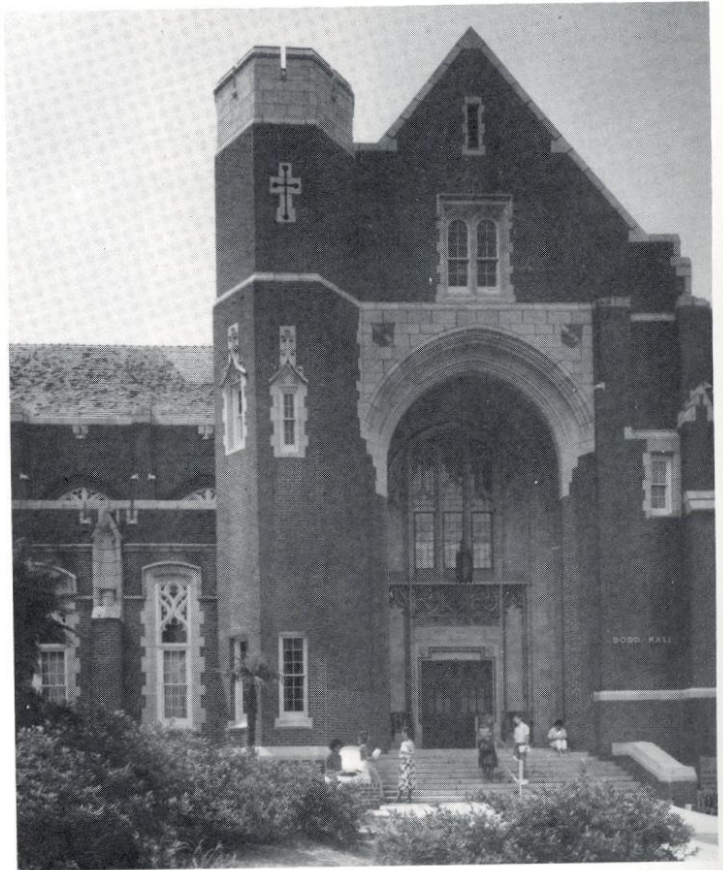
Building rapidly from the framework of a highly regarded liberal arts college for women, located on the oldest continuous site of higher education in Florida, the University has emerged as an initiation of national and international esteem, evidenced by a number of exciting advances in many areas.

The main campus is spread over 347 acres in Tallahassee. Within the state, FSU maintains facilities at its campus in Panama City, the marine laboratory on the Gulf of Mexico, the Appleton Museum of Art in Ocala and the Film and Theater Professional Development and Public Service, housed in the Florida State Conference Center on the edge of the main campus.

These far reaching programs are but a few of the 271 graduate and undergraduate degrees offered through Florida State's eight independent colleges. With 1,533 members, the FSU faculty currently includes five members of both the National Academy of Sciences and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and has included five Nobel Laureates.

Florida State continues to

progress and grow — from its foundation as the Seminary West of the Suwannee, through the early 20th century as the academically respected Florida State College for Women and its coeducational status as a university in 1947, to its modern development as an acclaimed research institution. In all areas of teaching research and service, Florida State University is advancing boldly into the 21st century.





Dr. Dale Lick became the 11th president of FSU on August 1, 1991. He heads an institution with an enrollment of 29,000 students and an operating budget of \$400 million.



Athletic Director Bob Goin has been at Florida State 11 years. He is widely credited with making the single most important move in the school's athletic history when FSU joined the ACC.



Associate Athletic Director Dr. Janice Stocker coordinates non-revenue sports at Florida State and serves as the senior women's administrator. She is in her seventh year with FSU athletic department.

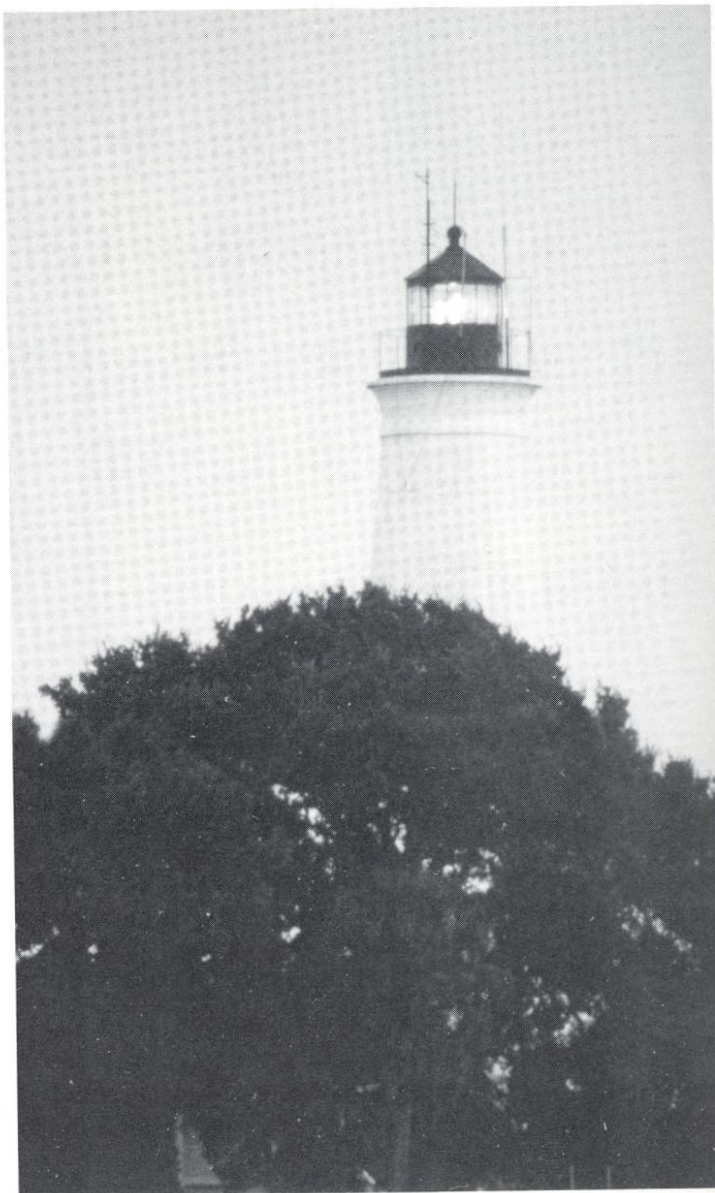

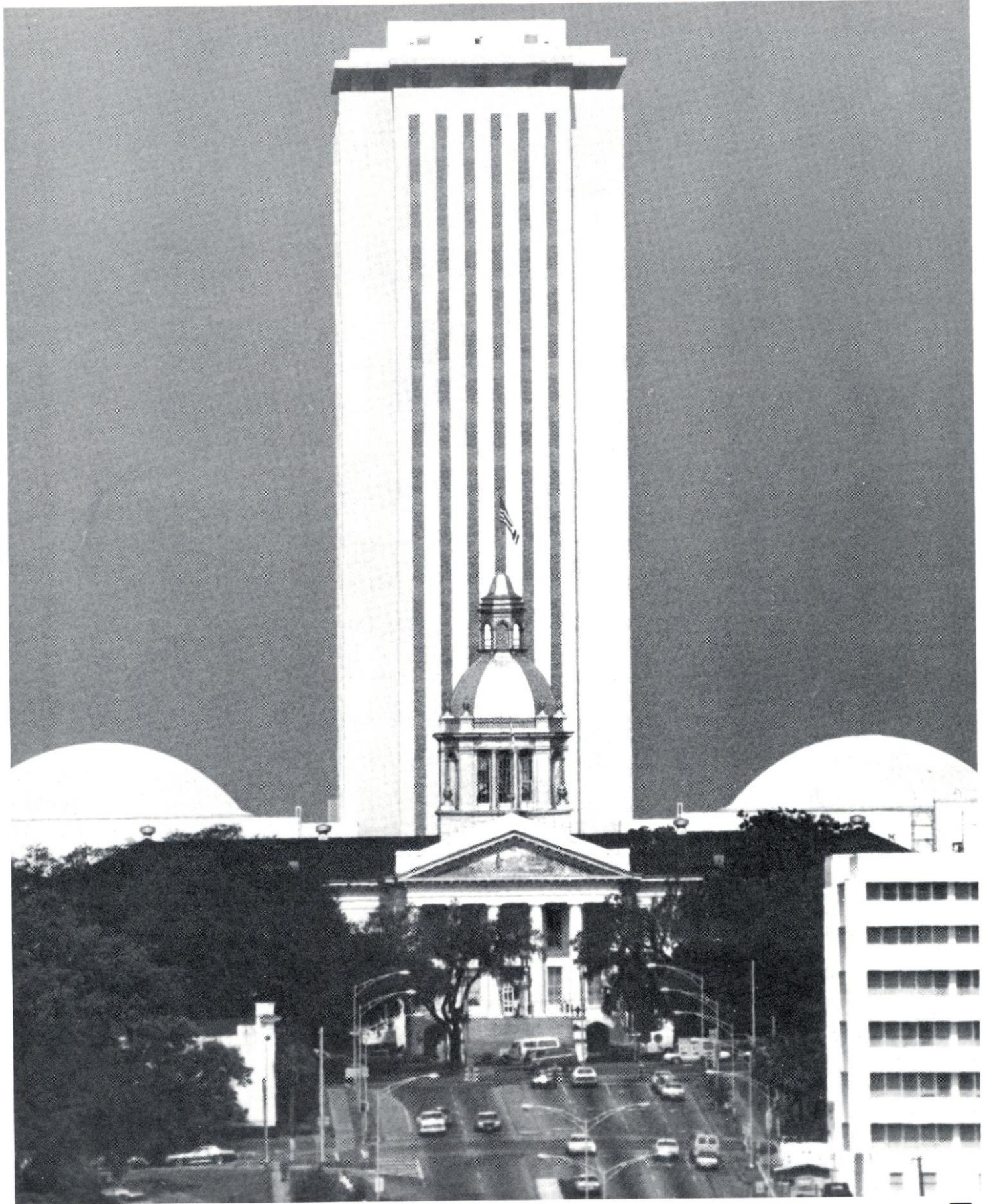

Residents also look forward to the Celebration of Lights in December when the Civic Center parking lot is turned into an ice skating rink along with lighting festivities and a 3K run in the downtown area. The LPGA Tour brings the world's top female golfers and FSU alumni like Jane Geddes, Colleen Walker and Barbara Bunkowsky, who compete each May for the largest purse on the tour at the Centel Classic hosted by the Killlearn Country Club. 1992-93 LADY SEMINOLE BASKETBALL

If FSU Head Coach Marynell Meadors could have her dream team, it would consist of three experienced "scoring machine" seniors, some talented juniors, budding sophomores, an incoming freshman with quickness and speed, and oh yeah ... throw in a six foot six center. Meadors' wishful team is more than promising, it's a reality this season.

Danielle Ryan, Chantelle Dishman and Tia Paschal make this team a dream come true as they look to complete their careers at Florida State in 1993. Combined, this trio has missed only three games since their freshmen years. Both Dishman and Paschal have been among the teams top four scorers the last three seasons and Ryan the last two. But they're more than scorers, they are the key to a successful season for the Tribe and a trip back to the NCAA Tournament.

"This trio certainly has been instrumental in turning the program in the right direction," said Meadors. "One of our strongest points is in our two outside players, Tia and Danielle, and we also have the option of moving Tia to scoring inside. Then there's Dishman who is a one person wrecking crew in herself. They all rebound, shoot, play good defense and hustle the whole ballgame. These three know what they have to do to win."

Also returning to the line-up is junior veteran **Christy Derlak** who started in over half of the last season's contest while averaging 8.5 points per game. She also chipped in 19 and 20 point performances within a week of each other against ACC foes Wake Forest and Georgia

Tech.

"Christy has been very instrumental in making our team better. She does so many little things that add up to a victory," said Meadors.

The junior class continues its depth with Joliet, IL native, **Alison Arnoldi, 6'6"** **Mary Berryhill** and junior college transfer **Ursula Woods**.

Berryhill is expected to play a bigger role on the court after

spending most of her summer in the weight room. Meadors looks to use her as a shot-blocker as she gains more confidence in her offensive ability. At 6-2, Woods developed her talents at Emmanuel Junior College where she starred for the Lady Lions the past two seasons.

"Ursula reminds me of Chris Davis (a former FSU standout)," said Meadors. "I think her quickness is really going to

surprise some people. She is a great rebounder and will help us offensively as well."

The biggest surprise from last season was the immediate contribution made by freshman **Allison Peercy**. During the first half of the season, Peercy averaged just over three points a game, but in the last 12 games the Tennessee native exploded, averaging of over seven points a game.

"Allison is a very intelligent

player and has the ability to be one of the best guards to play at Florida State," comments Meadors.

Liberty Taylor, who has yet to miss a free throw shot (10-10) rounds out the sophomore class. The lone freshman, **Angela Atkinson** is expected to add speed and quickness to the Lady Seminole team this season.

"I really expect to see a big change in the maturity of our younger players, especially our sophomore class," said Meadors. "They got a lot of playing time last season that should pay off. We'll see a faster, more disciplined offensive team and plan to prepare a stingy defensive team."

The Lady Seminole will have many opportunities to exhibit their new and improved squad. Besides the ever-so-tough ACC schedule, the Tribe will be making a trip to California to play Cal-Berkeley, Northwestern and Tennessee Tech at the Oakland Tribune Classic. California and Tennessee Tech both participated in the NCAA Tournament last season. FSU will also host the second annual Dial Soap Classic in Tully Gym featuring teams from LSU, Hartford and South Florida. The regular season will once again close-out in Rock Hill, South Carolina at the ACC Tournament.

"Our aggressiveness and quickness is untested," said Meadors. "If we go into the season mentally tough and aggressive I think we'll be unstoppable. This is definitely the team that can do it."



MARYNELL MEADORS

MIDDLE TENNESSEE STATE, 1965 • CAREER RECORD: 460-214 IN 22 YEARS • FSU RECORD: 97-75 IN 6 YEARS

When a coach has won over 450 games, been recognized as one of the best coaches in women's basketball, and turned a struggling program into a winning championship team you would think that the coach would be satisfied. Think again! Marynell Meadors has done all of these things but she is no where near ready to rest with her laurels now.

Instead, Meadors is working even harder to make her Lady Seminoles into one of the nation's elite basketball teams. Her goals are simple ... she wants another NCAA bid and a finish atop of the premier women's basketball conference, the ACC.

Meadors is well on her way to reaching these goals. In six years at Florida State, the Tennessee native has taken two teams to the NCAA tournament and strung together four consecutive winning seasons. Two of her former athletes have gone on to compete in the International League in Europe, and in 1991, she led the Lady Seminoles to the .500 mark in their inaugural year of ACC competition.

Meadors' peers have recognized her for her success over the years. She was named Metro Conference Coach of the Year for the 1989-90 season and Co-Coach of the Year in 1990-91. Most recently, she was selected as an assistant coach for the 1992 USA Women's Select Team which claimed its sixth gold medal at the International Jones Cup Tournament in Taiwan. In

1989, Meadors led the North team to a U.S. Olympic Festival gold medal.



Prior to her arrival at Florida State, Meadors enjoyed a successful 16 year career at Tennessee Tech. Building the program from scratch, she amassed 363 wins becoming the first women's coach to win 300 games at one institution.

While at Tennessee Tech, Meadors produced fourteen 20-win seasons, four Ohio Valley Conference Championships, was named Coach of the Year twice, and advanced her team into post-

season play 12 times.

As a spokesperson on the sport, Meadors has served on

Committee. Recently, Meadors joined some of the nation's top coaches in conducting the Nike Championship Basketball Clinic in Chicago.

Meadors has been instrumental in strumming up community support for Lady Seminole Basketball. She instituted the weekly Marynell Meadors Basketball Show where she reviews past games and previews upcoming opponents as well as started booster programs and the Little 'Nole Club.

An alumna of Middle Tennessee State, Meadors ranks sixth among the top ten active winningest coaches. In the off season, when Meadors is not on the recruiting tour she enjoys golfing in the Florida sunshine.

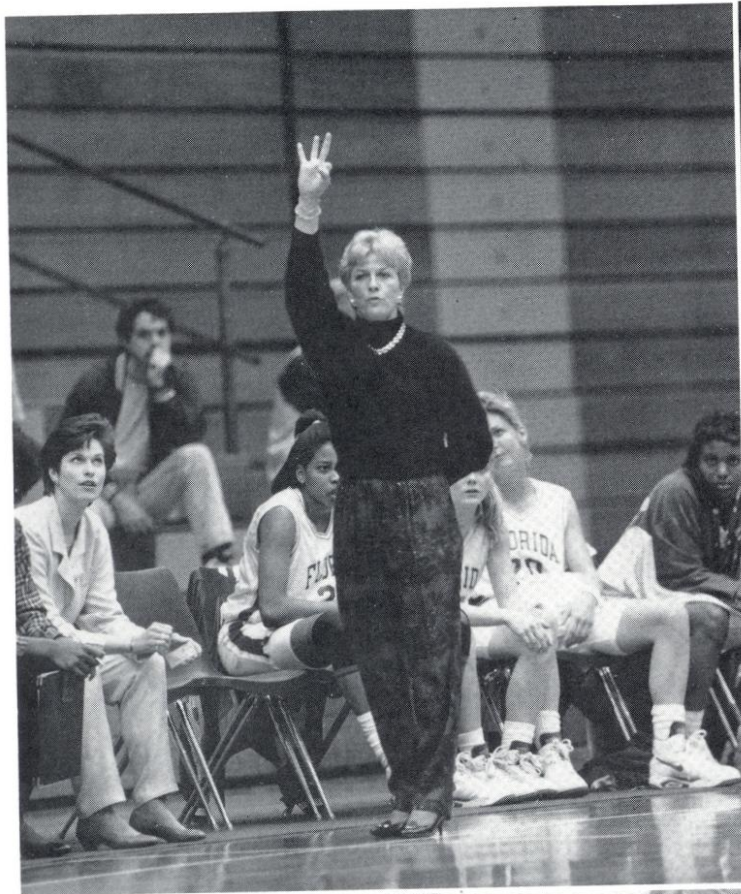

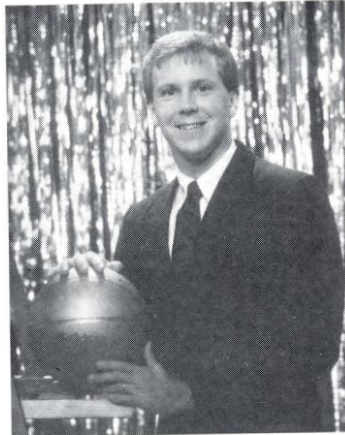
FREDA GLOVER
Assistant Coach
Sixth Year • Cheyney State, 1981

Entering her sixth year on the Lady Seminoles coaching staff, Freda Glover continues to provide valuable insight to the game before and after the tip-off. Glover works throughout the season scouting future teams which has assisted the Seminoles in reaching their 42 wins over the last two seasons. She is also involved in recruiting new athletes, supervising the academic progress of the players and directing Meadors' team and individual camps during the summer.

After a successful four year career as the starting center for the Lady Wolves at Cheyney State University of Pennsylvania, Glover continued her education at the University of Missouri where she was also the assistant basketball coach. Glover's 1982-83 squad claimed the Big 8 Conference championship title. After completing her master's degree, she moved to her present position as assistant coach at Florida State.

In 1990, Glover traveled to Europe as the head coach for the Christian Sports Outreach International Team which played nine games in four countries. She is currently an active speaker at banquets, retreats, and civic organizations throughout the state and takes part in organizing the Fellowship of Christian Athletes at FSU.

Glover graduated with a degree in business administration and holds a master's degree in public administration from Missouri. She was born in Natchez, Mississippi and moved to Atlanta where her mother still resides.



MARK SCHMIDT
Assistant Coach
First Year • Luther College, 1985

Assistant Coach Mark Schmidt begins his inaugural season as a member of the Lady Seminole coaching staff. He will serve as the coordinator for recruiting, supervisor of fall conditioning, and as the chief scout of opponents.

A seven year coaching veteran, Schmidt begins his stint as an assistant after relinquishing his post as the head coach at the University of Hartford. During his two years at Hartford, Schmidt implemented a tough denial defense, one that will complement the press and run style that Meadors brought to Florida State.

Schmidt was head coach of the women's basketball program at the University of Tulsa from 1985-87. He then proceeded to the United States Military Academy at West Point, spending three seasons as an assistant coach to former professional player Lynn Chiavaro.

Schmidt helped Chiavaro form one of the stingiest defenses in the nation at Army. The Lady Knights finished among the top three nationally in Division II scoring defense during each of Schmidt's three seasons at the New York state school.

A 1985 graduate of Luther College in Decorah, Iowa, Schmidt received his degree in physical education and is in the process of finishing his master's degree in athletic administration from the University of Tulsa. He and his wife, Mary Jo, were married last May.



KAREN KRAEMER
Graduate Assistant
Second year • Hartford, 1988

Karen Kraemer enters her second year as the graduate assistant on Coach Meadors' staff. She comes to Tallahassee from Connecticut where she earned her degree in education at the University of Hartford. As a graduate assistant, Karen makes travel arrangements for the team, supervises various pre-game setups, and assists the other coaches at daily practices and games. She has also served as the co-director of the Marynell Meadors summer basketball camps.

Kraemer was a four-year letter-winner on the University of Hartford's women's basketball team. Currently, she has four years of coaching experience ranging from every age group. During the 1990-91 season, Kraemer served as an assistant under new FSU assistant coach Mark Schmidt at Hartford. While the Lady Hawks she worked with the post players on the court as well as in their pre-season training. Kraemer also coordinated a "big sister" program between the University and an area elementary school where she taught remedial reading class.

In 1989, she served as the assistant for the girl's basketball team and head coach of the track team at Granby Memorial High. She has also taught physical education and sixth grade while in Connecticut.

A Dean's List student, Kraemer is now completing her master's degree in library science at Florida State and earned a 4.0 last spring.

"I look for Chantelle to come back and take this team back to the NCAA Championship. Her rebounding and scoring ability is unbelievable. You will not find many players who can shoot the percentage that she has in her career at Florida State."
