

The Florida State volleyball team, under the guidance of first year head coach Todd Kress, finished the 2002 season on a high note as it advanced to the championship match of the ACC Tournament and returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1998. The Seminoles' 2002 campaign came to an end on December 6th in the first round of the NCAA Tournament as the Tribe finished the season with an overall record of 21-13 and an ACC record of 10-6. Florida State thrived on its home court, finishing the season with a record of 12-2 at Tully Gymnasium. After starting the season 0-2, the Seminoles bounced back to win eight of their next 10 matches. Highlights of the season included wins against powerhouses LSU, Duke and North Carolina.

Carolina Blues

Florida State caused teams from the Tar Heel state to have the blues during the 2002 season. The Seminoles had a combined record of 7-2 against teams from the state of North Carolina. Against Duke, the Tribe split matches, winning 3-1 in Tallahassee, before falling to the Blue Devils 3-0 in Durham. Florida State enjoyed the most success against Wake Forest and NC State. The Seminoles swept



the Demon Deacons by a score of 3-1 in both meetings and swept the Wolfpack 3-0 at home and in Raleigh. The Florida State squad accomplished a difficult task, as it became the only team outside of the top 15 to knock off nationally ranked North Carolina. The Seminoles were victorious in two of three matches against the Tar Heels. The first win for the Tribe came at home in Tully Gymnasium, when Florida State had to come from being down 2-0 to win the match 3-2. The Tar Heels then split the regular-season series as they defeated the Seminoles 3-0 in Chapel Hill. In the ACC Tournament, the Tribe got revenge as they shut down the North Carolina attack and defeated the Tar Heels 3-0 to advance to the ACC Championship match.

National Rankings

The Seminoles received national recognition for their accomplishments as Florida State finished the 2002 season with a ranking of fourth in the NCAA East Region. The Tribe faced six of the 10 teams ranked in the regional poll. Those teams were ACC foes North Carolina (1), Georgia Tech (2), Duke (3), Clemson (5), Maryland (7) and cross-town rival Florida A&M (9). The Seminoles defeated five of these teams in head-to-head competition.

There's No Place Like Home

After getting off to a sluggish start on the road, the Seminoles returned to the friendly confines of Tully Gymnasium and realized that there is no place like home. Over the years Tully Gym has been kind to the Florida State volleyball program as the Tribe has an all-time home record of 277-94 (.747). The 2002 season was no different as the Seminoles finished the regular season with a 12-2 home record.

Frye Named to All-ACC Team

Florida State's senior opposite Kristin Frye was named to the All-ACC first team following a season of hard work and tremendous efforts. As a captain on the Florida State squad, Frye was looked to as a leader throughout the 2002 season. Due to her leadership ability on the court, Frye earned the prestigious honor.

Frye led the Seminoles in kills and hitting percentage. With 469 kills, Frye finished the season ranked seventh in the ACC. Frye also ranked sixth in among ACC players in hitting percentage as she hit .297 on the year.

Aisha Carr Earns ACC Player of the Week Honors

Florida State's sophomore sensation Aisha Carr earned ACC Volleyball Player of the week honors after leading the Seminoles to victory against NC State and 11th-ranked North Carolina. The middle hitter averaged a hitting percentage of .600 over the two-match span. With 29

total kills against the conference opponents, Carr averaged 4.14 kills per game. Carr had 12 kills on 17 attacks with just one error for a career-high hitting percentage of .647 against NC State. The Dallas, Texas native also notched 17 kills on 30 attacks with only one error, as she hit .533 against nationally-ranked North Carolina. Carr was a force at the net during the two crucial home matches, as she had nine blocks, averaging 1.29 blocks per game.

Seminoles Serving Up Aces

Senior outside hitter Alex Sevillano kept opponents on their toes during the 2002 season as she recorded a team-high 59 service aces. Teammate Kristin Frye put a few down for the Seminoles as well, as she tallied 20 services aces during the season. Sevillano passed Maggie Philgence to take sole possession of seventh place among Florida State's all-time ace leaders, as she tallied two service aces against North Carolina October 27th. Sevillano had 127 service aces during he career at Florida State. Frye claimed the 10th-place spot in the record books as she recorded 20 aces in 2002 and finished her career with a total of 115.

Setting up the Competition

Junior setter Jennifer Anderson has made her mark on the record books in her three seasons at Florida State. Anderson moved into second place in career assists with 4,015. In 2002, Anderson finished ranked first in the ACC in assists as she recorded a team-high 1,734. The mark was also good for a second place finish in Florida State's all-time individual season records.
