Finally, the decisions and priorities of the Department should always focus on our student-athletes first, as individuals; second, as students; and third, as athletes.

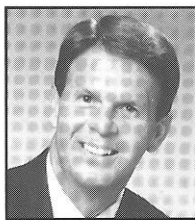

Todd Kress

Head Coach

Entering his first season at the helm of the Florida State University volleyball program, Todd Kress, one of the most talented young coaches in the nation, was hired to lead the Seminoles on February 14, 2002. Prior to his arrival in Tallahassee, Kress spent seven years coaching at Fairfield University and Northern Illinois University, where he led three teams to the NCAA Tournament and compiled a record of 152-75.

Before arriving to Florida State, Kress spent three years at Northern Illinois, where he led the Huskies to a 58-30 record. In his last season at Northern Illinois, Kress guided the Huskies to an overall record of 24-6, a 15-3 regular season record in the Mid-American Conference, the MAC tournament championship and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. In the 2001 season, Kress' Huskies won 21 of their final 23 matches and stormed through the MAC Tournament as they won all three matches by a score of 3-0. At the completion of the season, Kress was named the 2001 MAC Coach of the Year.

During his second year as the head coach of the Huskies, Kress guided Northern Illinois to a 24-9

mark. With a conference record of 12-6, Northern Illinois finished the 2000 season in third place in the MAC's Western Division. The 2000 season marked the 10th time in 13 seasons that the Huskies finished with 20 or more wins.

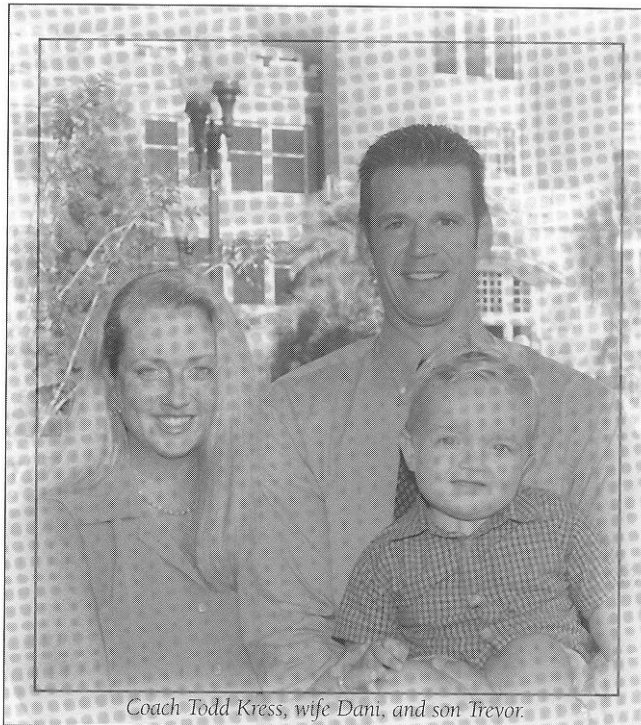
Kress faced much adversity in his first season as head coach at Northern Illinois. Key players were lost to injury, which weakened an already inexperienced squad. Although the season was challenging, Northern Illinois rallied to win five of its final eight matches and finished with an overall record of 10-15, including a record of 7-11 in the MAC.

In 1995, Kress began his collegiate head-coaching career when he accepted the position at

Fairfield. Before Kress' arrival at Fairfield, the Stags had not posted a winning season in seven years. During his four-year stint at the helm of the program, Kress boasted a record of 94-45 and became the school's winningest volleyball coach. In his final two years, he guided his team to a 60-12 record and two NCAA Tournament appearances.

In his final season at Fairfield in 1998, Kress led his team to the school's first ever national ranking,

a 35-2 record, which included a 27-game winning streak, a 14-0 mark at home and an impressive victory over national powerhouse Notre Dame. The Stags won their third straight regular-season MAAC championship and second consecutive tournament championship. With a winning percentage of 94.6, Fairfield was ranked third nationally in this category behind national champion Long Beach State and national runner-

up Penn State. Following the season, Kress was named AVCA/District II Coach of the Year and MAAC Coach of the Year.

Fairfield earned its second consecutive regular-season MAAC title in 1997 as Kress led the Stags to a record of 25-10 overall and 9-0 in the conference. After winning the conference tournament championship, Fairfield advanced to face Ohio State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Following the completion of the season, Kress earned the title of MAAC Co-Coach of the Year.

The 1996 season marked the first time in eight years that the Stags posted a winning record. After finishing his first season at Fairfield in 1995 with a record of 11-21, Kress was able to lead the Stags to a 23-12 record and the regular-season MAAC Championship in 1996. This became a standard at the university.

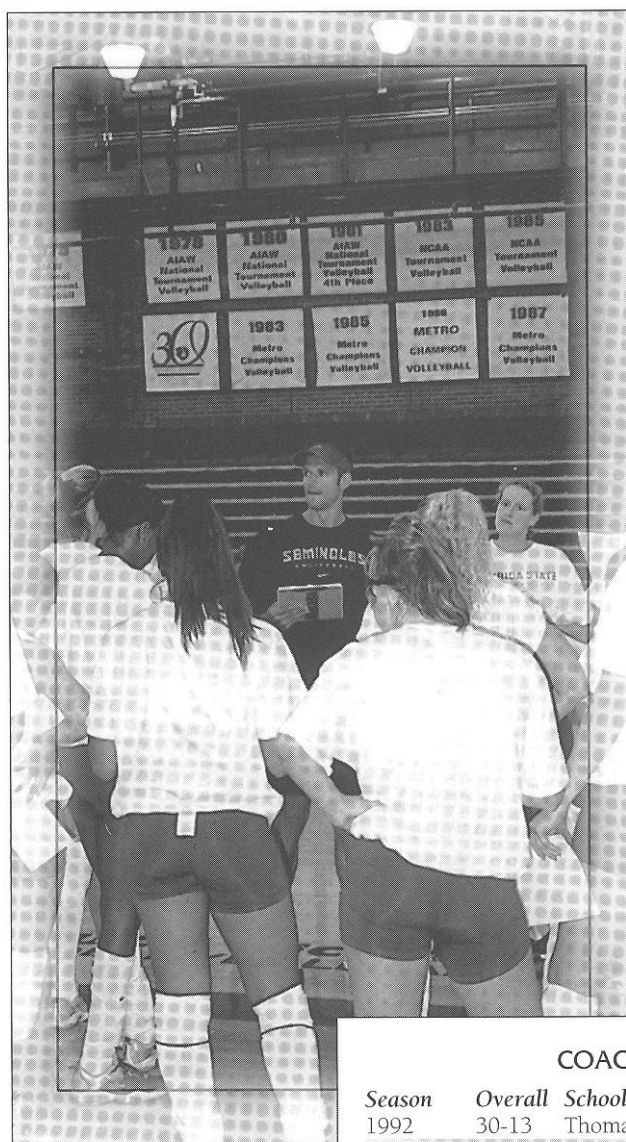
Kress served as an assistant at Saint Ursula Academy and Thomas More College prior to taking his first head coaching position at Fairfield. While at Saint Ursula Academy, Kress helped lead the squad to a 25-2 record, winning the 1994 Ohio Division II High School State Championship title. Kress was an assistant under Darrell McLean at Thomas More College during the 1992 and 1993 seasons. During those years, the Saints made back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Division III Tournament and earned two Association of Mideast Colleges

Conference trophies. In 1993, Kress also directed the men's club team at the University of Cincinnati, his alma mater.

It was at Cincinnati that Kress began his coaching career. While completing his undergraduate education, he was a four-year starter for the Bearcat's club squad and served as head coach for two Junior Olympic programs and as an assistant for the Seton High School junior varsity.

After earning an Associate of Arts degree in Communications from Edison State College in Ohio in June of 1988, Kress earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in broadcasting from Cincinnati in June of 1992.

Kress, a native of Piqua, Ohio, married the former Dani (DON-ee) Peterson in May of 1998. Also very passionate about volleyball, Dani was an assistant coach to Kress at Northern Illinois during the 2000-2001 season. On February 8, 2001, the couple's first child, Trevor, was born.

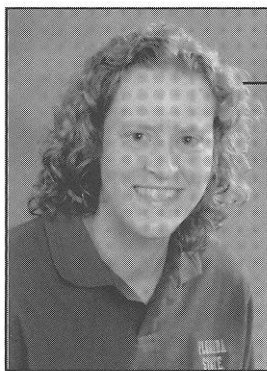

Assistant Coach

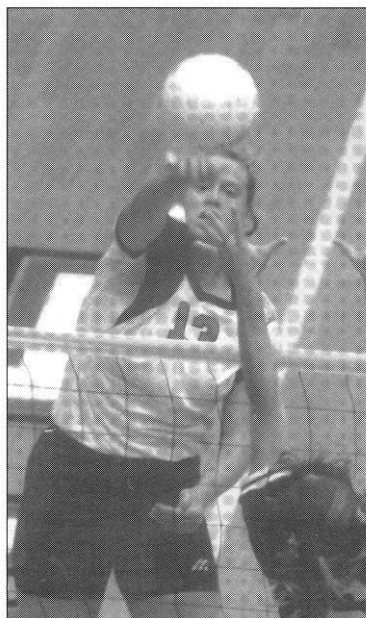
Kirstine Jensen, former Assistant coach at Ohio University, enters her first season as an assistant at Florida State University. Jensen spent approximately two years as an assistant at Ohio before accepting the position under head coach

Todd Kress in April of 2002. As an assistant coach, Jensen is involved with recruiting for the Seminoles and the coordination of travel plans.

In the summer of 2000, Jensen began coaching at Ohio when Mike Lessinger was promoted from assistant to head coach. As an assistant at Ohio, Jensen's responsibilities included practice supervision, player development and game preparation.

Before accepting the position as an assistant coach under Lessinger at Ohio, Jensen spent two years as a volunteer assistant at Northern Illinois University. In May of 1999, Kress was hired as the next head coach at NIU. Jensen remained at Northern Illinois and served as a volunteer assistant under Kress. While coaching at Northern Illinois, Jensen also coached the USAV's Club Fusion squad, a club team, in Huntley, Illinois.

Jensen, a native of Aurora, Ill., graduated magna cum laude from Ohio State University in 1997 with a bachelor's degree in speech and hearing science. While at Ohio State, she was a four-year scholar athlete for the Buckeyes and helped her team advance to the Final Four as a junior. Jensen plans to complete her master's degree in athletic administration from Ohio University.

Assistant Coach

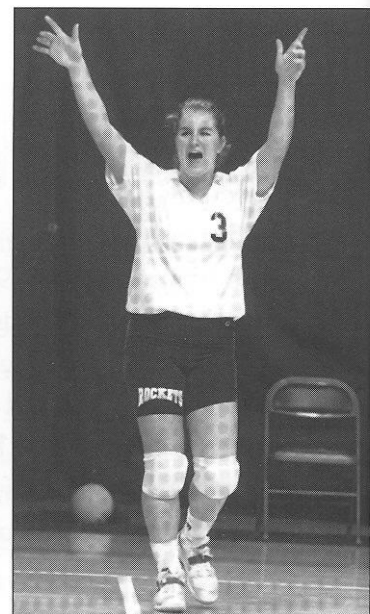
Jenny Fette, who served as an assistant coach for two seasons under Todd Kress at Northern Illinois University, is in her first season as an assistant with the Seminole volleyball program. In February of 2002, Fette joined Kress when he accepted the

position as Florida State's head volleyball coach. At Florida State, Fette's primary responsibility will be setter training. She will also be the coordinator of the Todd Kress Florida State Volleyball Camp.

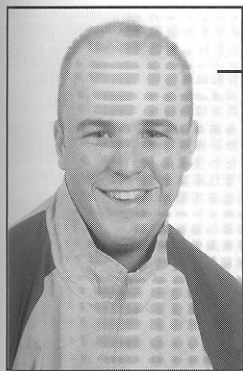
During her two years at Northern Illinois, Fette was responsible for running individual setter training sessions, scouting opponents, running drills and evaluating performances in practice and charting the offense during matches. She was the recruiting coordinator for the Huskies, and assisted in the Northern Illinois Volleyball Camps.

Before working at the collegiate level, Fette gained experience coaching at the club level. Between February and May of 2000, Fette coached Sports Express, a 15-year old junior club team in Cincinnati, Ohio. She coached the Glass City Volleyball Company, a 17-year-old junior club team in Toledo, Ohio, between the months of January of 1998 and July of 1999. While completing her education at the University of Toledo, Fette assisted in the University of Toledo Volleyball Camps.

In December of 1998, Fette earned her bachelor's degree in biology at the University of Toledo where she also lettered in volleyball from 1994-97.

Martha Hamilton

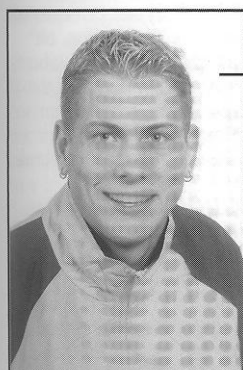
Team Manager

serving as host for visiting teams, video taping matches and traveling to away matches.

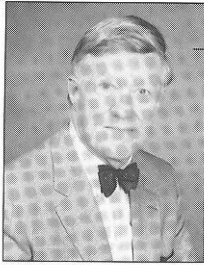

Talbot "Sandy" D'Alemberte

President, The Florida State University

Talbot D'Alemberte was appointed president of The Florida State University on November 29, 1993, by the Florida Board of Regents, and took office on January 3, 1994. D'Alemberte served as the fourth dean of the FSU College of Law from 1984 to 1989 and continues to teach as a member of the University faculty.

President D'Alemberte is an active member of many legal and higher educational committees and boards, including numerous American Bar Association committees, state and regional bar associations, the American College of Trial Lawyers, the Lawyers' Committee on Civil Rights Under Law, the NAACP Legal Defense and Education Fund, the Florida Council of 100, the Business-Higher Education Forum, the Campus Compact Board, the First Amendment Center Board at Vanderbilt University, the Southeastern Universities Research Association Board, the National Association of State Universities and Land Grant Colleges Board, the Mildred and Claude Pepper Foundation Board, and several FSU committees and boards including the FSU Foundation, the FSU Alumni Association, the Collins Center for Public Policy, the Caribbean Law Institute, and the Seminole Boosters, Inc.

D'Alemberte was the 1991-1992 president of the American Bar Association and the 1982-1984 president of the American Judicature Society. He represented Dade County in the Florida House of Representatives from 1966 to 1972 and chaired several legislative committees. After leaving the Florida Legislature he chaired the Florida Constitution Revision Commission in 1977-1978 and the Florida Commission on Ethics in 1974-1975.

D'Alemberte practiced law with the Steel Hector & Davis law firm in Miami and Tallahassee where he first began his legal career in 1962 and was named partner in 1965.

D'Alemberte's book, *The Florida Constitution*, was published by Greenwood Press in 1991. He co-edited the 1990 four-volume work, *The Florida Civil Trial Guide*, and has authored over twenty published articles.

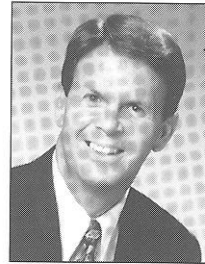
The numerous awards D'Alemberte has won include the 1998 ABA Section of Legal Education Robert J. Kutak Award, the 1998 ABA World Order Under Law Award, 1996 American Judicature Society's Justice Award, the 1996 National Council of Jewish Women's Hannah G. Soloman Award, the 1993 Academy of Florida

Trial Lawyers "Perry Nichols" Award, the 1993 Florida Academy of Criminal Defense Lawyers Annual Criminal Justice Award, the 1990 Jurisprudence Award from the Anti-defamation League of South Florida, the 1987 Florida Bar Foundation Medal of Honor, the 1986 National Sigma Delta Chi First Amendment Award, an American Academy of Television Arts and Sciences "Emmy" in 1985 for his work in open government, particularly in the opening of court proceedings to electronic journalists, and the 1984 Florida Civil Liberties Union "Nelson Poynter" Award.

D'Alemberte holds honorary degrees from Cleveland State University, Hofstra University, Nova Southeastern University, Stetson University, the Universities of the South (Sewanee), of Bridgeport, of Denver, the University of the West Indies, and the Open University of Great Britain.



Dave Hart, Jr.

Director of Athletics

Dave Hart, Jr., became Florida State's 10th athletics director after a national search selected the former East Carolina athletics director in February 1995. Hart has gained national recognition for his skills in the areas of athletics management, public relations, student-athlete welfare, marketing and fund-raising. He brought to Florida State an outstanding reputation as one of the country's most respected athletics directors. Prior to being named athletics director at FSU, Hart was the architect of significant growth in East Carolina's athletics program from 1987-1995. Under his leadership, ECU dramatically enhanced its reputation and image while demonstrating marked strides in fund-raising and facilities as well as funding for women's athletics.

Hart has served on several prestigious committees at conference and national levels during his career in athletics administration. He has been a member of the NCAA Council, the NCAA Honors and Awards Committee and the NCAA Special Events and Post season Bowls Committee as well as a consultant to the NCAA Student-Athlete Advisory Council. Hart has held positions of considerable influence within conference and national circles. He has served as President of both the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics and the Division I-A Athletics Directors Association. He currently is a member of NCAA Footballs Board of Directors where he serves with commissioners of Division I-A conferences and the NCAA president. In addition to serving in prominent leadership roles nationally, Hart chaired the Atlantic Coast Conference

Television Committee where he played an integral role in the renegotiations of the ACC's football and basketball television contracts, considered to be the nations best. He has served as Chair of the ACC Men's Basketball Committee as well as the Football Committee.

Three years ago, Hart was honored by his peers in athletics administration when he was awarded the distinction of Athletics Director of the Year in the Southeast Region at the annual NACDA Convention.

A popular speaker at the national level and the author of a number of articles for national publications, Hart has made numerous speaking presentations to conventions and presented seminars on such topics as program management, student-athlete welfare, marketing, fund-raising and personnel transition. For the past thirteen years, he has been an instructor at the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics' Management Institute.

Just the 10th athletics director in FSU history, Hart begins his eighth year as Florida States Athletics Director where he oversees the Seminoles 40 million dollar athletics budget. Since his arrival at Florida State, Hart has negotiated unprecedented multi-million dollar contracts for the department totaling more than 35 million dollars, guided the development of an extensive and comprehensive athletics facilities master plan, initiated a multi-faceted Student

Development/Life Skills program for all student-athletes at FSU, which was recognized nationally with a "Program of Excellence" award, and spearheaded the rewriting of the department's mission statement to put the student-athlete at the core of everything the athletics department does in its goal to build comprehensive excellence throughout the many facets of the department.

He has taken a leadership role in the athletics department's first major Capital Campaign, in concert with Seminole Boosters, to raise 70 million dollars for athletics facilities and endowed athletics scholarships for all sports at Florida State. The new state-of-the-art Golf Facility and Teaching Center became a reality recently as the latest piece of the facilities master plan to be put in place.

Hart has restructured the athletics department including major hires within coaching and administrative components of the department. Under his guidance, Florida State's Compliance and Academic Support programs have made continued strides and are now considered model programs within intercollegiate athletics. Exposure for all Seminole Athletics has escalated tremendously since Hart's arrival at FSU through the negotiation of television contracts with Sunshine Network as well as ACC contracts with regional sports carriers and ABC and ESPN.

Since Hart's arrival, FSU has formed a Varsity Club to encourage the participation of former student-athletes in current athletics department activities and a new focus has been placed on the growth of women's athletics at FSU. That commitment is reflected in the increased allocation of funding and facility improvements, such as the Soccer/Softball Complex, during Hart's tenure. Also during Hart's tenure, FSU has become home to the inaugural National Student-Athlete of the Year (Daryl Bush) as well as the NCAA's State of Florida Woman of the Year (Casey Jo Custer). A record number of FSU student-athletes have made the ACC Academic Honor Roll and been recipients of NCAA post-graduate scholarship awards during the past seven years. Student-athlete's community service involvement has also become a priority since Hart's arrival. Student-athletes at FSU contributed over 3,800 hours this past year to community outreach projects with the women's golf team winning the Athletics Directors' Cup for community service.

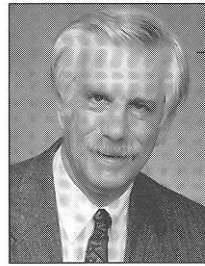
Football and baseball continue to flourish nationally during Hart's tenure as athletics director as evidenced with both the football and baseball programs competing for national championships. The commitment to build men's and women's basketball into a conference and national contender is very tangible. A 20 million-dollar renovation to the Leon County Civic Center is now complete and a new 9 million-dollar practice facility is to be fully operational this fall.

"We've been so fortunate to have Dave leading the university's athletic programs," said President Sandy D'Alemberte. "We hired him because of his record in building successful programs, his commitment to gender equity, his innovative approach to shaping the student behind the athlete, and the stability he offered. He proved us right and has certainly lifted Florida State athletics to a new level."

A 1971 graduate of Alabama, Hart played basketball for the Crimson Tide and earned a master's degree in 1972 while serving as a graduate assistant basketball coach. He coached and taught at the high school level before joining the East Carolina athletics program in 1983.

Hart met his wife, the former Pam Humble, while at Alabama and they have three children Rick, Jamie and Kelly.

Charles W. Ehrhardt

Athletics Board Chair

As Chair of the FSU Athletics Board, Professor of Law Charles Ehrhardt is an important link for Florida State with the National Collegiate Athletic Association and Atlantic Coast Conference.

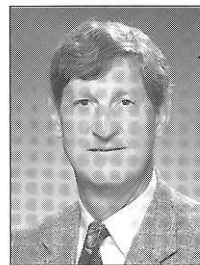
He has served as President of the ACC and as a member of the NCAA's Eligibility Committee. For the last several years he has served as chair of the ACC Sportsmanship Committee. Earlier during his tenure as the athletics board chair, he was elected president of the NCAA's Faculty Athletic Representative Association, was a member of the NCAA President's Commission Liaison Committee and the Special Committee to Study the NCAA Enforcement and Infractions Process. He twice served as president of the Metro Conference. As a Commissioner to the National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws, Ehrhardt is involved in drafting legislation for a uniform state law regulating the activities of sports agents.

A highly-respected expert in the field of evidence, Ehrhardt is the Ladd Professor of Evidence in the Florida State University College of Law, where he has taught for over 30 years. He wrote the Florida Evidence Code, passed by the Florida Legislature, which regulates the admissibility of evidence during court trials. Ehrhardt has written books on evidence and trial objections, which are frequently cited and relied upon by courts.

Ehrhardt is in demand as a lecturer and speaker. He works with lawyers and judges nationwide as a consultant on evidence matters. He currently teaches in the areas of torts, evidence, trial advocacy and sports law. He has been honored as the FSU College of Law outstanding professor in six different years. He was the recipient of a University Teaching Award in 1989 and the Professorial Excellence Award in 1997.

A native of Elkader, Iowa, Ehrhardt received a bachelor's degree from Iowa State University. He went on to the University of Iowa, where he earned his law degree in 1964. Before coming to Tallahassee, he was an Assistant United States Attorney.

Ehrhardt and his wife, the former Judy Sutton, have three children.

Senior Associate Athletics Director

Charlie Carr enters his eighth year as senior associate athletics director at Florida State in 2002. FSU athletics director Dave Hart named his longtime associate shortly after he accepted the job in 1995.

Prior to coming to FSU, Carr served under Hart as an associate athletics director at East Carolina University for four years and was executive director of ECU's educational foundation from 1988 until his elevation to associate AD.

He also serves on the NCAA's Baseball Committee.

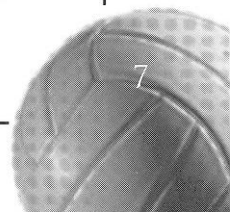
Carr also is charged with overseeing departmental personnel in addition to the administration of the Seminole baseball, cross country, golf, track and volleyball programs.

Carr and his wife, Dee, have one daughter Caitlin (18).



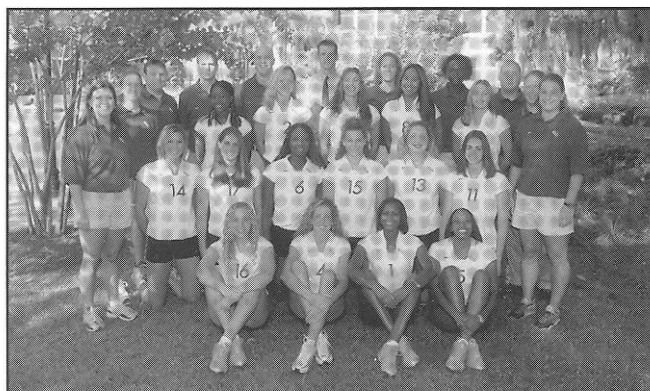
