

# The Matthew Schmauch Leadership Award

**A**t the conclusion of the 2003-04 season, this leadership award will be given in memory of Matthew Schmauch, an Assistant Director of Athletic Academic Support at Florida State, who died on June 13, 2003 from anaphylaxis due to an allergic reaction to nuts while representing FSU at the N4A convention in St. Louis, Missouri.

Matt served as the academic advisor for the Florida State women's basketball program for four seasons and was instrumental in the academic success of the student-athletes. However, Matt's influence went well beyond his efforts in assisting the student-athletes in the classroom. He wore many hats for the Florida State athletics department. He was an ambassador, a mentor, a friend, a big brother, a fan — truly a shining example of where hard work, leadership and determination can take you.

As a former student-athlete, Matt understood what it took to balance athletics and academics. He captained the FSU men's swimming team from 1994-96. During his FSU career, he was an Atlantic Coast Conference finalist while achieving ACC Honor Roll status. His good habits started early. He was the captain of his high school swimming team, a two time state champion and the recipient of his school's 110% Award for four straight years. In addition, he was the valedictorian of his high school class and is only the second person at Allen Park High School in Michigan to be inducted into both the Academic and Athletic Halls of Fame.

The community was also important to Matt. While a student at FSU, Matt was involved in the "Say No to Drugs" campaign and was a member of the Student Athlete Advisory Council. As a professional, he continued to provide service to the community. He served as a staff representative on the Student Athlete Advisory Council and volunteered his time as a Big Brother to a young man from Tallahassee.

Well-respected in his profession, Matt was a member of the National Association of Academic Advisors for Athletes (N4A) and served as the two-year college committee liaison. The N4A has also named an award in Matt's memory, the Matthew Schmauch Professional Promise Award, which will be given out annually.

Matt's focus was always on academics and he worked diligently to bring former FSU athletes back to campus to finish their degree after they had left to play professional sports. As part of his legacy, the Matthew Schmauch Endowed Scholarship fund has also been created through Seminole Boosters, Inc.

Matthew Schmauch was a leader in many ways and the Florida State women's basketball program will continue to honor him each year by selecting a player who exemplifies these characteristics of leadership.

### FLORIDA STATE UNIVERSITY & SUNSHINE NETWORK

Florida State University and Sunshine Network announced a multi-year contract in August of 2000 that ensured Sunshine Network will continue to be the exclusive Florida cable home of FSU athletics for many years to come. Eight regular-season women's basketball games will be shown on Sunshine Network in 2003-04.

Since 1988, Sunshine Network has been the exclusive regional sports network home of FSU athletics in Florida. Available in over 5.5 million homes statewide via cable and satellite, Sunshine Network provides more coverage of FSU athletics than any other Florida television outlet.

Each year, Sunshine network airs over 100 games/programs for FSU, including its own production of every FSU regular season football game, which replay statewide on Sunshine Sunday evenings at 7 p.m. during "Prime Time Noles."

Also included in the agreement are the rights to a minimum of 10 baseball games and a minimum of 14 women's events including basketball, volleyball, soccer and softball.

Other programming includes highlight shows for fall and spring sports, call-in and/or coaches shows, "Seminoles Summer Showcase," highlighting replays or highlights of previous FSU events, "Seminoles Sports Magazine," "Seminoles Uprising" and more. Additional FSU athletic events, including men's and women's basketball, are available to Sunshine Network from the Atlantic Coast Conference and its rights holders.

An agreement with the ACC provides

Sunshine Network with additional FSU games and events, including the conference's new Sunday night ACC basketball package which begins this fall on regional sports networks nationwide (exclusively on Sunshine in Florida). The network also airs "ACC Live!," Mondays at 7 p.m., and numerous other games/events for the ACC, giving FSU fans coverage of not only their home team, but FSU's conference opponents as well.

"Our contractual partnership with Sunshine Network provides an extremely valuable distribution avenue for Florida State University events which are showcased within our own state and well beyond," FSU Director of Athletics Dave Hart said. "This extension affords us a very comprehensive means of exposure which enhances every facet of our athletics program. We are pleased to extend our contract and relationship with the people at Sunshine Network."
