13 points in the Clemson win...scored seven points, all in the second half, at No. 6 Maryland and grabbed two rebounds ...had one of her best performance of the season with 22 points in the first win over Virginia and had four 20+ point games this season...also added seven rebounds in her effort vs. UVA...scored in double figures in 19 of the last 22 games and 23 games overall...had a five-game double figures scoring streak snapped at No. 2 Duke when she had nine points but tied for team honors with six rebounds...shot 73 percent from the field and led all scorers with 20 points in 20 minutes of play in the Lipscomb win...had 15 points in the season-opener vs. Georgia Southern...recorded her first double-double of the season with 12 points and 12 rebounds in the win over UCF...has grabbed four or more rebounds in 21 games...was second on the team with 109 free throw attempts and was first with 62 steals...made her first career three-pointer in the season-opener and had three on the year...averaged 27.7 minutes per game...led the team in steals the last two seasons, now has 202 career steals which moved her into a 4th place on FSU's all-time list.

**2004-05:** Was second on the team in both scoring (12.4 ppg) and rebounding (6.6 rpg)...team's most aggressive defender ...a member of the five-member ACC All-Defensive team and an All-ACC honorable mention selection...led the team with 101 steals (had 39 total last year) and led the ACC with a 3.2 steals per game average...set a new FSU single season record for steals (previous was 96 set back in 1992-



93)...shot a team-high 52 percent from the field which ranked 4th in the ACC in shooting percentage...scored in double figures in 23 games...had four double-doubles this season (and in career)...led the team in scoring three times, including 13 points in the regular-season finale...grabbed a career-high 18 rebounds in the FAMU win — a mark that ranks fifth in the FSU single-game records...had eight or more rebounds in 13 games and four or more steals in 15 games...her 12.4 ppg ranked 14th in ACC...14th in ACC with 6.6 rebounds pg...was among the leaders in rebounding 11 times...scored a career-high 24 points, added a team-high nine rebounds and snagged six steals in the 2OT win at Virginia Tech...was named all-tournament in all three tourneys this season...set her career-high with six assists at Miami and matched it with six at Wake Forest...earned Seminole Classic all-tournament team honors after averaging 10.5 points and 9.0 rebounds per game... earned San Juan Shootout honors after averaging 13.0 points, 7.0 rebounds and 4.0 steals in the three games...earned Lady Griz Holiday Classic all-tourney honors after averaging 9.0 points and 8.5 rebounds per game ...started every game since coming off the bench in the season-opener.

**2003-04:** Averaged 5.2 points and 3.2 rebounds per game...rookie wing player who broke into the starting line up and started the last 21 games of the season... played in all 30 games and averaged 19.4 minutes per game, including 19 or more minutes in 17 games...played 34 or more minutes in three contests...was solid defensively...had four or more rebounds in 17 games and five or more points 18 times ...shot 46 percent from the field...led the team in scoring twice...was second on the team with 39 steals, including a career-high four vs. Maryland in the ACC Tour-ney...in a career-high 35 minutes, scored a then-career-high 13 points to lead all Seminoles in the win over Wake Forest... led the team in scoring for the second straight game with a new career-high 15 points in 35 minutes of play at NC State... scored 10 points and dished out a career-high four assists in the win over Clemson...had nine points at No. 10 North Carolina and added four rebounds in 27 minutes of play...played 30 minutes in the win vs. Maryland...had seven points, a career-high eight rebounds and three assists in 25 minutes of play vs. Virginia... played 17 minutes vs. NC State and tied her career-high with nine points and had four rebounds...played 16 minutes in the win at Wake Forest and contributed seven points, four rebounds and two assists...in her first career start, scored six points and had a career-high five rebounds in 26 minutes of play vs. No. 17 LSU...scored nine points vs. FDU in 21 minutes of play ...played 21 minutes vs. South Florida and scored seven points...scored six points vs. Florida...had five points in the season-

opener vs. Savannah State.

**HIGH SCHOOL:** Orange Park's women's basketball's most valuable player for her final three seasons...finished her career with 1,550 points, 570 rebounds, 415 steals and 420 assists...named to the all-first coast girls basketball team three years...led Orange Park to regional and district titles in 2003 and a 21-4 record... named the most valuable player in the Florida North/South All Star Game in Daytona Beach...also played in the Nike All Star game...was nominated for the 2002 and 2003 Amateur Female Basketball Player of the Year Jasper Awards...was a member of a senior class that racked up 95 wins against 21 losses...a *Street & Smith* All-America Honorable Mention selection in 2002...named to the Class 5A All-State Third Team in 2002...ranked among the nation's top 50 players in the All Star Girls Report...also earned 2002 all-conference honors in track and field...a 2002 National Honor Roll member who had a 3.97 grade point average...was a Florida delegate nominee to the International Summit of Young Leaders.

Played in all 30 games in the middle for the Seminoles...had two starts...was a force to be reckoned with defensively and on the boards...pulled down a career-high 10 rebounds in the NCAA Tourney win over No. 17 Louisiana Tech in just 19 minutes of play to lead FSU and led the squad again with eight boards vs. No. 14 Stanford...had six boards in the win at Miami...scored in 19 games and grabbed four or more rebounds 11 times...was a defensive force at No. 3 North Carolina and had three steals while tying her career-high with nine rebounds in just 12 minutes of play off of the bench...had a strong showing vs. Lipscomb

with nine points and three steals off of the bench...scored a season-high 10 points in the win over Montana and grabbed eight rebounds in the Western Carolina victory...was named to the Seminole Classic All-Tournament team after averaging 9.0 points and 6.0 rebounds per game...averaged just 12.1 minutes per game but played a season-high 21 minutes in the Montana win and has played 15 or more minutes in 12 games.

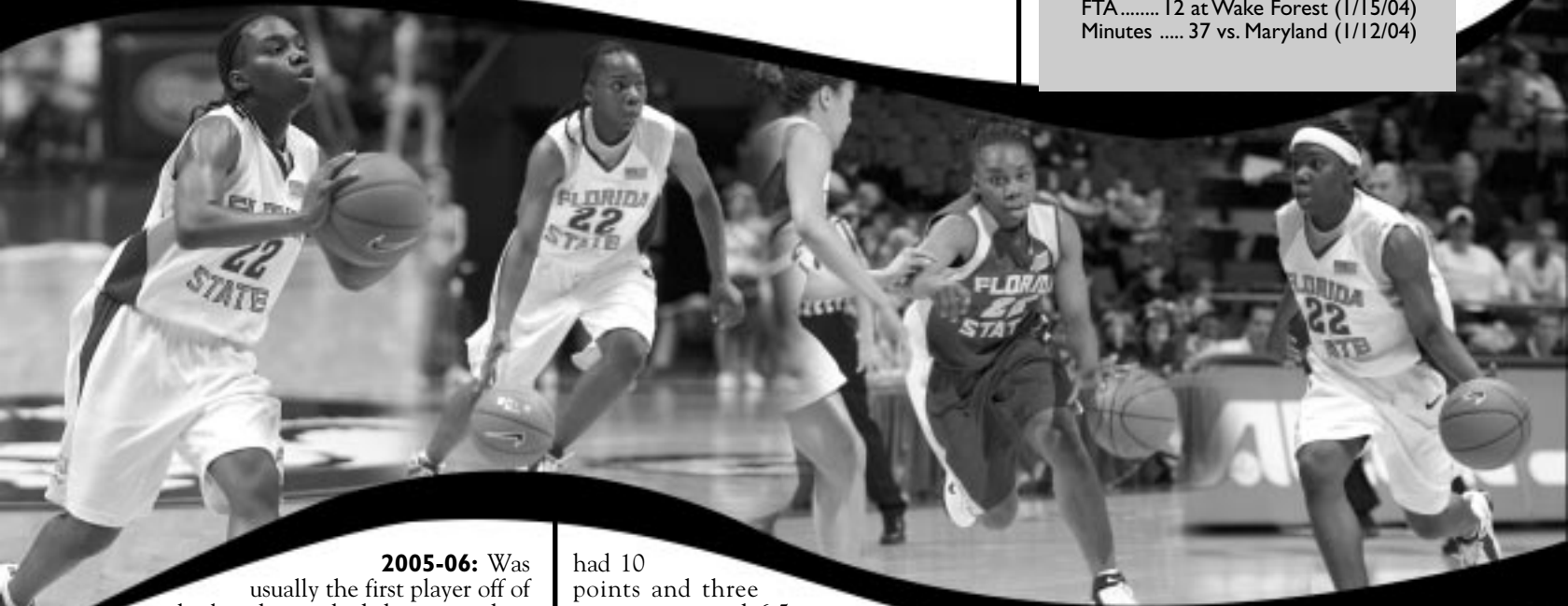

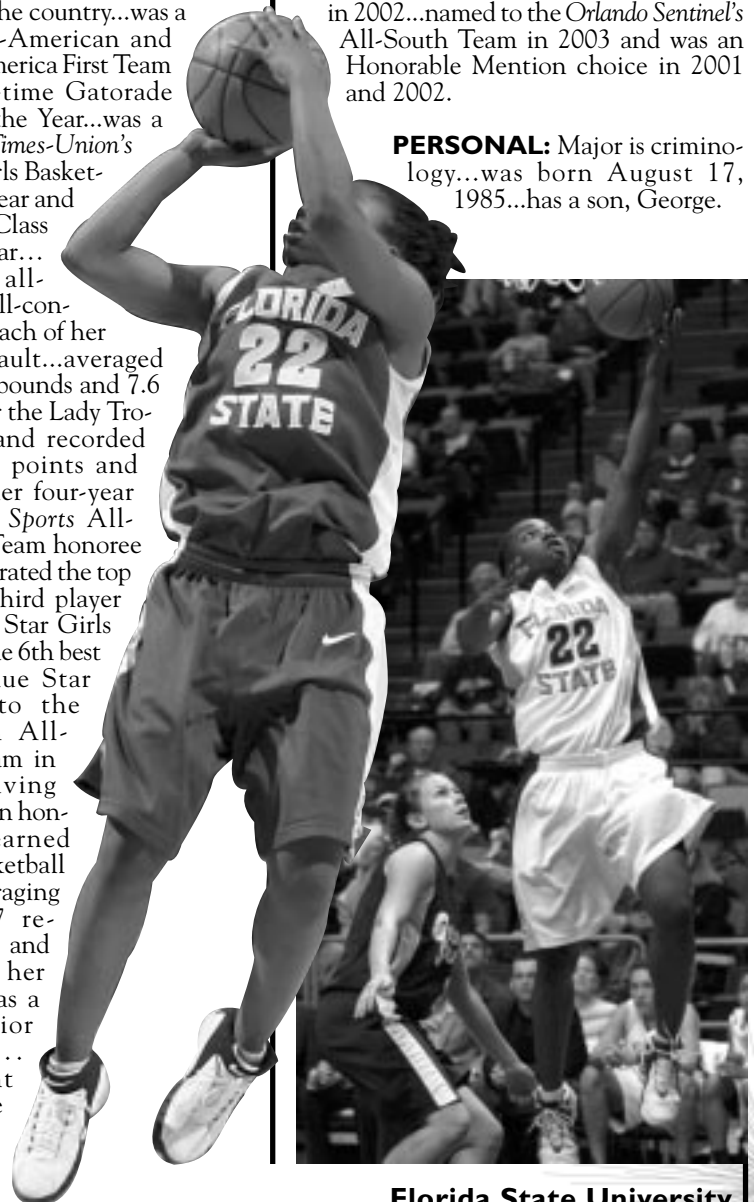

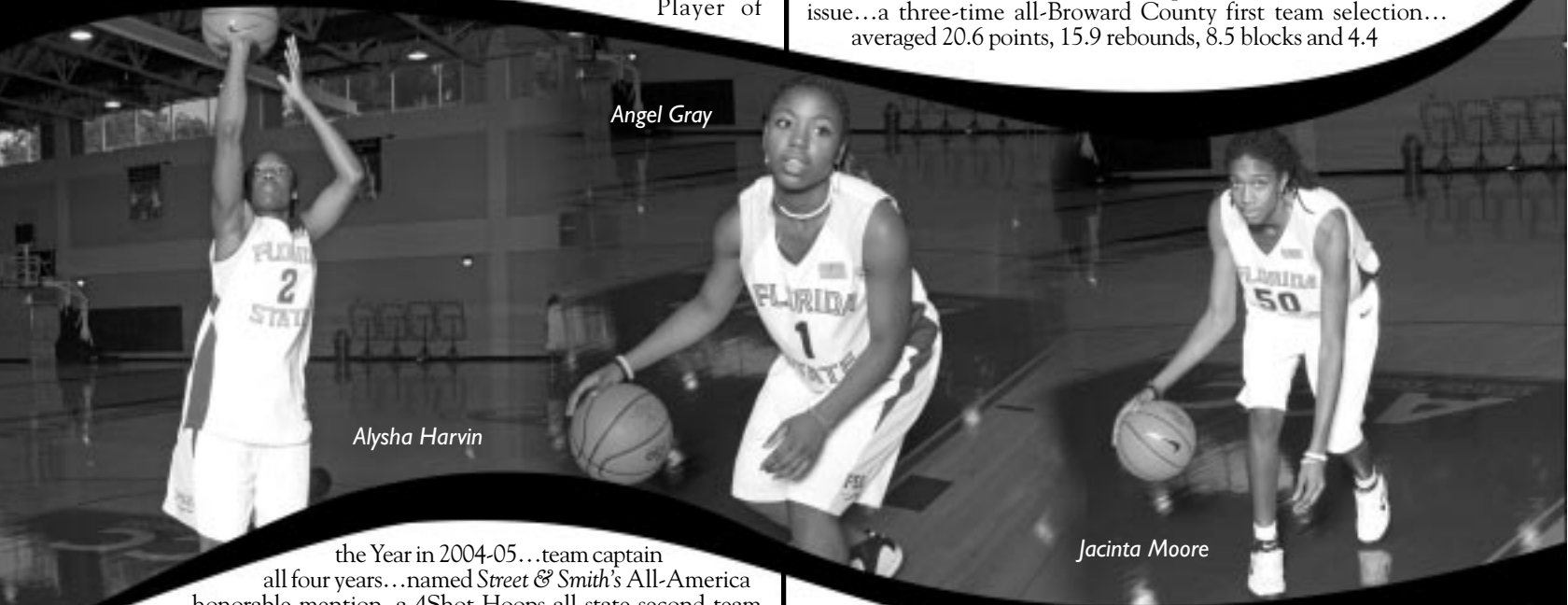
