

Junior Year (2006): Became just the third player in school history to earn AVCA All-America accolades with an Honorable Mention selection ... Named AVCA All-Region, the first by an FSU junior since 2000 ... First-Team All-ACC selection ... Earned the Team's MVP Award ... Led the team with a average of 3.95 kills per game - the eighth-best single-season rate in school history - that ranked third in the ACC ... Upped her rate to 4.12 kpg during conference matches to move her up to number two ... Also rated fifth in the conference at 4.43 points per game during ACC contests and eighth overall at 4.30 ppg. ... Recorded 22 double-digit kill performances, including five matches of 20 or more ... Set a career-high 26 kills and 26.5 points against Virginia (11/10) Needs 97 kills to reach 1,000 career kills and become the 21st player in FSU history to record 1,000 kills ... Set career-high with a .692 hitting percentage in the season opener against Mississippi Valley State (8/25) ... Named to the Gamecock Invitational All-Tournament Team after notching 21 kills against host South Carolina (9/6) ... Notched a career-high with five aces – after game with three for her career - in the victory at Virginia (10/14) ... Team leader with 15 solo blocks ... Topped the team in kills during 20 matches.

Sophomore Year (2005): Transferred to Florida State from Long Beach State and made an immediate impact ... Played in all 30 matches with 27 starts, while seeing action in 115 games ... Finished in the top three on the team for kills (295), blocks (75) and points (345.0) ... Increased her kills per game average to 2.95 during conference matches ... 20 kills against Wake Forest (11/25) and at Clemson (11/4) were tops on the team for thee-game and four-game matches, respectively ... Had FSU's top blocking match against Houston (9/10) with nine stuffs ... Recorded 16 matches with double digit kills, including the last 11 matches of the season ... Scored 10 or more points in 17 matches with a personal-best 23.0 against the Demon Deacons ...



Second on the team with a .238 hitting percentage with nine matches where she hit .300 or better, including a personal-best .588 at Virginia Tech (11/12).

Freshman Year (2004): Guided Long Beach to a 24-7 record and a trip to the second round of the NCAA Tournament ... Second on the team with a 3.25 kills per game average and added 18 total blocks in 57



Senior • 5-5 • L Boca Raton, Fla. (Olympic Heights) Boomers Volleyball Club

Junior Year (2006): Moved up to number three in school history with 1,379 career digs, the highest three-year total in school history ... Needs 393 digs to break the Florida State career record held by Luiza Ramos ... Recorded 467 digs last season - the third best single-season total - making her the only player in FSU history besides Ramos to have three of the top 10 single-season marks ... Recorded double-digit kills in 28 of 30 matches ... Fell one dig short of breaking the Seminole single-match record with career-best 37 digs at NC State (11/17) ... Rated fifth during conference matches at 4.81 digs per game while her overall rate of 4.41 was sixth in the league ... Topped 20 digs on six different occasions ... Notched a career-high four assists and recorded her lone kill of the season at Boston College (9/24) ... Produced a season-best three aces as Florida State took the title of the FSU Invitational by beating Eastern Illinois (9/2) ... Set personal single-season standard with 43 assists while limiting herself to a new low of 25 receiving errors ... Team leader in digs in 27 matches.

Sophomore Year (2005): One of the top liberos in the nation for the second year in a row ... Broke the Florida State single-season dig record against Wake Forest when she surpassed Luiza Ramos total of 507 digs that had stood for 11 years ... Ended the year with a new standard of 513 ... Ranked seventh in the ACC with 4.42 digs per game ... Improved to fifth during ACC contests at 4.58 dpg ... One of only two players on the team to start in all 30 matches and play all 116 games ... Team leader for digs in 24 of 30 matches ... Reached double-digit digs in all but three matches with 11 contests of 20 or more and one 30-dig outing ... Notched a season-high 30 digs against Boston College (10/28) ... Tallied 28 digs against Clemson (10/2) and North Carolina (11/20) ... Fourth on the team with 14 aces while rating third with a .936 serving percentage ... Also finished fourth on the team with 37 assists ... USA Volleyball (2005): Became just the third Florida State player to ever compete for a USA Volleyball team when she traveled to Ankara, Turkey, to compete at the 2005 FIVB U-20 World Championship ... Started all five matches at libero for a USA squad that went 1-4 ... The American's lone victory came against the Japanese.

Freshman Year (2004): Made enormous impact as a newcomer, asserting herself as a force on the defensive end ... One of only two players to have appeared in all 109 games ... Tied Maggie Philgence for ninth on the single-season charts with 399 digs – highest total since Holly Schneider had 401 in 1997 – for a 3.66 digs per game average ... Led the Seminoles in serve percentage with an impressive .931 mark, despite also posting a team high 510 attempts... Finished second on the team in service aces with 28

... Had double-digit digs in 21 of team's 29 matches, recording more than 20 on six occasions ... Season high 32 digs came in FSU's commanding 3-1 win over North Carolina (11/13) ... Team leader for digs in 20 contests ... Went for 11 digs, one service ace, and one assist in loss to fourth-ranked Florida (9/14) ... Recorded a career-high six service aces and six points in 2-3 loss to George Mason (9/17).



Sophomore Year (2006 - At Oregon): Second in the conference with 44 aces (0.41 per game - No. 10 on the Oregon single-season list) ... 
