

JUNIOR YEAR (2007):


- Started 14 of 30 matches played in first season at Florida State



JUNIOR YEAR

(2007 - AT FLORIDA STATE):

- Was a powerful force on the Seminole squad, starting 29 of 30 matches
- Was only Seminole to be individually ranked in the NCAA finished the season in fourth with
 0.73 service aces per game
- Maintained an attack percentage of .300 or higher in 14 matches, seven of which were .400 or higher






