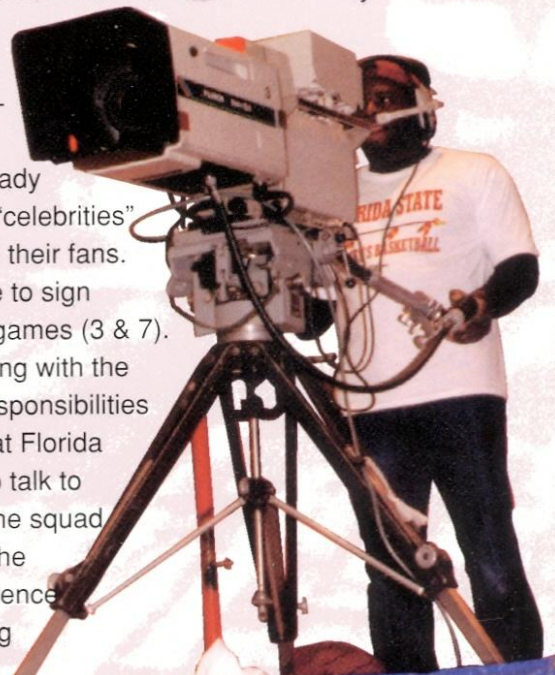


# In the Media LADY SEMINOLES

## *Photographers*

Photographers are to contact the SID office as well. Flashes are not permitted at Tully Gymnasium. Working area for all photographers will include the floor area at both ends of the court and along the media side of the playing floor opposite the benches. Television camera persons should abide by the same guidelines as still photographers.

## *Radio*

A complimentary radio line is available for visiting teams. The SID office must be notified at least three days in advance.

## *Game Operations*

Pre-game notes, rosters and a running play-by-play will be provided along with halftime and final statistics. A FAX machine is also available upon request.

All player interviews must be arranged through the SID office (904) 644-1065. Coach Gobrecht can be reached at her office (904) 644-3641, or the SID office will

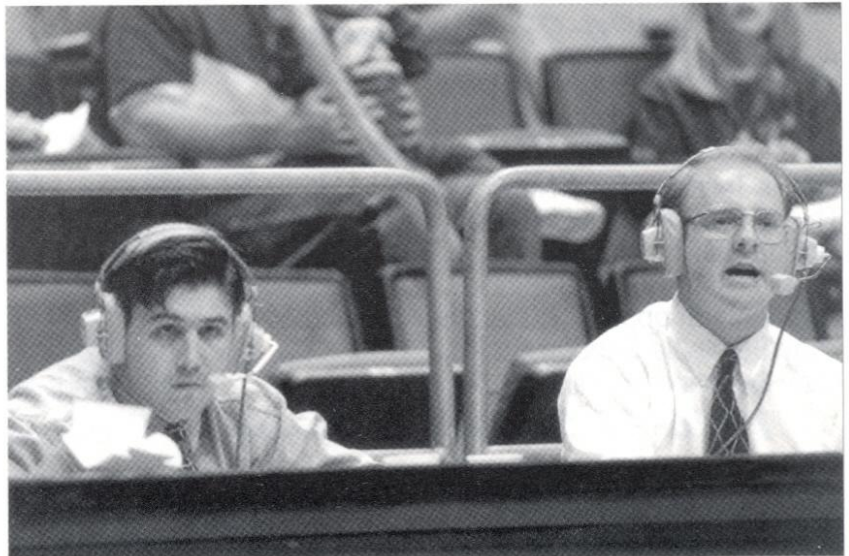
be happy to set up any interviews. NO INTERVIEWS WILL BE GIVEN DURING PRACTICE TIMES.

## *Post-Game Interviews*

Coach Gobrecht and requested players will be available after a 10-minute cooling-off period. No interviews will be given on the floor immediately following the game. The visiting coach and players will be brought in on a request basis only.

## *ACC Faxback Service*

Through the services of FaxBack, Florida State University — as well as the other eight members of the Atlantic Coast Conference — distributes its press information via fax machine distribution. FaxBack is an automated, 24-hour-a-day, seven-day-a-week service that instantly sends the latest media information from Florida State to your fax machine. This service is for MEDIA USE ONLY! 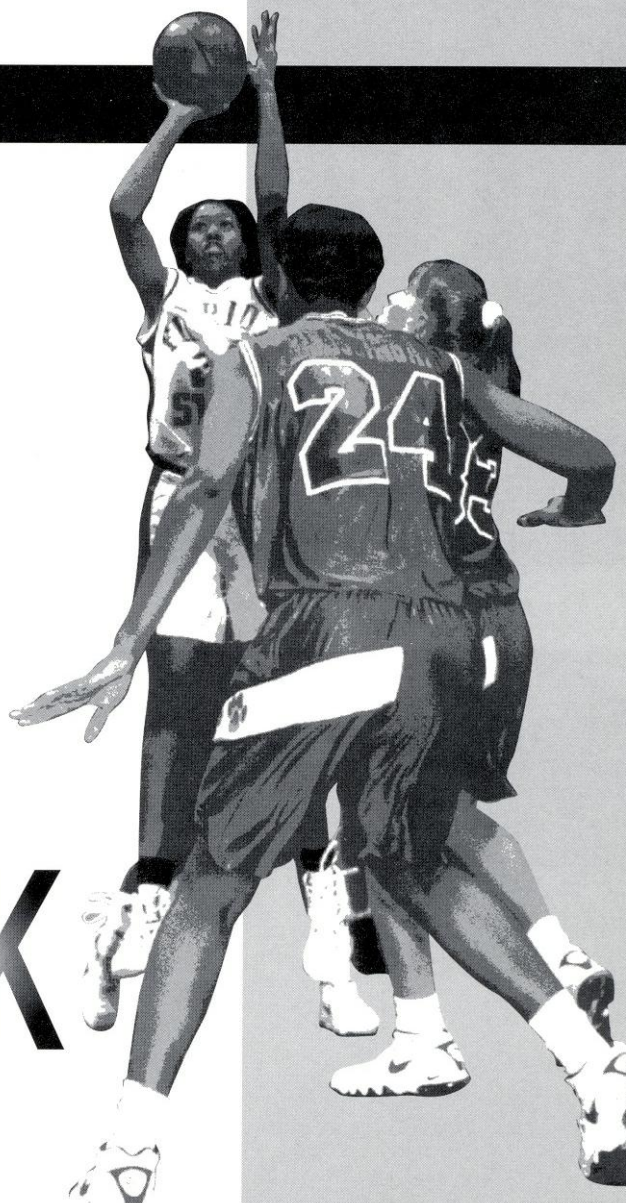

# Ready, Set GO-brecht!

**F**rom the outside looking in, first-year Florida State head coach Chris Gobrecht does indeed have an enormous challenge ahead of her, but for the woman chosen to jump-start the Florida State women's basketball program, the view from the inside looking out is a whole different story.

"I never see obstacles, I only see the vision," Gobrecht said when asked about the task ahead of her. "I only see what I want it to look like and I deal with the obstacles as they come up. I don't go out looking for them. I'm sure they're there, but if I'm not looking for them, I'm not sure I can tell you what they are."

She is feisty, determined and anxious to get things started, yet she is realistic and patient at the same time. She knows what she wants, she knows how to get it and she is a believer. Her first job is to make others believe.

"I believe that Tallahassee and Florida State University have to learn about the sport," Gobrecht said. "There's probably a certain amount of skepticism that is not uncommon in women's basketball, but that is quickly remedied by educating people about the game or by having them be exposed to the game. As long as we make the most of that exposure by having a competitive, exciting basketball team, we will reap the benefits here at probably a greater pace than most places in the country because this part of the country loves Florida State University."

Gobrecht inherits 11 letterwinners, including four starters, from the 1995-96 squad that finished the

season with an 8-20 record. She welcomes two freshman to a team that will have no seniors on the roster. Although the squad is young, the players are mature in experience beyond their years. Each of the returnees has had the opportunity to gain valuable playing time and are quite familiar with the quality of Atlantic Coast Conference competition. Although Gobrecht has not had the chance to work with the players on the court, what she has learned about them off of the court has been just as important.

"I believe that this Florida State team can be very, very effective in the style of play that I like to teach," Gobrecht said. "I think these players have shown to me already that they have a heart for being the best that they can be. They have a heart for wanting to improve, test themselves and that's the most important thing."

Although Florida State returns four starters, the Lady Seminoles will have to play without the services of the graduated Carla Williams who led the team in virtually every statistical category. Williams' 15.8 points, 8.4

rebounds per game and 52 percent shooting from the field will leave an offensive void in the FSU lineup. Junior Lysa Moorefield's 7.6 points per game is tops among all returnees, but she is followed close behind by junior Latrice McLin's 7.0 points per game and 5.3 rebounds per game average which is first among the returning letterwinners. Look for juniors Wendy Hampton and Aletha Penn to help fill the scoring void. Each had explosive outings during the 1995-96 season, recording careers highs of 19 and 18 points, respectively. Sophomore Kristy White probably made the most impact as a freshman last season, averaging 6.9 points and 4.8 rebounds while seeing playing time in all 28 games. Her 6-foot-4 frame and long arms will continue to be an advantage to Florida State's inside game. White led the team with 26 blocked shots as a rookie. Guards Jen Robinson and Kristy Parker also made solid contributions throughout the season, but will need to build consistency which should develop with added experience. Newcomer Latavia Coleman has the potential to make an immediate impact to the team. She averaged 17.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and 6.0 assists per game as a high school senior.

Experience will be an asset for the returning players, but with a new coaching staff and a new system to learn, every player will have to prove herself.

"I'm anxious to learn about them all (the players)," Gobrecht said. "There are few things I know and a whole lot I still have to learn, but I think the team will buy

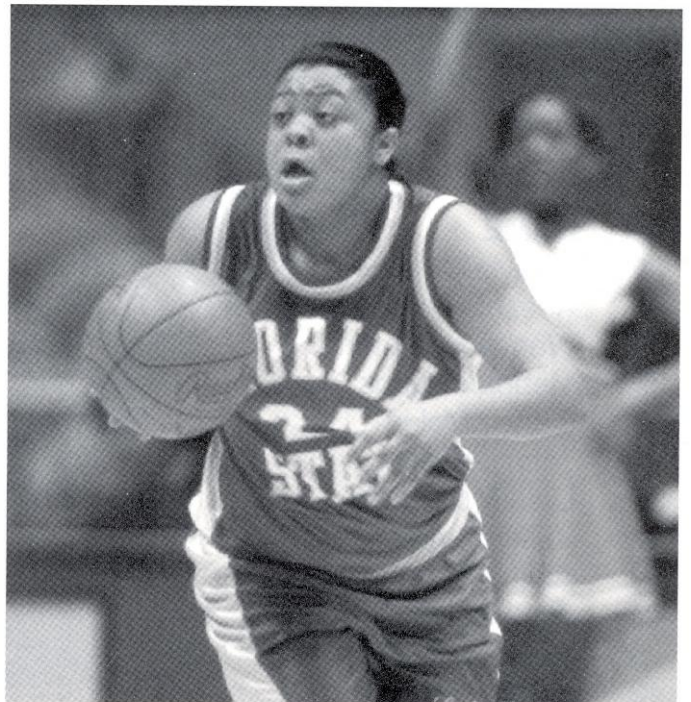
into playing good defense and playing aggressively on offense. We've got some really good skill players in Jen Robinson, Wendy Hampton and Kristy White and good athletes in Latrice (McLin), Aletha (Penn) and Lysa (Moorefield). I also see a lot of good role players. If we can get everybody to play their role and do the thing they do and do it well, then we'll get all of the bases covered, but we are going to get all of the bases covered as a team. We're not going to get the bases covered individually. And that's the way we have to approach it."

The Lady Seminoles will have their eyes widened early this season as the 1996-97 schedule presents even greater competition than in past years. Four ACC teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament last March, so the league schedule will be as challenging as ever. But FSU's non-conference slate is also very rigorous.

"We have a very challenging schedule and I'm excited about that," Gobrecht said. "I think it has a little bit of everything. It's going to give us the opportunity to have some games where we won't be in over our heads and where we will have an opportunity to be successful, but we'll also have some games where we are going to find out real quick what we're made of."

National powers Southwest Missouri State, Florida and Mississippi highlight FSU's non-conference schedule. All three opponents, along with Central Florida, advanced to NCAA postseason play last season. Florida State will face all four schools within the first month of the season.

"I like a schedule like this, especially for a young team," Gobrecht said. "I think you can build a lot of false confidence with a soft schedule and then the first time you get smacked back on your backside in the ACC, then you don't understand it. I'd much rather deal with it in the preseason and deal with how to recover and bounce back from it. This will help the team to understand how much tougher you have to be going into the ACC. That's how we'll get ready for the conference."

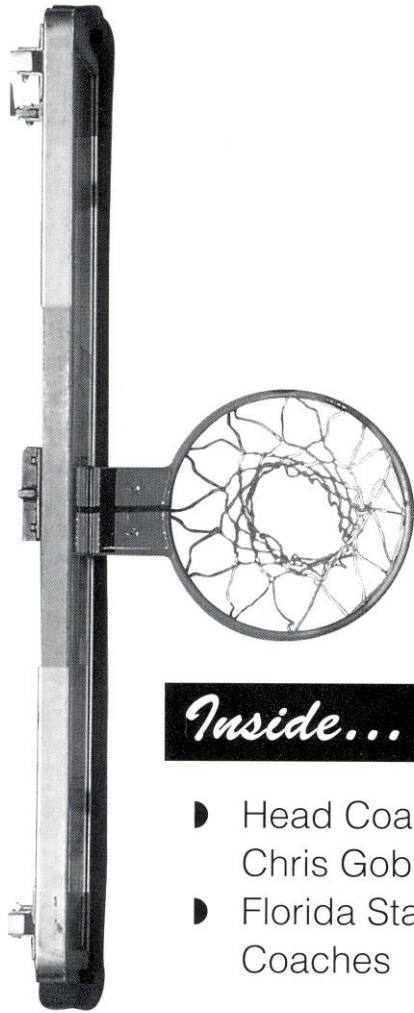

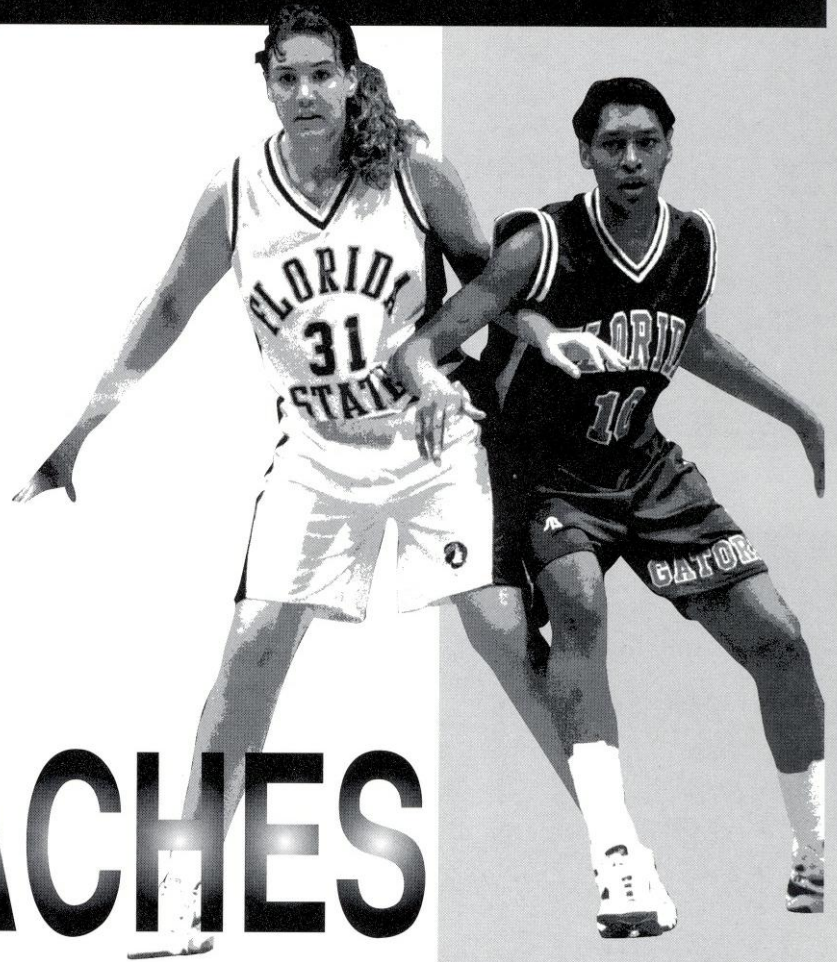

# Head Coach CHRIS GOBRECHT



**W**hen Florida State Director of Athletics Dave Hart, Jr., decided it was time for the FSU women's basketball program to head into a new direction, he set his sights on finding the best in the country. When the search was completed, Hart knew he had done just that with the hiring of Chris Gobrecht.

"Our national search for a women's basketball coach produced an exceptional pool of candidates," said Hart.

"Our search culminated with the hiring of a coach who is widely recognized as one of the elite women's basketball coaches in the country. Chris Gobrecht brings the total package to FSU women's basketball.

"Chris fits our profile exceptionally well. We went after the best and were fortunate enough to attract the Gobrecht family to Tallahassee and FSU. It's an exciting day for

Lady Seminole basketball."

A proven winner, Gobrecht brings an impressive list of credentials with her to Florida State. A two-time Pac-10 Coach of the Year, she led the University of Washington to nine NCAA Tournament berths and compiled a 243-89 record over 11 years as the Huskies head coach.

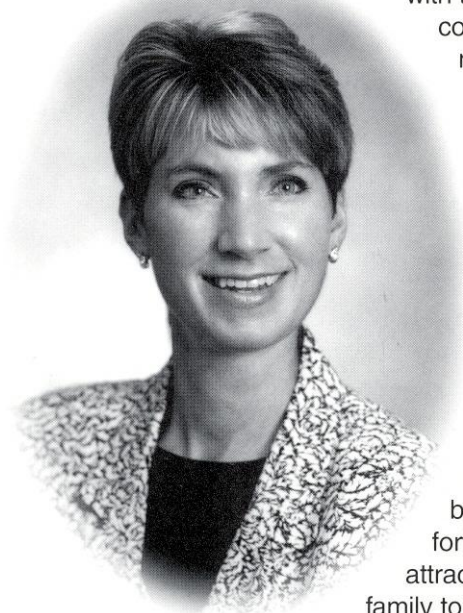
Gobrecht's Washington teams advanced to the regional round of the NCAA Tournament four times. She posted eight 20-win seasons and won at least 16 games each season. Gobrecht led Washington to three conference championships, most recently sharing the 1990 Pac-10 title with Stanford. She

clinched her first Pac-10 crown in 1988 and captured the last Northern Pacific Athletic Conference title in 1986. Her teams were conference runner-ups on four occasions.

The Toledo, Ohio, native has twice been named Pacific-10 Conference Coach of the Year, capturing the coveted title following the 1986-87 and 1987-88 seasons. She became the first women's basketball coach at Washington to win 100 games. She posted her 300th career win in 1995, faster than all but one other coach in NCAA women's basketball history.

Attendance at Washington rose dramatically under Gobrecht, going from an average of 622 fans her first year to 4,260 last season, 15th highest nationwide.

In 17 years of coaching, Gobrecht's career record stands at 327-181. Prior to her stint at Washington, Gobrecht spent six seasons as head coach at Cal State-

Fullerton where she posted an 84-92 record. She guided the 1984-85 Lady Titans to a Women's National Invitational Tournament berth in her last year with the program.

Grobrecht began her coaching career in 1977 at Santa Fe High School in the Los Angeles area, leading her team to a 20-4 record and a spot in the California Interscholastic Federation AAA playoffs. In 1978 she became the head coach at Pasadena City College, winning the Metropolitan Conference Championship and finishing as runner-up in the state junior college tournament.

Grobrecht's accomplishments on the basketball court have brought her national recognition. In 1991 she was a featured speaker at the NCAA-sponsored "Spotlight on Women's Basketball" media gathering. She was honored by the Seattle chapter of Women in Communication at its annual Matrix Table awards presentation as a 1990 Woman of Achievement.

She served as assistant coach for one of the USA Basketball select teams in 1990, traveling to Czechoslovakia and Italy. During 1989, she coached the silver medal-winning East Team in the U.S. Olympic

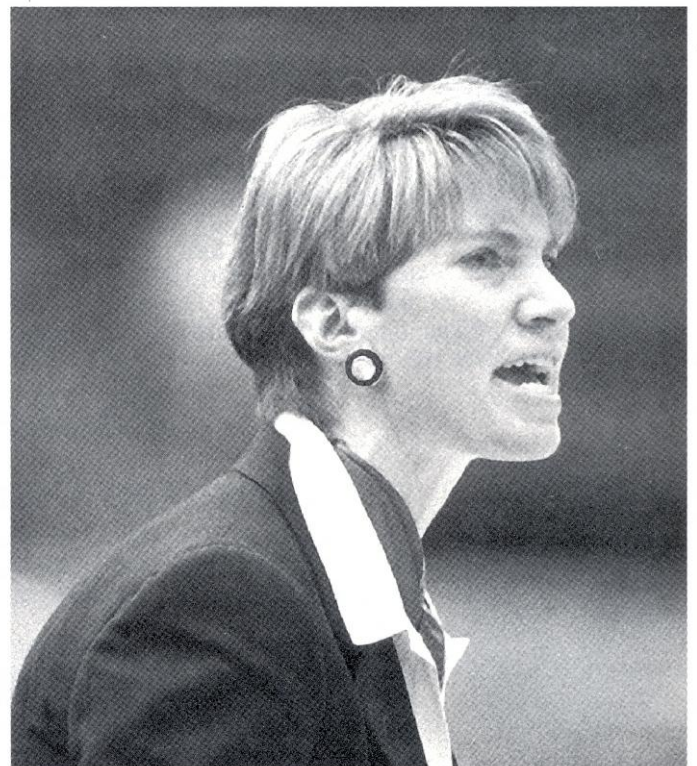

Following graduation, Grobrecht worked as a Peace Corps volunteer, spending the year teaching English at St. Mary's College in Apia, Western Samoa.

Her husband Bob spent the last four years as Vice President of Sales & Marketing for the Seattle Mariners major league baseball team, where he was responsible for the team's revenue producing activities. Prior to joining the Mariners, he held key special events management and sponsorship positions with the Walt Disney Company and Seattle Seafair.

The couple has two children, Eric (10) and Madeline (7).

## *Karen Sowada*

### **Assistant Coach • First Year • Rice • '88**




Karen Sowada, the former top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Rhode Island, brings an impressive list of coaching credentials with her to Florida State as she begins her first season on Chris Gobrecht's staff.

A Seminole, Fla., native, Sowada was a four-year letterwinner at Rice in Houston, Texas, where she captained the team as a senior in 1987-88. Following her graduation in managerial studies and sport management in 1988, Sowada returned to her home state of Florida to further her education. She worked as a teaching assistant, administrative assistant and volunteer assistant coach at the University of Florida in Gainesville while earning a master's degree in exercise and sport sciences in 1990. From 1990-92, Sowada served as a graduate assistant coach at the University of Texas working with on-campus recruiting, scouting and on-court coaching. The next year, Sowada was the restricted earnings coach at Louisiana State and then earned full-time status at the University of South Florida the next two seasons, before heading north to Rhode Island. At Rhode Island, Sowada coordinated all aspects of recruiting, which resulted in the signing of the largest recruiting class in the nation during the early signing period last fall. She helped lead the Rhode Island 1995-96 squad to a 21-8 record and its first NCAA tournament berth.

## *Theresa A. Gernatt*

### **Assistant Coach • First Year • Georgia Tech • '91**




Theresa Gernatt begins her first year at Florida State after serving as the restricted earnings coach at Mississippi State the past season. At MSU, Gernatt monitored the academic progress of the student-athletes, managed the program's tape-exchange program and assisted in on-court responsibilities.

A native of Marietta, Ga., Gernatt has several ties to the Atlantic Coast Conference. She was a four-year letterwinner and two-year team captain at Georgia Tech. She earned a degree in management in 1991 and then served as an assistant coach at the University of Maryland the next season. Gernatt returned to her alma mater the next two years and worked as an assistant to the athletic director while finishing her master's degree. Prior to attaining her position at Mississippi State, Gernatt worked one year at for Wisconsin women's basketball program as an administrative assistant.

## *Erika Lang*

### **Restricted Coach • First Year • Florida • '95**



Erika Lang, who played for the University of Florida from 1988-92, joins Chris Gobrecht's staff after a one-year stint as the restricted earnings coach at Purdue University. At Purdue, some of Lang's responsibilities included coordinating film exchange, team travel and assisting with on-campus recruiting.

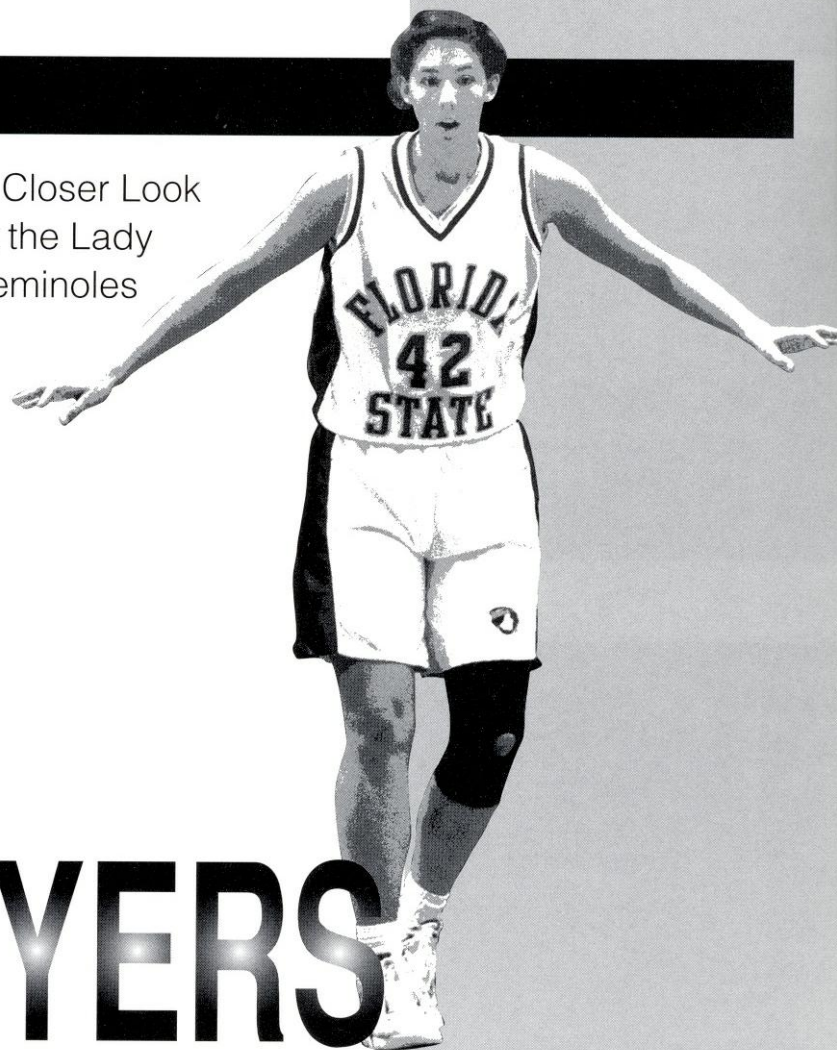
Lang, a native of Jacksonville, Fla., graduated from Florida in 1995 with a degree in exercise and sports science. She served as a student-assistant coach for the Lady Gators during the 1992-93 season and was also the junior varsity head coach at FW Buchholz High School in Gainesville during that time.
