- Second on the team with 28 walks despite 59 fewer at-bats than the category leader.
- Second on the squad in sac bunts, third in walks, fifth in on-base percentage and fourth in runs scored.
- In ACC games she was tied for fifth in batting average - raising her average 60 points during league play — and runs scored and fourth in on-base percentage.
