Career at FSU: A 2001 AVCA All-American candidate ... spent the summer before her senior year training with the USA Women's A2 Training Program with 13 of the top collegiate volleyball players in the nation ... Campbell is currently averaging 267 kills per year over her career and at this rate will reach 1,068 this season...hit .351 for the 2000 season, claiming the seventh spot on the all-time hitting percentage list at Florida State ... stands eighth on the all-time career hitting percentage list (.293) ... also owns the 10th spot for all-time single season kills with 447 in 2000.

2000: Earned first team All-ACC honors in her junior year after leading the conference with her .351 hitting percentage ... named to the AVCA East Region team ... selected to the 2001 USA Women's National A2 Training Program ... led FSU in five major categories, including kills (447), hitting percentage (.351) and blocks (119) ... averaged 3.60 kills per game and 0.96 blocks per game, both team leading statistics ... had 119 total blocks ... had her best match in the Lady 'Noles second-to-last match of the season, when she had 22 kills and hit .500 in the Garnet and Gold's win over Georgia Tech ... had double-digit kills in all but five matches (27) ... had 20+ kills three times, including a season- and career-high 23-kill performance against Duke ... had a career-best night against Jacksonville when she hit .789 with 16 kills ... named ACC Player-of-the-Week for the week ending September 18, 2000, following a week in which she hit .606 and collected 4.00 kills per game while marching Florida State to a 3-1 record, including wins over Jacksonville, Samford and Florida A&M in three straight before falling to No. 25 Notre Dame in four.

1999: Was a member of the 1999 USA Junior National Volleyball Team that competed at the Junior World Championships in Saskatoon and Edmonton, Canada, from August 28 to September 5...led the squad in hitting in its final match vs. the Czech Republic with 11 kills and four blocks...rejoined FSU on September 7th and played in 27 matches...ranked third on the team in hitting at .208 and in kills with 298...was second on the team with 83 blocks...recorded 19 kills and five blocks in her first match back vs. UT-Arlington...also had five blocks against Santa Clara on her way to a team-high 12 block assists at the NIU Invitational...had a then career-high 20 kills vs. Virginia and 18 kills in the last regular-season match at NC State...tallied double digit kills in 16 matches...best outing by percentage was .519 in Duke match (17k, 3e, 27att).

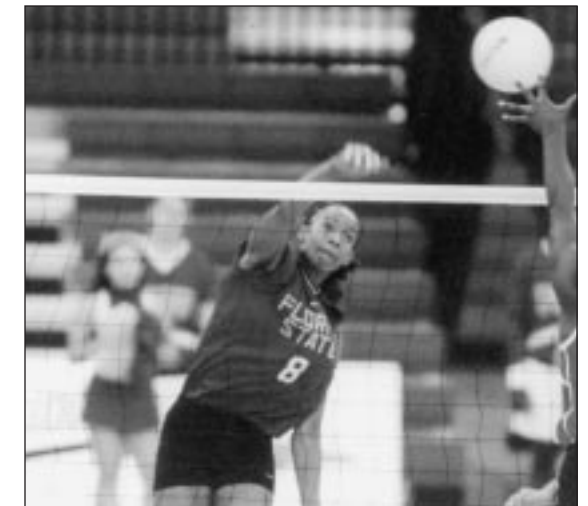

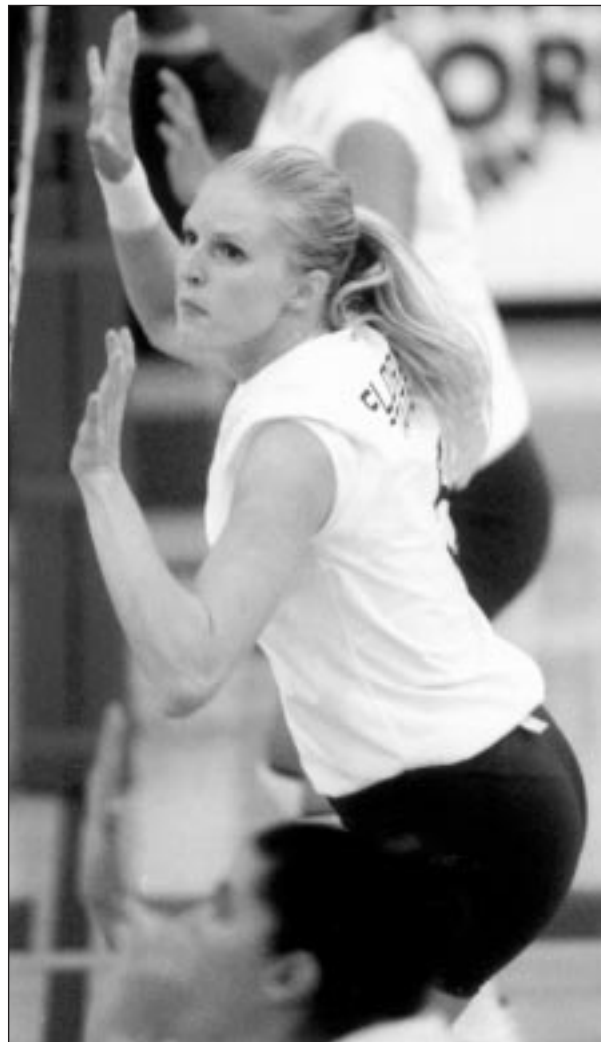

Career at FSU: Pound has accumulated 138 kills over her career, while hitting .227 ... came to FSU in 1998 and saw action in two matches before playing in 21 matches in 1999 ... almost doubled her career-kill total with her 89 kills in 2000 ... has 13 solo blocks and 51 block assists in her three-year career at FSU ... has 24 service aces, including 17 in her sophomore year.

Career at FSU: Bunch played in 30 matches in her freshman season, followed by 21 matches in her sophomore season ... notched 244 kills in her freshman year and has since bettered her career total to 422 kills ... has 329 career-digs, including 198 in her freshman season ... has 60 career total blocks.

2000: Battled through an early season injury which caused her to see limited action early ... played in 21 matches and 70 games during the season and notched 178 kills ... reached double digit kills eight times, and reached the 20-kill plateau twice, including the 'Noles second to last match against Georgia Tech, in which she had 20 kills and hit .340 to help the Lady 'Noles to a 3-1 win ... ended the season with three straight double digit kill matches (16 vs. Clemson, 20 vs. Georgia Tech and 15 vs. Duke) ... hit .300+ in three of her last seven matches, including .340 and .366 percentages to round out the regular season ... had season-high hitting percentage of .625 with six kills against Florida A&M ... had a career and season-high 23 kills against Virginia when she hit .308 along with 12 digs ... notched 10 digs twice this season (vs. Clemson, at NC State) ... averaged 1.87 digs and 2.54 kills per game ... named ACC Player of the Week on Nov. 14, following strong performances against Clemson and Georgia Tech ... tallied 15 kills and a season-high 14 digs in the ACC Tournament game against Duke.

1999: A starter at outside hitter ... played in 30 of 31 matches ... ranked fourth on the team in kills with 244 ... was second on the team with 20 service aces ... tallied double-digit kills in 11 matches, including a career-high 16 kills vs. Virginia ... had her first career collegiate double-double in first match with 13 kills and 16 digs vs. Auburn ... also had a double-double vs. UVA (16 kills, 13 digs), Jacksonville (10 kills, 10 digs) and Clemson (10 kills, 14 digs) ... had five block assists in UVA match ... was third on the team with 198 digs ... best outing was a .480 hitting performance (13k, 1e, 25att) vs. South Carolina.

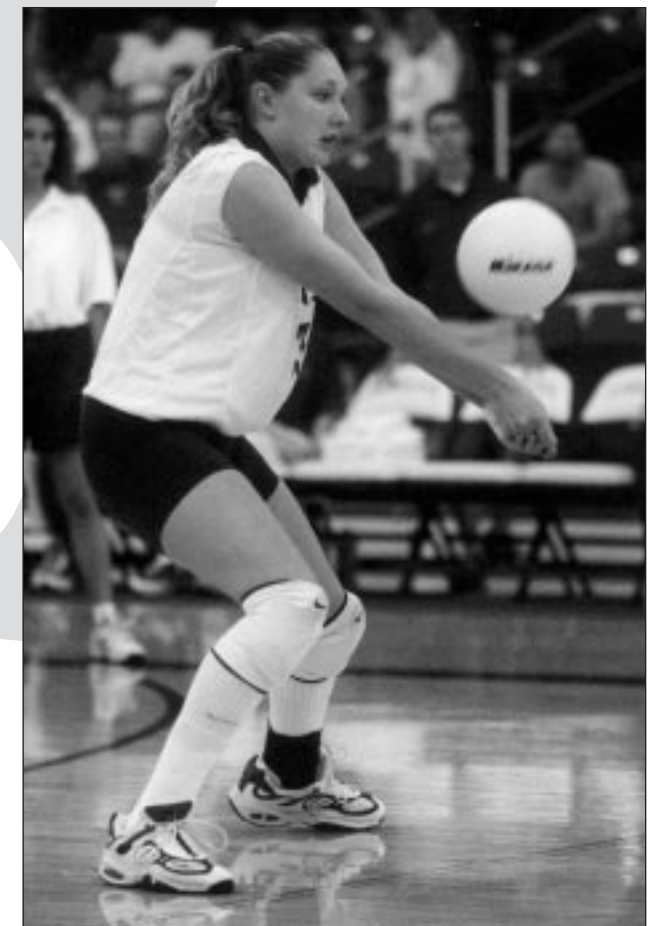

Career at FSU: Frye began her career at FSU in 1999, when she played in 14 matches and collected 62 kills ... raised her career kill total to 342 with 280 kills in 2000 ... has 46 career service aces and 85 assists ... has an impressive 310 career digs.

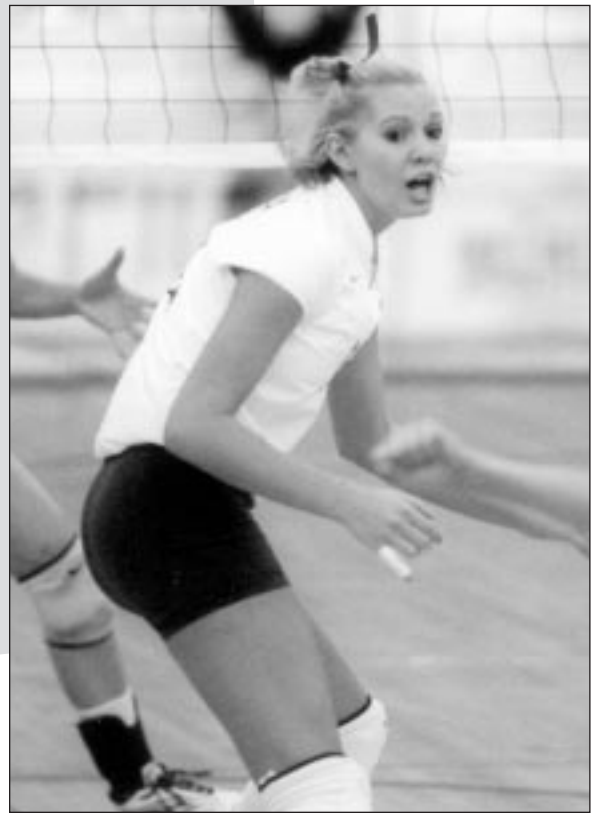

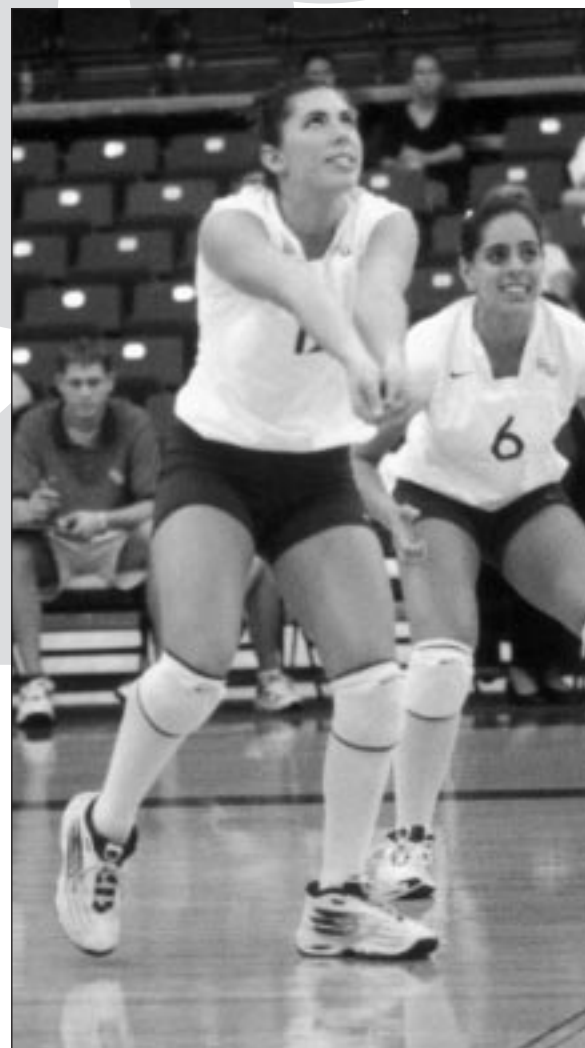

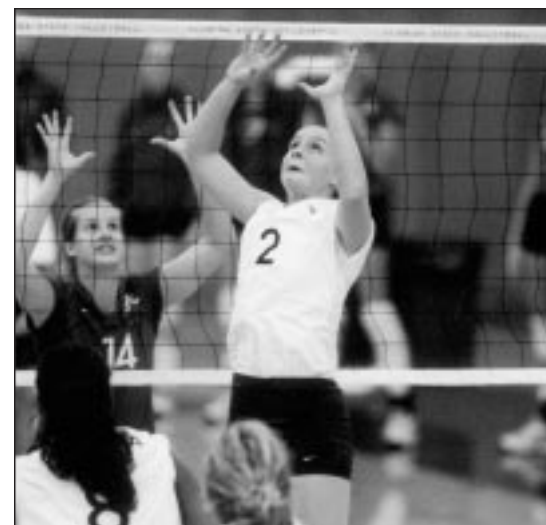
