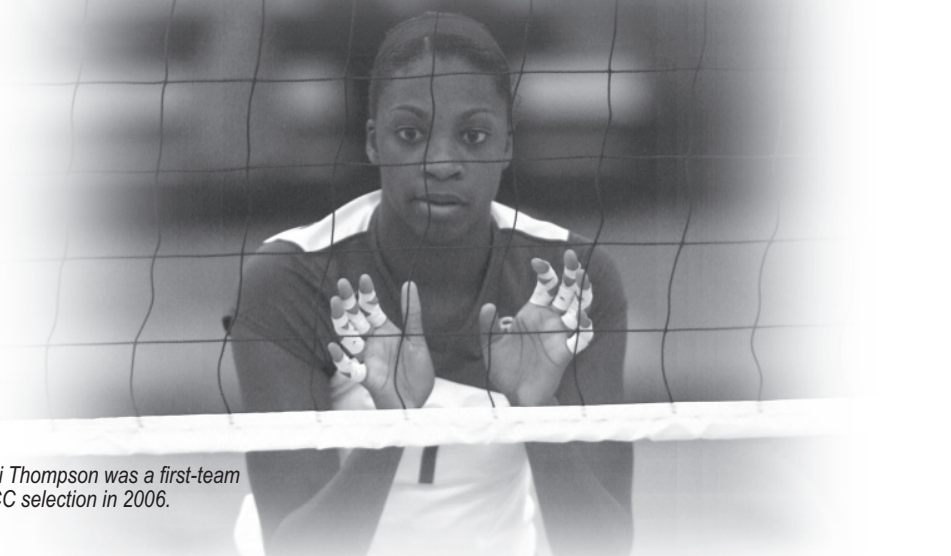

## FSU Volleyball on the Way Back Up In 2006

What started in the middle of the 2005 season came full circle in 2006 as the Florida State volleyball team improved by six wins last season to produce a 19-12 record. The Seminoles' six-game turnaround was second in the league behind Clemson.

Florida State began the year a house of fire as it ran out to a 5-0 start, including the title of the Florida State Invitational. FSU got its first test of the year when it dropped a tough 3-0 decision to No. 10 USC at the South Carolina Tournament. The Seminoles came away from that weekend with a quality win as they took down the host Gamecocks in one of only four victories over the SEC by an ACC school. For the third time in four meetings under head coach Todd Kress, the Seminoles took a game off rival No. 6 Florida before dropping a 3-1 decision.

Just like the beginning of the regular season, the start of the ACC slate saw the Seminoles get off to another strong start. Florida State kicked off the conference schedule with a dramatic 3-2 win at Miami – beating the Hurricanes in Coral Gables for the second year in a

row – before sweeping Maryland and Boston College at home. FSU capped the best ACC start in school history with another thrilling 3-2 win at Georgia Tech.

The streak ended at four with a loss at Clemson, but the Seminoles responded by winning four more in a row, including a weekend sweep of Virginia Tech and Virginia. FSU's 3-0 triumph over Virginia was its first in Charlottesville since 1994 and put the Seminoles in second place in the league at 8-1. Unfortunately, Florida State could not sustain its strong start as it went 3-6 during the next month of the season. The Seminoles rallied the last two weeks of the season to produce wins at NC State and Wake Forest to climb up to fourth with a 13-9 mark.

## Seminoles Finish Fourth In ACC

The 4-0 start to the ACC schedule – the best conference start in school history - propelled the Seminoles to a fourth-place finish in the league. Florida State finished the year with a 13-9 mark, the most ACC wins in school history. Under Todd Kress Florida State has finished in top half of the league four of his five seasons, topping out at second place during his inaugural 2002 season.

### Second Best Record Under Kress

After a 13-17 record in 2005, Florida State rebounded to post its second-best record under Todd Kress with a 19-12 record. Included in this record was a 5-0 start as the Seminoles equaled the 2004 squad for the best start during the Kress era. Through five seasons at Florida State, Kress has average 17.4 wins per year.

### Thompson Collects Awards Hat Trick

For the third year in row a Florida State player has brought home a trio of end of the year awards. Junior outside hitter Makini Thompson became the third-straight Seminole to garner All-America accolades as she claimed Honorable Mention honors from the AVCA. Her march towards the national honor started with a spot on the First-Team All-ACC squad, followed by an AVCA First-Team All-East Region accolade. Thompson was tops on the team with 423 kills – the most by a Seminole since First-Team All-Region selection Kristen Frye had 469 in 2002 – and she needs 382 during her senior season to become the 21<sup>st</sup> player in FSU history to record 1,000 kills.

### Barry Named ACC All-Freshman Team

Freshmen played a major role for the Seminoles this season and none shined brighter during their inaugural year than rookie middle blocker Brianna Barry. The Orlando native became the first Florida State player in three years to garner attention from the league office as she earned a spot on the ACC All-Freshman Team. The 6-foot-3 rookie was first among freshmen with a .325 hitting percentage and was among the freshmen leaders in kills per game, blocks per game and points per game.

### FSU Invitational Champions

It had been two years since the home team won the Florida State Invitational, but that changed in 2006 as the tournament title stayed in Tallahassee. Sweeps of Stetson, South Alabama and Eastern Illinois gave the Seminoles the crown. Senior middle blocker Sarah Griffin posted 33 kills and had a .519 hitting percentage as she took home tournament MVP honors. Joining her on the all-tournament team was senior outside hitter Jessica Skower and rookie outside Malorie Wessel.

### Seminoles Get Offensive

A major reason for Florida State's improvement from 2005 was a stronger offense. The Seminoles' ACC-best .266 hitting percentage is the fourth-highest rate in school history and a 71-point improvement from a year ago. The rise in hitting percentage is the best improvement during NCAA competition and the second highest in school history behind the 1980 squad that jumped from .150 to .330. Florida State also averaged more than one kill per game better in 2006 (14.3-to-15.6 kpg).

## 2006 REVIEW

### Weissing Moves Up To Third

From the outset of her career, junior libero Summer Weissing has been working towards the school's all-time digs record. She made a giant climb up the list this season as she moved from outside the top ten all the way up to number three with 1,379 digs. Going into her senior campaign, Weissing only needs 393 digs – she's averaging 459.6 a year during her career – to break Luiza Ramos' school record of 1,771 digs.

### Skower Ascends a Pair of Lists

Showing that she's the ultimate team player, Jessica Skower gave up her spot as the Seminoles' starting setter that she held the last two years to move to a new position her final season. Despite making the move to outside hitter, Skower managed to amass enough assists to move up to number three on the career charts and finish her career with 2,990 assists. In addition, she became the first non middle blocker or full-time outside hitter to make it onto the FSU top ten for blocking assists as she finished her FSU tenure at number eight with 282.

### Queen of Aces

Few student-athletes have done more for Florida State off the court than senior Sarah Griffin and she left her mark on the court with a spot on the FSU Top 10 for career aces. President of SAAC (Student Athlete Advisory Committee), executive board member of Seminole Student Boosters and a two-year team captain, Griffin finished her Florida State career with 139 aces to rate fifth in Seminole lore.

### FSU Among the National Leaders

As Florida State got out to its smoking hot start, the Seminoles were all over the national rankings. In the first report by the NCAA, FSU was No. 1 in the country with its .404 hitting percentage. The Seminoles also checked in at third in the nation at 3.53 aces per game as well as 24<sup>th</sup> with 16.47 kills per game. Individually, Jessica Skower was fifth in the country with a .531 hitting percentage, while Makini Thompson came in 17<sup>th</sup> at .458. Florida State finished the year 20<sup>th</sup> nationally with a .266 hitting percentage and 36<sup>th</sup> at 2.03 aces per game.

### ACC Leaders

Correlating to Florida State's success last year was the appearance in the top half of the league in most statistical categories. The Seminoles topped all ACC schools this year with their .266 hitting percentage. FSU came in second for aces (2.03 per game) while ranking third in kills (15.62 per game) and assists (14.34). Individually, freshman Malorie Wessel was the highest ranking Seminole as she came in second at 0.51 aces per game while Sarah Griffin was eighth on that list at 0.40 aces. Makini Thompson rated third at 3.95 kills per game and eighth with 4.30 points per game. Freshman Brianna Barry was tops among freshmen and fourth in the league with her .325 hitting percentage. Setter Zrinka Tomic rounded out the FSU contingency on the ACC charts, coming in at number four with 11.55 assists per game.

### Tomic and Griffin Were Double-Double Trouble for Opponents

All 12 of Florida State's double-doubles this year came from a pair of players. Senior setter Zrinka Tomic led the way with eight double dips, while senior middle blocker Sarah Griffin recorded the other four. Griffin posted back-to-back double doubles against in-state rivals Florida and Miami, while both seniors accomplished the feat against the Hurricanes.

### Weissing Nearly Sets Single-Match Digs Record

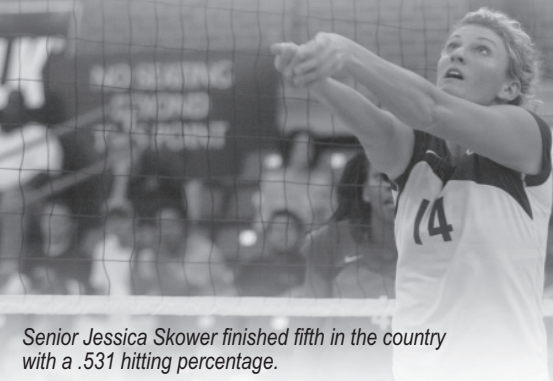
While junior libero Summer Weissing has been a star in the back row for the Seminoles during her first three years, one match in 2006 stood out more than the rest. On November 17 at NC State, the Boca Raton native recorded a career-best 37 digs in the 3-1 win over the Wolfpack. Weissing finished the match just one dig shy of tying the single-match school record of 38 set by Luiza Ramos against Loyola Marymount on September 13, 1991. The amazing part of Weissing's performance is that she did it in four games, compared to Ramos, who set the mark in five games.
