ATHLETIC COMMITTEE MEMBER

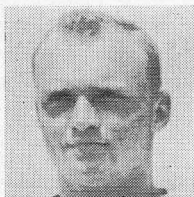

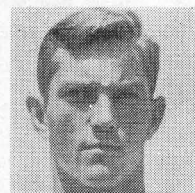

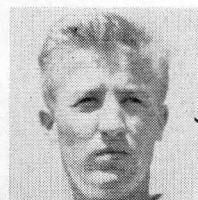

MEET THE SEMINOLES

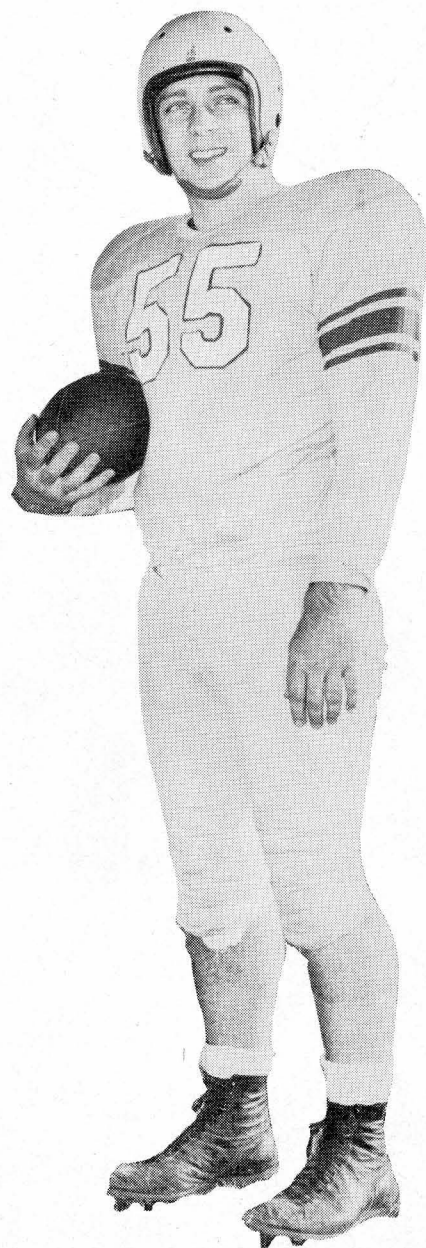
Tackle LOREN "DUKE" MALTBY will captain the 1950 Florida State University football team. . . . Duke's value to the team can best be illustrated by saying he may be used at tackle, guard and center before the season is over. . . . He does a fine job at all three positions and is a hard working leader. . . .

End JAMES ARNOLD is the smallest man on the Florida State squad, yet his defensive play rates him with the best. . . . He is a Freshman. . . . Tackle SAM BAKER is one of the largest boys on the squad at 220 pounds and he likes the going rough. . . . Halfback WAYNE BENNER runs and punts well, but is outstanding as a passer. . . . Much of Florida State's success this season will depend on his good right arm. . . . Halfback HARRY BRINGGER was one of the few Freshmen to earn a letter last Fall. . . . He is at his best on defense, being particularly adept at knocking down or intercepting enemy passes. . . . Halfback TOM BROWN is rated top defensive back on the squad. . . . Tom was hurt in the Randolph-Macon game and may be out rest of the season. . . . Guard BILL DAWKINS, an outstanding defensive player at Florida State the past two seasons, needs no introduction. . . . Pre-season injuries may hold Bill back in the opening games. . . . Quarterback BILL DRIVER, a lanky newcomer, passes well and is a capable play selector. . . .

End NORMAN "CHIEF" EUBANKS has the biggest hands on the squad, and you'd swear there is glue all over them when he makes those "impossible" pass catches. . . . End TED HEWITT, also a letterman at basketball and golf at Florida State, will play end on offense and halfback on defense for the Seminoles. . . . Quarterback MAC HUEY is one of the top Freshmen on the squad. . . . He is an excellent blocker and lacks only experience. . . . Halfback ERNIE HUGGETT is expected to fill a need that Florida State has had ever since it became co-educational in 1947. . . . Hug can kick those extra points after touchdowns, and he has looked promising as a kick-off artist. . . . Halfback NELSON ITALIANO runs well, blocks well, throws well—what more can you say? . . . Center STEVE KALENICH is a Freshman who is coming right along in his attempt to fill the shoes of graduated Joe Marcus, last year's most valuable player. . . .

Tackle W. A. "DUB" KENDRICK will also be used at end by Coach Veller this Fall. . . . Dub has been one of the big reasons Florida State has had championship teams the past two years. . . . Fullback DICK TURK, a hard running Sophomore, has been the surprise of early season games. . . . Tackle CARMINE LOMBARDI is rated one of the Seminole's best Freshmen linemen. . . . He's a standout on defense. . . . Center MONTE MAY will be seeking his third letter at Florida State and has a good chance to be the starter at this position. . . . Guard WALT MILLER is big and powerful. . . . He will see plenty of action this Fall. . . . Guard EARL O'NEAL is a Georgia boy with junior college experience who doesn't talk much but plays lots of football. . . . Tackle DWIGHT OSHA will also be used at end this Fall. . . . "Big Osh" has good hands for pass receiving, and when he tackles he likes to rack 'em. . . . Halfback DICK PETERSON is the Seminole's only returning backfield regular. . . . Adept at running, passing and blocking, Pete should have a great year. . . . End CLIFFORD POWELL is a big boy from Wrightsville, Georgia, who blocks and tackles well. . . . He is a Freshman. . . . Guard BOB SCHMELZ, injured most of last season, figures heavily in Coach Veller's plans for 1950. . . . He will play some at end on defense. . . . Fullback MILAN "MIKE" SELLERS is expected to be Florida State's big gun this Fall. . . . Mike hits hard into the line and can go all the way with hips flying if he gets into the secondary. . . . Tackle VIC SZCZEPANIK showed much promise as a Freshman last year and should be at his best in 1950. . . .

Freshmen ends PAT HARRIS, DICK SUTHERLAND, CLINT THOMAS and JOHN HEDRICK are all coming along fine and will see action this Fall. . . . With just a little improvement tackles HAROLD FARMER, BILL HOPPE, LAWRENCE MERO or BOB WODRICH could be pushing for a starting berth at their position. . . . Looking best of the Freshmen guards are WENDELL DENNIS, FRED MOATES and GEORGE STOREY. . . . JACK PHILLIPS, a Junior guard, has been held back by injuries. . . . Center candidates in addition to Kalenich and May, include BOB O'CONNELL, TOMMY OWEN, LESLIE HIGH and WODRICH, any of which might move up if the others falter. . . . DON GLADDEN is a promising Freshman quarterback candidate. . . . Gladden would be right up there with the best except for an injury. . . . PRESTON BRADLEY, RAY INLOW and DON LINTON are battling with Sellers and Turk for the fullback job, while among the better halfback prospects not mentioned before are PHILIP ALVERS, GARY FOLSOM (who may turn out to be a great passer), and EDDIE GRAY.

Howard College was founded in January, 1842, at Marion, Alabama. In 1887, the Baptist institution was moved to the eastern residential section of Birmingham where it is today. Howard's curriculum includes liberal arts and sciences. Major Harwell G. Davis is President of the college.

Howard, once a real power among the small college football teams of the South, resumed the sport last year after a lapse of several years due to World War II. The Bulldogs called on likeable Earl Gartman, a former Howard football and basketball star, to coach the team.

Last year, under Gartman, the Bulldogs won four games and lost five—finishing second in the Dixie Conference. Conference victories were scored over Mississippi College 19-14 and Millsaps College 18-0. Howard played one of its best games of 1949 while losing to Wofford College by a 13 to 27 score.

So far this season the Bulldogs have had a pretty rough time of it, losing their first three games as they did in 1949. Florence State defeated them last Saturday 7 to 0 at Decatur, Alabama. Prior to that they lost to Tennessee Poly and Western Kentucky State. However the Bulldogs got in the win column in their fourth contest last season, and Coach Gartman is hoping this pattern will hold true tonight.
