In the summer of 2004, Seminole Productions moved to a new 6,000 square foot communication center in the new Coyle Moore Athletics Center. This state-of-the-art facility includes a brand new studio, two control rooms, 10 Avid digital editing and graphics suites, private offices, a green room, a new computer editing and graphics classroom, a student producer area and much more. There are also fiber optic video camera connections to all areas of the Coyle Moore Athletics Center, Doak Campbell Stadium, Donald L. Tucker Civic Center, FSU Basketball Training Center and Dick Howser Stadium with connections to WFSU-TV's uplink. This has created the ability to do live, multi-camera productions or uplink feeds. With a simple camera connection, Seminole Productions can send the signal through fiber to WFSU's satellite uplink and bang, Coach Bowden's wit and charm is instantly seen all over the

FSU athletics aren't the only ones reaping the benefits of this new state-of-the-art communication center. Students in the College of Communication media production program also have plenty of hands-on access to some of the finest equipment around. Since Seminole Productions' mission is one of teaching, students studying in the art of television design, production and performance work alongside the SP staff gaining real experience with real deadlines in a professional environment while gaining class credit as well as professional experience. This new facility also ensures that FSU continues to attract the best and brightest students of media production from all across the globe.

Seminole Productions continually gets recognized for excellence. The staff once again raised the bar in the field of visual communications by gathering eight more awards in two national video competitions in 2005-06. With these latest recognitions, Seminole Productions staff members continue an almost unheard of streak of national recognitions with over 30 since 2003.

The most recent recognitions come from two of the most respected competitions in the industry, the Aurora and Telly Awards. These international competitions are designed to recognize excellence in the film and video industries on an international level. Entries have come from across the US and abroad including Canada, Hong Kong, Denmark, Mexico, and more.

The Aurora Awards competition recognized Seminole Productions staff for their Seminole Pride video presentation, the 2005 Gameday Football Headshots, and the Environmental Results program produced for the Florida Department of Environmental Protection. Staff members recognized with Aurora Awards include Jim Garbarino, Jerry Tootle, Chris Hahn, and Jim Shaw. The Aurora statue itself was commissioned specifically for the competition by a nationally renowned sculptor. The statues are cast in the same foundry that creates the Emmy, Oscar and Clio statues.


Earlier this year in competition against universities across North America, Seminole Productions took home the Golden Matrix Award (GMA) for having the Best Overall Video Display for Universities. The Golden Matrix Award means that the content appearing on the Seminole Vision screens at all FSU home football, baseball, and basketball games, was judged to be the best in the nation for Universities. The Golden Matrix Awards are voted on by In-Game Entertainment and Video Display professionals across North America and includes league members from the NFL, MLB, NHL, NBA, and Universities as well as representatives from Stadiums and Arenas. Finalists for the GMA award for universities included The University of Nebraska, Ohio State University, University of Illinois, Texas A&M, Purdue and Baylor.

With an experienced, award-winning staff and creative and talented students, Seminole Productions is looked at as a leader in sports production, graphics and corporate video. Creating the perfect blend of high-tech wizardry with good ole' Seminole sports action is a big part of what Seminole Productions is all about.

Since 1988, Sun Sports Network, previously known as Sunshine Sports, has been the exclusive regional sports network home of FSU athletics in Florida. Available in over 6.4 million homes statewide via cable and satellite, Sun Sports Network provides more coverage of FSU athletics than any other Florida television outlet. FSU was the first local sports team to sign an agreement with Sun Sports prior to the network's 1988 launch and is one of its cornerstone properties.

THE VOICE OF THE SEMINOLES

Play-by-play man Ryan Pensy returns for his third season with the Seminoles in 2006 and will provide all the action. Pensy is a 2002 graduate of the University of Central Florida where he earned a degree in radio/TV with a minor in computer science. He went on to receive his master's degree in sport administration from Florida State in 2003 during which time he served as a graduate assistant in the Seminole ticket and business offices. In 2003, Pensy became a full-time member of the Florida State athletics staff as an Information Technology Manager. Some of his duties at FSU include technical support for the department, website maintenance and editor of the Seminole Dispatch, FSU athletics weekly online newsletter. Pensy is also the Seminole women's basketball broadcaster and the producer for the Seminole



Sun Sports Network's extensive coverage of FSU sports is available to fans not just in Florida, but across the U.S., enabling alumni from coast-to-coast to follow their team year-round. In addition to distribution on cable and satellite in Florida, Sun Sports Network is also available nationwide on satellite, from DirecTV and DISH Network. Much of Sun Sports' FSU programming is also available to digital cable subscribers nationwide via Fox Sports Digital Nets, a programming service offered to cable systems throughout the U.S.

Each year, Sun Sports Network airs and produces numerous FSU games/programs, including its own production of every FSU regular season football game, which replay statewide on Sun Sports on Sunday evenings during "Prime Time Noles". "The Bobby Bowden Show" can be seen statewide Sundays at

12:30pm. Weekly highlights of FSU athletics air Saturdays with "Seminole Sports Magazine" and "Seminole Uprising", all on Sun Sports Network. In addition, the 'Noles are discussed on Sun Sports' popular "SportsTalk Live" show featuring media panelists from around the state each Monday night.

An agreement with the ACC provides Sunshine Network with additional FSU games and events, including the conference's Sun Sports night ACC basketball package, "ACC Sunday Night Hoops" on regional sports networks nationwide (exclusively on Sun Sports in Florida). The network also airs "ACC Live!," Mondays at 6:30 p.m. and numerous other games/events for the ACC, giving FSU fans coverage of not only their home team, but FSU's conference opponents as well.
