2003 All-ACC, ACC Player of the Week (5/5/03)

2003: All-ACC selection...George's play in 2003 was one of the main reasons FSU won 27 straight games to close the regular season...the sophomore became one of the most reliable and consistent fielder's and hitters on the team...compared to 2002, George hit 46 points higher, slugged 59 points higher and fielded 40 points higher...set or tied single season highs for RBIs and home runs...amongst the team leaders for runs scored, total bases, sac bunts, slugging, hits, triples, on base pct and RBIs...had more than double the sacrifice bunts of anyone on the team in 2003...since April, she hit .357, slugged .589 and had an on base percentage of .429...during that span she scored 16 runs, had three doubles, two triples, two home runs, 18 RBIs and seven walks...second on the team with 14 two-out RBIs and tied for third for game-winning RBIs...had the fourth longest hitting streak for FSU in 2003...six multi-RBI games and 12 multi-hit games last year. **ACC REGULAR SEASON:** Amongst FSU's leaders in seven categories in ACC games...led the team in slugging percentage, two-out RBIs and sacrifice bunts...second in runs scored and total bases and third in RBIs...fourth in batting average...ranked amongst the ACC leaders for on base percentage and slugging percentage...in games versus ACC teams, George was first in the ACC in home runs, slugging percentage and walks...in ACC games she was second in runs scored and on base percentage, third in RBIs and fourth in total bases...raised her career fielding percentage in ACC games over 130 points after posting a perfect 1.000 last season...also raised her career slugging percentage in conference games by an amazing 283 points. **GAME HIGHLIGHTS:** Recorded her first hit of the season against **Auburn** along with collecting two RBIs, two walks, and one sacrifice hit...versus No. 8 **Georgia** went 2 for 4 with an RBI, which capped a two-run comeback in the bottom of the sixth...hit in three of four games at the Sunshine State Tournament and started the weekend off with a huge outing against **Middle Tennessee**. George went 3 for 3 with three runs scored and a walk in the opener. Went on to collect hits versus **Iowa State** twice in the next two days. Her RBI against the **Cyclones** was her fifth of the year...hit .375 at the 2003 NFCA Leadoff Classic...started with a perfect day by going 2 for 2 with a run and an RBI versus then-No. 18 **Pacific**...recorded her third hit of the tournament as she went 1 for 3 versus then-No. 17 **Oregon State**...recorded hits in three straight games versus **Mercer**, **Mississippi State** and **Syracuse**...her week was highlighted by a 2 for 4 performance with both hits being doubles against the **Orange women**...recorded FSU's only RBI of the week as she went a perfect 2 for 2 with a walk in the Tribe's opening win over **Long Beach State** at the Kia Classic...with FSU clinging to a 1-0 lead in game two versus **UNC** and already having stranded eight base runners, George laced a two-out double that plated two more runs and put the Tribe comfortably in front of **UNC** 3-0...after going 2 for 6 with a walk in a sweep over **UCF**, George exploded on the road at **Furman**...in the first game, George went 2 for 3 with a run scored and an RBI. She also had a sac bunt that advanced the eventual game-winning run...followed up that performance with a 3 for 4 day in game two that included a double, a triple, three runs scored and four RBIs...exploded in the series opener with **JU**. The sophomore went 2 for 2 with a run scored, two RBIs and a double...against **Florida**, she had an RBI hit in game one and scored a run and recorded another hit in game two...had probably her best defensive series of her career against **Virginia**, as her glove work was superb. Also came through at the plate as she scored three runs, drove in a run, recorded a hit and a sacrifice...had one of her best series of her career in the regular season finale against defending ACC Champions **Georgia Tech**...the sophomore led the Seminoles sweep of the **Jackets**, as FSU became the first Atlantic Coast Conference school to ever go 8-0. George led FSU in runs scored (3), home runs (2), RBIs (3), slugging percentage (2.000), walks (2) and on base percentage (.667). The shortstop came into Sunday's season finale with two home runs in 352 career at bats but she equaled that number in just four at bats versus the **Yellow Jackets**. In game two, FSU was clinging to a 1-0 lead against reigning ACC Rookie of the Year Jessica Sallinger. The sophomore went to right field again as she lofted a two-run shot over the wall to bring home **Florida State's** second and third runs en route to a 6-0 win and sweep of the **Jackets**...in the ACC Tournament, George tied for third on the team with three RBIs...tied for the team lead with two RBIs in the Seminoles' tournament championship clinching victory over **Virginia** (including the game-winning RBI)...reached based twice in three at bats and scored one run in **Florida State's** tournament opening victory over **Virginia**...had the game-winning RBI in the seventh inning against **Georgia Tech**...two hits and two RBIs in three at bats including the game-winning RBI in the championship clinching victory over **Virginia**...doubled to center field to score Natasha Jacob from second to give the Seminoles a 10-2 lead...was perfect on 15 total chances as **Florida State's** starting

shortstop with five putouts and 10 assists...was one of nine Seminoles with a 1.000 fielding percentage in the ACC Championship.

2002: One of FSU's top newcomers in 2002...led all freshman in every offensive category while starting 69 of 75 games...second on the team in runs scored (39), sacrifice bunts (13) and at bats (207)...third with 102 assists and fourth on the team with 50 hits, two triples, 71 games played, 245 plate appearances and 69 starts...was also in the top five for triples (2), walks (20), on base percentage (.319), RBIs (20) and steals (4)...was a perfect 4-for-4 in stolen bases...led all Seminoles with a .500 batting average in six at bats with the bases loaded...successfully advanced runners nearly 49% of the time while hitting in the one or two hole for 47 games...during the 2002 NCAA postseason, George was in the top five for average and sacrifices...led all six of FSU's newcomers in games played, starts, at bats, runs, hits, doubles and RBIs...opened up NCAA Tournament play versus **Auburn** by going 2-for-3 against fourth seeded **Auburn** in a **Florida State** win...went 1-for-3 with one run scored in the NCAA Tallahassee Regional Championship...started all four games at the 2002 Women's College World Series...had her best outing in the semi-finals as she recorded a hit and drew a walk off 2001 College Player of the Year Jennie Finch.

High school: All-Sunkist League honorable mention, All-San Bernardino County, Sun Newspaper Player of the Week and All-CIF Honorable Mention during her high school career...All-League for Inland Empire Dream Team at shortstop after batting .640...Girl Athlete of the Year...All-County...also lettered in tennis, basketball and volleyball.

Personal: Member of 2002-2003 ACC Honor Roll...Principal's Honor Roll for students with a GPA between 3.8-4.0 every year in high school...received Outstanding Student Recognition...class president in 10th and 11th grade...listed in Who's Who of American High School Students in 10th and 11th grade...received special honors in mathematics...served on ASB council during her senior season...major is Business...born April 15, 1983.

2003: Named All-ACC and second-team NFCA All-Region in her first season as a starter...sophomore hurler had one of the most dominant seasons in the nation inside the circle...ace of an FSU pitching staff, which had the nation's fourth-best ERA (0.86)...the Millstadt, IL native finished fifth in the nation in ERA (0.67) and 14th in the nation for wins (27)...one of just three sophomores in FSU history to lead the team in wins, ERA, strikeouts, shutouts and appearances...had the best season by a sophomore pitcher at **Florida State** since Julie Larsen in 1986...just the third Seminole in the last 10 years to finish the season with an ERA below 1.00...won 15 straight decisions and had a streak of 28 scoreless innings during FSU's 27-game winning streak...allowed more than two earned runs just once in 38 appearances and didn't allow a single earned run in 24 of those outings...allowed three hits or less in 18 of her 31 starts and threw three one-hitters and a no-hitter...registered seven or more strikeouts in 15 of her 31 starts and had six double-digit K games last season...set a career high for Ks (15) against **Pacific** who was ranked 20th in the nation at the time...didn't walk a single batter in four of her starts...led FSU in ERA, wins, starts, appearances, complete games, shutouts, innings pitched and fewest earned runs...named ACC Player of the Week February 24th after throwing her first career no-hitter (**Florida A&M**), winning her first ever start versus a Top 25 team (No. 20 **Pacific**) and striking out 15 batters in a game (**Pacific**) for the first time in her career. **ACC REGULAR SEASON:** Led the conference in ERA, shutouts and wins in both overall and ACC games...had the most wins and lowest ERA of any FSU pitcher in team history in ACC games...in the top three of every overall pitching category amongst ACC players...allowed just two earned runs in ACC play...second in the ACC in opponent batting average and complete games...had a 4 to 1 strikeout to walk ratio in ACC games...completed a perfect ACC season (5-0) with a 0.24 ERA. **GAME HIGHLIGHTS:** Started 2003 by throwing a complete game against **Georgia Southern** and striking out a career high 13 in picking up her first victory of the season...pitched her first shutout of the season in an 8-0 victory over **Auburn** allowing only two hits over six innings...allowed just two earned runs in 14 innings of work versus **Oregon** and **SE Louisiana**...at the Sunshine State Tournament and against **FAMU**, Hunter pitched 21 innings, posted a record of 3-0, didn't allow a single earned run, struck out 28 batters, walked just four, held opponents to a .116 average and threw the first no-hitter of her career...struck out 11 and threw the first no-hitter of her career versus **FAMU**...at the 2003 NFCA Leadoff Classic she recorded her first top 25 win and set a career high with 15 K's in a game. Her ERA for the tournament was just 0.89 and opponents hit just .064 against her...started the tournament off with the most dominant performance of her career against the best team she has ever started against. Hunter allowed then-No. 18 **Pacific** just two hits and struck out 15 batters en route to a 8-1 win...turned around and one-hit then-No. 25 **UMass**...shut out **Rutgers** by allowing three hits and one walk on top of striking out 13...was the hard luck loser versus **Penn State**. She pitched 10.1 innings and didn't give up an earned run...started Kia Classic play with a dominating performance against **Long Beach State**. The sophomore struck out eight batters and issued just two walks as she recorded her sixth shutout of the season...in a 5-1 win over **Princeton** at the Buzz Classic she retired 15 straight batters at one point...then took the hill against **Middle Tennessee** and picked up her seventh shutout and 16th complete game of the year...won three games in a week as she recoded both decisions against **Maryland** and another win over **FAMU**...against **UNC**, Hunter out deuled **Tar Heel** ace Crystal Cox as she shut out **UNC** for the first time all season in Chapel Hill. Also held the Heels without a homer in their own park for the first time in 2003...upped her consecutive win streak to 10 games including her ninth shutout of the season in a win versus **UCF** in which she allowed just one run and had a no-hitter through eight innings...was dominant against **Furman** as she didn't allow a run or issue a walk in the seven-inning win...won her 11th and 12th in a row as she posted a 2-0 record and a 0.00 ERA against No. 22 **Florida** and a hard-hitting **Virginia** team...pitched back-to-back shutouts in two big time games including her first-ever start in the park of an opposing Top 25 team. Add to that it was the **Gators** in Gainesville. Dominated again in her next start against a **UVA** team hitting almost .300. She didn't walk a single batter and picked up three Ks in the seven-inning, 5-0 shutout win...completed a perfect ACC season as she limited **Georgia Tech** to just two hits in a 4-0 shutout...earned two wins in the 2003 ACC Tournament including the championship-clinching victory over **Virginia** in the title game...first Seminole pitcher to earn multiple wins in the ACC Tournament since Leslie Malerich won two games against **Maryland** in 2001...appeared in all three games during the tournament with two starts (both wins against **Virginia**) and one relief appearance (in

the Seminoles' victory over **Georgia Tech**)...allowed only one earned run in 10 innings pitched with the only earned run allowed coming in the fifth inning of the Seminoles' first game of the tournament...faced 45 batters during the ACC Tournament and allowed only six (13.3 percent) to get to third base and only three to score (6.7 percent).

2002: Went a perfect 4-0 in her freshman campaign as she learned from two of FSU's all-time greats (Leslie Malerich & Jessica van der Linden)...will be counted on to make a major contribution this season due to the departure of all-time FSU wins leader Leslie Malerich...led all FSU pitchers by holding right handed hitters to a .176 batting average...also tops on the team in opponent batting average with runners on base (.183)...averaged an amazing 8.59 strikeouts per game, which led all pitchers...didn't give up a triple or a home run in 36.2 innings...

High school:

Considered one of Illinois' top high school pitchers...named the Belleville News-Democrat Class AA Player of the Year and Pitcher of the Year by the Journal Newspaper of Southern Illinois...as a junior for the Belleville West Maroons, Hunter posted a 15-2 record with a 0.35 ERA...in 120 innings of work, she struck out 225 batters and issued only 31 walks...a three-sport star, Hunter was also a middle blocker for the school's 28-1 volleyball team and she also played basketball during her junior and senior years

ACC Championship Most Valuable Player

2003: The newcomer started 52 of FSU 57 games and quickly established herself as one of the top power hitting threats on the team...the Tribes' top returning power hitter...named to the ACC All-Tournament team and tournament MVP...second on the team with six home runs and a .566 slugging percentage...third on the team in doubles, walks and on base percentage...led all first year players in average, doubles, homers, RBIs, total bases, slugging, walks and on base percentage...only 2003 All-American Brandi Stuart slugged higher and hit more homers than Palmer did in 2003...finished the season strong with hits in 17 of her last 23 starts...tied for third on the squad with four game-winning RBIs...hit four of her six homers in the final 20 games...set ACC Championship records for home runs in a game and home runs in a tournament. **ACC REGULAR SEASON:** Started all eight ACC games for FSU...third on the team for doubles...tied for the lead among newcomers for average, runs scored, total bases and doubles...second amongst FSU's first year players for slugging percentage and fourth in the ACC for walks. **GAME HIGHLIGHTS:** Picked up her first collegiate hit, a double to right center, against **Auburn**, scoring a run and walking twice...versus **FAMU** Palmer went 1 for 2 with two runs, an RBI, a double and two walks. She also scored the game-winning run when she came home on a passed ball...went 1 for 3 with a walk versus No. 8 **UGA**...was 1 for 2 with 2 RBIs, a double, a walk and a sac versus **SE Louisiana**...in her first outing against **Iowa State** she went 2 for 3...against **Middle Tennessee** the third baseman opened up going 1 for 2 with a run scored and a mammoth 250-foot home run to left field...in the final contest versus **Iowa State**, Palmer went 1 for 1 with a double, a game-winning RBI, a run scored and two walks...went 1 for 2 versus **Syracuse** with a walk and a two RBI double...had a great outing in a doubleheader against **Troy State** where she went 2 for 5 with two RBIs, a run, a walk and a stolen base...against **Rutgers**, Palmer went 1 for 1 with a walk, an RBI and a run scored as she blasted her second mammoth homer of the year. It was the second of three straight game-winning RBIs she recorded...had another multi-hit game with a 2 for 3 day against **Penn State**...broke out of a 1 for 25 slump with a 4 for 9 week against **Elon** and **North Carolina**...started off by going 1 for 2 with an RBI in game one versus **Elon**...had a big game two as she went 2 for 2 with a run scored and an RBI on her third HR of the season...against **UNC**, she finished off the sweep by going 1 for 2...started the **UCF** twin bill with a 1 for 2 day including a double...recorded hits in both **Furman** games. Went 1 for 2 with a double in game one and then went 1 for 2 again in game two but this time with an RBI...in the series finale versus **Virginia**, she went 2 for 2 with a run scored and a double. Both hits started Seminole rallies...in FSU's first win over **Georgia Tech**, Palmer went 1 for 1 with a run scored and a walk...named the ACC Tournament Most Valuable Player and to the All-Tournament team after hitting .800 with four hits, four runs scored, three home runs, 13 total bases, and a 2.600 slugging percentage...in game one she hit a solo shot to left field to put the Seminoles up 8-1 in the third inning...hit a two-run shot to left center field to put **Florida State** up 2-0 in the second inning of game two...hit another two-run home run in game three to tie the game at 2-2 in the second inning...was retired only once in six plate appearances...was also perfect in three chances in the field at third base, one putout and two assists.

Junior College: Played one season at Lake City CC, which produced former Seminole slugger Monique Marier...2002 NJCAA first team All-American...named All-State, All-Conference 1st Team and Conference Pitcher of the Year in 2002.

High School:

Dominated high school softball in the state of Virginia, which led her to the University of Texas as a freshman...2nd team high school All-American her junior year...four-time WCAC Conference Pitcher of the Year and a four-time All-WCAC 1st team selection...named first team All-State all four years in high school...three-time MVP of the Virginia State Tournament...All-MET Player of the Year as a junior and a 1st team All-MET selection for four straight years...All-Fairfax Player of the Year as a junior and All-Fairfax 1st Team...finished her high school career owning every record at Bishop O'Connell except for runs and stolen bases...played for the nation's seventh-ranked high school softball team as a sophomore.

2003: One of **Florida State's** top freshmen in 2003...one of just eight Seminoles with double digit RBIs in 2003 despite having half as many at bats as the starters...led all freshmen in RBIs and sacrifice flies and was tied for first in doubles...was behind only starter Natasha Jacob amongst freshmen in games played, at bats, runs, hits, total bases, walks, on base percentage, sacrifices and steals...tied for third on the team with four game winning RBIs...four multi-hit games last season...Brieske showed a knack for coming through in the clutch as she has two walk-off game winning hits...she was also the team's top pinch hitter going 3 for 6 with two RBIs and two doubles on top of slugging .833 and posting a .500 on base percentage. **ACC REGULAR SEASON:** Appeared in four ACC games and made one start...third on the team in game winning RBIs in ACC contests...fourth amongst all players for hits in conference contests...fifth on the team in runs scored in conference games...had one of FSU's 13 doubles and also recorded two RBIs...had the game-winning hit versus **Maryland** in the 10th inning in a 3-2 FSU victory. **GAME HIGHLIGHTS:** Made her collegiate debut as a pinch hitter in game one versus **Auburn**, recording a double and a RBI. 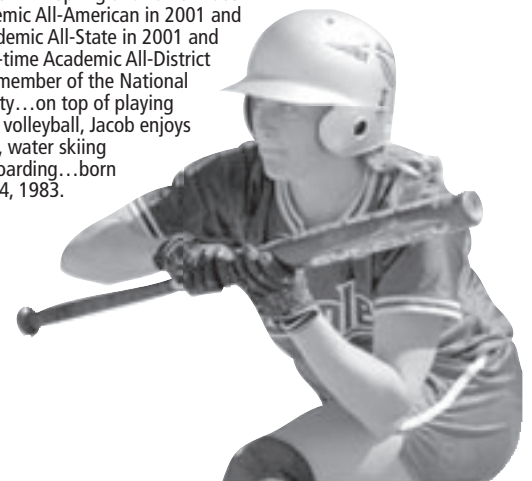
