JENNIFER ANDERSON BECOMES FSU'S ALL-TIME ASSISTS LEADER

Senior setter Jennifer Anderson became Florida State's all-time leader in career assists with her third assist in game one against Virginia (11/16), which also happened to be Senior Day. In 2002, Anderson finished first in the ACC in assists with 1,734. Her career total is currently 4,907 as she has passed Nancy Gaspadarek's (1986-89) career mark of 4,804. SUCCESS IN SEASON OPENERS

Since 1986, Florida State is 17-1 in season openers. The only loss in that period was in 2002 when the Seminoles fell at Illinois State 0-3. FSU swept Florida Atlantic 3-0 (30-21, 30-23, 30-21) in this year's season opener in the FSU Invitational. The last time the two schools met in the season opener was in 1996 when the Seminoles swept two matches from the Owls 3-0.

UC IRVINE SNAPS SEMINOLES' STREAK

In 2003, the Seminoles hadn't lost a match after winning game one nor had they lost a game after being the first to score 24 in that game. Against UC Irvine (9/13), both of those streaks came to an end. The Anteaters defeated Florida State in five games 3-2 (30-28, 27-30, 27-30, 30-24, 7-15) after the Seminoles took game one 30-28. Florida State also took a 24-15 lead in game three of that match only to fall 27-30, the first time the Seminoles were defeated after being the first to score 24 in a game during the 2003 season.

TODD KRESS - SETTING THE STAGE FOR SUCCESS

In his first season, Kress took the Seminoles to the NCAA tournament for the first time since 1998, finished with a 21-13 overall record and advanced to the championship match of the ACC tournament. Kress has had six 20+ win seasons in nine years as a head coach including a 35-2 mark at Fairfield University in 1998. AISHA CARR - ALL TOURNAMENT TEAM

Head coach Todd Kress was hoping Aisha Carr would have a breakout junior season and in 2003 she did just that. In three of the four preseason tournaments , Carr was named to the All-Tournament team in each one (UC Irvine Sunset Classic only one not named). Carr provides a strong presence at the net for the Seminoles both offensively and defensively. She finished the season with 126 blocks and a hitting percentage of .282.

FRESHMEN IMPACT

Coming into the 2003 season the Florida State volleyball team knew that the incoming freshman class would have to provide an immediate impact. Four freshmen (Nikki Anthony, Sarah Griffin, Cassie McLaughlin and Jessica Skower) started matches for the Seminoles in 2003. On top of that, three transfers (Lindsay Curtiss, Renee Hill and Amanda Santos) have made an immediate impact for FSU. Freshman Cassie McLaughlin recorded her first career and the team's only triple-double of the year against Arkansas State (9/5). She also had six double-doubles on the season. Santos led the team in blocks despite missing five matches due to a fractured finger, but returned to the court against Clemson (10/17). McLaughlin earned the ACC and East Region's Freshman of the Year honors.

JACKSONVILLE HEAD COACH COURTNEY DIPERT RETURNS TO FLORIDA STATE

Courtney Dipert, a 2001 graduate of Florida State, returns to FSU in her first season as head coach of the JU Dolphins. She was an assistant coach for the Seminoles in 2001 before taking an assistant position at Duke University in 2002. Dipert assisted in the day-to-day operations of the program and served as the director of the summer camps while at FSU. The Seminoles defeated the Dolphins 3-0 (30-12, 30-28, 30-12) in the opening match of the 2003 FSU Classic.

AMANDA FROM THE BLOCK

Junior middle blocker Amanda Santos made a name for herself as a dominant blocker for the Seminoles in 2003. In just her first season at Florida State, the junior transfer led FSU in blocks in 15 matches during the year. Santos recorded a season-high 13 blocks against Maryland (11/14) surpassing her previous season high of 11 against in-state rival Miami (9/19) earlier this year. Amanda led the team in total blocks (137) and was third in the ACC with a 1.32 blocks per game average. Santos missed five matches due to a fractured little finger on her right hand before returning against Clemson on October 17th. The Seminoles finished third in the ACC while averaging 2.62 blocks per game.

SWEEPING AWAY THE CAROLINAS

From October 29 to November I the Seminoles won three straight matches over South Florida, North Carolina and NC State. The back-to-back wins over UNC and NC State was the first time in 2003 FSU had won two consecutive conference matches. All three wins came in the form of a sweep which marked the first time since 2001 that Florida State swept three straight opponents. In 2001, the Seminoles swept North Carolina, NC State and Wake Forest late in the season as they finished the season winning five of their last six matches.

CASSIE MCLAUGHLIN NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK (NOV. 3)

After she helped lead Florida State to three straight sweep wins over South Florida, North Carolina and NC State, Cassie McLaughlin earned ACC Player of the Week honors. For the week, the freshman outside hitter hit a combined .387 in the three matches connecting on 34 kills in 62 opportunities and committing only ten errors. This marks the first time this season a Seminole has received the weekly award and first in McLaughlin's career. The last time an FSU player was named ACC Player of the Week was on October 29, 2002 when Aisha Carr earned recognition for her play against NC State and North Carolina.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

The Seminoles played three teams during the 2003 season that were ranked in the Top 10 of the USA Today/AVCA Coaches Poll, including three matches with conference foe Georgia Tech who finished ranked No. 8. Pepperdine finished ranked No. 6 and Kansas State No. 11 in the final poll. Despite losing to all three teams, playing the best teams in the country is sure to prepare this young Seminole team for the future.

CASSIE MCLAUGHLIN - ACC & EAST REGION FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

Florida State's Cassie McLaughlin was named ACC Freshman of the Year on Thursday, November 20. McLaughlin becomes just the second player from FSU to earn this recognition since joining the ACC in 1992 (Kate Hemlepp, 1997). She leads the Seminoles in kills (349), total attacks (848) and was fourth in the ACC in service aces (43). McLaughlin was also second on the team with a 2.96 kills per game average and 2.24 digs per game average.




