2005: Right midfielder assumed starting duties after suffering a nagging injury at the start of the year...appeared in 19 games for the second straight season...started the last 15 games after appearing in just four games previously...more than tripled her number of starts from her freshman year in 2004...solidified the midfield and added to the depth allowing previous starters Melissa Samokishyn and Toby Ranck to come off the bench along with Rachel McDowell...recorded one point on the year as she assisted on FSU's third goal in a 3-1 win over Maryland...just the second assist and point of her young career. **(in the ACC)** played in nine of Florida State's 10 ACC games...started seven straight ACC contests to end the year...recorded her only point of the season in a conference match against Maryland...assisted on Katrin Schmidt's goal versus the Terrapins...started just two conference games in 2004 so she has almost quadrupled that number this year. **(in the NCAA Tournament)** started every NCAA Tournament

game for FSU as the Seminoles wide midfielder on the right side including the national semifinal at the College Cup.

2004: The only FSU freshman to garner All-ACC Freshman Team honors and the only freshman defender to make the team...joined Seminole teammate Kelly Rowland as the only two defenders in the entire conference to garner any type of All-ACC honor...appeared in 19 games and made four starts...her 19 games played were more than any freshman on the 2004 roster...recorded one assist on the season...recorded two shots and one was a shot on goal...became FSU's starting left back the last four games of the regular season...she and her defensive mates finished off a second record-setting season...the Tribe allowed just 21 goals, which shattered the school record...the team's 1.02 GAA was the lowest in team history as well. **(in the ACC)** played in all nine ACC games and started in two...one of just two FSU

freshmen to appear in every conference game in 2004...had her only assist of the season during ACC play in FSU's 3-2 win over NC State...the Tribe had the second best season in team history when it came to goals allowed in ACC play...the FSU defense allowed just 11 goals in nine games for a GAA of 1.19 in ACC play. **(in the ACC Tournament)** appeared in the first ACC Tournament game of her career in the quarterfinals versus Clemson. **(in the NCAA Tournament)** made the first NCAA Tournament appearance of her career starting versus BC.

2005: Australian forward had a breakout season in her first ever collegiate campaign...named one of just 11 Soccer America MVP's... 2005 Soccer Buzz third team All-American... 2005 NSCAA All-Region first team...2005 Soccer Buzz All-Region first team...one of the nation's top newcomers...spent most of 2005 ranked in the top 20 in the nation in scoring...finalist for Soccer Buzz's National Player of the Year award...joined teammate Viola Odebrecht as the first FSU players in school history to be nominated for that honor...an All-ACC first team selection...named ACC co-player of the week (9/12), ACC Player of the Week (10/29), Top Drawer Soccer National player of the week (9/12), to Soccer America's Team of the Week (8/30) and SoccerFLA.com's player of the week (8/30)...Kuralay had the most productive offensive season of any first-year Seminole in team history...her 16 goals, nine assists, 41 points and six game-winners all rank in the top three for single season records at FSU and are each the most ever by an FSU player in her first season...no player in FSU history has ever had as many goals with nine or more assists...her 41 points were the second-most in one season and she was just two points away from moving into first place...recorded either the game-winning goal or assist in nine of Florida State's 20 wins...with her 16 goals, Kuralay ranks third in single season goals and was just two shy of moving into a tie for first place...Kuralay came just one game-winning goal shy of tying the single season record in that category...had five multi-goal games on the year, which is tied for the most ever in a single season and already second on the career list as well...became the quickest player in FSU history to reach 10 goals when she got there in the ninth game of the season... led the Seminoles in goals (16), points (41), assists (9), game-winning goals (6), shots (94) and shots on goal (38)... only one player in FSU soccer history led FSU in every offensive category (points, goals, assists, game-winning goals, shots and shots on goal) and that was Emma Breland in 2000...scored the latest game-tying goal (88:42) and quickest second half goal (45:10) in team history...equaled an FSU record on three occasions with two first half goals (Jacksonville, UCF and Clemson)...the only Seminole to ever score two first half goals in a conference game...recorded the 12th golden goal in team history when she scored in the 105th minute at Loyola Marymount...became the first player in FSU history to record two goals in a game versus the Gators and to score two career goals versus Florida as well...her five shots in the UNC game (9/22) were the most ever recorded by an FSU player in the series... scored the first goal of the game four times in 2005...holds single game highs for points (6), assists (2) and shots (9). **(in the ACC)** had just as productive a season in conference as she did out of it...tied for first in the conference in game-winning goals in ACC play... finished second in the conference in shots and shots per game...was third for goals scored in ACC matches and points per game in ACC play...was second for shots taken in conference games among all ACC players...finished with the fourth-most points in ACC games as well...scored five goals, recorded two assists and 12 total points despite missing one game due to commitments with the Australian National Team...tied for the team lead with five goals in ACC play, which were the second-most ever scored by an FSU player in a single season of conference play...second on the team with 12 points in conference, which was tied for the most ever coming into 2005 but is now second behind Viola Odebrecht...had three game-winning goals, which were triple the amount any other player recorded and a new single season record at FSU...led the team with 41 shots and 16 shots on

goal...recorded goals against Clemson, NC State, Virginia Tech and Maryland...became the first player in Seminole soccer history to score two first half goals versus a conference opponent when she did that October 29 versus Clemson. **(in the NCAA Tournament)** started all five of FSU's NCAA Tournament games...tied for the team lead in postseason assists...second in tournament play for goals, points, shots and shots on goal...scored her 16th goal of the year in the second round match versus Illinois staking FSU to a 1-0 lead...led FSU with six shots and three shots on goal versus the Illini...her assist versus Cal was her team-leading ninth of the year and her third game-winning assist of the season.

AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL TEAM: Called into camp the summer of 2006 with the Australian National Team...member of the Australian National Team that competed at the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens...played in three of Australia's four matches and was part of the first Australian team to win a match in a senior women's FIFA event (1-0 over Greece)...reached the quarterfinals of the 2004 Olympiad...has 13 caps with the Australian National team since being called up in 2004...played in the 2005 Four Nations Tournament held in China and faced Germany, China and Russia...participated in the 2004 Oceanic Olympic Qualifiers in April at the age of 19 in her first ever full national team duty...made her international debut in Australia's 2-0 win over New Zealand... was tied for the tournament led for goals scored

with five in two matches including a hat trick versus Papua New Guinea...played in the 2004 Youth World Cup...competed at the inaugural U-19 FIFA Women's World Championship in Canada in 2002... started three of four matches in the tournament... helped guide Australia to the quarterfinals where they lost 4-3 to Brazil on a golden goal...Kuralay's penalty kick tied the game at 3-3 and sent the match into extra time...a member of the national team for Oceanic U-19 qualifiers in Tonga (2002)...awarded Top Goal Scorer for the tournament with nine goals...five of her nine goals came against Samoa in the semifinals...also recorded a hat trick versus host country Tonga as a first half substitute...first appearance with the national team came in 2000 when she traveled to the U-17 adidas Cup in Houston, TX.

STATE/CLUB: Member of the WNSSL's Victoria Vision...won the WNSSL Rising Star Award for 2000-2001 becoming the first Victorian to win a WNSSL award...won the youth National Championship 1999 as a member of the Victorian team... member of the boy's Victorian State U-13 team, which won the National Championship... won the Victorian Women's Premier League in 2000 with Ringwood City and in 2001 with Box Hill.

PERSONAL: First played at the age of six with a local boy's team...had reconstructive surgery on her knee in 2003...major is exercise science... 2006 ACC Academic Honor Roll...also speaks Turkish.

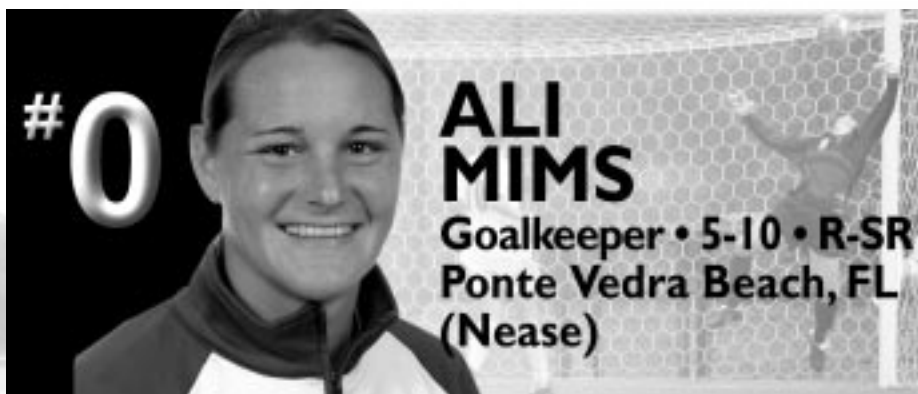

2005: Continued her miraculous road back from more than 20 surgical procedures on a broken leg suffered in 2002 by regaining her starting position and enjoying one of the top seasons in net of any FSU keeper in school history...started 24 of the Seminoles' 25 games ...named to 2005 All-Florida team...posted a 19-4-1 record and eight clean sheets...set single season records for shutouts and wins... her 19 wins were four more than any Florida State goalkeeper had ever recorded...posted a shutout streak of 452:42, which is the second-longest streak in team history...streak covered four straight games without allowing a goal... her 0.90 GAA established a new single season record at FSU... joined former Seminole great Joy McKenzie as only the second FSU keeper to ever record a sub-1.00 GAA for a season... allowed just 22 goals in almost 2200 minutes in the net, which is the second-lowest total in

team history... logged 2188:58 in net, the second-most ever by a Seminole keeper...set new personal single season highs for starts, wins, minutes, GAA, save percentage and shutouts...surpassed her career numbers in every one of those categories in 2005 alone...with her 19 wins in 2005, Mims now has 28 career victories, which is the highest total in program history...currently third all-time at FSU with nine career shutouts...career GAA of 1.11 is the second-lowest career GAA in school history. **(in the ACC)** recorded all eight of FSU's wins in conference play...her eight victories set a new single season record and Mims now owns the career record at FSU for wins in conference matches with 10... posted a GAA of 1.00 in the ACC...her two shutouts are tied for the second-most in a career by an FSU keeper in ACC play...would have had three ACC clean sheets but was

pulled to get No. 2 keeper Minna Pyykko experience in another FSU blanking...recorded clean sheets versus two ranked ACC opponents (Boston College and Clemson)...allowed more than one goal just once all season in ACC play and that came against North Carolina...finished the season third in the conference in GAA, fourth in shutouts and fifth in shutouts per game. **(in the ACC Tournament)** recorded her seventh shutout of the season in a 4-0 quarterfinal win over Clemson...FSU has only recorded three shutouts in ACC Tournament play and Mims has had a hand in two of those clean sheets. **(in the NCAA Tournament)** played all 470:00 in the 2005 NCAA Tournament for FSU...posted a GAA of 1.34 in the tournament with 27 saves and one shutout...all-time leader at FSU for wins (4) and saves (27) in NCAA play...her career GAA in the NCAA Tournament is a stellar 1.07...coming into the Illinois match, Mims had a scoreless streak of 180:00 in the NCAA Tournament and that reached 225:42 before the Illini scored...one of just three Seminole keepers to ever record a clean sheet in NCAA Tournament play...turned in

one of the most brilliant performances of her career in helping send FSU past North Carolina and into the College Cup...recorded a career high 13 saves...saved the game for FSU in overtime when she stopped Lindsay Tarpley's break away, which would have ended the Seminoles' season.

2004: After two years of intense rehab following more than 20 surgical procedures to repair a fractured leg, Mims made a triumphant return in 2004...the Tribe keeper not only appeared in three games, she made her first start since October 28, 2001...Mims saw her first action in over two years playing the second half in a 5-0 win over Jacksonville... came in versus FIU and preserved FSU's 1-0 win over the Golden Panthers...then made her first start in almost two years as she opened in the starting 11 October 5 versus USF...the win over the Bulls was her first since an NCAA Tournament victory over Auburn November 16, 2001...in 135:00 in net, Mims did not allow a goal...faced 11 shots and made five saves...lowered her career GAA to 1.43, which is the third-best career GAA in program history.

2003 & 2002: Missed both seasons due to a leg fracture that resulted in 20 surgeries and surgical procedures.

2001: Took over starting goalkeeping duties eight games into the season and went on to have a record-setting freshman year replacing injured starter Kerry York...posted an 8-5-1 record and 2.5 shutouts with a 1.59

GAA in 18 games and 10 starts...played more than 1246 minutes while recording 62 saves and a .738 save percentage on 170 shots...her 62 saves were fifth-best in a single season and the second-best by a rookie keeper at FSU... 1.59 GAA set a freshman record for a single season at FSU and she also set a record for the third-most wins by a Seminole keeper in one season...finished the year with the fifth-best saves per game average in the ACC... saved the first three penalty kicks of her collegiate career and ended up saving five of the seven PK's she faced in 2001...after stepping in for York, Mims went on to start 10 straight games posting a 6-4 record during the regular season including wins over NCAA Tournament teams Kansas, Miami and Duke... had a huge ACC Tournament where she allowed just two goals in 195 minutes, saved 16 shots, faced 39 shots, recorded a save percentage of .889 and registered a GAA of 0.95 against No. 21 Maryland, No. 8 Virginia and No. 1 North Carolina. **(vs. NC State)** had a huge impact making back-to-back big saves in the 78th-minute including a sprawling save in OT...**(vs. Florida)** made her first start at eighth-ranked Florida in front of almost 3,500 fans and finished the night with five saves...posted the first two shutouts of her collegiate career in road wins at South Florida and UCF...**(vs. Duke)** saved the game in OT for FSU when she made a diving stop on Katie Heaps' penalty kick, which allowed FSU to play on and get the golden goal just two minutes

later...**(vs. Virginia)** her play in the ACC semifinal match against Virginia will go down as one of the greatest goalkeeping performances in FSU history. Mims and fellow freshman Kerry York combined to shutout the Cavs over 150 minutes. Mims set single-game career highs for saves (12), minutes (105) and shots faced (24). After stoning the first two shooters in the shootout, the PK's were tied at 2-2 when two-time ACC Player of the Year Lori Lindsey stepped to the line. The midfielder, who scored 17 goals in 2001, sent a hard shot right down the middle. Mims, who was already diving to her right, stuck her foot out and kick saved the shot allowing FSU to lock up a trip to its first-ever ACC Final.

2005: Sophomore had a breakout second season...after playing in 13 games and not making a start in 2004, Peltzer appeared in 23 matches and made six starts...the only Seminole named to the 2005 All-ACC Tournament Team after scoring twice versus Clemson...named a third team ESPN the Magazine Academic All-District selection...came into the season with no goals and just one assist but posted 16 points on seven goals and two assists as a sophomore...burst on to the scene on live TV in FSU's 4-2 win over then-No. 7 Florida. Peltzer came off the bench in a 2-2 game and scored two goals to boost FSU to a 4-2 win. They were not only the first goals of her career but the first was her first-ever game-winning goal...became just the second FSU player ever to score twice in a game or in a career versus the Gators. The first was Sel Kuralay who did it in the first half of that match...named ACC Player of the Week, Top Drawer Soccer National player of the

week, SoccerFLA.com player of the week and to Soccer America's National Team of the Week after her performance versus UF... Peltzer proved she was not just a one game wonder as she went on to record goals versus Boston College and Miami and an assist versus Virginia Tech...fourth on FSU for points and goals and tied for fourth in game-winning goals. **(in the ACC)** after not making a start and appearing in just five ACC games in 2004, Peltzer played in every single conference match and started four games in 2005...five points on two goals and an assist in conference action...goals came against BC and Miami with the assist coming against Maryland...sixth-most points, third-most goals and in the top six for shots as well in ACC play...logged the second-most minutes by a front runner trailing only Sel Kuralay. **(in the NCAA Tournament)** appeared in four NCAA Tournament games playing 144 minutes...scored the first NCAA postseason goal of her career versus FAU...the

goal was the third she scored in Gainesville this season.

tive starts...now the most prolific scorer in school history among all defenders despite playing just two seasons...in 40 fewer games she is just one assist away from the career record by a defender and just two goals shy of tying that record as well...second on the team with 36 shots and tied for third on team with 13 shots on goal...led all Seminoles in points in non-conference games...recorded 10 of her 13 points in 11 matches versus non-conference opponents including a team-leading six assists...the heart and soul of an FSU defense that completed its second consecutive record-setting season in 2004...the Tribe allowed just 21 goals last season, seven fewer than the team record set in 2003...the team's 1.02 GAA was the lowest in team history...no defense in FSU history has ever allowed fewer goals in a two-season span than the 2003-2004 FSU defense and Rowland was a big key to that success. **(in the ACC)** started all nine ACC games and has now started all 16 conference games in her two year career...third on team with three points on one goal and one assist...recorded the first ACC regular season goal of her career versus NC State as she staked FSU to a 1-0 lead...recorded a game-winning assist against Wake Forest and now has three career game-winning assists in ACC play...second on team with 16 shots and tied for second with eight shots on goal...Rowland and the Tribe defense had the second best season in team history when it came to goals allowed in ACC play...the FSU defense allowed just 11 goals in nine games for a GAA of 1.19 in ACC play. **(in the ACC Tournament)** scored the fourth ACC Tournament goal of her career when she equalized the game versus Clemson...the 78th minute goal completed FSU's come-back from a 2-0 deficit...she now is FSU's all-time leading goal scorer in ACC Tournament history with four career goals in four games...tied for the team lead in the quarterfinal match with four shots and was second on the squad with two shots on goal. **(in the NCAA Tournament)** made the first start of her career as a front runner in the Seminoles' NCAA Tournament game against Boston College...part of a three front utilized by the Seminoles against a stingy Eagle defense...led the team with three shots and one shot on goal in the match

2003: One of the nation's top freshmen, Rowland keyed an amazing turnaround by the Seminole defense when she was moved to center back just five games into the season...after Rowland was slipped into the middle of the FSU back-line, the FSU defense went from allowing an average of two goals a game to an average of 0.80 goals per game...named a *Soccer America* freshman All-American and a *Soccer Buzz* honorable mention freshman All-American...just the second Seminole ever named a *Soccer America* freshman All-American and just the fourth-ever FSU rookie to earn a freshman All-American honor...also named a *Soccer Buzz* freshman all-region selection...a member of the 2003 ACC Championships All-Tournament team after leading the tournament in goals scored despite being a defender. She is just the second Florida State freshman to ever garner that award...named to *Soccer America's* National Team of the Week three times in 2003 and to the *Soccer Buzz* Elite Team of the Week on one occasion. No Seminole player had ever been named to *Soccer America's* National Team of the Week three times in their career and Rowland did it in just one season...combined with the Soccer

Buzz weekly honor, no player in FSU history has ever received four national team of the week honors in one season and she is tied with Leah Gallegos for the most national team of the week honors in a career...Rowland joined with Katie Beal to form one of the nation's best tandems starting in the middle of any defense both offensively and defensively...Rowland started every game for FSU including all 10 times FSU played versus a Hermann Award semifinalist...with Rowland in the backline, the FSU defense set a school record with nine shutouts, set a school record with four ACC shutouts and a school record with four consecutive ACC shutouts and six consecutive shutouts overall...the team finished the year allowing just five goals in ACC play, which beat the previous record by six goals and Rowland and the FSU defense allowed just 28 goals, the fewest in school history...as good as she was defensively, Rowland had one of the most prolific offensive season ever put together by an FSU defender...she scored six goals and registered four assists for 16 points...only one FSU defender in school history has ever tallied more points than Rowland and that is her backline teammate Katie Beal who also had six goals but added seven assists for 19 total points...the two FSU center backs combined for 12 goals and 11 assists. No two Seminole defenders had ever combined to score 35 points in FSU history before Rowland and Beal did it in 2003...Rowland had the fifth-most points on the team, the third-most goals, the second-most game-winning goals and the fifth-most assists...among rookies, Rowland was second in goals, points, and assists and led all freshmen in game-winning goals...no freshman defender had a more prolific offensive season than did Rowland in 2003 as she set records for both goals and points by a rookie defender...became a dangerous offensive weapon for FSU off long throw-ins as all four of her assists came via the throw-in...registered three straight games with an assist in wins over Miami, Ole Miss, and Maryland...one of only four Seminoles to start all 26 games and the only rookie to do so. **(in the ACC)** Rowland was one of just four Seminoles to start all seven Atlantic Coast Conference matches and one of just two freshman to start every game...second on the team in assists in ACC games with two and led all rookies...both of her assists were game-winners (Maryland and NC State)...only one freshman, forward Julia Schnugg, recorded more points than Rowland in ACC games...a main reason the Seminole defense allowed the fewest goals ever in a single ACC season and the third-fewest goals ever allowed by an ACC team in one year: **(in the Postseason)** five of Rowland's record-setting six goals came after the regular season had concluded (ACC and NCAA Tournaments)...in the ACC Tournament Rowland not only tied for the scoring title but she also became the first Seminole ever to score a goal in two games of a single ACC Championship...tied with Carolina's Heather O'Reilly with three goals to lead all players at the ACC Tournament. O'Reilly had three of UNC's 15 goals in the tournament while Rowland scored three of the five FSU goals scored on the weekend...she and her defensive teammates recorded the only shutout of the tournament and allowed just one goal all weekend in the run of play. They limited to North Carolina to just two goals off set pieces and a penalty kick

goal...she started every postseason match for FSU...set a new freshman record for points in the NCAA Tournament with four...helped FSU record just the third shutout in the team's NCAA Tournament history versus Dartmouth. **(2003 highlights)** the first goal of her career was a game-winner against Jacksonville...recorded assists in three consecutive matches versus Miami, Ole Miss and a game-winner versus Maryland...recorded another game-winning assist against NC State to give FSU a 4-1-1 ACC record...proceeded to go on to score five goals in the postseason...the center back out score Lindsay Tarpley, Alyssa Ramsey, Casey McCluskey, Leah Gallegos, Courtney Foster and all the others to share the ACC Tournament goal scoring title with three...her first ACC Tournament goal was a game-winner versus Maryland in the semifinals...her next two goals came on one of the biggest stages of the season in the ACC Championship final, which was broadcast all over the eastern United States...against No. 1 North Carolina, Rowland put FSU up 1-0 on a header goal just over 6:00 minutes into the match...after the Tar Heels tied the game in the 13th minute, Rowland went back to work putting the Seminoles in front again 2-1...with her two goals, Rowland became the first player in more than a year to score two goals in a single game versus the Tar Heels...North Carolina hadn't given up two goals to an opponent in an ACC Tournament final since 1994 yet Rowland scored two herself...scored her sixth goal and fifth of the postseason as she staked FSU to a 1-0 lead in a win over third-seeded Florida in the Elite Eight.
