SEASON PREVIEW

2005 SEASON OUTLOOK

GENERAL OVERVIEW

Notes:

- As head coach Dr. JoAnne Graf enters her 27th season at Florida State, it will mark the beginning of a new era—the post Jessica van der Linden show. After losing the USA Softball National Player of the Year and the Honda Award winner for softball, along with two other outstanding seniors, Graf will feature a much different look in 2005.
- The senior class of van der Linden, Beth Wade and Elisa Vasquez led the school to 221 victories (.800 winning percentage), two Women's College World Series (WCWS) appearances, two ACC Championships, two NCAA Regional championships, and four straight NCAA tournament berths.
- The Tribe is coming off arguably the best season in the program's history that saw FSU ending 2004 with a 62-12 record, a Top 5 national ranking, and its seventh trip to the Women's College World Series (WCWS).
- Florida State returns seven of nine starters, including four NFCA All-Southeast Region selections, from a team that won the 2004 ERA Title and set team records for homeruns, RBIs, runs scored and walks. In the circle, they set a new strikeout record as well.

ACCORDING TO COACH GRAF:

"I think this is going to be a good year for us even though we still have a lot of questions. The girls came back from the holidays in great shape, and they really worked hard during the fall. Obviously we lost a good senior class of not only Jessica van der Linden, but Beth Wade and Elisa Vasquez as well. All three were starters throughout their careers. Pitching is going to be the big question. Not to put too much pressure on Casey Hunter, but our team will perform how she performs. I think we have a lot of quickness and speed on defense...that was our biggest positive from the fall. If our batting and pitching comes around, I foresee us having a successful year. It should be exciting."

PITCHING

Notes:

- The Seminole's top pitching ace, senior Casey Hunter, finished with a 33-4 record and the nation's third-lowest ERA in 2004. She is among the best in the country and is continuing to establish herself as one of the all-time Seminole greats in the circle.
- Last year's pitching staff won the 2004 ERA Title.
- In three seasons, Hunter has yet to allow anyone to hit a triple against her.
- Hunter hurled four no hitters in 2004 and has five in her career.
- Hunter was named a second team NFCA All-American last year.

With her win over Eastern Michigan to end the regular season, she notched her 30th victory of the season and became just the sixth pitcher ever at FSU to record 30 or more wins in a season.

- Hunter finished eighth in the NCAA for wins with 33 and third in the nation with a 0.63 ERA. She is the first FSU pitcher since Toni Gutierrez in 1992 to put together back-to-back sub 1.00 ERA seasons.
- Freshman Tiffany McDonald and Amy Harrison will also join the rotation. Harrison had three appearances and one start in 2004.

ACCORDING TO COACH GRAF:

"Casey Hunter is one of the best pitchers in the country and she will be our main go-to player and our pitching will focus on her. Our season will rely on her arm and how she performs in the circle. Our freshman Tiffany McDonald also joins the rotation. She had a preseason injury and seems to be recovering well, but we'll have to see how she progresses as we get closer to the season. Sophomore Amy Harrison is back and she has been pitching well. We'll use her in relief situations. The three of them give us different options and will combine to be a positive aspect of our defense."

One of the nation's top pitchers, Casey Hunter, is back to lead the Seminoles in the circle.

INFIELD AND CATCHER

Notes:

• The infield is anchored by four returning starters including second team NFCA All-American Veronica Wootson (sophomore) at second base, four-year shortstop starter Tatiana George, senior second team NFCA All-Southeast Region member Lesley Palmer at third base, and junior utility player, Kim Hoffer, who started 61 games in 2004. George and Palmer combined to miss a total of 37 starts last season with a fractured wrist and torn ACL, respectively, but both are fully recovered as they enter their final year of play. Wootson enjoyed nothing short of a spectacular rookie season as she became the first Seminole to ever be named an All-American in her freshman campaign. Hoffer split time at shortstop and third base for an injured George and Palmer and she can play at any position on the field. Look for her to back up the two as well as playing at first base.

• First base and catcher will feature two new starters as All-ACC standouts Beth Wade and Elisa Vasquez were lost to graduation. The top preseason candidate to play at first is freshman Brittany Osmon and the most likely starter behind the plate will be junior BillieAnne Gay.

• Gay started in 26 contests last year and she is the frontrunner to replace the four-year starter Vasquez. She worked in a battery with Jessica van der Linden as the All-America pitcher continually praised Gay for the amazing transformation of van der Linden's pitching in 2004. Gay was perfect behind the plate last year with a 1.000 fielding percentage in 330 chances and led FSU with a .583 stolen base allowed (SBA) percentage as she pegged 10 of the 24 runners that tested her arm.

• Also competing for playing time in the infield are freshmen Melissa “Moe” Wood at catcher and second baseman Robyn Petrovich.

• The five returning position players fielded an average of .928 last season.

ACCORDING TO COACH GRAF:

“I think defense is one of our strongest points, and we have a great group of starters and back-ups at every position. We will have to replace two outstanding seniors in Elisa Vasquez at catcher and Beth Wade at first base, but I feel confident in the players we have that they will step up to the challenge.”

Behind the plate we have BilleAnne Gay and freshman Melissa Wood. BillieAnne is a very intelligent catcher and she works very well with the pitchers. Melissa brings power to the lineup and is very willing to learn. The pitchers may throw to different catchers because it just depends on different situations.

As for the infield, Kim Hoffer will be the backup to everyone. She is very good and understands her role and will find playing time at first, shortstop and third base. Brittany Osmon plays first base and she has to learn maturity and confidence on the field like any freshman that moves into a starting role. I am confident she will adjust pretty quickly.

Veronica Wootson is back at second base and she had an outstanding season last year. She is very enthusiastic and pushes herself everyday in practice and is always looking to get better. Robyn Petrovich is the backup at second base, but she will be used more for spot duty like pinch running and so forth. Also, she has become our third catcher and has done a good job as a bullpen catcher.

Tatiana George is at shortstop and she is very experienced. Over the last few years Tatiana has suffered injuries, but right now she is healthy so that is something positive. The final infielder is Lesley Palmer, our third baseman, and she is coming back from ACL surgery and is about 95 percent ready right now. Lesley's conditioned a lot, so she is a lot quicker and we expect a big year out of her.”

OUTFIELD

Notes:

• Florida State returns an outfield that had a stellar year in 2004. Considering that five of six different Seminoles that started last year are returning, the Tribe is stacked with one of the top outfields in the nation.

• The one major loss is replacing the national player of the year, Jessica van der Linden, who was probably FSU's best defensive outfielder. She and junior Carly Brieske split time roaming the field in center. Brieske had 38 starts and van der Linden recorded 36, respectively.

• Junior Natasha Jacob in left field has started almost every game the last two seasons and has totaled just one error in her career. Many believe she should have garnered All-American honors last season.

• Sophomore right fielder LaShaun Davis started 52 games as a freshman in 2004 and totaled just one miscue. Brieske showed how versatile she was last season with 48 starts between center and right.

• Junior Carey Galuppi and senior Katie Fricke are also back. The two of them combined for 10 starts in right field last year. Speedy freshman Whitney Buckmon joins the outfield mix in 2005 and will compete for playing time in center as she is one of the most natural athletes on the team.

• Last season, the six Seminole outfielders had 125 chances and made only four errors all season. That is a combined .969 fielding percentage by that group.

ACCORDING TO COACH BERNDT:

“Obviously we've always had speed in the outfield, so we'll continue to have success at that. The junior class has been there for two and a half years so they really know what to expect. I think the outfield might be one of our stronger assets this year. I feel that Natasha Jacob could have been an All-American last year and I expect good things out of her this season. She has an opportunity to be an All-American in 2005 as well as some other players. She is super fast, bats well, and is very reliable. In right field you have LaShaun Davis and Katie Fricke. LaShaun went through some ups and downs as a freshman, but this year she looks much more confident and I believe she is going to rebound. Katie is a power hitter and will be a back-up DH-type. In center field you have freshman Whitney Buckmon who is learning to use her speed. She has a lot of weapons and will just need to learn how to properly use them. Carly Brieske is also out there. She is very experienced, strong defensively and a very vocal leader. Carey Galuppi will back up Jacob and she is one of those that will come off the bench to add a spark. Carey is very versatile...she can play both left and right field.”

SEASON OUTLOOK

THE POSTSEASON

Notes:

- Florida State has captured the Atlantic Coast Conference Championship 10 times in 13 years.
- The Seminoles have played for the NCAA Regional title four times in the last five years on top of advancing to the Women's College World Series twice (2002, 2004).
- Only four teams in the history of NCAA Division I softball have been to more WCWS than Florida State.
- The Seminoles have been to the NCAA Tournament 17 times in the last 19 years.

ACCORDING TO COACH GRAF:

"Our postseason goals are ultimately the same every year. Our goal is to win the ACC Championship and national championship. Those are very lofty goals but that's something at Florida State we work towards every season. We believe in that and structure our program around that."

THE ACC EXPANSION

Notes:

- NC State's addition to the ACC last year marked the first new softball team to play in the ACC since Maryland joined in 1995.
- Virginia Tech joins the ACC schedule in 2005 and Boston College will be added next year. The conference will have doubled in size in a decade, going from four teams to eight. Tech registered a 36-23 mark in 2004 and went 2-2 against ACC teams (Virginia and Georgia Tech).
- Also, in the new conference, teams will play a three-game series each weekend, with a doubleheader being played on Saturday and a single game contested on Sunday.
- A change in the NCAA is the addition of the Super Regionals, like baseball already does. Sixty-four teams will still make the tournament, but instead of eight, eight-team regionals being played, now 16, four-team regionals will be played. Already bracketed, the 16 winners will advance to the Super Regionals, where two teams (played at eight different sites) will play a best-of-three series to determine the eight teams to play in the WCWS.

ACCORDING TO COACH GRAF:

"The ACC has changed in a couple ways. First of all, you add Virginia Tech and then you go into a three-game series. This reduces the number of games you can play against other teams outside the conference. So, that has changed our scheduling a little bit."

THE SCHEDULE

Notes:

- As in year's past, Florida State will face one of the toughest schedules in college softball. The Seminoles are scheduled to face eight-or-more games against 2004 NCAA Tournament teams.
- Including tournaments, FSU could possibly face as many as 20 teams that played in the 64-team NCAA Tournament last season.
- FSU plays in two of college softball's premier tournaments, the 10th Annual Leadoff Classic in Columbus, Ga., Feb. 25-27, and Cal State Fullerton's Kia Classic, March 18-20.
- Six of the eight teams that participated in the Women's College World Series played in last year's Leadoff Classic, which was highlighted by record attendance. Twenty-four of the nation's top collegiate teams return in 2005, highlighted by WCWS participants FSU, LSU, Michigan and Oklahoma. Twenty of the squads qualified for regional play in 2004.
- Florida State heads to California for its final regular season tournament at Fullerton for the 2005 Kia Classic. The Seminoles are seeded in Pool D with three tough teams including Texas, Arizona and Long Beach State. Texas returns Olympic Gold Medalist pitcher, Cat Osterman, who took an Olympic redshirt last season and competed with the U.S. National team. The 49ers advanced to the NCAA Regionals and boasted of an impressive 51-13 record, and Arizona was the 2004 Pac-10 champions.

ACCORDING TO COACH GRAF:

"We have a really tough, strong schedule. Both the Leadoff and Kia Classic are the best tournaments in the country and this year will be no different. I think it's important to play

top teams early on so it gives us idea of where we are to give us time to make adjustments to get ready for conference and post-season play. I'm really excited about our team, schedule and this season. I like the variety of it and I think it will prepare us for postseason play."

AT THE PLATE

Notes:

- The 2004 squad excelled offensively and set new program records for RBIs (313), home runs (44), runs (369), and walks (252). They also made a valiant run at the triples (27) and batting average records (.288) where FSU finished fourth and sixth all time in each respective category.
- Veronica Wootson is the sparkplug at the top of the order that made the 17th-ranked offense run last year. She finished the year ranked 12th in the nation in runs scored and 15th in triples, while setting new rookie records for runs, total bases and home runs. Behind her is Natasha Jacob who was third in team batting average last season, second on the team in triples, first in steals, and second in on base percentage. Lesley Palmer led FSU with 12 doubles (along with Beth Wade) and Palmer set new career-highs for at bats, runs, hits, doubles, and RBIs.

ACCORDING TO COACH

BERNDT:

"I think our hitters 1-9 will be tough to go against because our older players are a lot more experienced. By now they know what to expect. I feel like the newcomers will be able to come in and adjust very well. I truly believe we have one of the strongest lineups we have ever had if they all stay healthy."



* PROJECTED STARTERS





FROM: Airport


Go North on Capital Circle to Pensacola Street. Make a right on Pensacola Street and follow to Stadium Dr. Make a left and the parking lot will be your second left.
