Few programs can match the combination of success on the field, fan support in the stands and on-campus facilities that makeup the Seminole softball program. Head coach Dr. JoAnne Graf has built one of the most successful programs in Division I softball history in her 23 years at Florida State University. Graf, who is just 12 wins shy of becoming the All-Time leader for victories by a Division I coach, has guided FSU to two slow-pitch national championships, five Women's College World Series appearances, 14 NCAA Regionals and back-to-back NCAA Regional finals during her tenure at FSU. She has seen 21 players garner All-American honors under her guidance and she has also coached nine players who have gone on to play professional softball.



FSU finished the 2001 campaign ranked 15th in the nation after being chosen to host one of just eight NCAA Regional tournaments. The two-year old Seminole Softball Complex is one of the nation's top softball facilities and it allows FSU to be a perennial contender to host ACC Tournaments and NCAA Regionals. Last season, 6,142 fans came to watch Seminole home games including a record 611 fans that saw the Seminoles down the Florida Gators for the third time in 2001 and advance in the NCAA Tallahassee Regional. Two of the top 10 home attendances in Seminole Softball Complex history were set during that regional.

Florida State was not only nationally ranked again last season (No. 15) but the team has finished in the top 17 in five of the last seven final USA Today/NFCA Division I polls. The Seminoles have a winning record against 85% of the 149 opponents they have faced in the program's illustrious 23-year history. Over the last 10 seasons, FSU has amassed 520 wins or an average of 52 victories a season.



Florida State's unprecedented success is even more pronounced when you look at what the squad has done in its 10 years of Atlantic Coast Conference play. The Seminoles have been crowned ACC champions in eight of their 10 ACC seasons and have produced eight ACC Tournament MVP's and Graf has been named the conference's top coach on four occasions. Last year, the Seminoles swept the ACC awards banquet for the first time ever taking home player, rookie and coach of the year honors. Of the 41 ACC post-season awards handed out during the ACC's 10 softball seasons, FSU has captured 19 of the awards. No other school has won more than eight. Florida State is 59-16 all-time in ACC play and has finished atop the ACC regular season standings eight times. The Seminole softball program has also produced 49 All-ACC selections in their 10 seasons in the conference.

The state-of-the-art Seminole Soccer Complex is one of the nation's top facilities and includes ticket and concession buildings and a spacious press box, including press seating, radio/television booths and high-speed Internet access. The two-level Mary Ann Stiles & Barry Smith Team Building houses the coaches' offices which overlook the softball field, a reception area, a combined



workroom, large team and coach's locker rooms, visiting team locker rooms and training and equipment rooms.

Playing for one of the nation's top programs under the guidance of the country's premiere softball coach, graduating from a prestigious university and playing on a 'field of dreams' are all a part of the package that is Florida State softball.
