MEET THE SEMINOLES

Guard **BILL DAWKINS** of Miami, an Intercollegiate All-State and All-Dixie Conference selection last year, is playing his fourth season as a regular for Florida State and will captain the team. . . . Bill sets a great example for the ball club by his own stellar play and has fine leadership qualities. . . . He is a physical education major and hopes to coach in the state after he graduates in June. . . .

GUARDS—**CHARLIE BOOTH** of Lakeland is a Sophomore with lots of promise. . . . **CHARLEY BROWN** of Monongahela, Pa., will also be used as a tackle and line-backer on defense. One of the best newcomers on the squad. . . . **MAC HUEY** of Tampa lettered at quarterback last year, outgrew the backfield and is learning fast as a lineman. He plays tackle or backs up the line on defense. . . . **BOB SCHMELZ** of Willoughby, Ohio, like Captain Dawkins, is starting his fourth season as a Florida State regular. He was an All-Dixie Conference selection last Fall and is expected to have his greatest year. . . . **ROGER SLABAUGH** of Mishawaka, Ind., may be the best of the Freshmen candidates at this position. . . . **BOB TULLY** of Tallahassee was a reserve on the 1949 Seminoles. Bob has lots of fire, likes it rough and backs up the line on defense. . . .

TACKLES—**VERN FREEZE** of Mishawaka, Ind., is a promising Freshman who also punts well. . . . **JOHN KARLOWICZ** of Fairbank, Pa., is a newcomer who is outstanding on defense. . . . **DONALD LINTON** of Port St. Joe was a reserve fullback on Florida State's 1950 eleven. He's learning fast as a lineman. . . . **DOSSEY MERRITT** of Lakeland is the largest man on the 1951 Florida State squad at 243 pounds. Dossey, a Freshman, handles his weight well and may become a great player if he continues to develop. . . . **EARL O'NEAL** of Valdosta, Ga., was a letterman guard last year and looks even better at tackle. Earl is one of the most aggressive players on the squad. He plays guard on defense. . . . **NAT POLAK** of Miami is another promising Freshman who lacks experience. . . . **VIC SZCZEPANIK** of East Rochester, Pa., is one of the two returning lettermen tackles. He likes the going rough and is at his best on offense. . . . **BOB WODRICH** of Miami lettered at Florida State as a Freshman last Fall and is expected to play lots of ball. He is also battling an early season injury jinx. . . . **GORDON DAVIS** of Fort Myers, **TOM NADRICH** of Youngstown, Ohio, **CHUCK SANDERS** of Monongahela, Pa., and **GEORGE KIRBY** of Tallahassee are all unproved Freshmen. . . .

CENTERS—**BUDDY BRYANT** of Perry was a letterman on Florida State's first football team in 1947 and has been out of school since. . . . He could help plenty if and when he gets back into shape. . . . **STEVE KALENICH** of Barberton, Ohio, was the Seminole's regular center last Fall and is expected to do better this year. . . . **ED LOCKARD** of Jacksonville is another returning letterman at center. **MARVIN MOLLNOW** of Jacksonville Beach looks good at times—he's a newcomer. . . . **TOMMY OWEN** of Webster was a reserve center last year and is expected to have a great year. . . . **BILL WHALEY** of Ocala is a promising Freshman who has scrap but lacks experience. . . . Ditto **JOHN MURCHEK** of East Chicago, Ill., and **EARL BROWN** of Tallahassee. . . .

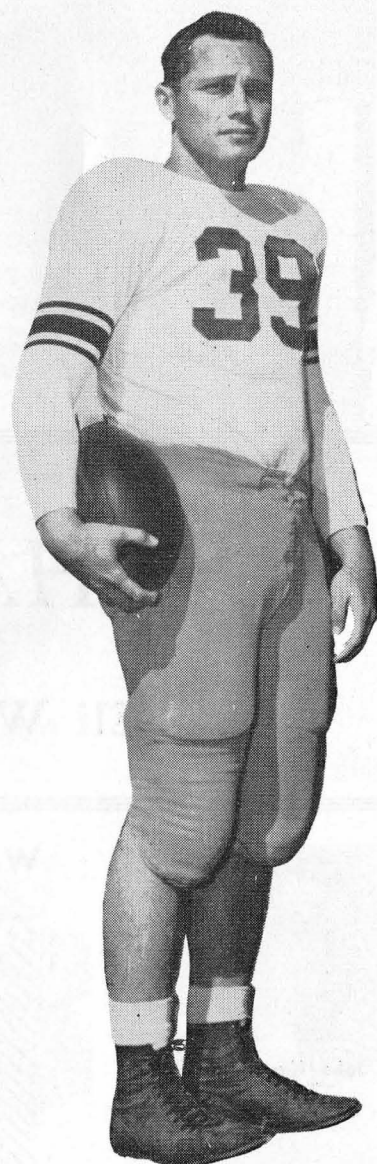
ENDS—**JIM ARNOLD** of Bainbridge, Ga., is one of the smallest men on the squad and one of the surest tacklers. . . . He was a defensive standout for the Seminoles as a Freshman last year. . . . **CURTIS CAMPBELL** of Pensacola is a returning letterman who is a fine pass receiver and is equally good on defense. He will also be used at right half. . . . **BILL DRIVER** of Girard, Ill., was the Seminoles' regular quarterback last season and is looking even better at end. . . . **JOE ROBINSON** of Coral Gables seems to be the most promising Freshman end. . . . **BOB WHITMER** of South Bend, Ind., is a fine pass receiver and blocker. Big and rangy, Bob could be great this Fall if he catches fire. . . . Newcomers **GENE BRIDGES** of Pensacola, **JERRY ELLENWOOD** of Fort Wayne, Ind., **AL GARRETT** of Sarasota, **TED MORRILL** of Miami and **MANUEL MOSHONAS** of Tarpon Springs are still unknown quantities. . . .

QUARTERBACKS—**PRESS BRADLEY** of Lake Wales lettered as a fullback last year and has looked even better in his new blocking back role. . . . **TOM SEBRING** of Tallahassee is the best passer of the quarterbacks and also punts well. . . . **JIMMY LEE TAYLOR** of Tampa, a newcomer, is a good blocker and may also be used as a defensive end. . . . **MIKE SELLERS** of Barberton, Ohio, has been moved to quarterback where he is expected to be even more valuable than he was at fullback. Mike was Intercollegiate All-State and All-Dixie Conference in 1950. . . . **DICK TURK** of South Bend, Ind., gained lots of ground for the Seminoles as a fullback last Fall and will probably be used at two positions this year. Dick's ability as a blocker prompted his shift to quarterback. . . . **GERALD SMITH** of Miami and **JOHNNY SHEPPARD** of Tallahassee are promising Freshmen. . . .

HALFBACKS—**WAYNE BENNER** of LaPorte, Ind., is a great defensive halfback and a good punter. . . . **HARRY BRINGGER** of Winter Haven is one of the fastest men on the squad, a shifty runner, good pass receiver and fine defensive halfback. . . . **TOMMY BROWN** of Tallahassee, rated one of the finest pass defense backs in the South, will also do most of the Seminole's punting. . . . **BOBBY FIVEASH** of Bainbridge, Ga., is a Sophomore with great promise as a runner and passer. . . . **GARY FOLSOM** of Jacksonville is at his best when throwing the ball. Gary is a returning reserve. . . . **ERNIE HUGGETT** of Mishawaka, Ind., is the Seminoles' kickoff and extra point specialist. . . . **ROY THOMPSON** of Wrightsville, Ga., is probably the best of the new players on the squad this season. Fast, shifty, and a hard runner, he is a touchdown threat every time he gets beyond the line of scrimmage. . . . **RALPH ATWELL** of Pensacola, and **AL WOODHAM** of Albany, Ga., are the unproved newcomers. . . .

FULLBACKS—**GEORGE CARNES** of Tampa is a promising Freshman who is at his best on defense. . . . **GEORGE GRAHAM** of Santa Rosa, Calif., is a hard, fast runner. . . . **NELSON ITALIANO** of Tampa has been moved to fullback from halfback in an effort to speed up the Seminoles' offense. He does everything—punts, passes, runs—well. . . . **RONALD KING** of Daytona Beach, a Sophomore, is big and looks great at times. . . .

THE DELTA STATE STATESMEN

Delta State Teachers College is located in Cleveland, Mississippi, an agricultural center of approximately 7,000 population situated in the heart of the Mississippi Delta, 120 miles south of Memphis on U. S. Highway 61. Dr. William M. Kethley is President of Delta State and the school is a member of the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

Delta State, a co-educational state maintained institution, was created by Senate Bill #263 in 1924. The college formally opened its doors to students on September 15, 1925.

Head football coach at Delta State is E. B. "Gene" Chadwick, now in his fourth year at the Statesmen helm. Chadwick played high school and college football, winning recognition as one of Mississippi State's all-time passing greats. He learned his college football lessons from Bernie Bierman and is remembered in the Magnolia State as one of the most deadly and accurate hurlers with the pigskin of the past two decades.

Chadwick took over the grid reins of the Statesmen in April, 1948. In three full seasons his Delta State teams won 17, lost 10 and tied one.

Chadwick's assistant is Bobby Barbour, one of the all-time outstanding players on the Statesmen gridiron. Bobby gave Coach Chadwick much needed assistance last year, and with a year of experience behind him he will be of untold value this year.

Other members of the Delta State physical education staff include head basketball coach

John Ray Hicks, tennis and golf coach Forest "Jeff" Wyatt, and head trainer "Wig" Reily.

Coach Chadwick is faced at Delta State this season with another "building year." Ordinarily this would have been a better than average year—that is, it could have been until Uncle Sam stepped into the picture. Of the 60 to 65 men who reported for football September 1st, only 20 have had previous Delta experience, and of these only thirteen will have donned the green uniform enough to earn a letter. With the loss of 25 men staring them in the face, Coaches Chadwick and Barbour have definitely had to start anew with their building program.

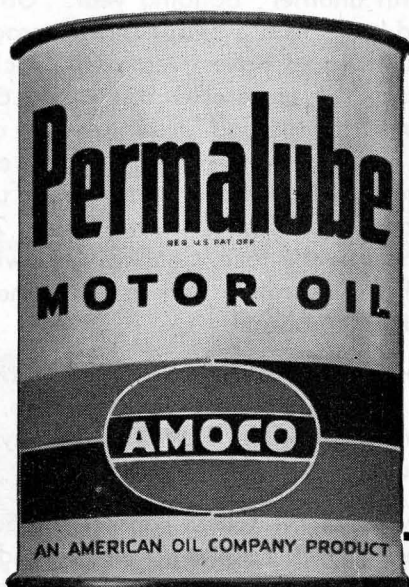
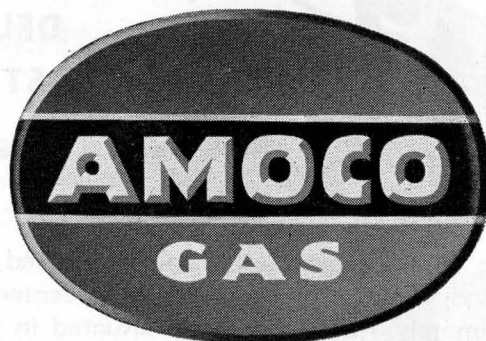
The loss of 12 men through graduation was expected. It was the loss of 13 to the Armed Forces, many of whom had their best years to come, that upset the apple cart.

This week for the fourth consecutive Saturday the Statesmen will take the field as underdogs. After winning their opener with Ouachita College, Delta State has lost to University of Alabama, Northeast Louisiana State and Arkansas State.

Highlight of the Statesmen's offense this season has been the passing attack sparked by the magic arm of Fred Foster. Foster uses a variety of receivers with ends Porter and Wilkinson, and backs Reed and Woodall grabbing a majority of the aerials. With Foster throwing the Greenies are always dangerous, and it is not beyond the realm of possibility they could score an upset over the highly favored Florida State Seminoles today. They'll be trying all the way.

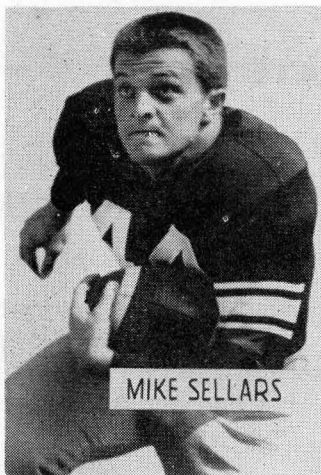

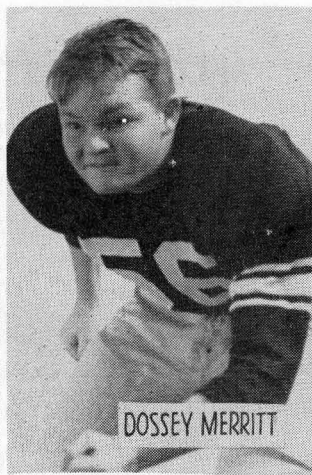

- All-time Record—Won 31, lost 10.



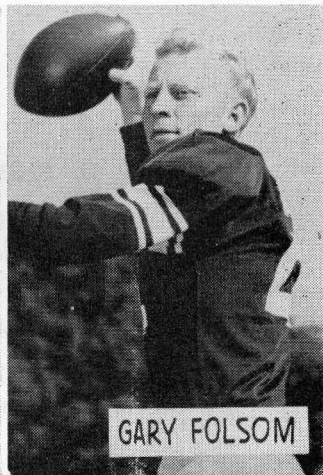
