SEMINOLES FINISH STRONG IN 2005

Through the first three weeks of the season, it appeared that the 2005 campaign was going to be a long one for the Florida State volleyball team. However, the Seminoles rallied during the last half of the season to move up to fifth in the Atlantic Coast Conference and set the tone for 2006.

Two key injuries severely hampered Florida State in the early part of the season as middle blocker/opposite Andreza Santos missed a pair of matches early and middle blocker Lauren Scott was out for four matches. With those two key components absent from the starting line-up, head coach Todd Kress was forced to put together make-shift line-ups.

Even though the Seminoles were not firing on all cylinders, they still competed with great effort, dropping a tough four-game match to South Carolina before losing a heartbreaking five-game bout to Pittsburgh in the Florida State Invitational. Another five-setter went against the Seminoles as they fell to Houston at the Varney's Kansas State Invitational. Those three matches alone could have dramatically changed the landscape of Florida State's season.

As if Florida State didn't have enough to overcome early in the year, the schedule was one of the hardest in recent memory. Of Florida State's eight non-conference opponents, seven came from the Big Ten, SEC, Big 12, Big East or Conference USA and half the teams qualified for the NCAA Tournament the year before. At the Kansas State Invitational the Seminoles had to face the 24th-ranked host Wildcats along with fifth-ranked Minnesota who was coming off back-to-back Final Four appearances. Also in the mix was in-state rival Florida, who the Seminoles fought hard against, but still could not come up with that elusive victory.

Moral victories will only get you so far, but there were glimpses of things to during the first part of the Seminoles' ACC schedule. Despite starting the league slate 1-4, Florida State went five games with Georgia Tech and Clemson before dropping a tough four-set contest at North Carolina. After 3-0 victories over NC State and Virginia Tech, the darkest before the dawn moment came on Tobacco Road as FSU dropped back-to-back 3-0 matches to Duke and Wake Forest.


2005 TOURNAMENT HONORS

FSU Invitational All-Tournament Team Kristen Rust

Varney's Kansas State Invitational All-Tournament Team Andreza Santos

With their backs against the wall, something changed for the Seminoles during that last week in October. With a rare week off between matches, Florida State dug in its heels and decided that start of 2006 season really began on October 28. For the first time all season, the newlook Seminoles did not falter at the end as they won their first five-game match against Boston College.

A loss to Maryland was one of FSU's hardest-fought matches of the year, but instead of dampening their spirits, it fired the Seminoles up as the came back to win 3-1 at Clemson and 3-0 Georgia Tech. It was first win over the Yellow Jackets since 2001, the first win at Tech since 2000 and the first sweep of Ramblin Wreck since 1998.

Another setback, this time at Virginia, propelled Florida State again as it ran off four-straight victories. Further proof of FSU's new attitude came in a five-set triumph at Miami – where Florida State had never won – and another five-set victory against North Carolina where the Seminoles had to rally from down 2-0. FSU fought to the end against Duke, but dropped a tough five-setter to the Blue Devils, but ended the season on a high note by returning the favor against Wake Forest by sweeping the Demon Deacons.

Sitting at 3-7 in the conference after the loss to Wake Forest on October 21, few would have guessed the Seminoles would climb all the way back to .500 with an even 11-11 ACC record at season's end. While FSU didn't get its overall mark back to .500 at 13-17, Florida State was one of the hottest teams at the end of the season as its 7-3 mark in the last ten matches was the third-best in the league.

ANOTHER SANTOS ANOTHER ALL-AMERICA HONOR

In 2004, Andreza Santos' sister Amanda collected the first America Volleyball Coaches' Association (AVCA) All-America award in school history. In 2005 it was the younger Santos' turn to take home the honor as she earned Honorable Mention All-America accolades. The team leader in kills, kills per game, points, points per game and attacking percentage, it was the third honor of the year for Santos. She picked up her first piece of hardware with a First-Team All-ACC honor, which was foreshadowed by a spot on the Preseason All-ACC team. The middle blocker/opposite put the wheels in motion for the All-America award by garnering AVCA All-Region honors, the 27th award bestowed upon a Florida State player. Santos had three matches with 20 or more kills, including a career-best 21 at Virginia, while her 19 kills against Houston solidified her spot on the All-Tournament Team at the Kansas State Invitational.

WEISSING CAN DIG IT

Apart from wearing a different colored jersey and having an Italian name that no one can agree on the pronunciations of, the libero position doesn't get a whole lot of recognition. But Summer Weissing isn't your ordinary libero. As a freshman she broke into the Florida State single-season top ten with the most digs since 1997. She followed that up with the best digging effort in school history as she surpassed Luiza Ramos' record of 507 digs that had stood since 1994. The sophomore used 20 digs against Duke on November 23 to set the new school mark of 513 digs. The Boca Raton, Fla., native has 912 digs for her career and is on pace to break Ramos' career record of 1,771 digs.

RUST CROSSES 1,000 KILLS

Certain numbers just stand out and 1,000 is one of them. Senior outside hitter Kristen Rust became the latest member of the Florida State 1,000-kill club with 12 kills against Miami on November 15. Todd Kress' very first recruit at Florida State, Rust had one of the best all-around careers in recent memory, ending her Seminole tenure with 1,038 kills, 762 digs and 83 service aces while playing in 100 matches. Rust tied Andreza Santos for the individual match high with her 21 kills against Houston and her 19 winners versus Pittsburgh helped her get on the FSU Invitational All-Tournament team.

SKOWER CONTINUES ASSIST ASCENSION

When she came in as a freshman, setter Jessica Skower had one of the best teachers as she played behind the school's all-time assist leader Jennifer Anderson. Since then, Skower has been asserting herself as one of the top setters in Seminoles lore. After breaking into the school's all-time top 10 as a sophomore, the Naples, Fla., native moved up four spots to number four with 2,906 career assists after a team-best 954 in 2005. Skower needs just 74 more assists to climb past Fiona Bolten for third in Florida State history.

THOMPSON MAKES AN IMMEDIATE IMPACT

Giving the Seminoles an infusion of new blood during the 2005 campaign was sophomore transfer Makini Thompson. The outside hitter joined Florida State after one season at Long Beach State where she helped the 49ers reach the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The Quincy, Mass., native was the only player on the squad to rank in the top three of kills (third – 295), blocks (third – 75) and points (third – 345.0). Thompson had FSU's best three-game and four-game matches with 20 kills against Wake Forest (three games) and Clemson (four games). She tied Lauren Scott for the best blocking performance in 2005 as she had nine stuffs against Houston.

SEMINOLES SHARE THE WEALTH WITH TEAM AWARDS

The total team effort that exemplified the 2005 season was rewarded at the annual team banquet as four different players took home the four team awards. Earning just the school's second All-America honor made senior Andreza Santos the obvious choice for Team MVP. Top Defensive Player honors were also a no-brainer as sophomore libero Summer Weissing collected the awards thanks to her record-setting dig performance. Her effort on the court not only during matches, but also in practice, allowed sophomore outside hitter Makini Thompson to garner the Coaches Award. Taking top honors for her work in the classroom was junior setter

FLORIDA STATE STRONG ON THE COURT AND IN THE CLASSROOM

Since his arrival at Florida State, Todd Kress has emphasized success in the classroom as well as on the court. The Seminoles had two representatives on the 2005 ACC All-Academic Volleyball Team in juniors Sarah Griffin and Jessica Skower. Griffin and Skower were joined by Kim Crawford and Zrinka Tomic as the team's representatives on the ACC Academic Honor Roll. During Kress' first four years at Florida State, the Seminoles have had 20 volleyball student athletes on the Academic Honor Roll, which is more than the five seasons prior to his arrival. In addition, Griffin earned the Golden Torch award for the highest grade point average on the team.

ACC RANKINGS

Three Seminoles were very prominent in 2005 among the ACC statistical leaders. Topping the list was junior Sarah Griffin as she rated second overall with 49 services aces and held onto the runner-up spot with 44 during conference games. Sophomore libero Summer Weissing moved up to fifth during ACC games with 4.58 digs per game from her number seven ranking overall at 4.42 dpg. Also playing better during league contests was senior middle blocker Lauren Scott as her blocking effort of 1.21 blocks per game was eighth, compared to 1.16 bpg for all matches, which rated ninth. Senior Andreza Santos made the charts during ACC matches at number nine with her 3.51 kills per game.

DEFENSE, DEFENSE, DEFENSE

A big reason for Florida State's success last season, particularly towards the end of the season, was its improved play on defense as it was one of the best total defensive efforts in the last decade. The 452 blocking assists in 2005 were the second most since 1989, while the 89 solo stuffs were also second highest since 1999 and the 313 total blocks were the second-most since 1993. In addition, Florida State's 1738 digs were the most in the last seven seasons


