## 2000 Review

#### 2000 RECORD

The Lady Seminoles finished the 2000 season with a 21-11 record, as well as a 9-7 record in the conference. FSU closed out the regular season with two big conference wins over rivals Georgia Tech (3-1) and Clemson (3-1) before falling to Duke in the ACC Tournament. The Seminoles defeated the league's top-ranked Yellow Jackets on the road for the squad's eighth conference win of the season. The Seminoles finished 12-3 in non-conference matches, 15-5 in the friendly confines of Tully Gymnasium and 4-4 in road conference contests. FSU was 2-1 in neutral site matches, including the ACC Tournament. The Lady Seminoles opened the season with seven-straight wins before falling to Ball State in the championship match of the Ball State Tournament. FSU went on to extend another four-match winning streak later in the season, and finished the season winning six of its final seven regular-season matches.

#### NATIONAL STANDINGS

The 2000 women's volleyball team received some national recognition for its 21 wins. The 'Noles finished the season ranked sixth in the NCAA East Region. The rankings list conference opponents North Carolina (1), Duke (2), Georgia Tech (3), Wake Forest (5), and Virginia (9) as the top-10 teams in the region. The 'Noles defeated two of the three teams that reside above them on the list, with a win over Georgia Tech (11/10) and a sweep of Wake Forest (10/6, 11/3).

#### REYNAUD NAMED ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

Following a 21-10 regular season record, as well as a 9-7 conference record and a fourth-place conference finish, FSU head volley-

ball coach Dr. Cecile Reynaud was named ACC Coach of the Year. The announcement was officially made Wednesday, Nov. 15, along with the announcement of Jen Werrick, Jen Anderson and Norisha Campbell's selection to the All-ACC Volleyball Team.

After ending the 1999 season with a 8-23 record, as well as a 1-15 conference record, Reynaud knew that she had her work cut out for her to turn the 2000 season around into a successful one. With all but two players returning from the 1999 squad, and a strong batch of newcomers, Reynaud and the Lady Seminoles took on the 2000 season with the determination that earned them a fourth-place conference finish. FSU opened the

season with seven-straight wins, including wins over SEC foe Alabama as well as Big Ten Conference opponent, Illinois.

With a career record of 618-314, Reynaud ranks ninth nationally in career victories among active Division I coaches. Reynaud has surpassed many milestones in her 25-year tenure at Florida State. She notched her 600th career victory in a match on Sept. 2, 2000, against Charleston Southern, after opening the season 3-0, placing her among an elite list of coaches in the 600-win club.

A two-time Metro Conference Coach of the Year, Reynaud earned her second ACC Coach of the Year honor in 2000. Reynaud earned her first Coach of the Year award in



1992 when she led FSU to a first-place regular season finish. She was also named Florida Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women Coach of the Year in 1991 and in 1989, she garnered AVCA South Region Coach of the Year accolades.

#### **BLOCK PARTY**


FSU had a solid advantage at the net in 2000, not only out-hitting its opponents (1930 kills to 1813), but out-blocking them as well. The Lady 'Noles had 278.5 blocks in 2000 to their opponents' 258.5. FSU led in blocks per game (2.2 to 2.1) and solo blocks as well, owning a 86-51 edge in that category.

#### CAMPBELL SELECTED TO 2001 USA WOMEN'S NATIONAL A2 TRAINING PROGRAM

Florida State volleyball player Norisha Campbell was named as one of 15 athletes invited to comprise the 2001 USA Women's

National A2 Training Program. Training began at the Olympic Training Center on May 21, 2001. The honor gave Campbell an opportunity to train with some of the top women's volleyball athletes in the country.

Campbell led the 'Noles in the regular season in both kills (431) and hitting percentage (.351), averaging 3.59 kills per game and 0.94 blocks per game, both team leading statistics. She had her best match in the Lady 'Noles' second-to-last match of the regular season when she had



22 kills and hit .500 in the Garnet and Gold's win over Georgia Tech. She had 20+ kills three times this season, including a season-and career-high 23-kill performance against Duke.

Campbell had double-digit kills in all but four matches this season (26). She also managed a career-best night against Jacksonville when she hit .789 with 16 kills. Campbell earned ACC Player-of-the-Week honors earlier this season, as well as adding First Team All-ACC honors to her list of accolades. Her .351 season hitting percentage lands her eighth all-time at Florida State in single season hitting percentage. In 1999, Campbell was named to the USA Junior National Team.

Campbell was also a member of the AVCA All-East Region team following the 2000 season.

#### BY THE NUMBERS

Despite playing one of the toughest schedules in the ACC, including matches against two top-25 ranked teams (Notre Dame and Florida), FSU still managed to stay towards the top of the conference in hitting percentage for the 2000 season. FSU hit .249 for the season, just .012 behind ACC leader, Georgia Tech. A big part of the reason for the Seminoles' success at the net was Norisha Campbell. The Universal City, Texas native had a .351 hitting percentage to lead the 'Noles.

#### **ALL-ACC SELECTIONS**


Norisha Campbell, Jennifer Werrick and Jennifer Anderson ended the 2000 season by being named to the All-ACC Volleyball

team. Campbell earned first-team all-conference while Werrick was named to the second team as an outside hitter. Anderson was named to the all-conference freshman team as the setter. Campbell hit a record setting .351 for the season while Anderson collected 880 assists for the season. Both Anderson and Campbell earned ACC Player of the Week honors during the 2000 season.

#### WOMEN'S VOLLEBYALL TEAM WINS ATHLETIC DIRECTOR'S CUP FOR SERVICE AT THE GOLDEN NOLE AWARDS BANQUET

At the seventh-annual Golden Noles Award Banquet, hosted by the Florida State Department of Athletics' Student-Athlete Advisory Council, FSU Director of Athletics Dave Hart, Jr., proudly presented the Athletic Director's Cup for service to the Lady Seminole volleyball team that donated 636 hours of service to the community. The award is given annually to the team that performs the most community service hours.

All of the Seminole teams combined to serve nearly 3,800 hours of community service to more than 100 local schools and organizations. Rounding out the top five teams in community service hours were women's basketball (524 hours), soccer (505 hours), women's golf (171 hours) and men's tennis (162 hours). Norisha Campbell was the volleyball team's representative as the Golden Nole Award winner.

With FSU's 3-0 defeat of Charleston Southern, Dr. Cecile Reynaud wins her landmark 600th career coaching victory. Reynaud takes her place as one of only nine active coaches with 600 career wins, and is the only active ACC coach with 600 or more wins.

After opening the season 3-0, Florida State wins its fourth-straight match with a victory over Big Ten powerhouse, Illinois to take the Tallahassee Democrat Tournament crown. With four matches behind them, the Lady Seminoles have yet to lose a game.

After opening the season with five-straight wins at home, FSU stays unbeaten, extending its winning streak to seven with 3-0 and 3-2 wins over SEMS and UTEP, respectively, in the opening rounds of the Ball State Tournament. The 'Noles would later drop their first match of the season to Ball State in the championship match of the tourney. The season-opening winning streak was the

longest since the 1998 squad, which went on to a 25-win season and an ACC Championship.

In the Garnet and Gold's win over UTEP, senior Jennifer Werrick tallied 13 kills, reaching the 1,000 career-kill plateau with 1,002. Werrick ended her career at FSU with 1,298 kills, which ranks seventh all-time at FSU for career kills.

Norisha Campbell captures the Lady Seminoles' first ACC Athlete of the Week award of the 2000 season. Campbell earns the conference honor after hitting over .700 twice, in matches against Samford and Jacksonville, and leading the 'Noles to a 3-1 record during the week. She tallied 71 kills in the four matches.

FSU defeats Florida A&M for its 10th win of the season. The Tribe's only losses so far have come to 2000 NCAA qualifiers Ball State and Notre Dame.

After a weekend which included 82 assists and a .417 hitting percentage, freshman setter Jennifer Anderson earns ACC Freshman of the Week honors. Anderson helped the 'Noles to wins over Maryland and Virginia, while notching six kills and a .500 hitting percentage against the Terps.

FSU defeats eventual ACC Champion Georgia Tech in Atlanta, Ga., in front of 1,216 fans. The 3-1 win over the Yellow Jackets gives Florida State its 20th win of the season.

Florida State wins its 21st match of the season, after taking Clemson in four games in the 'Noles final regular-season match. The win marks the 20th time that Reynaud has led her team to 20 or more wins in a single season and the fifth time since joining the ACC in 1991.

Erica Bunch earns ACC Athlete of the Week honors following her performance in the Lady Seminoles' wins over Clemson and Georgia Tech when she totaled 36 kills and hit .352 over the weekend. Bunch's efforts helped the Seminoles take their final two matches of the regular season.

Dr. Cecile Reynaud is named Coach of the Year by the Atlantic Coast Conference. Jennifer Werrick concludes her career with second team All-ACC honors, while junior Norisha Campbell takes first-team honors. Jennifer Anderson is named to the ACC All-Freshman team.

Campbell is named to the AVCA All-East Region team following a season in which she tallied 447 kills and hit .351.


