PRESS CREDENTIALS



GAME OPERATIONS

Pre-game notes, rosters and a running play-by-play will be provided along with halftime and final statistics. A fax machine is also available upon request. Live stats are available on www.seminoles.com for all home games.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

The Seminole Productions awardwinning staff also creates the season highlight tapes, team motivational videos, banquet and special event videos for many sports. Seminole Productions is also a resource for media outlets when it comes to finding footage of FSU Athletics. Seminole Productions has garnered national recognition as one of the best video production facilities in the nation and consistently ranks at the top of the in-game entertainment arena for universities across the nation. And it only gets better...

In the summer of 2004, Seminole Productions moved to a new 6,000 square foot communication center in the new Coyle Moore Athletics Center. This state-ofthe-art facility includes a brand new studio, two control rooms, 10 Avid digital editing and graphics suites, private offices, a green room, a new computer editing and graphics classroom, a student producer area and much more. There are also fiber optic video camera connections to all areas of the Coyle Moore Athletics Center, Doak Campbell Stadium, Donald L. Tucker Civic Center, FSU Basketball Training Center and Dick Howser Stadium with connections to WFSU-TV's uplink. This has created the ability to do live, multi-camera productions or uplink feeds. With a simple camera connection, Seminole Productions can send the signal through fiber to WFSU's satellite

Students in the College of Communication media production program also have plenty of hands-on access to some of the finest equipment around. This new facility also ensures that FSU continues to attract the best and brightest students of media production from all across the globe.

Seminole Productions continually gets recognized for excellence and has received over 28 international and national awards in the last two years. Most recently, SP received six Telly Awards, six Communicator Awards, and two Aurora Awards for its work with Florida State Athletics during the 2004-05 academic year. The Telly Awards are presented to honor outstanding local, regional and cable television production.

Seminole Productions certainly started off 2005 with a bang! Staff members Jim Garbarino and Jerry Tootle were honored with Gold Awards in the Aurora Awards international competition which brought

Assistant Director of Homecoming 2005.




have the opportunity to compete on a national level, by focusing on non-national commercials, regional or special interest entertainment and corporate sponsored film and video. Entries come from across the US, and abroad including Canada, Hong Kong, Denmark, Mexico, etc. The Aurora Gold Awards given to Seminole Productions were for the 2004 Football Stadium Open, produced and created by Jim Garbarino, and the Lassiter-Ware Commercial, produced by Jerry Tootle. Previous winners of the gold award include Disney I.D.E.A.S, The History Channel, A&E Network and Fox Sports Net. The Aurora statue itself was commissioned specifically for the competition by a nationally renowned sculptor. The statues are cast in the same foundry that creates the Emmy, Oscar and Clio statues.

Earlier this year, Seminole Productions was honored by the Communicator Awards with six awards and two honorable mentions. Of the six Communicator awards won by Seminole Productions, three were Crystal Awards of Excellence. The Crystal Awards were given to the 2004 Bowden Show Open by Jim Garbarino, the 2004 Football Stadium Open also by Jim Garbarino, and the Lassiter-Ware Commercial for Host Communications by Jerry Tootle. SP staff also took home three Awards of Distinction. Awards of Distinction were given to the 2004 Bobby Bowden Show by Jim Garbarino, the Mike Martin Show also by Jim Garbarino, and Florida's Compliance Assistance Program by Jerry Tootle. Much of Sun Sports' FSU programming is also available to digital cable subscribers nationwide via Fox Sports Digital Nets, a programming service offered to cable systems throughout the U.S.

Each year, Sun Sports Network airs and produces numerous FSU games/programs, including its own production of every FSU regular season football game, which replay statewide on Sun Sports on Sunday evenings during "Prime Time 'Noles," and again on Monday afternoon. "The Bobby Bowden Show" can be seen statewide Sunday aftersoons. Weekly highlights of FSU athletics air Saturdays with "Seminole Sports Magazine" and "Seminole Uprising," all on Sun Sports Network. In addition, the 'Noles are discussed on Sun Sports' popular "SportsTalk Live" show featuring media panelists from around the state each Monday night.

An agreement with the ACC provides Sun Sports Network with additional FSU games and events, including the conference's Sun Sports night ACC basketball package, "ACC Sunday Night Hoops" on regional sports networks nationwide (exclusively on Sun Sports in Florida). The network also airs "ACC Live!," Mondays at 6:30 p.m. and numerous other games/events for the ACC, giving FSU fans coverage of not only their home team, but FSU's conference opponents as well.

Some of his duties at FSU include technical support for the department, website maintenance and editor of the Seminole Dispatch, FSU athletics weekly online newsletter. Pensy, who is also handling the Internet broadcasts for FSU Volleyball, is the producer for the Seminole Radio Network football broadcasts.

He married the former Maggie Davis, a medical student at FSU, in June.
