THE DELTA STATE STATESMEN

Delta State Teachers College is located in Cleveland, Mississippi, an agricultural center of approximately 7,000 population situated in the heart of the Mississippi Delta, 120 miles south of Memphis on U. S. Highway 61. Dr. William M. Kethley is President of Delta State and the school is a member of the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

Delta State, a co-educational state maintained institution, was created by Senate Bill #263 in 1924. The college formally opened its doors to students on September 15, 1925.

Head football coach at Delta State is E. B. "Gene" Chadwick, now in his fourth year at the Statesmen helm. Chadwick played high school and college football, winning recognition as one of Mississippi State's all-time passing greats. He learned his college football lessons from Bernie Bierman and is remembered in the Magnolia State as one of the most deadly and accurate hurlers with the pigskin of the past two decades.

Chadwick took over the grid reins of the Statesmen in April, 1948. In three full seasons his Delta State teams won 17, lost 10 and tied one.

Chadwick's assistant is Bobby Barbour, one of the all-time outstanding players on the Statesmen gridiron. Bobby gave Coach Chadwick much needed assistance last year, and with a year of experience behind him he will be of untold value this year.

Other members of the Delta State physical education staff include head basketball coach

John Ray Hicks, tennis and golf coach Forest "Jeff" Wyatt, and head trainer "Wig" Reily.

Coach Chadwick is faced at Delta State this season with another "building year." Of the 60 to 65 men who reported for football September 1st, only 20 have had previous Delta experience, and of these only thirteen will have donned the green uniform enough to earn a letter. With the loss of 25 men staring them in the face, Coaches Chadwick and Barbour have definitely had to start anew with their building program.

The loss of 12 men through graduation was expected. It was the loss of 13 to the Armed Forces, many of whom had their best years to come, that upset the apple cart.


