Shannon Coe served a ball from the far right wing and Boyce sent it past the keeper pushing FSU to a 3-1 lead... (vs. North Carolina) saved another goal in a key conference battle with the second-ranked Tar Heels. UNC had its first scoring chance 25 minutes into the match when Lindsay Tarpley got in behind the Seminole defense. Kerry York charged out to cut off the freshman's angle but the Michigan native took a beautiful shot to the far post. Before the ball could get within five yards of the net though Boyce blocked the attempt. 2001: The only Seminole defender to start every game for FSU in 2001...garnered all-region honors from SoccerBuzz when she was named to the magazine's third-team...the most dangerous scoring threat on the FSU backline, Boyce led all defenders with 11 points, five goals, one game-winning goal, one gamewinning assist, 30 shots, a .167 shot percentage and 16 shots on goal...more than doubled her goal production and point total from her freshman season when she scored two goals and tallied five points...finished the year in FSU's top five for points, goals, game-winning goals, shots and shots on goal...scored a goal in 67% of the games in which she has recorded a shot on goal...started the season off with a goal and an assist in back-to-back games at the

FSU to a 1-0 lead that they held on to for more than 45 minutes... (vs. Oregon) opened 2002 with a strong performance in the second game of the year. After giving the Ducks fits all game, Bybee scored a huge goal for FSU. In the 61st min-ute Jez Ratliff beat the Oregon keeper to a 50-50 ball and sent it to fellow Oklahoman Bybee who scored the fourth game-winner of her career...(vs. LSU) had another impressive outing where the sophomore recorded an assist on Summer Corum's 90th-minute goal...(vs. Virginia Tech) in a scoreless game versus the Hokies, Bybee scored her second game-winner in the 21st-minute of the game. An FSU corner kick was driven in by Amber Tollefson and hit off Ratliff's foot. After deflecting off a Hokie defender, Bybee picked the loose ball up, beat one player and fired a sliding shot into the side netting at the near post... The Oklahoman took one touch and went the other way with the shot beating the keeper...(vs. Clemson) recorded a point in her third straight game in FSU's next match, a key ACC win. Her gamewinning assist on Leah Gallegos' golden goal gave FSU its first ever back-to-back regular season conference wins over a single opponent...(vs. UF) recorded back-to-back assists in two huge games the next week as Florida State beat rival UF and regionallyranked UCF...with FSU trailing the Gators 1-0, Bybee started the play that would equalize the match. The midfielder fed Gallegos the ball just inside of the 18 in the center of the box. The freshman from Los Angeles took one touch, turned to goal and tucked the ball in to the left side of the net past UF keeper Jordan Kellgren...(vs. UCF) Bybee helped stake FSU to a 1-0 lead as she took the ball away from a group of defenders. The midfielder found Schofield just inside the box to the right of the goal. The forward took a touch and fired a blast to the far post beating the Golden Knight keeper... (vs. Maryland) brought FSU back within one goal of Maryland in the ACC Tournament when she narrowed the score to 3-2...(vs. Auburn) in second round NCAA game, Schofield sent a low free kick diagonally to the left post where Bybee and Ratliff were making a run. (in the ACC) led all FSU freshmen in ACC starts with six and she appeared in all seven games...was second amongst all ACC freshmen in assists and was in the top five in the conference for goals scored amongst first year players...one of just three rookies to be named ACC Player of the Week in 2001...recorded assists in three straight games versus Wake Forest, North Carolina and a game-winner versus NC State. (in the NCAA'S) one of five FSU freshmen that saw action in all three NCAA Tournament games in 2002...the only Seminole rookie to start an NCAA Tournament game for the Seminoles in 2002...her play in the Auburn game was one of the main reasons FSU advanced to the Round of 16...her run at the Tiger goal in the 19th-minute resulted in the FSU free kick that staked the Seminoles to a 1-0 lead...recorded her first-ever postseason point in grand fashion later in the match. With the Seminoles and Auburn tied 1-1 with less than four minutes remaining in regulation, Gallegos made one of the biggest plays of the weekend. With her back to the goal and two defenders converging on her, she slipped a pass to Cindy Schofield who netted the game-winning goal sending FSU to the Sweet 16...(vs. Missouri) recorded the first point of her Semi-

nole career just three games into the season as she assisted on FSU? first goal...(vs. Miami) two games later she found the net for the first time...(vs. Clem-son) had a recordsetting night as she scored three goals in less than 30 minutes recording just the seventh hat trick in the program's seven-year history and the first ever recorded by an FSU player in an ACC contest. She is just the fifth Seminole freshman to ever record a hat trick and the first newcomer to do it in four years After Schofield tied the game at 1-1 just 2:27 into the second half, Gallegos took over. In the 64th minute, the striker collected a throw in just inside of the 18. She split two defenders on a beautiful move and turned to goal. She struck a low line drive

putting FSU up 2-1. After the Tigers scored two goals to reclaim the lead at 3-2, time was running down for FSU. With less than three minutes remaining in the match, Gallegos started her run on the far right side of the box that would eventually tie the game at 3-3. The striker beat one Tiger defender and megged another as she created just enough space to fire a shot past keeper Sarah McClurg. Gallegos completed the hat trick and gave FSU its second-consecutive win in an ACC opener when she scored the golden goal just over two minutes into OT. She got the ball from Camie Bybee at the top of box and wasted little time before pulling the trigger as she rocketed a low shot to the left side of the net for the first golden goal of her Seminole career... (vs. USF) she had a hand in two goals in FSU's 3-2 win. Gallegos played a great ball to sophomore Marion Cagle played a beautiful ball into the center of the box. Senior midfielder Katie Talley was there waiting and stuck the cross into the back of the net. Gallegos got the game-winning assist less than five minutes later when the forward collected a throw-in, beat a defender with a spin move and sent a ball into Summer Corum standing just outside of the six-yard box. She collected the pass and gave the Seminoles a 3-0 lead in what would end up a 3-2 win... (vs. Florida) against the Gators, Gallegos breathed new life into FSU as she equalized the match just 15 minutes after the Gators took an early lead. Bybee fed Gallegos the ball just inside of the 18 in the center of the box. She took one touch, turned to goal and tucked the ball in to the left side of the net...(vs. UCF) notched the second game-winner of her young career after the Golden Knights tied the game at 1-1. With just over 10 minutes remaining in regulation, the freshman collected a pass from Jez Ratliff and blasted a shot that caromed off the post and went into the net...(vs. Wake Forest) her assist against the Demon Deacons helped lead FSU back from a 2-0 deficit... (vs. NC State) recorded her second game-winning assist in Raleigh, NC versus the Wolfpack...(vs. George Mason) closed the Seminoles' road schedule out by assisting on FSU's first goal versus George Mason and then turned around and recorded her third game-winning goal of the year... (vs. Auburn) recorded her first NCAA tournament point as she assisted on the game-winning goal sending FSU to the Round of 16. 2002: Another one of Florida State's top freshmen, Lewis saw action in 21 of Florida State's 23 games...Lewis brought an attitude to the central midfield and showed no fear playing against every ranked team on FSU's schedule...fifth on the team in points and goals...one of just two freshmen to record a multi-goal game...second amongst rookies in goals, points, shots and shots on goal...all three of her goals came against ranked teams (NC State, Maryland and Charlotte)...(in the **ACC)** made a huge impact in Florida State's first-ever conference win in the state of North Carolina versus NC State where she scored two goals...appeared in six of the Seminoles conference contests...only game she did not appear in was season finale versus Virginia...

second to just Leah Gallegos for goals scored and points recorded in conference games by an FSU freshman...second amongst all Seminole rookies for shots and shots on goal in ACC games...(in the NCAA) one of five FSU freshmen that saw action in all three NCAA Tournament games in 2002...second on the team with four shots in the 2002 NCAA Tournament... (vs. Charlotte) had a break out game versus the No. 12 49ers in the Miami Hurricane Invitational Tournament. The freshman not only scored a goal that put the Seminoles in the lead at 3-2 but she made a big impact all over the field. Lewis took one of the most impressive free kicks in recent memory in the 37th minute of the match. She lined up for the kick on the left side of the pitch and about 28 yards from goal. She drove a low, line drive to the back post that caught the inside of the post and bounced back into play. It was an amazing strike that just missed being the first goal of her Semi-nole career. After the 49ers staged a two-goal comeback in the second half, Lewis got the two points that eluded her on her free kick. Freshman Leah Gallegos made a great run into the box on the left side. She turned to goal and ripped a shot off the crossbar. The ricochet ended up at the feet of Lewis. The freshman one-timed the rebound to give FSU the 3-2 edge...(vs. NC State) Lewis bested that effort in a key conference road game in Raleigh, NC. The midfielder scored two goals, her first since the Charlotte game, and recorded the first multi-goal game of her young career. In the 27th minute, Florida State broke out to a 1-0 lead. Jez Ratliff made a great run down the right wing. She found Lewis at the top of the box just to the right of the goal. Lewis settled the ball, took one touch and fired a low drive to the near post beating Gretchen Lear. In the 67th minute Jenny Garcia collected the ball in the mid-

dle of the pitch and laid the pass off to Lewis standing about 25 yards away just to the right of goal. She blasted a shot over the top of Lear and it fell in over the keeper's head staking the Tribe to a 5-1 lead... (vs. Maryland) brought FSU back within one goal of Maryland in the ACC Tournament when her shot from 25 yards out beat the keeper and narrowed
