SEASON REVIEW

SEMINOLES' RANKED 26TH IN FINAL NATIONAL RANKINGS, FINISH IN THIRD AT ACC CHAMPIONSHIP AND PLAY IN NCAA REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP. WESTRUP FINISHES IN A TIE FOR 13TH AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

FLORIDA STATE FINISHES SEASON RANKED 26TH NATIONALLY

Florida State finished the 2007-08 season ranked 26th nationally in the final GolfWeek / Sagarin Performance Index and 31st in the final head to head rankings by GolfStat. The Seminoles' ranking of 26th in the GolfWeek poll is their highest of the season. Junior All-America Caroline Westrup is ranked 12th nationally in the GolfStat Cup standings and 15th among all Division I women's golfers in the GolfWeek rankings.

WESTRUP FINISHES SEASON RANKED NINTH NATIONALLY

Junior All-America Caroline Westrup finished her junior season ranked ninth among all Division I golfers in the final GolfStat Cup standings and is ranked 12th nationally in the final GolfWeek / Sagarin Performance rankings of the 2007-08 season.

SEMINOLE SUCCESS UNDER DILLMAN

Florida State won the team championship at the Louisiana State/Cleveland Golf Classic in March. The team championship was the third in the last two years and the 21st in the 24-year head coaching tenure of Debbie Dillman. The Seminoles have won at least one tournament championship in six of the last seven years.

FLORIDA STATE FINISHES IN 8TH PLACE AT NCAA REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State finished in a tie for eighth place in the team standings at the 2008 NCAA Central Regional Championship at the University of Texas Golf Course. The Seminoles were defeated by LSU in a one-hole playoff and did not advance to the NCAA Championship finals. The Seminoles and the Tigers finished tied for eighth in the team standings and were forced to wait nearly four hours until the round was completed before beginning the sudden-victory playoff which was won by the Tigers. With all five players teeing off of hole No. 1, the Tigers earned one birdie and four pars while the Seminoles earned five pars. The winning shot - a chip in birdie - was holed by LSU's Alexis Rather.

WESTRUP FINISHES IN A TIE FOR 13TH AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

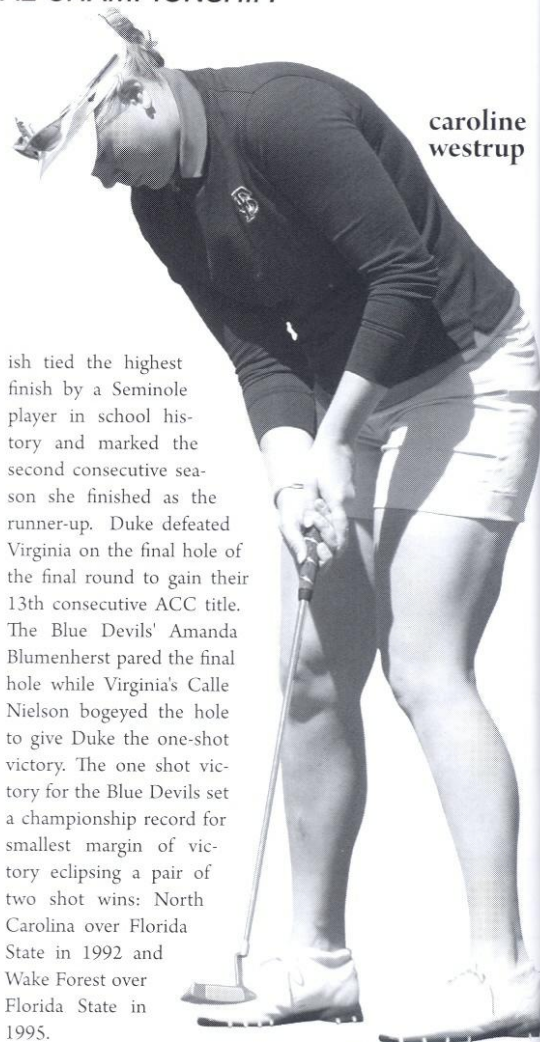
Florida State University junior Caroline Westrup shot a one-under par 71 in the final round and finished in a tie for 13th place in the NCAA Division I Women's Golf Championship on the Champions Course on the University at New Mexico Golf Club. Westrup played her best round of golf in the final round of the four round event and finished only eight strokes behind the winning individual score. Westrup finished the event with a six-over par score of 294. She finished at even par in the first round (72) and at one under par in the final round (71). Azahara Munoz of Arizona State won the individual title as she defeated Tiffany Joh of UCLA in a playoff. Westrup played her best round of golf in the final round as she was never more than one stroke over par for the entire round. She carded a bogey on her first hole of the afternoon and then birdied two of her next three holes to move to one-under par. Westrup closed her first nine holes at one under par and played her second nine holes at even par to finish with a score of 71.

WESTRUP EARNS ALL-AMERICA HONORS

Seminole junior golfer Caroline Westrup earned All-America Second-Team Honors as announced by the National Golf Coaches' Association at its annual banquet following the final round of the NCAA Division I Women's Golf Tournament. It marked the third consecutive season Westrup has earned All-America honors, making her the first three-time All-American in Seminole women's golf history. She earned All-America First-Team Honors in both 2006 and 2007 and All-America Second-Team honors this season.

SEMINOLES FINISH THIRD AT ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State finished in third place in the team standings and junior All-America Caroline Westrup finished in second place in the individual standings in the 20th Annual ACC Championship on the Legends Course at LPGA International in Daytona Beach, Fla. The Seminoles' third place finish marked the second consecutive season the team had finished in third place at the ACC Championship. Westrup's second place individual fin-

ish tied the highest finish by a Seminole player in school history and marked the second consecutive season she finished as the runner-up. Duke defeated Virginia on the final hole of the final round to gain their 13th consecutive ACC title. The Blue Devils' Amanda Blumenherst pared the final hole while Virginia's Calle Nielson bogeyed the hole to give Duke the one-shot victory. The one shot victory for the Blue Devils set a championship record for smallest margin of victory eclipsing a pair of two shot wins: North Carolina over Florida State in 1992 and Wake Forest over Florida State in 1995.

WESTRUP EARNS ALL ACC HONORS FOR THIRD TIME

Florida State junior Caroline Westrup was named to the All-Atlantic Coast Conference women's golf team in a vote by the league's nine head coaches. It marks Westrup's



third consecutive selection to the all-conference team for the Seminole junior. Westrup is the only the second player in Florida State women's golf history to earn All-ACC honors three times in her career and the first in school history to earn the honor as both a freshman, a sophomore and a junior. Westrup and former Seminole All-America Kristin Tamulis (2001, 2002 and 2003) are the only three players who have earned All-ACC honors three times during their careers.

BRUMMETT CLOSES OUT FINE SEMINOLE CAREER

During her career, she helped lead the Seminoles to three NCAA Regional and one NCAA Championship Final appearances, played in four ACC Championship tournaments and helped lead Florida State to a pair of third place finishes in the event (2007 and 2008) and helped Florida State earn four tournament championships - the spring 2006 Ryder/Florida Championship, the fall 2006 Cougar Classic, the spring 2007 Florida State hosted Chrysler Challenge and the spring 2008 LSU/Cleveland Golf Classic.

WRIGHT AT HER BEST AS A SENIOR

Senior Whitney Wright averaged a career-low 76.83 strokes in 30 rounds during 10 events as a senior. Her stroke average was the best of her career and marked the first time she had averaged below 78.00 strokes per round in a single year for her career.

Junior All-America Caroline Westrup led the Seminoles during the fall 2007 and spring 2008 seasons as she has counted 100 percent of her individual scores (30 of 30) toward the team score. The Seminoles' seniors - Whitney Brummett and Whitney Wright - both counted 80 percent of their scores while freshman Macarena Silva counted just under 76 percent of her scores toward the team score.

SEMINOLES FINISH IN THE TOP 10

Three different Seminoles - Caroline Westrup (five), Whitney Brummett (one) and Macarena Silva (one) earned a total of seven top-10 individual finishes during the 2007-08 season. Westrup has now earned 17 top-10 individual finishes in 29 career events.

WESTRUP PLAYS WELL IN REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Junior All-America Caroline Westrup earned her third career top-five NCAA regional championship finish in 2008 as she finished in a tied for fifth at the Central Regional Championship at the University of Texas Golf Course. She finished with a one-under par score of 215 and is a cumulative total of 12 strokes under par in three career regional appearances.

BRUMMETT AT HER BEST LATE IN SEASON

Senior Whitney Brummett played the best golf of her senior season in the final three events of her career with a pair of top-15 finishes and a 35th place finish at the NCAA Central Regional Championship. She finished well with three rounds of below par golf with a 71 in the

WRIGHT PLAYS CONSISTENTLY AS A SENIOR

Senior Whitney Wright played consistently as a senior as she finished with strokes averages of 76.67 in the fall and 76.90 in the spring. During the fall season she carded a career-low single round score of 68 in the first round of the Cougar Classic and carded six of nine rounds with scores in the 70's.

SEMINOLES CLAIM TEAM TITLE AT LSU CLASSIC

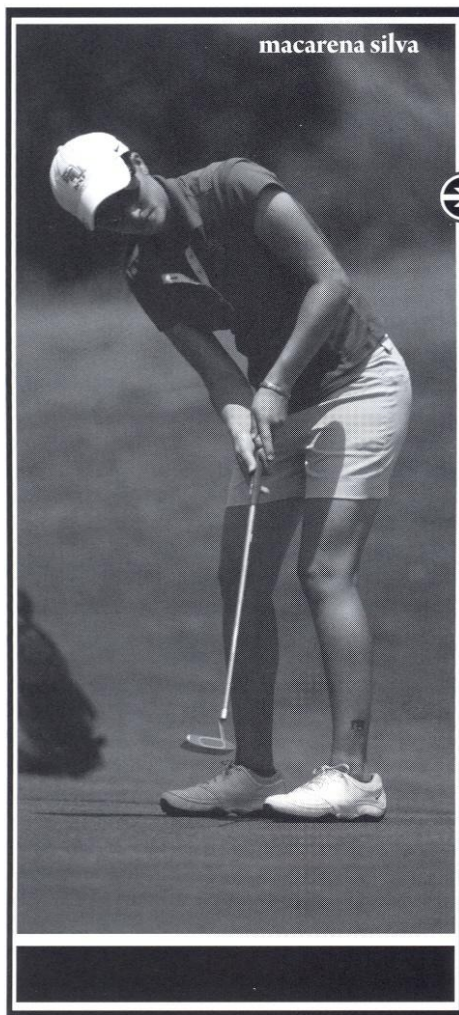
The Florida State University women's golf team - led by individual medalist Caroline Westrup - won the team championship at the LSU / Cleveland Classic with a six-stroke victory over Louisiana State at the University Club in March of 2008. The Seminoles led the event wire-to-wire and earned their first team championship since winning the Florida State hosted Chrysler Challenge during the spring of 2007.

SEMINOLES PLAY TOUGH SCHEDULE

Florida State, which finished as the fourth highest ranked ACC team in the final GolfWeek / Sagarin Performance Index, played the nation's 20th toughest schedule according to GolfWeek.com. The Seminoles competed against teams in the final top-25 at total of 78 times and earned 13 wins over those teams.

SILVA – A FRESHMAN IN THE LINE-UP

Freshman Macarena Silva was the only freshman who earned playing time during the 2007-08 season. She played in both the ACC Championship and the NCAA Central Regional championship to mark the first time the Seminoles have played with a freshman in their line-up since the 2004 NCAA East Regional Championship. Then freshman Jaclyn Burch played in the ACC Championship and the NCAA East Regional Championship in 2004.

SILVA'S IMPROVEMENT DURING HER FIRST SEASON

Freshman Macarena Silva finished her first collegiate season averaging 77.30 strokes per round during her first season as a Seminole (fall 2007 and spring 2008 combined). She has cut more than 0.5 strokes off of her single round average, more than two strokes off of her tournament score and improved by an average of 18 positions in the individual standings in the spring as compared to the fall – her first as a collegiate golfer.

SILVA ENJOYS BEST OUTING AT ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

Freshman Macarena Silva tied her career-low for a single round score with an even par 72 in the third round and finished with a career-best six-over par score of 222 in her first career ACC Championship. On the final day of the event, Silva carded three birdies on the front nine and made the turn at two-under par. She finished her round with scores of par on seven of her last eight holes. Her score of 72 tied her career best for her freshman season; she also carded a 72 during the second round of the University of Alabama / Ann Rhoads Invitational during the fall of 2007. She finished with a total of six-over par 222 – her best score vs. par by four strokes and her best gross score also by four strokes. Silva finished in a tie for ninth in the individual standings – her best finish by 15 places in the individual standings of an event.

COUSART TO PLAY IN SECOND CAREER REGIONAL

Junior Lauren Cousart, who averaged 78.61 strokes in 18 rounds as a junior, enjoyed a strong season as a member of the Seminoles' starting lineup. She established her career low score for a single round in the third round of the Cougar Classic (70) and tied her career low 36-hole score in the first two rounds of the LSU/Cleveland Classic (151).

COUSART CUTTING HER STROKE AVERAGE

Junior Lauren Cousart, who carded an even par 72 in the second round of the 2008 ACC Championship, looks to have cemented her position in the Seminoles' starting line-up for her senior season. She averaged 78.47 strokes per round in 15 rounds and earned the best finish of her career in a high profile tournament of tied for 19th at the 2008 ACC Championship.

YOUNG WINS MINORITY GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP

Junior Sara Young won the independent women's division title at the 22nd Annual PGA Minority Golf Championship at the PGA Golf Club on May 11, 2008. Young, who lost the championship in a playoff in 2007, earned the 2008 title with a nine stroke victory over Alexis Garduno of Old Dominion University. Young won the event with her play in the final two rounds of the three-round event. She took the lead after shooting a 76 in the second round and carded a 77 in the third round for a 235 total. Young was in third place after the first 18 holes as she carded an 82. She was three strokes behind Garduno after one round but seized the lead during the second round and never looked back.

BRUMMETT HONORED WITH ACC SCHOLARSHIP

Whitney Brummett was one of 41 Atlantic Coast Conference scholar-athletes named recipients of postgraduate scholarships in 2008 as announced by Commissioner John Swofford. The Weaver-James-Corrigan and Jim and Pat Thacker scholarships are given to selected student-athletes who intend to pursue a graduate-level degree following graduation. Each recipient will receive \$5,000 to use towards his or her graduate education. Student-athletes receiving the award have performed with distinction in both the classroom and in their respective sports, while demonstrating exemplary conduct in the community.

WESTRUP EARNS ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT HONORS

Florida State All-America golfer Caroline Westrup, who holds a 3.69 grade point average in sport management, was named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District 3 Second-Team by the College Sports Information Directors of America. It marked the second consecutive year she has earned the academic honor for her success in the classroom.

SEMINOLES HONORED FOR ACADEMICS

The Seminole women's golf team was honored last fall at the university's annual Golden Torch Gala for outstanding academic performance in October of 2007. The formal event is presented by the Department of Athletics at Florida State University and the Seminole Boosters, Inc., and is a way for the university to recognize the hard work and academic performances of both team and individual student-athletes. The women's golf team finished in a tie with the women's cross country team for the highest team GPA which was identical to the fourth decimal point. Golden Torch Awards are also presented to the top academic performers in each sport and the winner for women's golf was senior education major Ashley Kemp who maintained a 4.0 GPA for the 2006-2007 academic year.

SEMINOLES HONORED AT GOLDEN NOLE BANQUET

Seminole senior Ashley Kemp was honored at the Golden Nole Awards Banquet for her outstanding commitment to community service in April 2008. She earned two prestigious awards, The Team Golden Nole and The Shining Star Award for her dedication to the university and to serving the community. The Shining Star Award recognizes a student-athlete who makes a major commitment to community service. During her four-year career Kemp donated more than 1,100 hours to community service. The Seminole women's golf team also won its seventh consecutive Athletic Director's Cup for Community Service.
