

# 2002-03 SEASON REVIEW

## FSU VS. TEAMS IN THE POSTSEASON

During the regular season, FSU did not face any of the other 31 teams in the 2003 WNIT. However, FSU did play seven of the 64 NCAA Tournament teams in 2002-03.

## WE PLAYED THEM BOTH

The Seminoles played two national champions. FSU faced NCAA Tournament champion UConn in December and it was eventual WNIT champion Auburn that the Seminoles fell to in postseason play.

## FSU IN POSTSEASON PLAY

While the Seminoles competed in their second postseason tournament in the last three years, the program's progress can be looked at in an even greater light. Prior to FSU's participation in the 2001 NCAA Tournament, FSU hadn't played in a postseason tournament since 1990-91 — a 10-year absence. So, this season will

actually be FSU's second postseason appearance in the last 13 years! In all, FSU has now played in four NCAA Tournaments and two NITs.

## FSU IN THE NIT

This season marked the second time that FSU has participated in the women's NIT. Back in the 1982 season, the Seminoles finished as the runner-up in the National Women's Invitational Tournament — the program's first national tournament appearance. FSU defeated Pepperdine, 76-63, and BYU, 75-71, before falling 76-60 to champion Oregon. Back then, the tournament was called the NWIT and included just eight teams. The NWIT later went to 16 teams. The 1996 season was the last NWIT tournament and there was no tournament in 1997. In 1998, the tournament was brought back under the new name WNIT and in 1999, the field expanded to its current 32 teams.

## THE WIN TOTAL

Florida State's 17 wins marked just the third time since joining the ACC in 1991-92 that the Seminoles have earned 17 or more victories. In fact, since records were kept in 1973-74, FSU has had 17 or more wins just eight times — two of which have been in the last three years. FSU has eclipsed the 20-win mark four times with its most wins being 28 back in the 1981-82 season.

FSU's 8-8 ACC record this year was the same league record the Seminoles had in 1991-92, its first season in the league.

That year however, the Tribe was the No. 5 seed. FSU has finished .500 or better in the ACC three times now, including twice in the last three years. FSU has finished a program-best fourth in the ACC twice in the past three years.

"After you've had a game when you don't win, I imagine it's hard to sound real excited, but if you look back at where your program was when you arrived in Tallahassee and here you are now, fighting in the middle of the ACC and contending and playing top teams and doing well. Can you talk about the progress you've made to go from no where to being a legitimate contender?"

Her answer...

"We've got a lot of really great people and players who have had the courage to say 'I'm going to come to Florida State and make a difference.' We've had some suc-

cess in recruiting and those players come in with an attitude. It's a tough situation to be in because it's not about walking into a lot of tradition, it's about developing and creating tradition and I think that's even harder. I just credit these players for their courage, enthusiasm and the fortitude that they have."

**IT WAS LATE BUT NOT THE LATEST**

FSU's game vs. Auburn on March 22nd marked the second latest date the Seminoles have played in a season. Back in 1982, FSU's last NIT appearance, FSU fell to Oregon in the championship game on March 27th. The FIU game on March 20th marked the latest time for a

home game. The last time FSU played a home game in the month of March was in the 1990-91 season when the Tribe hosted first and second round NCAA Tournament games.

**TASHEIKA TAKES CONTROL**

Tasheika Morris exploded for a career-high 26 points in the WNIT win over FIU. Morris was in double digits within the first six minutes of the game as she scored 11 of FSU's first 17 points. She made a career-high 11 field goals in the game and was the only Seminole to tally double figures. She also committed just one foul in 32 minutes of play. Morris scored more than 20 points in two of the last four games of the season and in six games overall.

**MORE ABOUT THAT FIU WIN**

In addition to Tasheika Morris' outstanding performance in the FIU game, LaQuinta Neely led all players, and tied her career-high with 10 rebounds. Katelyn Vujas led all players with five assists. She has been among the team leaders in assists in nine games, including two games in which she solely led the squad. As a team, FSU made a season-high 32 field goals in the game. The 26-point margin was one of four games this season that FSU has won by 26 or more points.

**TEAM EFFORT**

FSU's last win of the season was indeed a team-effort. All 11 players who were healthy saw action and all 11 scored. Eight players had five or more points and six players had four or more rebounds. Three players also had three or more assists.

**TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS**

FSU took care of the ball while taking care of business in its 26-point win vs. FIU.

The Seminoles committed a season-low nine turnovers — the program's lowest output since having nine vs. UVA on Feb. 25, 2001. FSU also tied its season-low with 10 fouls and sent FIU to the free throw line just six times.

**ALL-ACC HONORS**

The Atlantic Coast Sports Writers Association announced the 2003 All-ACC Women's Basketball teams on March 4th and for the second straight season, Florida State's Tasheika Morris was recognized. Morris, a 6-0 junior guard from Huntsville, Ala., earned second team honors while freshman Ganiyat Adeduntan garnered honorable mention All-Freshman Team honors.

**DOUBLE MEANT DOUBLE FOR VUJAS**

Katelyn Vujas, who averaged 7.9 field goal attempts per game this season, should really have shot more because of the eight games in which she has attempted 10 or more shots, she scored in double digits in seven of them.

**AND SPEAKING OF DOUBLES...**

Katelyn Vujas recorded her third double-double of the season and sixth of her career with 11 points and 11 rebounds in the Georgia Tech game. Here's a look at individual double-double performances:

**JOHNSON IS VERSATILE**

While Holly Johnson's position is point guard, the rookie contributed in a variety of ways. Since reassuming the point guard duties in the final six games, she averaged 35.3 minutes per game, including all 40 minutes in the final two regular-season games. She also averaged 6.0 points and 4.3 rebounds per game in that stretch. Johnson had a knack for getting to the free throw line this year where she shot 73 percent for the season. Overall, Johnson attempted five or more free throws in six games. She also had five or more rebounds in eight games.

**SWEEP 'EM UP**

Heading into the 2002-03 season, Clemson was the only ACC team that FSU hadn't beaten in the Sue Semrau era. So this year, the Seminoles swept the Tigers. FSU also swept Wake Forest this season.

Since Semrau's arrival, FSU has recorded sweeps over Georgia Tech, Wake Forest, NCSate, Maryland and Clemson.

**BRADLEY EARNS HONOR**

Lauren Bradley was named to the 2003 Verizon Academic All-District 3 University Division Women's Basketball First Team. Bradley, a native of Lake Mary, Fla., holds a 3.83 grade point average in criminology. The 6-4 center played in 28 games for the Seminoles and averaged 4.9 points per game.

**ON THE ROAD IN THE ACC**

FSU went 3-5 on the road in ACC play this season. Since joining the league in 1991-92, FSU has recorded three or more ACC road wins four times. Only Duke (8-0) and Carolina (6-2) had better ACC road records than the Seminoles this season.

**AGAINST TOP 10 TEAMS**

Tasheika Morris had some outstanding performances in five games against Top 10 teams this season. She averaged 17.2 ppg and 3.8 rebounds per game against those foes.

**ON GUARD!**

Tasheika Morris, who played the post position last season, moved to wing this year and it seemed to suit her just fine! She led the team in scoring 17 times this season and scored in double figures in 26 games, including a career-high 26 vs. FIU. Morris wasn't afraid to shoot the ball either. In fact, she attempted a career-high 24 field goals at UNC and averaged a team-high 15.6 shots per game.

**11 OR MORE**

Ten of FSU's 17 wins were by 11 or more points. The Seminoles also proved that they could win the close games as they went 7-4 in games decided by nine or less points.

**BLOCK IT TO 'EM**

FSU recorded seven blocks in two games this year. In fact, FSU had four or more blocks in 15 games this season and had 105 on the year for an average of 3.5 per game. The Tribe had 62 in 28 games last year. The most blocks FSU has had in a season is 129 in 1997-98.

**EIGHT WAS GREAT**

LaQuinta Neely recorded a career-high eight assists in the Maryland win. The eight assists was the most in a single game for a Seminole this season. FSU had double-digit assists in 19 games.

**NEW HIGH FOR NETTA**

Trinetta Moore's 21 points in the win at Maryland was the senior's career-high. Her previous high was 20 in the South Florida win earlier in the season. She shot an impressive 82 percent from the field in

the game. Moore also played a career-high 33 minutes in the Maryland game.

**GOOD AND TWENTY**

The Maryland win marked the only time this season that two Seminoles recorded 20 or more points in the same game. Tasheika Morris had a game-high 24 points while Trinetta Moore scored a career-high 21 points and led all players with nine rebounds. And speaking of 20 — the Seminoles also recorded a season-high 23 assists in the win at Maryland — the team's most since December 2, 2001 vs. Austin Peay.

**FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING!**

FSU's win at Clemson was the first for the Seminoles in school history. Clemson had won 23 of 24 meetings between the two schools. FSU's only previous win was in the Seminoles' first season in the ACC (1991-92) on February 1, 1992. Clemson had won 21 straight over the Tribe, including 10 straight in Clemson. Sue Semrau has now won at least one game vs. all eight ACC opponents.

**UNBELIEVABLE!**

Linnea Liljestrand scored a game-high 19 points in just 13 minutes of play, including 17 straight in the second half, to lead the Seminoles from a nine-point deficit to a 59-57 victory over Clemson, marking the program's first win at Clemson. After trailing 33-30 at halftime, Genesis Choice scored eight of FSU's first 10 points in the second half, but the Seminoles found themselves down by nine at 49-40 with 11:46 remaining in the game. Enter Liljestrand. The sophomore guard, who had just two points in the first half, scored 15 unanswered points, including 4-for-5 from three-point range, before the Tigers even knew what hit them!

**GENESIS WAS A FACTOR**

Genesis Choice was a major contributor in FSU's win at Clemson. The sophomore scored 13 points and shared team-high honors with seven rebounds while adding two blocks in 24 minutes of play off of the bench. Choice scored in double figures six times this season. She has also led the team in rebounding in six games.

**ACC ROAD WIN**

FSU's 15-point win at Maryland was the program's biggest ACC road win, by margin, since the Seminoles defeated Georgia Tech in Atlanta by 35 points, 88-53, on January 18, 1998.

**REBOUND THAT BASKETBALL**

Florida State recorded a season-high 64 rebounds in the triple overtime win vs. Wake Forest. In fact, the total is the most rebounds FSU has had since joining the

ACC and most since February 15, 1990 when the Tribe had 67 in an 87-60 win vs. FAMU. The 64 ranks seventh on the all-time single game rebounds list.

**GEE WAS G GOOD**

Ganiyat Adeduntan led all scorers with 17 points in the win at Wake Forest. She also grabbed three rebounds and had two assists, two blocks and a steal and NO turnovers in 25 minutes of play.

**HANNAH HELPED A LOT**

Hannah Linquist, a native of North Carolina, had her own fan club at the Wake Forest game and she didn't disappoint! Linquist hit a jumper, almost immediately after entering the game, which began a 9-0 for the Seminoles. She also had two key rebounds in five minutes of play. Linquist played in 18 games overall and scored a career-high seven points vs. Alabama and a grabbed a career-high six rebounds vs. Maryland.

**TWO IN THE BOOKS**

Trinetta Moore recorded her second career double-double, and second of the season, with a 10-point, 10-rebound performance in the win over Virginia. Overall, Moore notched double digit points in eight games and double digit rebounds in two games this season.

**MORE GOOD AND TWENTY**

Four players reached the 20-point mark this season in a game:  
 Ganiyat Adeduntan - 23 vs. Alabama State  
 Genesis Choice - 20 vs. Georgia State  
 Trinetta Moore - 20 at South Florida, 21 at Maryland  
 Tasheika Morris - 21 at NAU, 24 at Maryland, 20 vs. Georgia Tech, 20 at UNC, 23 vs. Clemson, 26 vs. FIU.

**GANIYAT HONORED**

After helping to lead Florida State to two wins, Ganiyat Adeduntan was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on January 6th. Adeduntan averaged 13.3 points and 2.7 rebounds off of the bench in FSU's three games last week. She rallied for 17 points in the win at Wake Forest, helping the Seminoles to their first win in Winston-Salem since the 1997-98 season, and led the team again with 16 points vs. UCF. The rookie guard shot 44 percent from the field, including 45 percent from three-point range, and had no turnovers in a total of 65 minutes played in the three games. It was the second ACC Rookie of the Week honor for Adeduntan and the third for FSU this season.

**BIG GAME BRADLEY**

Lauren Bradley tied her career-high with 15 points in 15 minutes of play vs.

UCF. She also notched a career-high seven free throws on a career-high eight attempts. The junior came off the bench to also tie her season-high with six rebounds.

**BIGGEST WIN OF THE SEASON**

FSU's 30-point win vs. UCF was the Seminoles' biggest win, by margin, this season. The Tribe opened the season with a 28-point win over Alabama State and had a 29-point win at Akron.

In the Sue Semrau era, FSU has won 20 games by 25 points or more, and 13 by 30 or more points, with its biggest win by a margin of 46 points occurring last year against Jacksonville. Of the 20 victories by 25 points or more, just four have been on the road. The 2000-01 season saw the most victories by 25 or more points with six of them.

**GOOD GOLLY MISS HOLLY!**

Holly Johnson was named the ACC's Rookie of the Week on Dec. 16th after helping guide the Seminoles to a 75-46 win at Akron. The Phoenix, Ariz., native scored a career-high 15 points to accompany her five rebounds and three assists in 34 minutes of action in the Seminoles' 75-46 victory against Akron. The 5-8 guard went 5-for-8 from the field (63%), 2-for-4 (50%) from beyond the arc and 3-for-3 (100%) from the free throw line.

**HOUSTON WAS "WRIGHT" ON**

Francine Houston played in 10 games and scored in four of them. She had a season-high five points in the Wright State win and played a season-high 13 minutes in that contest.

**IT WAS GOOD TO BE HOME**

In front of her hometown fans (Wadsworth is just 13 miles from Akron), Katelyn Vujas scored a career-high 19 points to lead all scorers and grabbed a game-high eight rebounds, including five offensive boards, to lead FSU to a 75-46 win at Akron. Vujas went 6-for-14 (43%) from the field and 7-for-9 (78%) from the free throw line and had two assists, one steal, one turnover and one block in 31 minutes of play.

**ACC ROOKIE OF THE WEEK**

Ganiyat Adeduntan was named the season's first ACC Rookie of the Week on November 25th after her all-tournament team performance in the Seminole Classic. Adeduntan averaged 16.5 points and 5.5 rebounds in FSU's victories over Alabama State and Georgia State. She scored a game-high 23 points in the season-opener which ties the best season-opening point performance for a rookie in the Sue Semrau era. Former Seminole April

Traylor also scored 23 points in her debut in a 76-67 win at Tulsa in 1998.

**DOUBLE-DOUBLE FOR GENESIS**

Genesis Choice recorded her first career double-double with a career-high 19 points and a career-high 11 rebounds in the season-opener vs. Alabama State and followed that up with a 20-point (new career-high), eight-rebound performance against Georgia State on her way to earning Seminole Classic MVP honors.

**ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM**

Tasheika Morris and Ganiyat Adeduntan earned Seminole Classic All-Tournament Team honors after helping lead FSU to the Classic title. After playing just 16 minutes and scoring nine points in the opener because of foul trouble, Morris, rallied for 19 points and five rebounds in the Georgia State game. Adeduntan was solid in both games, scoring a game-high 23 in the Alabama State game and 10 in the Georgia State win. She also averaged 5.5 rebounds in the two contests.

**NON-CONFERENCE**

The Auburn game was FSU's 13th non-conference game of the season. Here's a look at FSU's record in non-conference play under Sue Semrau's reign:
