**2001-02:** Played in 22 games and started in 16 contests...averaged 7.5 points and 4.2 rebounds, good for third best on the team, in 20.4 minutes per game...scored in double figures in eight games...led the team in rebounding in four games and in scoring in three contests...led the team with 14 points vs. Georgia Tech...paced the team with 16 points and six rebounds in the NC State win...led the team with 15 points at Maryland and added four rebounds and three steals...played a season-high 35 minutes at Wake Forest...scored 12 points and had six rebounds at IUPUI...had 10 points and grabbed six rebounds to lead the team in the Austin Peay game...had eight or more points in 12 games...was perfect from the free throw line in four contests...shot 72 percent from the free throw line...had six or more rebounds in eight games...missed the first four games with a stress fracture in her left foot.

**2001-02:** Was third on the team in scoring at 11.0 points and second in rebounding at 5.1 rebounds per game... played in all 28 games and started 26 of them...made a team-high 82 free throws on the year while shooting 72 percent from the charity stripe...recorded a team-best 34 three-pointers after coming into the season with just 26 in her career...was tied for first on the team with 41 steals, including a team-high five at Georgia Tech...scored in double figures in 17 games, including two games in the 20's...led the team in scoring five times and in rebounding in six games...was third on the team with 10 blocks...recorded her first double-double with a career-high 28 points and a career-high 12 rebounds vs. No. 18 Florida...scored 27 points in the season-opener vs. Saint Mary's...was perfect from the free throw line in nine games...in the ACC regular season, ranked 18th in scoring, 9th in free throw percentage and 15th in rebounding...hit a career-high four treys at Wake Forest...hit at least two three-pointers in 10 games and at least one in 19...grabbed six or more rebounds in 10 games...scored a team-leading 19 points and had nine rebounds in the home game vs. Duke...had a career-high five assists at Georgia Tech and vs. UNC...was named MVP of the Paradise Jam in the Virgin Islands...earned all-tournament team honors in the Seminole Classic.

**2000-01:** Was a solid contributor... played in all 31 games, including two starts...averaged 8.1 points and 2.7 rebounds per game in 17.7 minutes per contest...scored a season-high 17 points and led the team in the UNC game on Jan. 18th...had 16 points in just 20 minutes against Coppin State...tallied 15 at Clemson...grabbed a career-high nine rebounds vs. Georgia Tech...has tallied double figures in scoring in 11 games, including 12 vs. Duke in ACC Tourney semifinal and 11 vs. Iowa State in the NCAA Tournament...scored nine points in each of the first three games before breaking out with 10 against UCF...hit a career-high seven free throws on a career-high 10 attempts vs. Fordham...wasn't expected to return to action until late December after recovering from a torn ACL suffered in the spring.

**2001-02:** Returned to the Seminole line up after having a medical redshirt the season before...played in 27 games and started four contests...averaged 5.1 points and 2.7 rebounds...scored in 24 games, including three games in double figures ...gave the team a boost with eight points and two boards in 13 minutes of play in the Maryland win...had seven straight points and played just seven minutes in the NC State win and gave the Tribe the lead for good in the game...scored 13 points, including 5-for-7 from the free throw line, in the regular season-finale vs. Virginia...grabbed a season-high eight rebounds at Maryland...had four or more rebounds in five games...tied her career-high with 15 points in the East Tennessee State game...scored 11 points, on 5-for-5 from the field, in 12 minutes of play vs. Jacksonville...played a season-high 25 minutes in the Dayton game.

**1999-2000:** Played in 19 games, with nine starts and averaged 18.5 minutes per game...was out four weeks with a fractured foot and missed nine games...returned to action on Feb. 10th vs. Virginia and had four points and five rebounds...averaged 6.6 points and 3.8 rebounds per game...led the team in rebounding three times...scored a season-high 15 points vs. St. John's...had 12 points at Mercer, Loyola and Wake Forest...twice grabbed nine rebounds vs. Tulsa and Mercer...had at least eight points in nine games and seven rebounds in four games...recorded four steals in Oakland game.
