Season Review

HOW SWEET IT IS

A 68-61 victory over Stanford on its home court sent the Florida State women's basketball team to the first NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 appearance in school history. The Seminoles opened the national summit by beating Old Dominion 85-75 in the first round of the Fresno Regional. Unfortunately, the magical season came to an end when LSU defeated the Seminoles 55-43 in the Sweet 16.

BEST THREE-YEAR SPAN

Florida State has now recorded 20 or more victories in three straight seasons which is the most successful span in program history. From the 1989 to 1992 seasons, FSU recorded 17 or more wins in three straight seasons. Aside from the current coaching staff, another constant in the last three seasons was Alicia Gladden who was a starter all three seasons. The three-time ACC All-Defensive player led the team in scoring in two straight seasons.

MATCHED MOST WINS

With their last win, the Seminoles earned their 24th victory of the season, matching the most wins by a Sue Semrau-coached Seminole team. In 2004-05, FSU finished the season 24-8. The 34 games played are the third most games played by FSU in a single season and the most since 1981-82 when the Seminoles played 38 games and went 28-10. FSU played 35 games in 1979-80 and finished 13-22.

SINCE THE BREAKOUT YEAR

Since Florida State's breakout year in 2000-01 when the Seminoles finished tied for third in the league with a then-record nine ACC wins and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 10 years, the Tribe has been very competitive in the league. Including the 2000-01 season, Florida State has averaged 8.1 ACC wins in the last seven seasons. Pretty amazing considering that just a short time ago, in 1996-97, FSU went winless in the ACC at 0-16.

THEY'RE A 10!

With the inclusion of new ACC members, the ACC regular-season format the past three years has included just 14 league games instead of the 16 games played in past seasons. Even with the two fewer opportunities, the Seminoles have earned their most ACC wins with 10 the past two seasons. FSU has earned eight or more ACC victories in a season six times now and five of those times have been in the last seven years under Sue Semrau's direction.

20+ WINS YET AGAIN

With a 24-10 record, Florida State recorded 20 wins for the third-straight seasons which is a program first. The current three-year span is Florida State's most successful and when the Seminoles advanced to the NCAA Tournament, it was also a program-first third-straight time. Since 1973-74 when season records

were kept, FSU has recorded seven 20-win seasons and with three in the last 10 years, only Sue Semrau has led a team to this feat more than twice.

SEMRAU MAKES STRIDES

Under Florida State head coach Sue Semrau's direction, the Seminoles have now recorded double-digit victories in eight-straight seasons which is a program best. From 1978-79 to 1983-84, FSU had six straight seasons with double-digit wins. With 160 victories in her 10 seasons, Semrau is the winningest women's basketball coach in Florida State history. Marynell Meadors is second with 132 wins in 10 seasons. Semrau is just the third coach in FSU women's basketball history to have a winning career record. The others are Jan Allen (1979-86), who had a 111-108 record while faculty coach Joel Thirer (1973-74) had an 8-3 record.

ALL-TIME DOUBLE DIGIT ACC WINS

For the second straight season, FSU had double-digit wins in regular-season ACC competition, which is the most since joining the league in 1991-92. The opponent who has suffered the most is Georgia Tech, who has lost by double digits to FSU eight times.

AMONG THE BEST

Alicia "Ice" Gladden scored 458 points last season, which is more than she has scored in any other season at FSU. Gladden led the team in scoring at 13.5 points per game, and scored in double figures a team-high 26 times last season. She also had seven or more rebounds in 16 games last season. She became the 20th member of the 1,000 point club at FSU in the second game of the season and finished with 1,403 career points which ranks seventh all-time at FSU. With 275 career steals, including a team-high 73 steals in 2006-07, she is FSU's all-time leader in career steals.

MONROE WRAPS UP GREAT ROOKIE SEASON WITH ACC ALL-FRESHMAN TEAM HONORS

For the third time in the last four years, Florida State was represented on the ACC All-Freshman Team as Jacinta Monroe was an easy selection. Her 1.85 blocks per game was tops by an ACC rookie and sixth in the country within the freshman ranks. She was among the league leaders for blocks, field goal percentage (6th - .539) and rebounding (20th - 6.0) and in the top three within the rookie ranks in all three of those categories as well as third in points. Monroe cracked the FSU single-season top 10 list with a .539 (111-of-206) shooting percentage.

FRESHMEN GARNERING ATTENTION IN GREENSBORO

As a whole, Florida State's freshmen class may have been the best in the conference. The Seminoles were honored with ACC Rookie of the Week honors four times in 2006-07, which trailed only Virginia who got all of its awards from Monica Wright. Forward Jacinta Monroe brought home the majority of the hardware for Florida State, winning the award three times: November 13, January 8 and January 29. A Seminole won two of the first three honors as Alysha Harvin was honored on November 27.

SEMINOLES EXCELLING IN THE CLASSROOM AS WELL

The success of last season extended to the classroom as well for the Seminoles. Florida State tied with Maryland for the most student-athletes on the ACC Women's Basketball All-Academic Team with representatives Nikki Anthony, Mara Freshour and Alicia Gladden. The trio was joined by Tiffany Buckelew and Christie Lautsch on the ACC Academic Honor Roll. Anthony was further recognized for her academic efforts with a CoSIDA Academic All-District selection.

SEMINOLES HAND OUT THE HARDWARE AT ANNUAL TEAM BANQUET

A whole evening probably wasn't enough, but the Seminoles looked back on the outstanding 2006-07 season with their annual team banquet. That night Florida State also handed out its team awards. Here are the recipients:

GLADDEN ROUNDS OUT CAREER WITH THIRD-TEAM ALL-ACC HONORS

For the second-straight season, Alicia Gladden was named to the All-ACC third team. During the regular-season, Gladden, a 5-11 senior guard from Orange Park, Florida, led the Seminoles in scoring at 14.0 points per game, was third in rebounding at 5.9 rebounds per game and was the team leader in steals.

Season Review

BLOCK PARTY

Florida State recorded a single-season record 166 blocks last season, which was nearly double the blocks of its opponents (93). FSU recorded a season-high 10 blocks in the win over Miami on January 7th. It's the most blocks in a game for FSU since the Seminoles swatted away 10 balls vs. Miami-Ohio on November 27, 2004. The Florida State record for blocks in a game is 12 vs. Mercer on November 17, 1978. The previous record for blocks in a season was 129 in 1997-98. FSU had 94 blocks all of 2005-06 and last season averaged 4.9 per game.

TWIN TOWERS ON THE BLOCK

With 55 blocks on the season, sophomore Britany Miller surpassed her personal single-season mark of 39 blocks. Including a career-high five blocks in the Old Dominion game, freshman Jacinta Monroe led the team with 63 blocks. She had three or more blocks in 12 different games last season. The 63 blocks are the most by a Seminole in a single-season since all-time blocks leader Brooke Wyck-off had 64 swats in the 1998-99 season.

DAVIS-CAIN NEARLY BREAKS SINGLE-SEASON THREE POINT RECORD

Opponents became aware of Tanae Davis-Cain's outside shooting ability in 2006-07. After hitting just 20-of-70 her first season, the guard hit 52-of-181, which was just two three-pointers off the record set by Linnea Liljestrand in 2005. In the process, she set a new Florida State single-season record with her 181 three point attempts. Davis-Cain's prolific year moved her up to 10th on the career FSU three-point list with 72 career three balls. Within the league ranks, she was 10th at 1.58 three-pointers per game and went up a spot during conference games.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE ACTION

Led by freshman sensation Jacinta Monroe, Florida State had nine double-doubles last season. The rookie accounted more than half of them as she tallied five, including the 28-point, 21-rebound outing in her career debut against UAB. Center Britany Miller followed with three and Alicia Gladden added another.

LADY PIRATE CHAMPIONS

Florida State was crowned champion of the Lady Pirate Invitational with wins over Fairfield and host East Carolina. Britany Miller was named the Most Valuable Player after averaging 15.0 ppg, 5.5 rpg, while Alicia Gladden earned all-tournament team honors after averaging 11.0 ppg, 5.0 rpg, and 3.0 apg. It is the fourth in-season tournament that the Seminoles have won, not counting their own Seminole Classic, in the Sue Semrau era.

FILLING THOSE SEATS

In 2006-07, a record 1,119 season tickets were sold (increase of 104.6%). The average home attendance last season was 2,010 (increase of 48.2%), which included six games that made the Top 10 Attendance List for FSU women's basketball. Topping the chart was the record 4,732 fans that attended the FSU-Maryland game on February 15th. More than 26,100

fans attended women's games this year, which shows the tremendous progress of this program. Average home attendance ranked 7th in the ACC this season, up from 11th last season and trailed Va Tech and NC State by less than 800.

MONROE MAKES A BIG SPLASH IN HER COLLEGIATE DEBUT

Few Florida State debuts have been as good as the one forward Jacinta Monroe had against UAB. The 6-foot-4 freshman scored 23 points and pulled down 21 rebounds against the Blazers. The 21 rebounds were the most in the ACC last season, the eighth-best total in the NCAA and the third-highest single-game total in school history. No FSU player had topped the 20-rebound mark since 2000 when Levys Torres set the school record with 24 rebounds.

DEFENSE HOLD 'EM

Florida State held opponents to 39 percent shooting last season and for the first time in the Sue Semrau era, held six or more teams to under 50 points or less in a game. The last time FSU held five teams to 50 points or less in a season was in 1975-76 - more than 30 years ago. That year, FSU also held five teams to 50 points or less, including a 100-16 win over West Florida.

MILLER FINISHES THE YEAR STRONG

Britany Miller's 29 points in the win at Wake Forest was just a continuation of her solid play late in the season. Including double digits in both first and second round NCAA Tournament games, in the final 15 games of the season, Miller averaged a team-best 13.7 points and 6.4 rebounds per game. Even more impressive is that Miller shot 51 percent from the field and 60 percent from the free throw line and averaged 1.0 turnovers in 26.4 minutes of play in that stretch. Miller has eight 20+ games in her career, six this season alone.

- Season block total is the fourth-highest single season mark in school history. Also broke into the FSU single-season top 10 with 184 field goals made.
- Eighth in the conference with a .513 field goal percentage.

FRESHOUR DOING JUST FINE IN SWITCH TO POINT GUARD

After being recruited as a shooting guard and spending her first season with the Seminoles as the two-guard, sophomore Mara Freshour made the switch to point guard last season. In her new role, the Nashville, Ind. native, ranked in the ACC's top 10 with 33.4 minutes per game. She was 11th in the league at 3.2 assists per game and eighth with a 1.24 assist-to-turnover ratio. Freshour was almost automatic from the free throw line, hitting .815 percent of her shots for the third-highest single-season rate in school history. If she makes 11 of her first 15 free throws in 2007-08 she'll become the school's career leader in free throw percentage.

WILLIAMS SETTING HERSELF UP FOR GREAT SENIOR YEAR

When her career is all said and done, guard Shante Williams will go down as one of the toughest players in school history. Despite an injured hip, Williams helped carry the Seminoles through the NCAA Tournament all the way to the Sweet 16. Against Stanford she came off the bench to score a team-high 16 points. With a team-high 116 assist last year – which ranked her ninth in the league – she moved up to 10th in school history at 326 helpers. Williams needs just 63 more during her senior season to set the career record. She is also just 244 points shy of becoming the 21st player in school history to reach 1,000 points.

HARVIN COMES ON DURING THE END OF THE SEASON

Rookie guard Alysha Harvin made a strong push to be a regular starter in 2007-08 with her play towards the end of last season. In the last 13 games, Harvin

averaged 6.8 points per game and shot 79 percent from the free throw line. She scored a career-high 12 points in the regular season finale at Wake Forest and earned the right to start both games in the ACC Tournament and all three contests in the NCAA Tournament.

STATE CHAMPS

FSU recorded a sweep of the Miami Hurricanes for the second-straight season and went a perfect 5-0 vs. Florida teams this season with wins over Florida, Stetson and UCF. In 2005-06, FSU went 5-1 vs. in-state opponents. Overall, FSU is 158-73 all-time vs. teams from the state of Florida (four-year schools).

THREE OF LAST FOUR

Florida State's win over Florida means that the Seminoles have now won three of the last four games vs. the Gators. FSU's win over UF on November 22, 2004, was the Seminoles' first over Florida since December 15, 1991 and snapped a 16-game UF win streak. Last season's 22-point FSU victory was Florida State's largest margin of victory over Florida since an 89-67 win back on February 19, 1983. It's also the largest margin of victory for either team since Florida defeated FSU by 27 points on November 23, 1996, which was pre-Semrau and Chris Gobrecht's first and only year as head coach at FSU.

BIG WIN

FSU's 50-point win over Fordham last season is tied for sixth among FSU's Top 10 biggest wins by margin. In 2005-06, FSU's biggest win was also 50 points (92-42 over Lipscomb). Before the Fordham game, the last time the Seminoles recorded a 50-point or more victory on the road was a 100-45 victory at Tulane on November 8, 1990.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

Florida State played two games in the ACC Tournament and the top five Seminole scorers in those two games were freshmen and sophomores. Rookie Jacinta Monroe led the team with 12.0 points and 8.0 rebounds per game. Sophomores Mara Freshour (10.5 ppg, 3.5 rpg, 4.5 apg), Britany Miller (10.0 ppg, 4.5 rpg) and Tanae Davis-Cain (8.5 ppg, 3.0 rpg) followed while freshman Alysha Harvin rounded out the group at 7.5 points and 4.0 rebounds per game.

WHOSE TURN IS IT?

There's just no telling who was going to be the spark plug each game on the Florida State team. FSU played 34 games last season and six different Seminoles led the team in scoring. Alicia Gladden led the way a team-high 11 times while Britany Miller led the way nine times.
