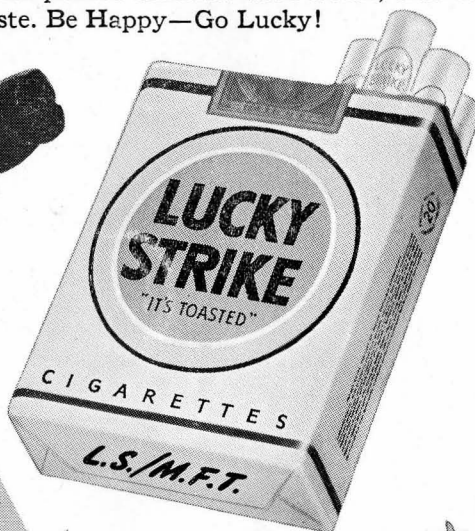

ABOUT OUR OPPONENTS AND FOOTBALL IN GENERAL

The football game tonight is an example of the color, gaiety, spirit and enthusiasm on the part of *two* student bodies. This is the first opportunity for DeLand fans to experience this thrill as previously this season, there has been no sizeable representation from our opponents. There are too few games between Florida teams. Stetson, Tampa and F. S. U. play each other. Miami plays Florida. Only four games between five Florida teams.

The modern series between Stetson and F. S. U. began in 1947 when the Hatters were victorious. In 1948 and 1949, F. S. U., those years under Coach Don Veller, were triumphant. Thus, the game tonight is an attempt by the Hatters to even the modern series. While football in Florida began at Stetson in 1901, the Green and White and the Seminole first met in 1904, a victory for F. S. U., before the school was made the Florida State College for Women.

Stetson enters the game tonight with six victories and one defeat this season. F. S. U.

is undefeated this season in five starts. They have won over Troy, Randolph - Macon, Howard, Newberry and Sewanee.

F. S. U. beat Troy 27 to 7. The Hatters downed the Alabamans 34 to 12. While many football experts gave F. S. U. a 6 to 12 point advantage over the Hatters in pre-game predictions, Dick Dunkel's selections showed the Green and White 4 points over the Seminoles.

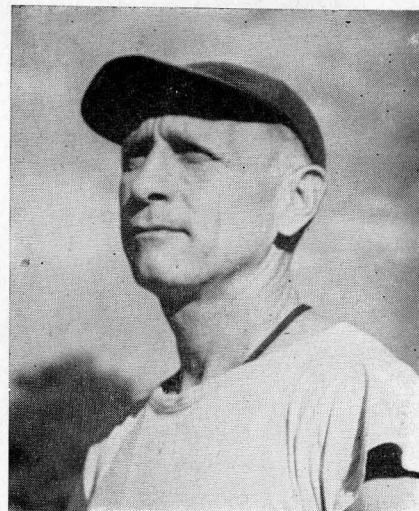
It must be remembered that no team has scored more than 8 points in a single game against F. S. U. this year and no team has scored more than 14 points against them in the last three years.

The F. S. U. offensive team tips the scales at 207, or 13 pounds per man more than the Hatters. The Seminole's defensive team averages 197, or 10 pounds a man more than the Green and White.

Coach Veller, who hopes to get the Seminoles into the Southern Conference, uses a single wing formation while Coach McMullen employs a winged "T."

Coach Cowell, at Stetson for more than 15 years, knows thoroughly the athletic picture in Florida. His counsel and advice is much sought after and is of great value in charting a clear course for athletics at Stetson.



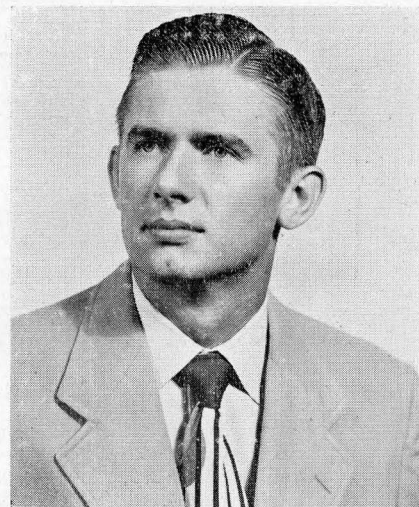
